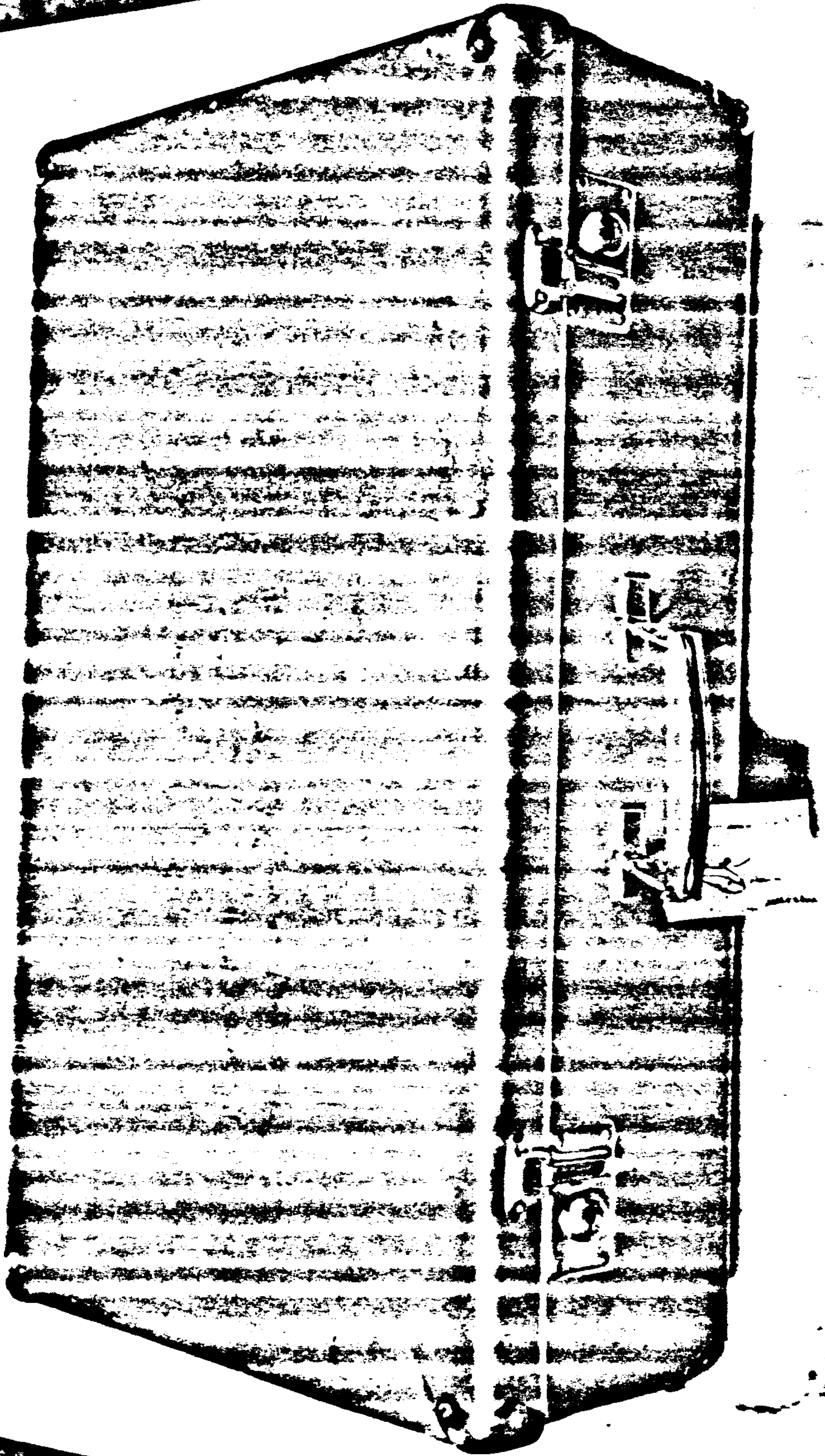
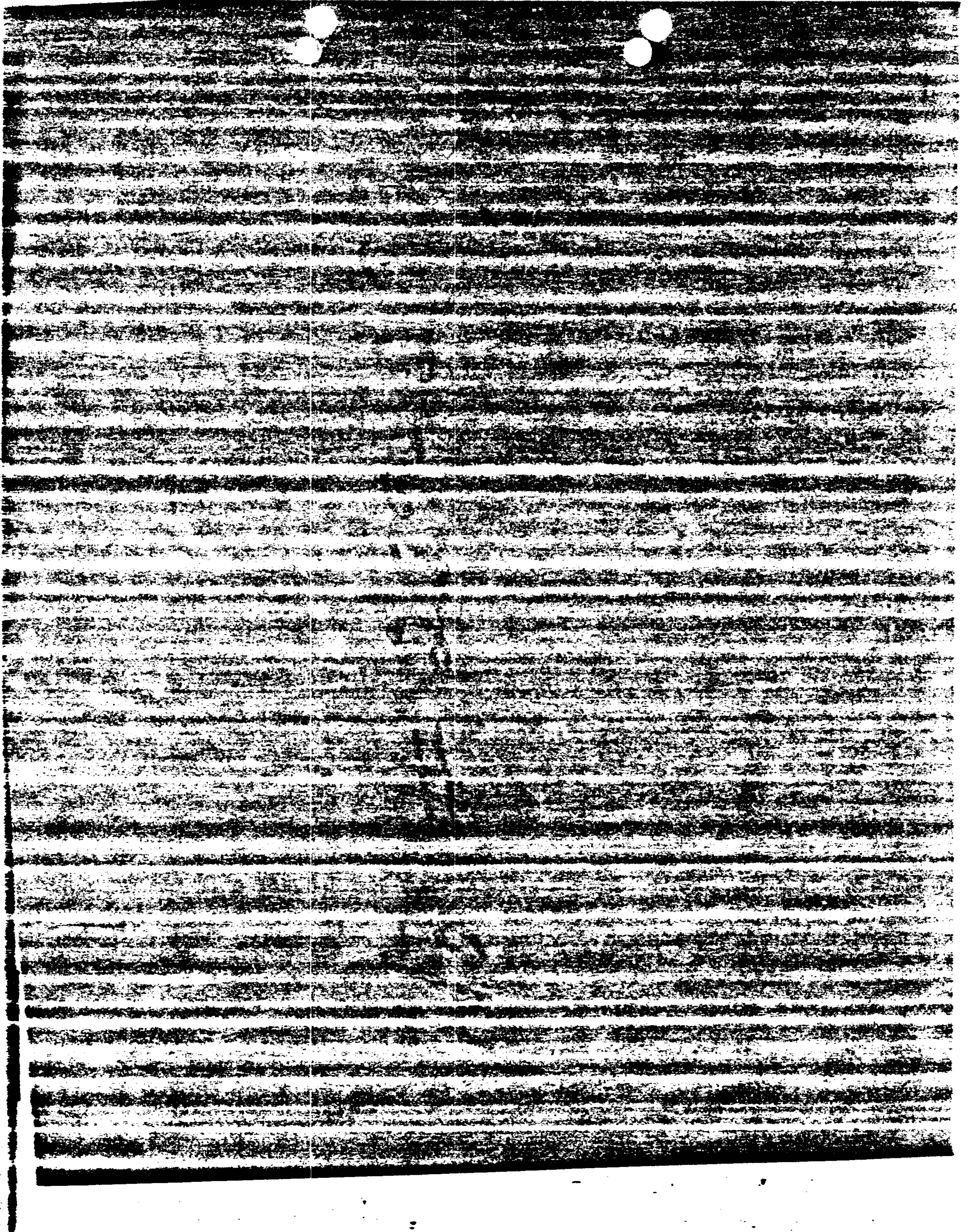


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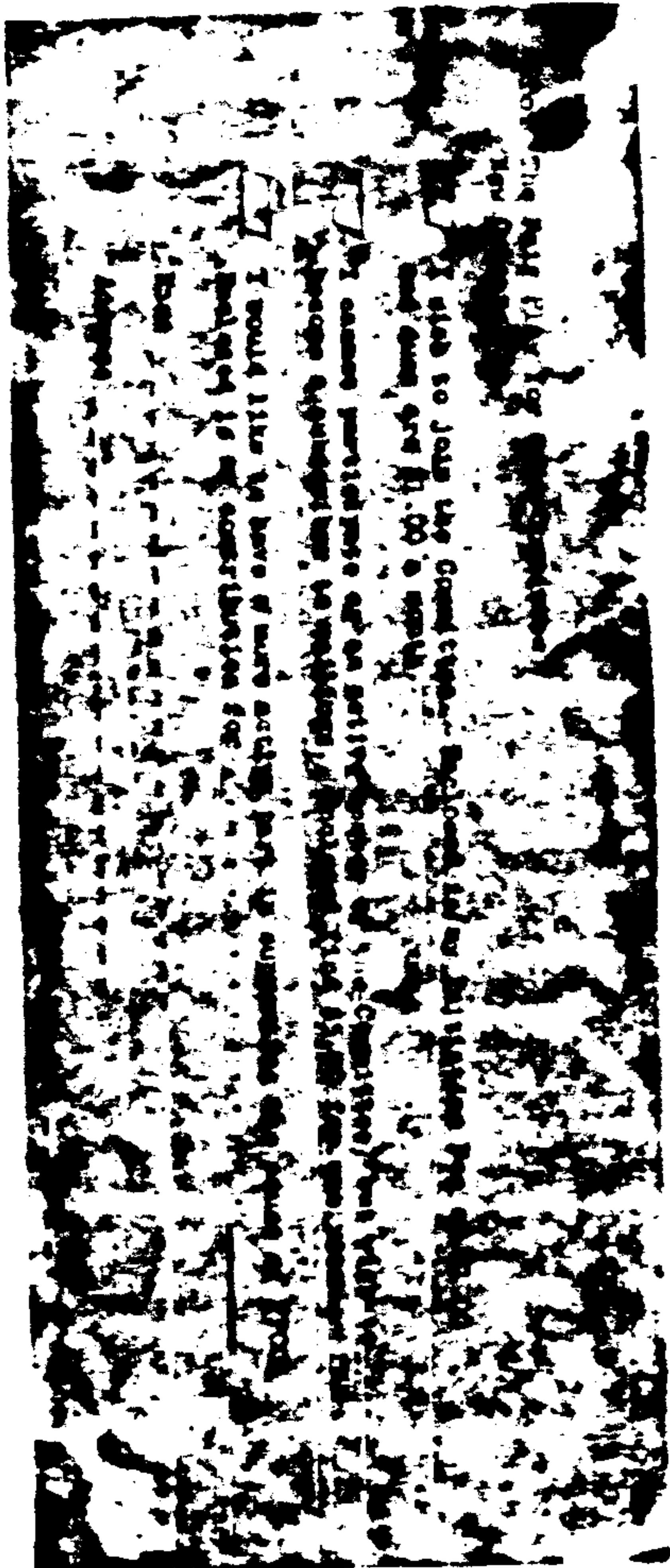
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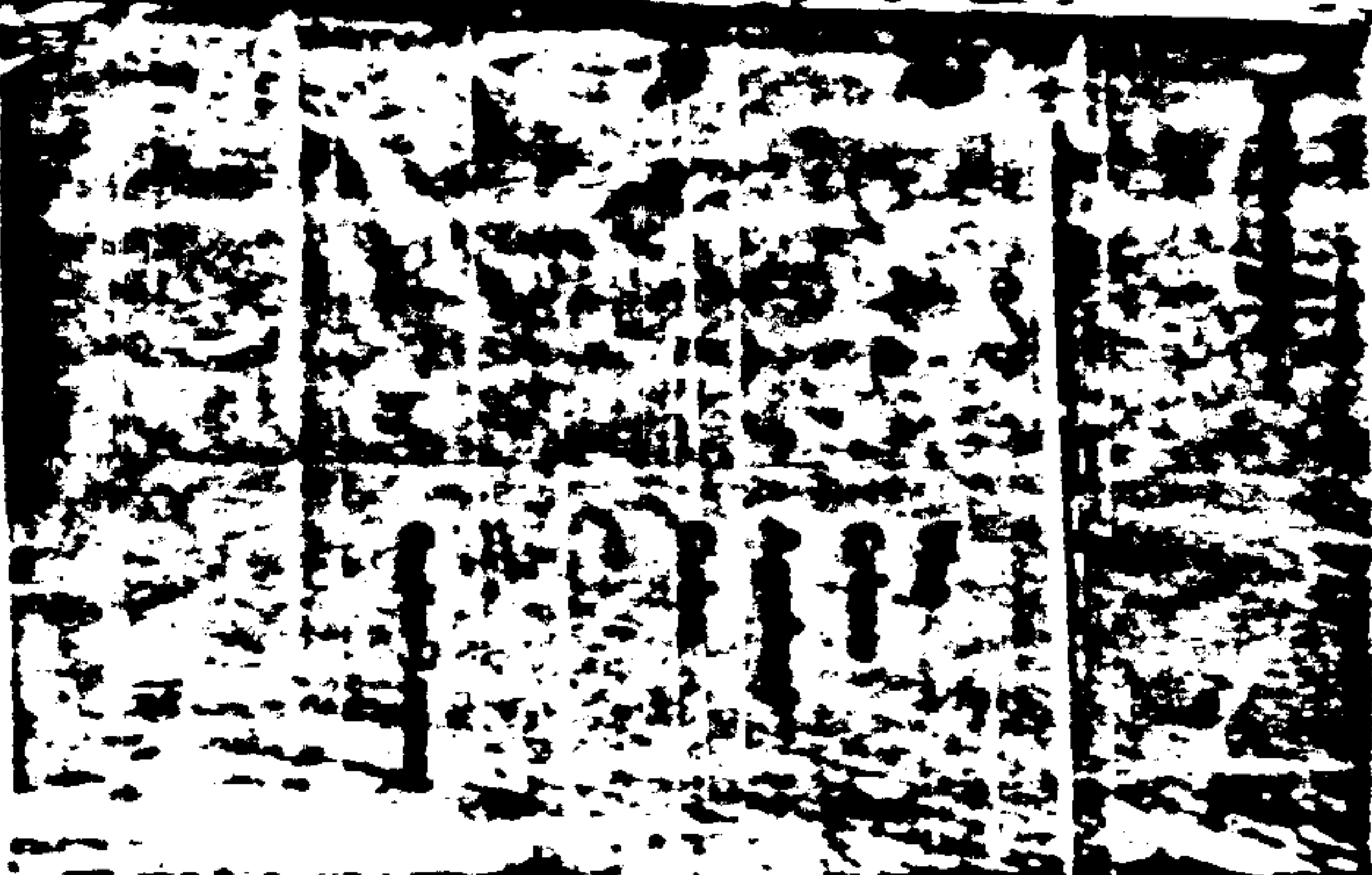
