

Inspector James R. Malley referred to an item in the Dallas Times Herald dated December 6, 1963, wherein reference is made to OSWALD, the accused assassin, practicing thoroughly with a 6.5 Italian carbine. The article continued: "The mail order house which sold Oswald the rifle also sold boxes of 108 rounds of 6.5 ammunition for about \$7. It also sold four-power telescopic sights that could be fitted to the rifle. However, in disclosing Oswald bought the rifle from the firm, investigators omitted reference to the scope and ammunition."

Inspector Malley anticipates questions will be asked concerning the possible purchase of ammunition by OSWALD from the same mail order house from which the rifle was purchased.

Accordingly, a check should be made of our files and a memorandum prepared, attention Inspector Malley, with reference to any ammunition purchased by OSWALD.

Investigation at Chicago has established that the 6.5 millimeter Mannlicher-Carcano rifle, Serial No. C-2766, was purchased from Klein's Sporting Goods, Incorporated, 4540 West Madison St., Chicago, Illinois, and that it was shipped to OSWALD's Post Office Box in Dallas, Texas by parcel post, "not broken down with the bolt and scope intact." It has been further reported by the Chicago Office that "The scope would have been wrapped in corrugated paper and then brown wrapping paper or newspaper would be used in wrapping to prevent shifting within the carton."

Investigation at Chicago does not specifically indicate that inquiry was made at Klein's Sporting Goods to determine if OSWALD under any of his known aliases ordered any ammunition for this rifle.

Investigation by the Los Angeles Office has established that the Smith and Wesson .38 caliber revolver, Serial No. V 510210, used by OSWALD in killing Dallas Police Officer J. D. TIPPIT, was purchased from the George Rose and Company, Inc., 1225 South Grand Ave., Los Angeles, California. Inquiry at this company in connection with the purchase of this revolver indicated that written in ink on the order form for the revolver, was an order for one box of ammunition and one holster, but that a line was drawn through these items cancelling that portion of the order.

OSWALD appeared at the American Embassy on July 8, 1961, according to State Department records at which time he told of his marriage on April 30, 1961, and said he was arranging for his wife to join him in Moscow for a visa interview.

MARINA said in interview of December 2, 1963, she and OSWALD had flown together to Moscow in the late summer of 1961 for the purpose of interviews at the American Embassy.

- Q: Can she fix the date better?
- Q: From State Department records it appears OSWALD was at Moscow alone on July 8, 1961, when he was interviewed at the American Embassy yet MARINA says they went together in the late summer Clarify this point.
- Q: Did OSWALD go to Moscow alone one time to make such arrangements? Did she join him in Moscow or did they go together on another occasion?

The American Embassy at Moscow received a letter on March 20, 1961, which was postmarked at Minsk on March 5, 1961, and postmarked Moscow March 17, 1963, in which he stated it was inconvenient for him to come to Moscow for the sole purpose of an interview.

The Embassy received a letter postmarked at Minsk on May 16, 1981, in which he said he was married to a Russian woman who would accompany him to the United States and that he desired full guarantees of no prosecution in the United States. The American Embassy furnished to the State Department on October 12, 1961, text of four letters detailing OSWALD's difficulties in obtaining exit visas for himself and wife and noting they were subjected to increasing harassment in Minsk. He requested the Embassy make official inquiry of Russian authorities concerning these exit visa requests. - Q: Did he own a rifle there and was he a member of a rifle club? If so, how often did he attend?
- Q: Does she believe OSWALD was given an assignment in the United States as a condition to leave the USSR?
- As apartments are scarce in Russia, does she believe he obtained one so easily? Why does she believe he obtained one so easily?
- Was MARINA permitted to leave Russia on the condition that she and OSWALD would accept assignments in the United States?
- Does she know whether OSWALD was in direct or indirect contact with the Soviet Embassy?
- Q: Did OSWALD know how to operate a short wave radio or did he have such equipment in Russia or United States?
- Q: Did OSWALD have any other unusual equipment in Russia or United States such as secret ink, etc.?

In the material received from the FBI Laboratory which is copies of correspondence found at the PAINE house there is a letter from PAVEL GOLOVACHOV, 11 Zakharov Street, Apartment 72, Minsk, written to MARINA on September 29, 1933. It appears that MARINA and PAVEL GOLOVACHOV are quite close friends.

MARINA has mentioned PAVEL before as a friend of OSWALD.

Question her more closely concerning this relationship between Q: herself and OSWALD and PAVEL GOLOVACHOV.

On 12/5/63, Privers License Division, Texas Department of Public Safety, Austin, Texas, advised telephonically that JERRY ANDREN McFADDEN holds Texas operator's license No. 4898798 and on 2/11/63 gave his address as 8603 Old Homestead, Dullas, Texas.

