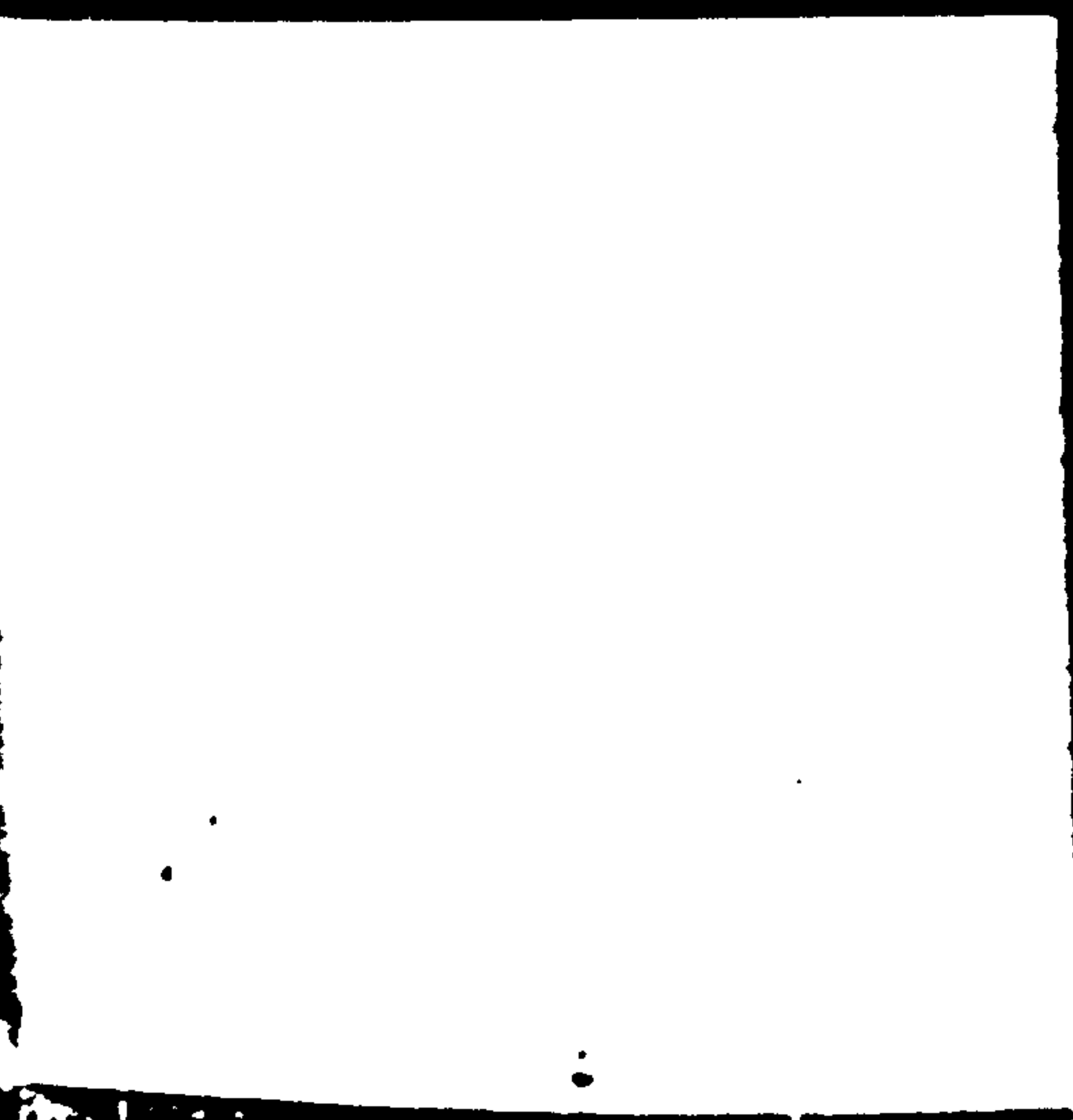
