A Lesson from Yesterday

A study of history reveals that three qualities marked the lives of those who made great contributions to their world.

The first is an attitude of discontentedness with the present state of affairs. This is the quality causing one to see that no matter how good things are right now, there is vast room for improvement and further achievement.

The second is an ability to have a dream of what could be or what ought to be. Today's dreams are the raw material for tomorrow's castles, the blueprint of tomorrow's accomplishments. Without the ability to dream, the future can only be a step lower than the present.

The third quality is the determination to work from the first stage of discontentedness through the second

step of dreaming and planning to the actual achievement of these worthy goals. It is not enough just to be dissatisfied with the present state of affairs. Nor is it enough just to advance to the stage of dreaming. One must weld these two into a definite attempt to improve the present, mold the future, and change dreams into realities.

Notice that all three are necessary. The first without the other two produces only a chronic griper. The second without the other two produces only a daydreamer. The third without the other two produces a frustrated person who wants to do something but doesn't know what or how. But a combination of these three qualities will produce significant results. Using this lesson from the past we can do more in the future for our Lord.

Eight Stills Washed Out By Agents

State liquor agents eclipsed eight moonshine stills in August. They captured 910 gallons of mash, destroyed 13 gallons of booze aging in the woods and nabbed 11 stillkeepers.

Monthly report of Coke R. Stevenson Jr., administrator of the Texas Liquor Control Board, shows four of the stills were in Harrison County, one was in Liberty County, two were in Montgomery County and one was in Titus County.

In Dallas County, 65 liquor violation cases were filed. August convictions in Dallas totaled 89. Fines and court costs totaled \$1,777. Seven offenders received jail terms. Six cases were dismissed and two defendants were acquitted during the month.

The 18 enforcement districts of the LCB reported a total of 798 criminal complaints filed during the month statewide. There were 754 convictions during the period.

The convictions resulted in 27 jail sentences and fines and costs totaling \$45,231.25. There were seven acquittals and 46 dismissed during the month.

HIDALGO, Texas (AP)—U.S. customs agents seized 45,036 rounds of rifle ammunition headed for the interior of Mexico Saturday and arrested three persons. Herbert F. Scott, customs agent in charge in McAllen, identified the trio as Omar Alberto Ramos Salinas, 32, his wife, Ana Maria Pedraza de Ramos, 24, and Gilberto Mata Rios, 27, when they were arraigned before U.S. Commissioner James K. Hall in Edinburg.

The three were charged with violating the National Munitions Control Act. The three waived preliminary hearing, and Hall set bond at \$2,500 for the woman and \$5,000 each for the men. All three live in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, they said.

The seizure was made at 1:45 p.m. Saturday when a customs agent noticed their 1963 model sedan was unusually low in the rear. When the agent investigated, he found the car was equipped with overload springs and pulled it out of the line of cars moving across the international bridge over the Rio Grande between Hidalgo and Reynosa, Mexico. Further investigation revealed

the thousands of rounds of ammunition. The boxes and clips of ammunition were packed behind the rear seat, under each rear window panel, and inside the frame at each front door. The mechanism for operating the rear windows and the adjustable window behind the rear seat had been removed, and this area was used to conceal the ammunition.

Scott said agents also found a Winchester Model 100 semi-automatic rifle behind the seat. Customs agent Leslie H. Jones said the agents recovered a .38-caliber snub-nosed revolver from the purse of the woman. He said it was fully loaded.

Scott said the seizure included 26,600 rounds of .30-caliber ammunition, 14,000 rounds of .30 M-1 military ammunition, 4,096 rounds of .30 M-1 military ammunition, and 20 rounds of .30-06 ammunition.

Ramos told the Associated Press he was taking the load of ammunition to Guadalupe, where he was to be paid \$240. "I don't know who is going to buy the ammunition," Ramos said. "I was just driving it down."

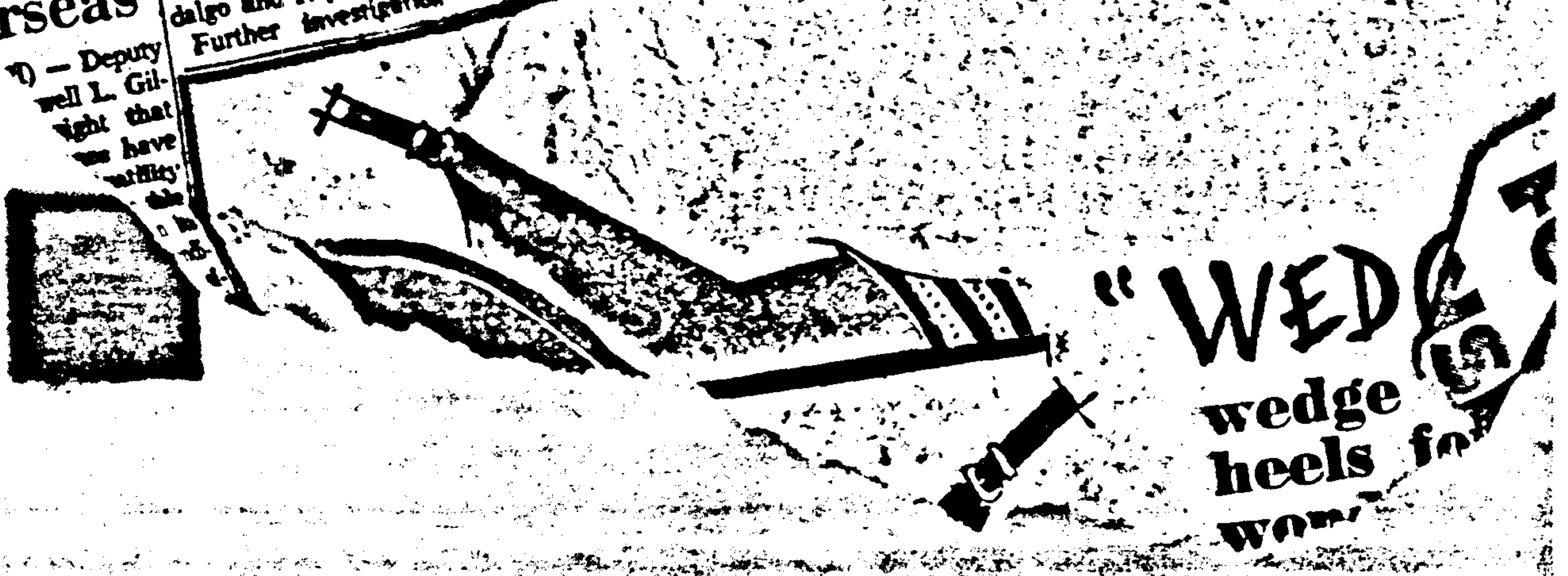
U.N. Veto Plan Explored by U.S.

