For assistance in conducting extensive investigation at Dallas, a complete review of all references on DUFF has been made. The following individuals have been interviewed on the dates indicated in an effort to locate DUFF who allegedly was seen with OSWALD 7 or 8 months ago on one occasion.

On 12-10-63, JOE LORIA, 4230 Oak Lane, furnished original allegation that he saw DUFF, who he knew as "SCOTTY", with OSWALD. (page 299, Dallas report 12-23-63)

On 12-10-63, Mrs. LEE WHITLEY, 1346 Classen Drive, telephone FL. 2-4735, was interviewed re her daughter having been engaged to DUFF. (page 300, Dallas report 12-23-63)

Done 1/10/64
Dallas files reflect that in January, 1963, information was received that DUFF had met and married FRANCES BERNARD, 5201 Willis, Dallas; they married three weeks after having met on a bus in Los Angeles. The marriage was annulled after she allegedly called DUFF's brother at 7614 East Glendon Way, Alhambra, California. (page 308, Dallas report 12-23-63)

Done 1/10/64
On 12-11-63, Lt. ELMO CUNNINGHAM, Dallas PD, advised his file on DUFF reflected DUFF had been given polygraph examination in connection with assault on General WALKER, and had been absolved. Lt. CUNNINGHAM stated he had contacted FRANCES BERNARD who he had previously interviewed and she had no information re DUFF. (page 308, Dallas report 12-23-63)

On 12-12-63, HERMAN GERRARD, -6214 La Vista, stated he had known DUFF but could furnish no information as to his whereabouts (page 305, Dallas report 12-23-63)

On 12-13-63, Mrs. FRANK MEIR, manager of apartment building, 5420 Lewis St., advised DUFF formerly resided that address. (page 302, Dallas report 12-23-63)

On 12-16-63, CHARLES HOLLOWAY, Apt. 123, 5420 Lewis St., Assistant Manager, Skillem Drug Store, 5400 East Grand Avenue, Dallas, stated he was formerly roommate of DUFF at that address and that DUFF left Dallas 7 or 8 weeks previous for Oklahoma City. (page 303, Dallas report 12-23-63)

On 12-17-63, Sergeant BRADY KELSEY, U. S. Army Recruiting Station, advised DUFF tried to enlist in Army 7-30-63 but was rejected for moral reasons on 8-16-63. (page 306, Dallas report 12-23-63).

1001 On 12-16 and 17-63, JUANITA BUCHANON, owner, El Dorado Lounge, 1010 North Haskell, advised she met DUFF while he was hanging around that bar 7 or 8 months ago. She identified ANDRE ANGELES (PH) and REID TIPPINS (PH) as individuals acquainted with DUFF, and stated ANGELES, who is using the alias DON MOON, was acquainted also with JACK RUBY. Mrs. BUCHANON furnished information indicating that ANGELES could be located at a telephone number in Washington, D. C. (page 304, Dallas report 12-23-63)

In Richmond report of SA ROLAND M. COCKRAN dated 12-20-63 (serial 2017), interview is reflected with DON ELAKE MOON, 426 Belleview Drive, Apt. 102, Falls Church, Virginia, who stated on 12-1-63 he had never heard of ANDRE ANGELES nor had he ever used such alias. He stated he had been attempting telephonically to contact REID RIPIN, not TIPPINS, a Dallas artist, through Mr. and Mrs. BUCHANON who operated the El Dorado Bar in Dallas, for the purpose of obtaining a commercial artist job in the Washington, D. C. area. MOON stated he was not

acquainted with OSWALD, RUBY or DUFF. He stated he had been in the Carousel Bar in Dallas and recalls seeing man identified to him as JACK RUBY, owner of the bar, in 1954, but has not seen since. (It should be noted that the Carousel Club was not in existence in 1954).

Page 442 of Dallas report of 12-10-63 reflects a review of the Dallas PD file on the shooting of WALKER. Captain O. A. JONES of the Dallas PD described DUFF as a pathological liar, and lazy. He stated DUFF was asked to leave the WALKER residence.

Page 99 of Dallas report 1-7-64 reflects investigation by Oklahoma City with negative results in effort to locate DUFF.