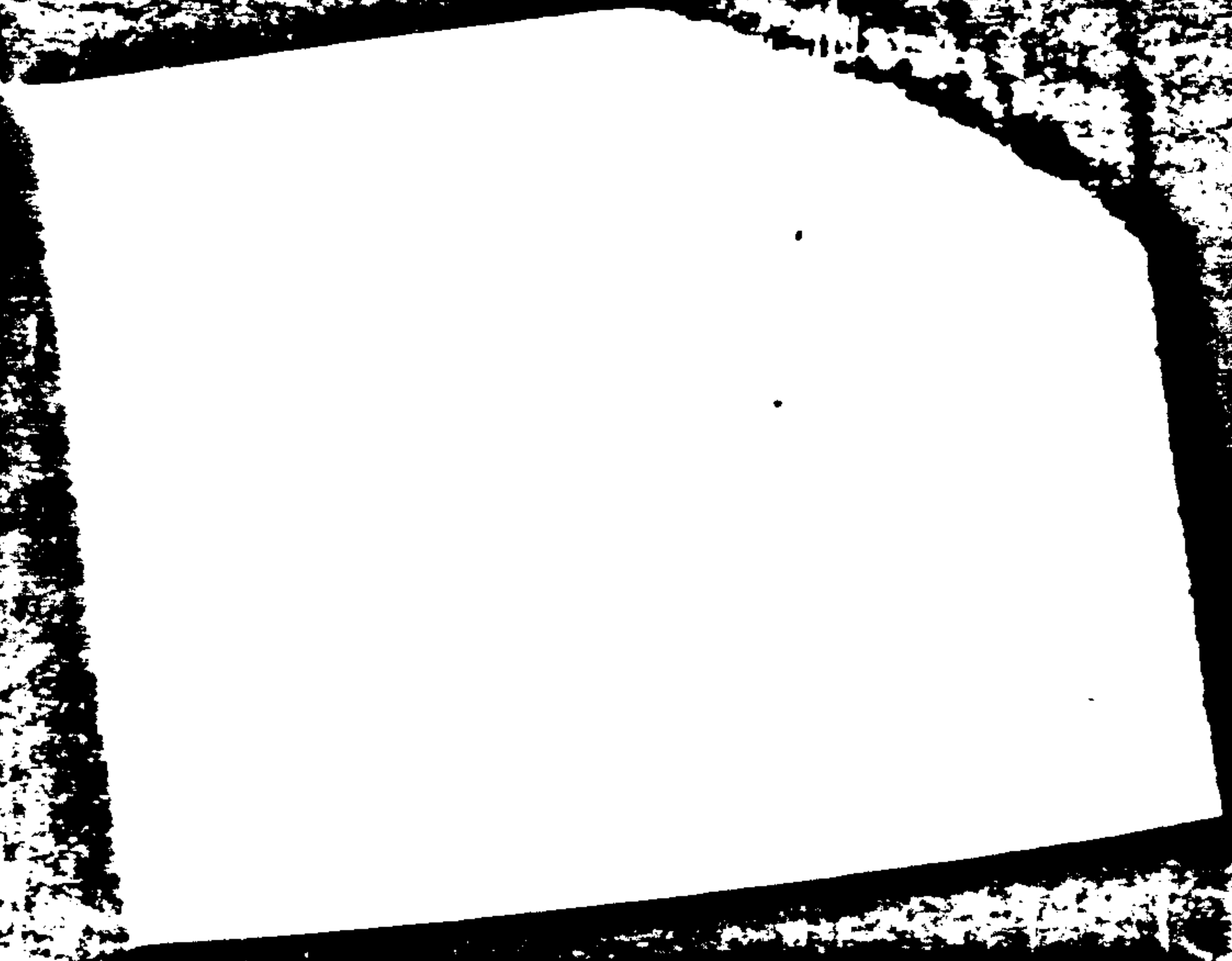

