Dear Robert.

Well, apparently I was too optimistic in my last letters since you say you thought I would be coming so soon.

The Russians are holding me up, and are giving me some trouble about the visa, so for now I can only wait in general for an ordinary Russian. It's impossible to leave the USSR, simply because he won't let. However, I am very much aware of the possibility because of the fact I am still a American citizen and have the U.S. passport.

My American documents are good only until Jan. 4, 1962, therefore you can expect that they will let me go before that date, since I will not extend the length of time on these documents after Jan 4, 1962.

— however the Russians have been known  
— to hold people against international  
— law, and against their wills,  
— but as I say, "time will show".  
— Maria did not write the letters  
— herself, but the words were hers.  
— I only translated them into English.  
— Maria doesn't know any English ?  
— at all, and at home she always  
— speak Russian.

Robert Lee sounds like he  
— is growing into a fine boy and  
— Cathy is also quite a grown up  
— little lady, already 4 years old,  
— It hardly seems possible, I  
— remember when mother phoned me  
— to say she was born, on Aug 27<sup>th</sup> or 28<sup>th</sup>.

— will leave a few days ~~later~~ <sup>from</sup> letters.  
— A lot has changed since then!!







from me.