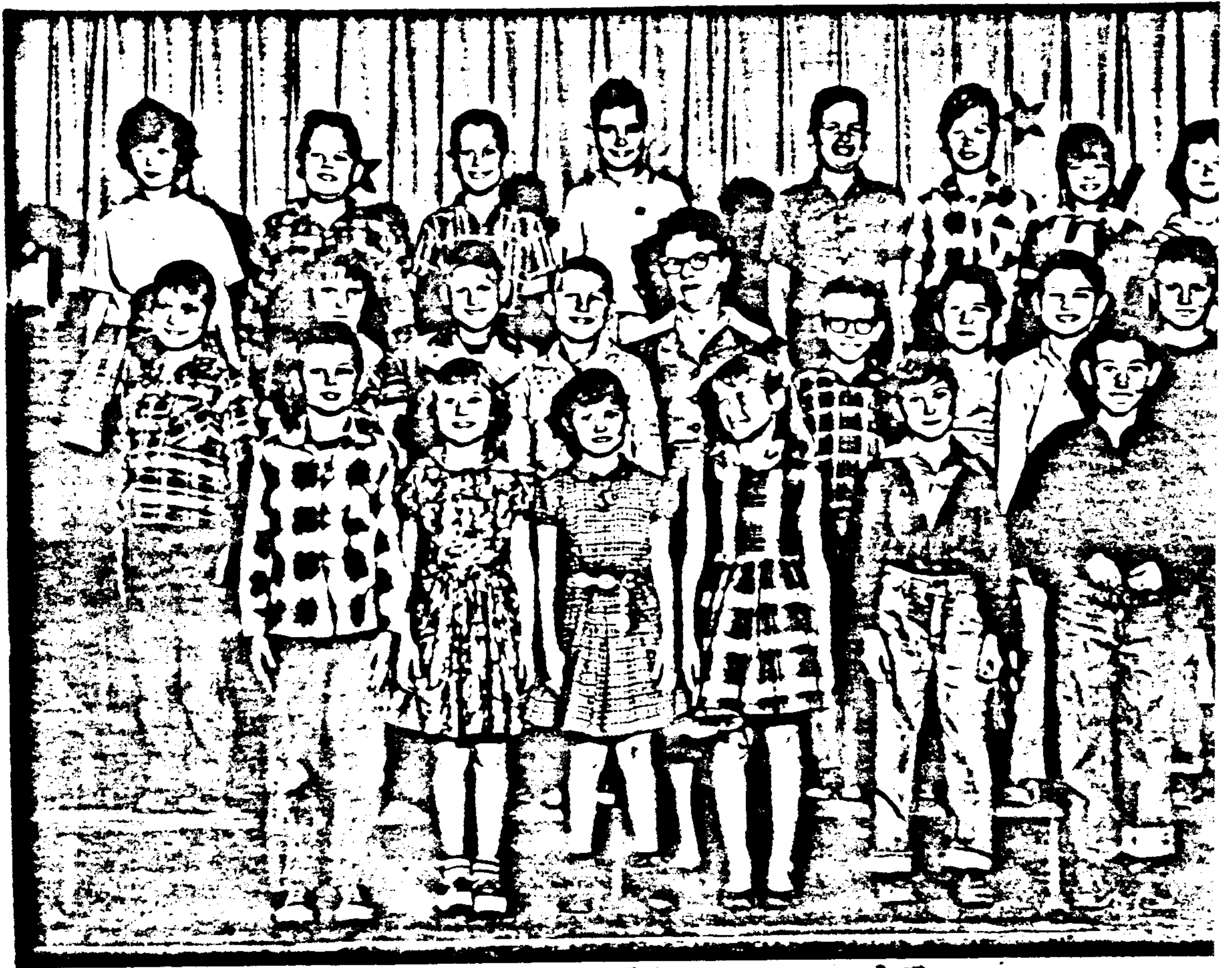