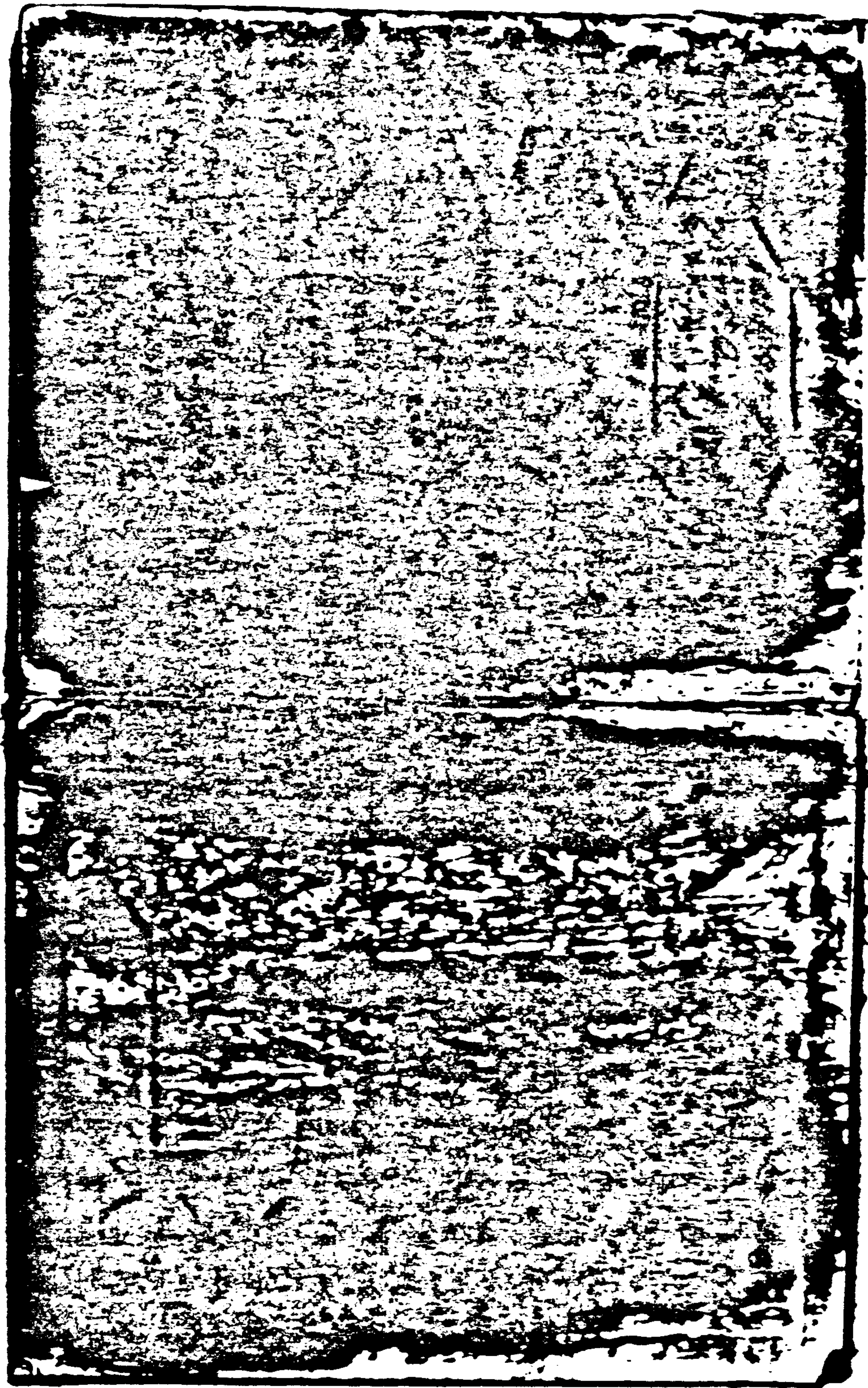

У КАРТЫ СССР 1980 ГОДА

Беседа с членом коллегии Государственного научно-исследовательского совета Совета Министров СССР А. С. ПАВЛЕНКО

ВОПРОС: Огромная, почти неизвестная цифра названа в Программе КПСС, утвержденной на XXII съезде партии 2700—3000 млрд. квт электроэнергии должны быть выработаны в СССР в 1980 году. Как представить себе, как осмыслить такую цифру?