On 12/6/63, Mrs. MARY WALL, 8609 Old Homestead, advised that the McFADDEN family resides at 8911 Cardella Street.

On 12/6/63, BILL McFADDEN, 8911 Cardella, advised that JERRY McFADDEN is his hephew and resides with CLIFF McFADDEN, 12004 Echo Drive, Mcsquite. BILL McFADDEN said he had no knowledge of any acquaintanceship between JERRY McFADDEN and LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

On 12/6/63, JERRY ANDREW McFADDEN, Mesquite, advised he was in Miami, Florida, on 11/30/63 in an effort to get his wife to return to Dallas with him. He stated that he did sell a gun to the Tamiami Gun Shop, Miami, Florida, on or about 11/30/63 and he recalls that the operator of this gun shop asked him, McFADDEN, if he, McFADDEN, knew OSWALD or RUBY. According to McFADDEN,

he did not tell the gun shop operator that he, JERRY McFADDEN, knew either OSWALD or RUBY. He admitted that it is altogether possible that during the conversation he may have left the impression with the gun shop operator that he knew OSWALD or RUBY.

Photographs of OSWALD and RUBY were exhibited to McFADDEN, and he stated that he did not know cither OSWALD or RUEY.

On 12/9/63, DONALD CARROLL, attorney, Tyler, Texas, telephone LY 2-7351, was telephonically contacted in an effort to obtain the present address of RAMON BUENOSTRO CORTEZ, whom CARROLL had previously represented in a trial at Dallas involving an impersonation violation.

Mr. CARROLL was advised this office was interested in contacting CORTEZ in connection with the assassination of President KENNEDY, but no further details were furnished to him.

CARROLL stated he was sure he could determine the present location of CORTEZ; however, it may take a day or two to do so. He stated either he or CORTEZ would then telephonically contact the Dallas Office.

He stated in conclusion that he preferred no matter not related to the assassination be discussed with CORTEZ, as he is presently representing CORTEZ in another matter involving the Federal Government.

Jail and had learned that subject DAVID LOUIS GOLDREYER had been removed from Memphis, Tennessee and had arrived at the Dallas County Jail at approximately 5:30 AM, Dec. 7th. The Deputy Marshals from Memphis who brought GOLDREYER to Dallas advised JOHN E. LOWELL, Deputy Marshal to the effect that GOLDREYER had received a telegram from OSWALD and had such a telegram in his possession when arrested in Memphis. SA LISH stated he had been unable to obtain any information indicating that anyone had seen such a telegram.

The report of SA PAUL N. CONRAD, Memphis, dated 12/4/63 reflects that GOLDREYER when interviewed by Agents of the Memphis Office, stated that while he was en route by plane from Dallas, Texas to Memphis, Tenn., he met a news reporter who asked him if he, GORDREYER, would send the following telegram, since he would be getting off the plane at Memphis:

"To Mr. BURT RHEINHARDT, United Press, Statler-Hilton Hotel, Dallas, Texas. Suggest obtaining telescopic rifle sights housing on a cross hair zooming a spot where tragedly took place. Perhaps you can use convertible and simulate incident. Fifth will help doorman. Local sports shop Cullum and Boron may rent you outfit. Director of Public Safety or Mayor should clear for entry, signed Fred and Jack. Sender United Press, Washington."

GOLDREYER advised that he did send this telegram from Memphis for the news reporter.

In view of the allegation that GOLDREYER allegedly had something in his possession that was from OSWALD, the Memphis Offico was called.

that there was no foundation to this comment of any kind; that the true facts are as set forth in the report of SA PAUL N. CONRAD. He stated, however, that he had talked to the Deputy Marshals who had brought subject GOLDREYER to Dallas, and that one of the Marshals admitted having made the statement that he thought perhaps the reason GOLDREYER had been returned to Dallas so quickly was because he was connected in some way with OSWALD. He denied, however, making the Deputy Harshal at Memphis deny having made a statement that GOLDREYER had a telegram from OSWALD.

DISSLY stated that the individuals in Memphis seemed to be somewhat upset over the fact that they were questioned and he wouldn't be at all surprised if the statement as quoted in the Dallas area was actually made.

SAC SHANKLIN telephonically contacted JOHN E. LOWELL and advised him concerning the above statements and the fact that it was understood GOLDREYER was being held in maximum ct'stody of the Dallas County Sheriff, and that this was being passed on to him for his information inasmuch as there was no foundation to this story that GOLDREYER had received a telegram from OSWALD.

I furnished the same information to ROBERT I. MASH, U. S. Marshal, and the Marshal assured me GOLDREYER would be treated now as any other prisoner.