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AMERICAN TIES

Walter Lippmann, dean of American columnists, has referred to the Kennedy Administration's support of the anti-Castro military venture in Cuba as an appalling and colossal mistake. But the abortive April invasion was worse than that. It was an outright crime against the Cuban people, and it was also a crime against the American people, against the United Nations and against world peace.

President Eisenhower might share the responsibility with President Kennedy for this enterprise in international immorality. As columnist William V. Shannon said in the New York Post of April 9, 1961: "Back in late 1954, the Eisenhower Administration decided to apply to Cuba the 'strategic treatment.' That is, the National Security Council gave CIA Director Dulles the go-ahead to organize the Cuban exile, train a military force and plan an invasion of Cuba."

In 1954 Eisenhower's team of the hush-hat Allen Dulles and John Edgar Hoover, Secretary of State, organized the overthrow of the progressive Government, supported by President Arthur. This was accomplished through covert U. S. subsidy and other aid to the anti-revolutionary forces.

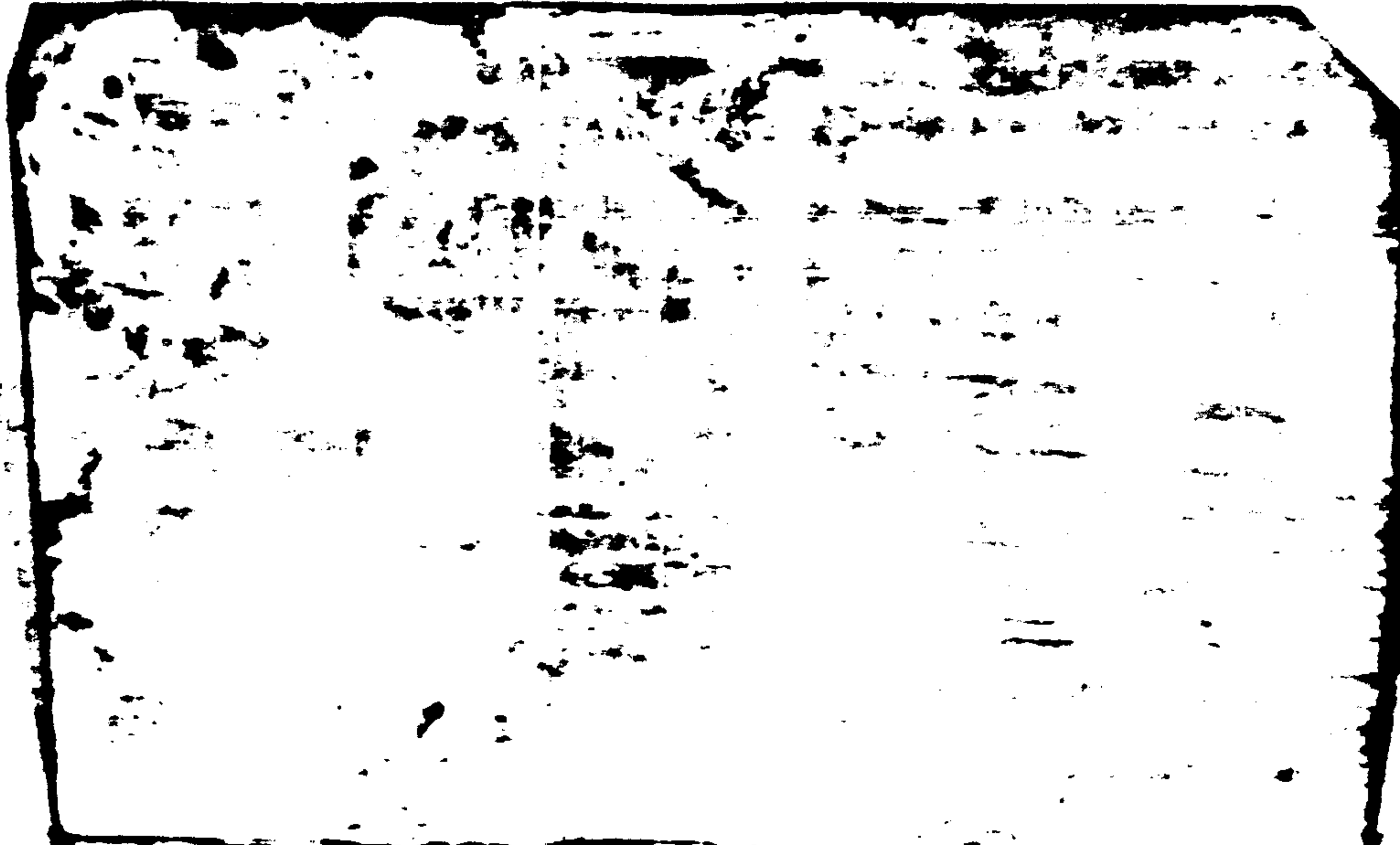
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Read and Appreciate for Cuba

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The world after economic security - the American and the