LEADS

1. Will contact Dallas PD for all information that would assist in locating DUFF including obtaining photograph.
2. Will contact Dallas County SO for all information that would assist in locating DUFF including obtaining photograph.
3. Locate and interview FRANCES BERNARD, 5201 Willis, re her knowledge of DUFF. It should be noted that Lieutenant CUNNINGHAM at the Dallas PD apparently knows where she can be located if not at the Willis address.
4. Will consider reinterviewing following individuals mentioned above in effort to locate DUFF:

JUANITA BUCHANON, El Dorado Lounge, 1010 North Haskell - She should be questioned closely as to the discrepancy in the information she furnished and that obtained from DON BLAKE MOON mentioned above. Efforts should be made to obtain from her the present location of a Dallas artist, REID PIPIN, in order that he may be interviewed concerning DUFF.

JEFF WOOSLEY, I.N.S. - Close liaison should be maintained with him inasmuch as all aliases are required to

report their current residence address during the month of January each year. Inquiries at 5420 Lewis St. and 5201 Willis St. should be considered in view of DUFF's former residence at those locations.

In the event DUFF is located, it should be borne in mind that Butte, Los Angeles and Oklahoma City are conducting investigation to locate him.

On 1/3/64, Mrs. A. C. JOHNSON, 1026 North Beckley, Dallas, Texas, WH 3-8993, LEE HARVEY OSWALD's former landlady, telephonically advised that one day last week she received a telephone call from an unidentified man wanting to know if DAVID MILLER lived at that address. She told this person MILLER did not live there. The caller said MILLER drove an old white station wagon and he understood that MILLER had lived there. Mrs. JOHNSON said she thought this was a bill collector trying to locate DAVID MILLER and paid no attention to the call.

She said about 10:30 PM, 1/2/64, she started receiving calls from a person who identified himself as DAVID MILLER and claimed he was a friend of OSWALD and that she had better not report him to the FBI. She stated she did not know DAVID MILLER and told this person that she did not know him and he replied "Oh, yes, you do know me and you'd better not report". She stated she received intermittent calls from this same person until 12:30 AM, 1/3/64, at which time she took the phone off the hook in order to get some rest.

She advised the person sounded intelligent and did not appear to her to be drinking. She advised that she and her husband got up early and went to their cafe and when they returned home at about 8 AM, 1/3/64, Mrs. EARLENE ROBERTS, who takes care of the rooming house for her told her she had received some five or six calls from a person identifying himself as DAVID MILLER.

Mrs. EARLENE ROBERTS, 1026 North Beckley, advised she received a call at 6:15 AM, from a man saying he was DAVID MILLER and this person talked in a loud whisper, asking her "how about meeting me in the alley, honey". She stated he did not ask her who she was but told her that he knew she was Mrs. JOHNSON's housekeeper. Mrs. ROBERTS stated she told this person

that she would not meet him in the alley and he replied "You'll be out there sometime today and I'll get all three of you". She stated that the same person called again about 6:35 AM, asking her "Aren't you going to meet me in the alley", and when she said no he replied "I will get you".

She stated there had been some four or five calls since the 6:35 AM call, all by the same person and all of the same general text.

She stated the Humble Service Station owner, located across the street from them, had also received calls from this same person.

On 1/3/64, JERRY DUNCAN, part owner, Humble Service Station, 1030 North Zangs, advised he received a call at about 10:20 PM, 1/2/64, from a person named MILLER. This person asked if the FBI had been talking to him and he replied that they had but not recently. This person told him, "I don't want you telling the FBI that I had anything to do with OSWALD". He told this person he did not know him and the caller replied, "Yes, you do, and you'd better not tell anyone you know me". According to DUNCAN, the caller said he was leaving town. He stated the man's voice sounded as though he was drunk and probably was an old man.

He advised that at about 9 AM, 1/3/64, this same person called him again and inquired as to who he had been talking with. DUNCAN stated he refused to answer, and the person said "Well, you had better not tell anyone anything about me". DUNCAN asked the caller to identify himself and the person refused. DUNCAN advised that on this call the caller appeared to be sober and his conversation was straightforward and fast.

The indices reflect DAVID LEON MILLER to be the husband of MILDRED MEHARG and there is a possibility that these calls were made by MARION MEHARG. Therefore, this information is being set forth in this file.