ОТВЕТ: Конечно, согласен. Но морального тут ничего нет. Наши планы — в ГОЗПРО, в первый пятилетний, в второй, в третий, и, наконец, вот теперь семилетний план, — когда не опубликовывали планы, многие назвали фантастическими.

Полно, как был встречен проект плана первой пятилетки на V Всесоюзном съезде Советов. На этом съезде я был депутатом от Артемовского округа Донбасса. Доклад делал Г. М. Кривжановский. Мы сидели в зале Большого театра, а на сцене Кривжановский иллюстрировал свой доклад электрифицированной сценой. На громадном поле, изображавшем территорию Советского государства, лишь кое-где горели несколько белых лампочек — действующие электростанции и промышленные предприятия.

«А вот что будет к концу пятилетки, — сказал Глеб Максимович, и вдруг вспыхнула масса красных точек, широко разбросанных по карте нашей страны. Над озвученной непорядочнейшей волнами. Все вскочили с мест, в зале громадный потопился возглас. В едином порыве мы закричали: «И-

тернативная. Да и в самом деле, как не удивляться, что не радоваться было такому скачку с 5 млрд. квт электроэнергии, которые мы выработали, когда проходил съезд, до 22 млрд. квт к концу первой пятилетки. Нетрудно понять наше воодушевление — ведь еще незадолго до этого, в 1920 году, в стране было произведено всего 0,5 млрд. квт электроэнергии. А теперь! В 1961 году в СССР выработано около 130 млрд. квт. Не нам надо совершить новый бросок в будущее, в коммунизм. Необходимо достигнуть производства 2700—3000 млрд. квт электроэнергии. Это в самом деле колоссальные цифры! Все электростанции Земли выработали в 1960 году 2100 млрд. квт, то есть почти на треть меньше. Широкое использование электроэнергии во всех отраслях народного хозяйства, по расчетам специалистов, позволит в 1980 году заменить 5000 миллиардов часов живого человеческого труда.

Вот как можно приблизительно представить себе величину цифр, названных в Программе КПСС, в которой вы говорите.

ВОПРОС: Но как добиться такой выработки электроэнергии? Очень хотелось бы взглянуть на карту выработки СССР 1980 года.

ОТВЕТ: Такая карта уже существует. Вот она, взгляните. По всей стране раскинулась гигантская сеть новых электростанций.

Four Indicted in Test Of Cuba Travel Ban

The federal grand jury in Brooklyn which for a month has been investigating the recent trip to Cuba by 36 American students, handed down four indictments on Sept. 27. The charges are "conspiring to recruit and arrange for the trip."

The announcement of the indictment was made in Washington by Attorney General Robert Kennedy and by the federal prosecutor's office in Brooklyn.

Three of those indicted — Levi Laub, 24, Phillip Abbott Luce, 26, and Stefan Marshall, 24, had gone on the trip to Cuba. The fourth defendant, Anatole Schmeier, 28, did not go.

Two others, Salvatore Carchiarli, 19, and Ellen Irene Shallit, 28, were named as co-conspirators but were not indicted.

The indictment alleged 31 overt acts of conspiracy, such as organizing a committee to promote the trip, meetings in New York and Buffalo, distribution of application forms, etc.

There is no law forbidding travel to Cuba, merely a State Department edict. Thus the prosecution had to base the indictment on the supposed existence of a

Civil Rights Forces Seek New Ways to Press Fight

OCT 3 — A serious crisis among civil-rights leaders has developed and a great debate has opened in the movement since the Birmingham murders of Negro children. The Birmingham events, and the Kennedy administration's inaction in the face of them, have made it apparent that the movement led by Martin Luther King, Jr. has reached a blind alley and a search is on for new roads.