Soviet. During World War II and for a few years after, the American mind appeared more attractive to the colonial peoples. ...

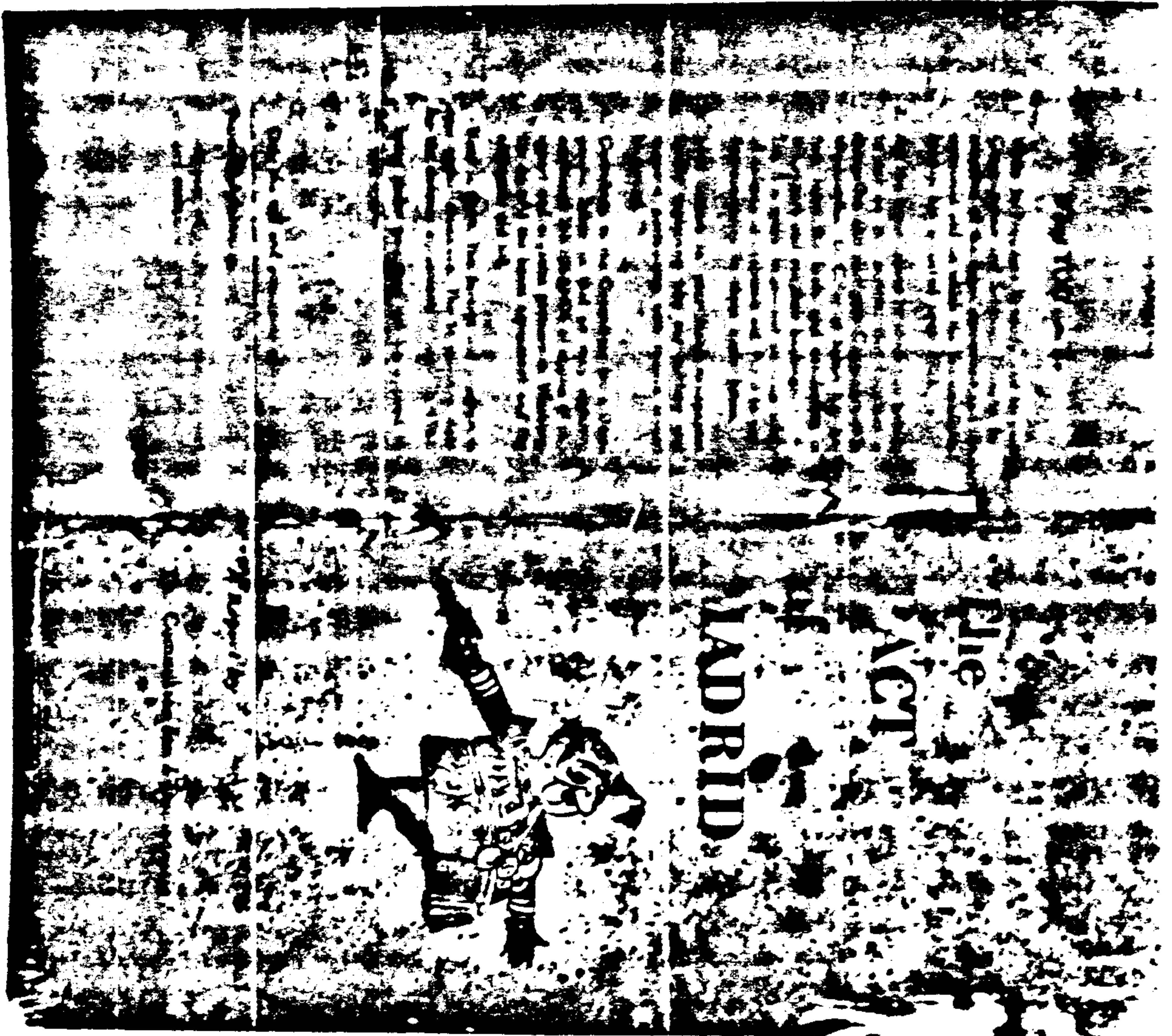

И мне вспоминается, что еще раньше я не была столько рада ни себе.

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