On 1-9-64, GARTH W. BALL, 110 Barnett, Dallas, Texas, an employee of Oak Cliff Cab Company, Dallas, Texas, advised that during the early morning of approximately 1-2 or 3-64, he went to the address of 1351 Galloway, Dallas, Texas, to pick up a customer. This customer, described as a white male, 35 - 40 years of age, tall and very thin, occupation - house painter, entered the cab and immediately stated: "Let's get this cab moving. Her husband may come home at any minute. Boy! Those drinks are sure expensive at the Carousel Club!" Later during conversation, customer stated that the girl he had just left was "one of RUBY's girls". Customer asked BALL to deliver him to 1026 North Beckley, Dallas, Texas. BALL stated he then asked customer if that wasn't the address where OSWALD had resided, and customer stated "Yes". Customer also advised that he had known OSWALD when OSWALD resided at the Beckley address. Extent of acquaintance not known to BALL.

A review of Dallas file 44-1639, in report dated 12-13-63, serial no. 2559, page 194, reflects the female referred to above to be WANDA JOYCE KILLIAM, 1351 Galloway Ave., Dallas, Texas. Customer referred to above has been identified in Dallas report 44-1639, as JOE CARTER. Interview located serial no. 3356, page 282.

Inasmuch as customer and female referred to by BALL have been identified and previously interviewed, no further action recommended.

Synopsis:

LLOYD JOHN WILSON, age 18, advised Bureau Agents on 12/19/63 at Chicago that he paid one OSWALD \$1,000 to carry out OSWALD's intentions of assassinating President KENNEDY. WILSON indicated that he was embittered at his discharge from the United States Air Force on 12/18/63 and as a result might reinstitute his organization, DAW, which organization believed in the assassination of political figures opposed to the aims of DAW. He indicated he might, in the future, contribute to an assassination attempt against President JOHNSON. WILSON arrested by Chicago Police Department 12/19/63 on disorderly complaint signed by Special Agent JOSEPH NOONAN, Secret Service, Chicago and held for psychiatric examination. On 1/3/64, WILSON appeared before United States Commissioner C. S. BENTLEY PIKE, Chicago, at which time he was held under \$25,000 bond on a charge of threatening President JOHNSON. WILSON is to be afforded psychiatric examination under Federal jurisdiction and is scheduled to appear before PIKE on 1/10/64.

DETAILS: AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

At approximately 8:45 A.M., December 18, 1963, a call was received by the Chicago Division Office from a Chicago newspaper reflecting that one LLOYD JOHN WILSON had telephonically contacted that newspaper moments earlier to state that he was going to give himself up to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, because of his involvement in the assassination of President KENNEDY. In his telephone call to the newspaper, WILSON indicated that he was in the Federal Bureau of Investigation building, 536 South Clark Street, Chicago, Illinois, at the time of his call. Agents of the Chicago Office were immediately alerted and took charge of WILSON as he stepped from the elevator on the ninth floor of the building at 536 South Clark.

WILSON was taken to the Chicago Division Office and placed in a secure area. He was advised that he would be taken to the San Antonio, Texas, where he had been employed by the American Legion, Santa Clara, California, and resided at 555 1/2 Santa Clara, California.

During the interview on August 1963, WILSON began to give an explanation of his involvement in the assistance of the American Legion. He stated that he had known WILSON since his childhood. WILSON was known to him as a member of the American Legion, Santa Clara, California. WILSON advised that he did not know any other associates among the American Legion members and that he had no personal regard for any of them. WILSON stated that he had received a letter from WILSON which was received to the American Legion, Santa Clara, California. WILSON filled out the membership application and received any members.

Administrative routing and filing stamps, including a date stamp of 12/21/63.

At 8:50 AM on December 19, 1963, LLOYD JOHN WILSON stepped off the elevator at the ninth floor offices of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, 536 South Clark Street, Chicago, Illinois. WILSON was immediately interviewed concerning his knowledge of the assassination of President KENNEDY since he had placed a phone call at approximately 8:45 to a Chicago newspaper indicating he was coming to the Chicago Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and had information concerning this assassination.

WILSON was advised that he need not furnish any statement, that any statement furnished by him might be used against him in court and that if he so desired, he could have the services of an attorney. No threats or promises were made to WILSON to secure his statement.

In August, 1963, WILSON returned to the San Francisco, California, area from Texas where he had been visiting relatives. WILSON was at that time employed by the Aragon Engineering Company, Santa Clara, California, and resided at 853 El Camino, Santa Clara, California.

During the latter part of August, 1963, WILSON began to plan an organization to be known as DAW-White Resistance Army. The DAW stood for the initials of the name DWIGHT ALLEN WILSON by which name WILSON was known since his childhood. According to WILSON, his organization, in many respects, adhered to the principles and aims of the American Nazi Party (ANP). WILSON advised that he did not personally belong to the ANP but had many associates among members of that group and has a strong personal regard for GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL, the founder and organizer of the ANP. WILSON advised that he had heard ROCKWELL speak on various occasions. WILSON's organization was conceived to combat the rise of certain racial groups which rise he felt was epitomized by the "March on Washington". WILSON filled a notebook setting forth the aims, objectives and rules of his organization but never actually recruited any members.