The debate involves the questions of non-violence versus self-defense, political action, the approach to Congress and Kennedy's civil-rights bill, and tactics of civil disobedience.

The doctrine of non-violence under all circumstances is now being widely challenged even by church leaders. For example, Bishop C. Eubank Tucker, of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church declared in Louisville that the Birmingham events have shattered the hope that law and order would be maintained in the Deep South in the face of integration moves and asked:

THE SUPREME COURT'S reversal of the conviction of 973 Negro students arrested at a demonstration in Orangeburg, S. C., three years ago, strikes a blow against the use of state "breach of the peace" statutes against civil rights demonstrations.

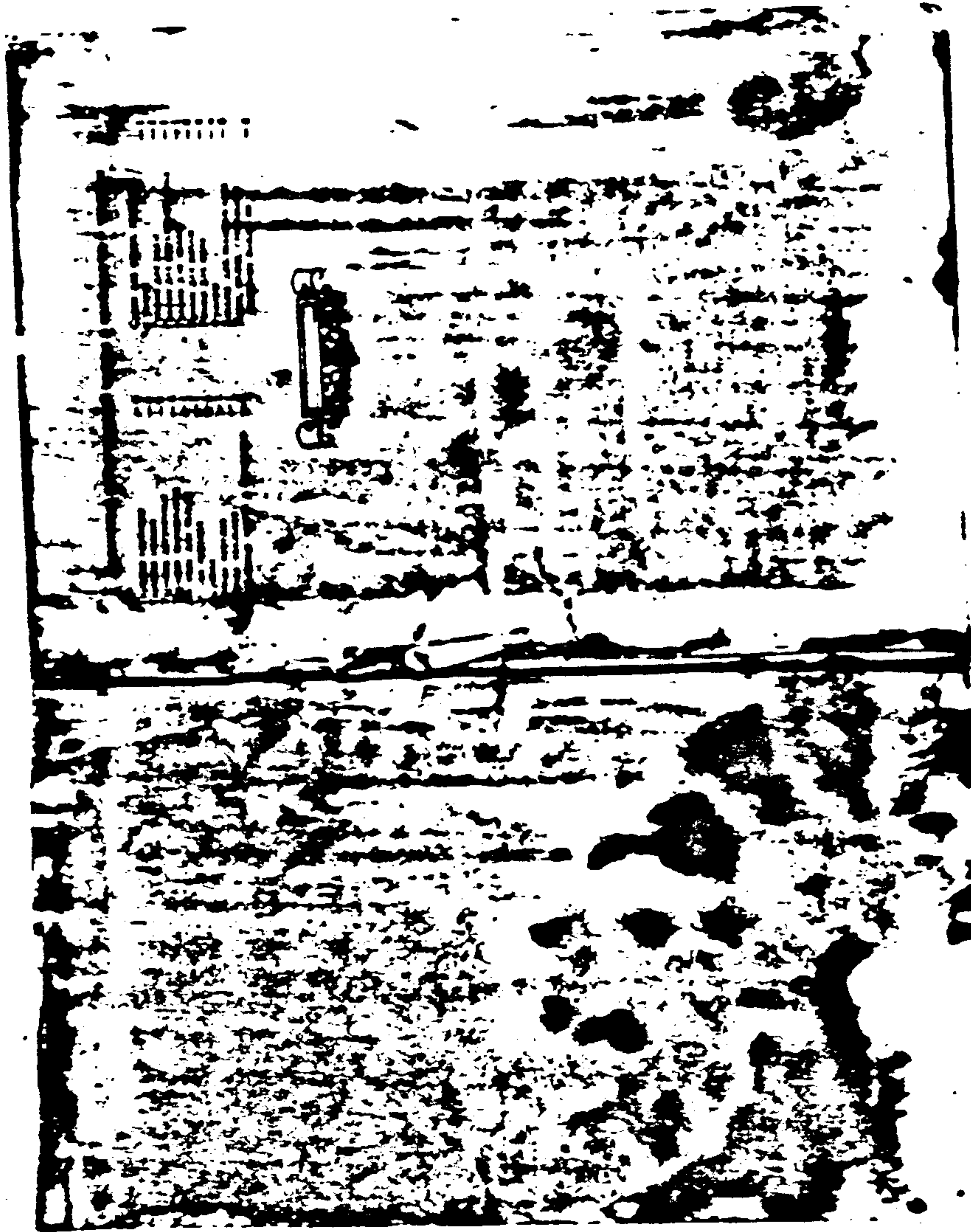

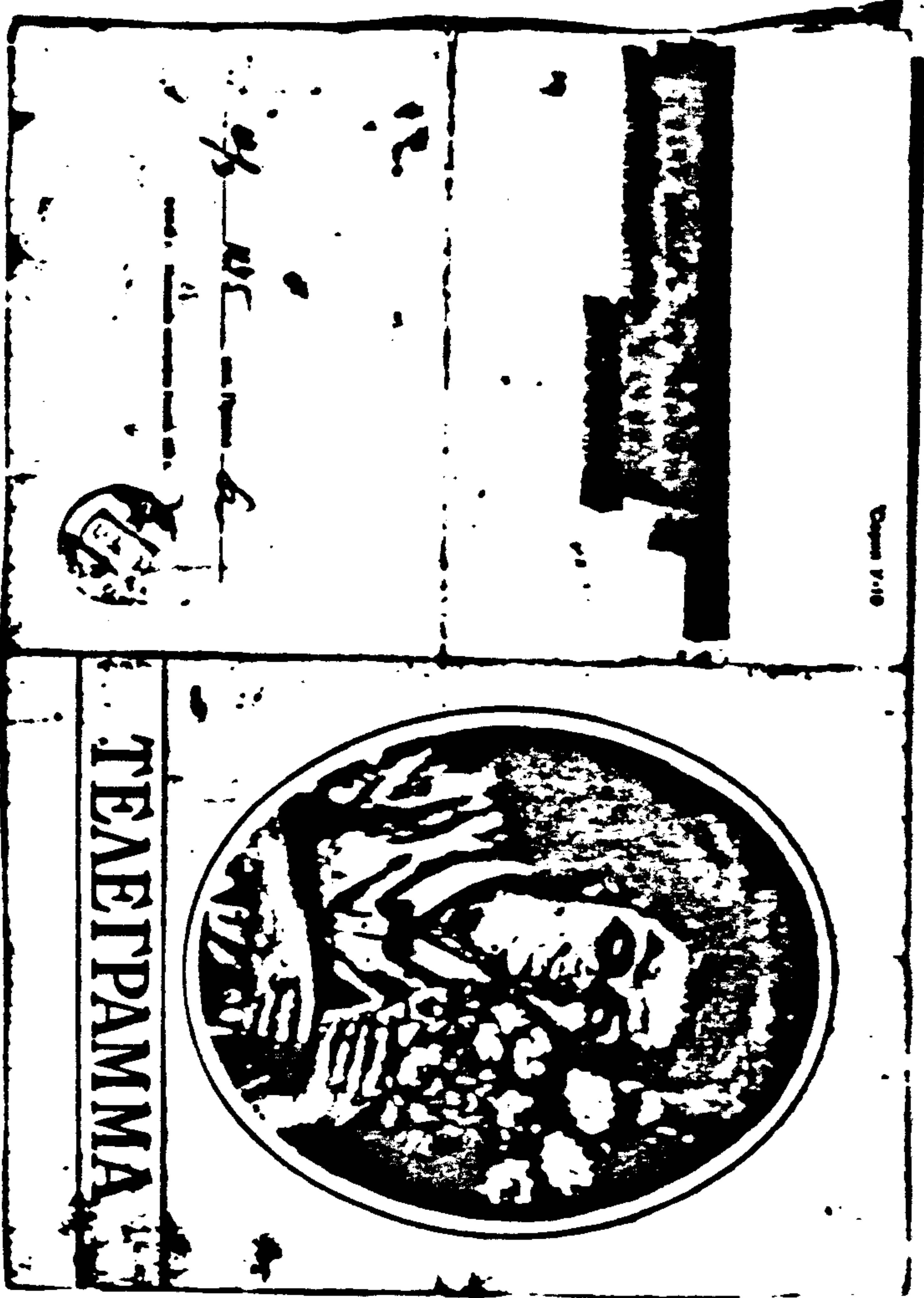

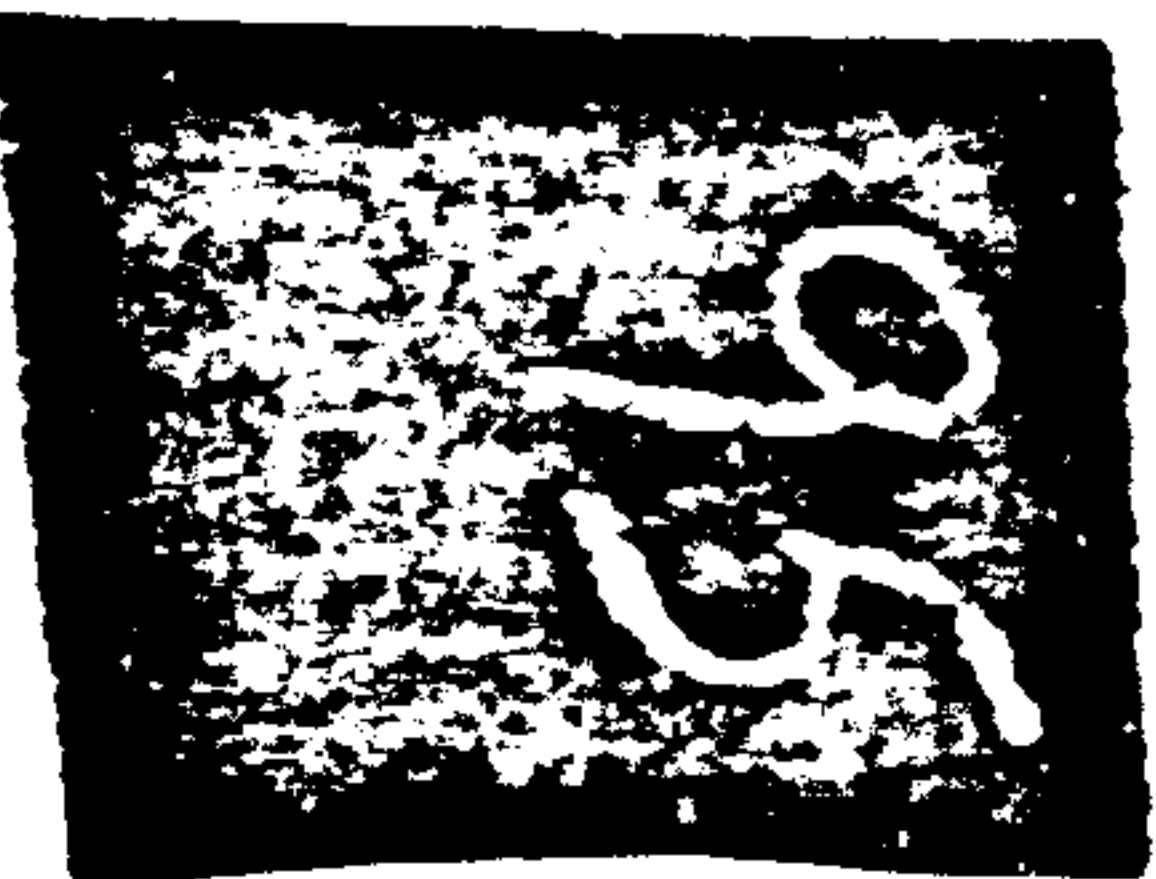