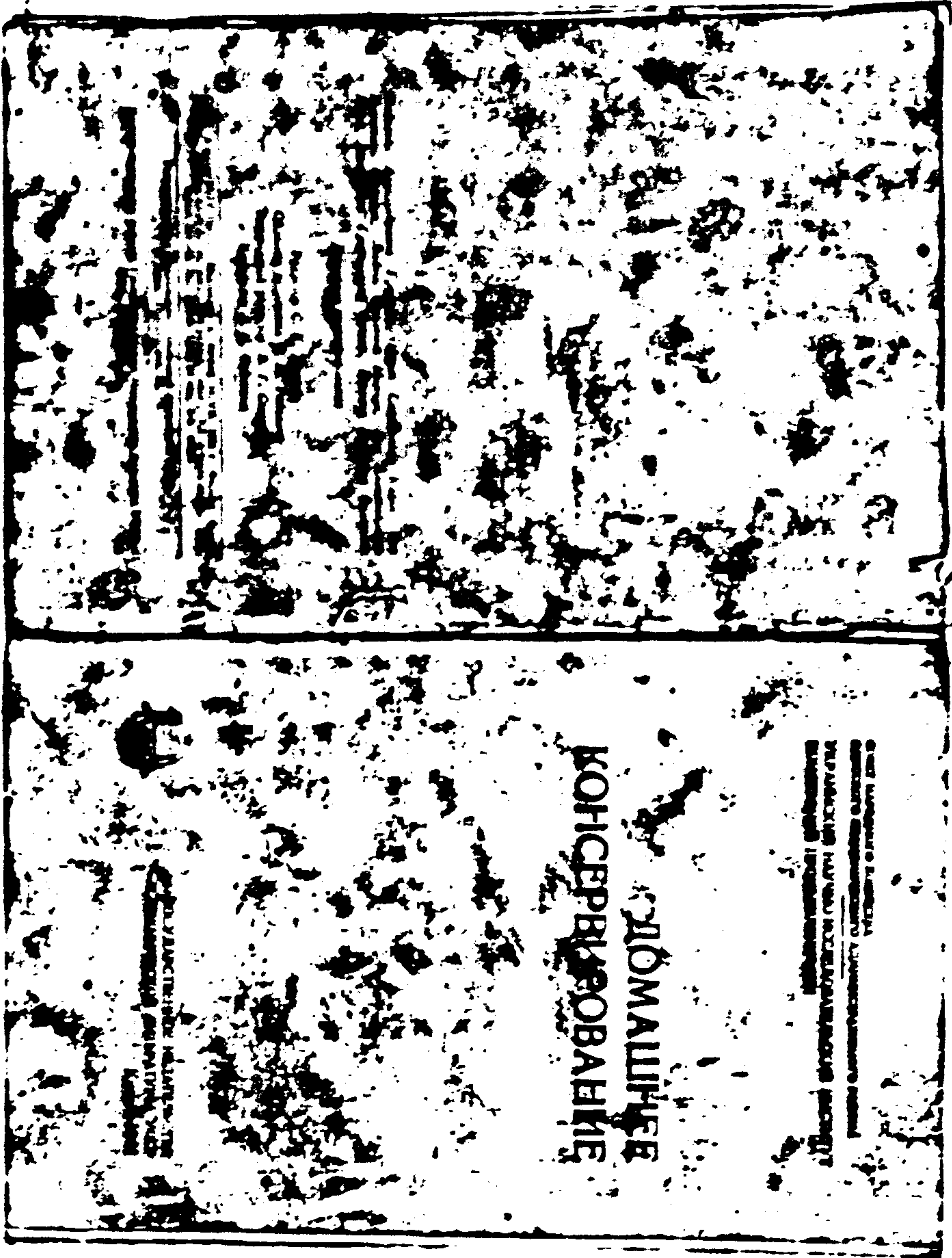
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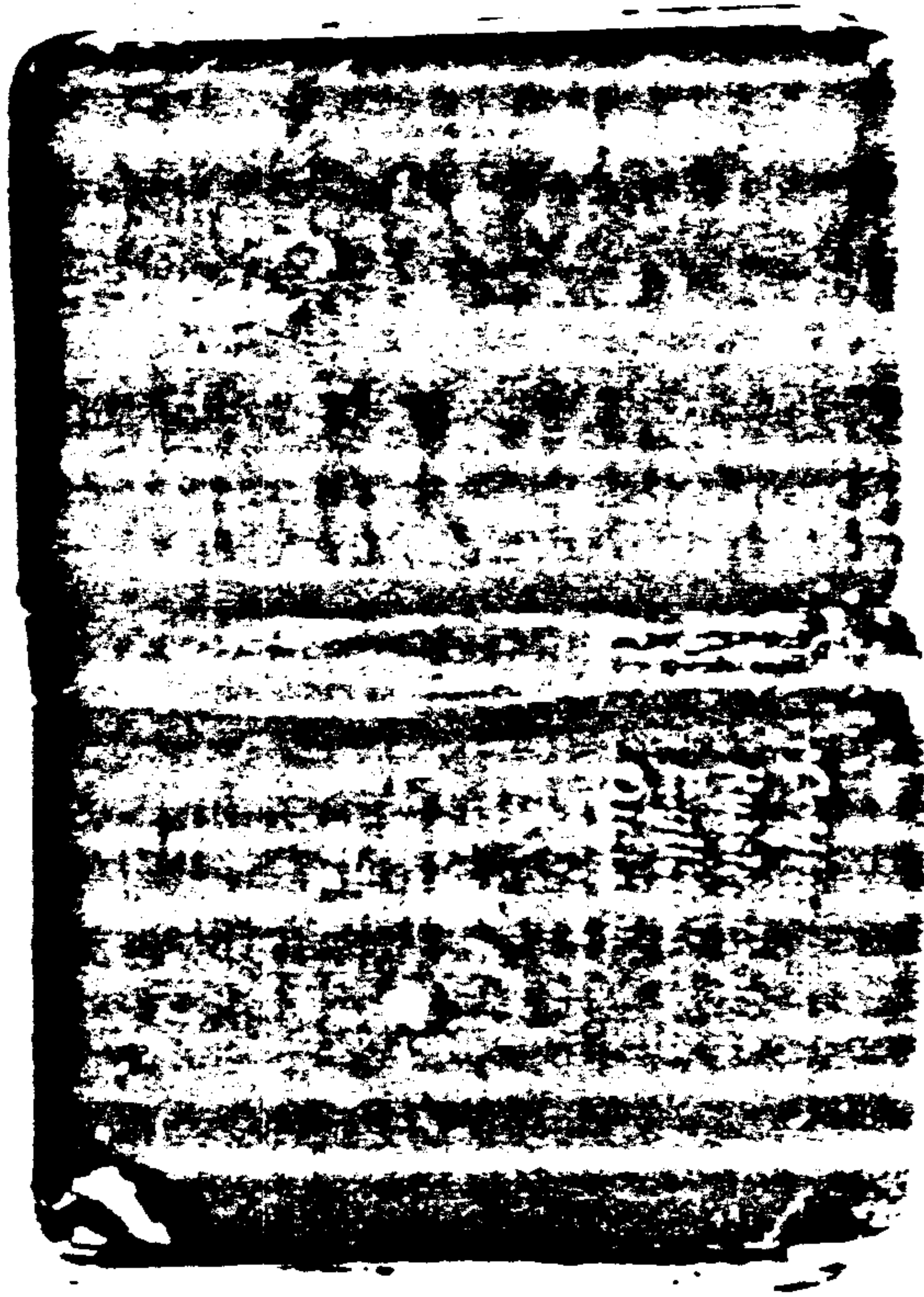
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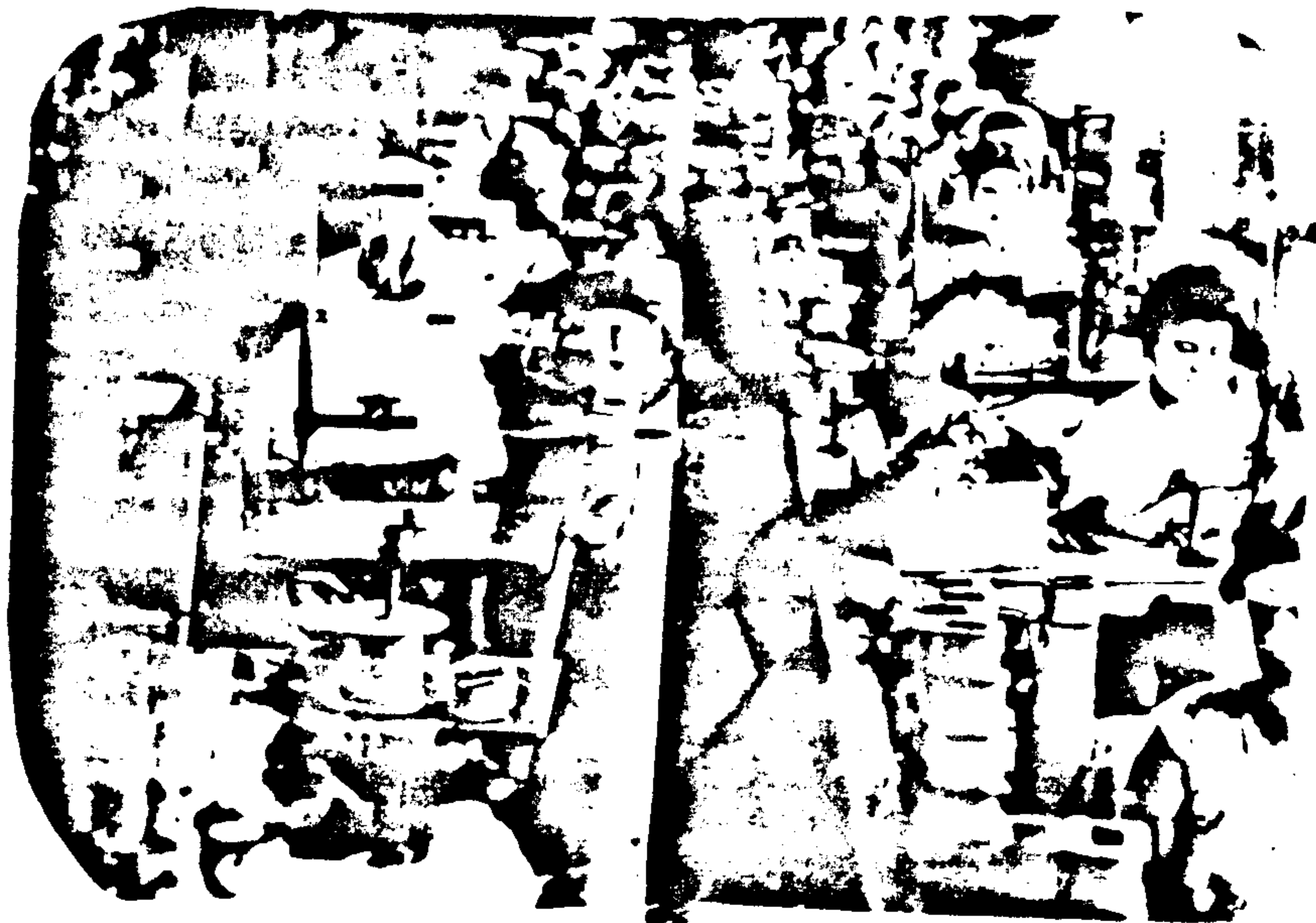
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