During this same period, the latter part of August, 1963, WILSON wrote a threatening letter to President JOHN F. KENNEDY but never mailed this letter.

At about this same time, WILSON learned from two unidentified friends, ANP members, in San Francisco, California, that a man named OSWALD, first name unknown, was deeply antagonistic toward President KENNEDY and had stated intentions of assassinating the President. These individuals further advised WILSON that OSWALD was "communistic" and therefore was not completely sympathetic to all of the aims of the ANP. WILSON, desirous of making contact with OSWALD, got in touch with an unidentified friend living in San Jose, California. This friend, according to WILSON, was "pro-CASTRO" and possibly had "communist sympathies". The friend, upon learning of WILSON's desire to meet OSWALD, put WILSON in touch with a member of the Communist Party (CP) at San Francisco, California. This latter individual advised WILSON that he would arrange a meeting between WILSON and OSWALD and that OSWALD would be in the San Francisco area in the near future.

During the last week of August, 1963, or possibly the first day or two in September, 1963, WILSON was advised by his friend in San Jose, California, that OSWALD was, in fact, in San Francisco and a meeting could be arranged during the course of a wrestling match held at the Cow Palace in San Francisco. WILSON recalled that the headline wrestlers on this particular wrestling card were: RAY STEVENS, DON DE NUCCI (phonetic) or CARL GOTCH (phonetic). WILSON stated that there is only one wrestling match at the Cow Palace in San Francisco each month.

On the designated date, WILSON, accompanied by his San Jose friend, went to the Cow Palace, where the friend pointed out OSWALD at a point near the north gate. WILSON then introduced himself to OSWALD and complimented him on his ambition to assassinate President KENNEDY. WILSON and OSWALD

went to the second level balcony of the Cow Palace to continue their discussion. WILSON gave OSWALD an envelope containing one \$1,000 bill, saying "This is a gift to help you in your mission. Do it in Texas if possible." He then told OSWALD that the date and manner of carrying out the assassination was left to OSWALD's discretion. Immediately thereafter, OSWALD departed and WILSON states he had had no further contact in any way with OSWALD since that one meeting.

WILSON indicated he obtained the \$1,000 bill in the following manner: He contributed \$250 of his own money. He secured \$350 from his friend in San Jose, California, and the remaining \$400 was given by his two friends who were members of the ANP at San Francisco. Because WILSON did not desire to carry a large number of small denomination bills, he requested and secured from his ANP friends one \$1,000 bill for which he returned the \$1,000 in smaller bills.

WILSON continued his employment at the Aragon Engineering Company, Santa Clara, California, until September 12, 1963. He said that about this time he had decided to discontinue his efforts in organizing the DAW-White Resistance Army group since he believed that the formulation of such a group would inevitably lead to large scale violence which he indicated he did not desire. WILSON left the San Francisco area in the middle of September, 1963, and went to Yakima, Washington. At Spokane, Washington, on October 29, 1963, WILSON was interviewed by a Mr. SHERIDAN of the Secret Service. He stated that he furnished Mr. SHERIDAN all of the information concerning his abortive organization but did not tell Mr. SHERIDAN anything of his meeting with OSWALD or his contribution of money toward the furtherance of OSWALD's assassination plans. On the same date, in the Secret Service office, Spokane, Washington, WILSON was interviewed by an Agent of the FBI regarding his Selective Service status. WILSON had not been given a discharge as a "security risk". WILSON said he

registered for the Selective Service since he was planning to enlist in the Air Force and did not realize he was required to register. Following this interview, WILSON did register for Selective Service in Yakima, Washington, and was sent from there to Spokane, Washington, to complete his induction into the Air Force. He was inducted into the Air Force on October 31, 1963, and immediately went to Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas.

Following the assassination of President KENNEDY, WILSON requested an interview with his commanding officer, Major LAWRENCE TATE, 3709 Squadron, Flight 1452. He requested permission from TATE to attend the funeral of President KENNEDY and when asked the reason for his request informed TATE of his prior anti-government feelings and beliefs, including details concerning the organization DAW-White Resistance Army. During this interview, WILSON denied to Major TATE any participation in the assassination of President KENNEDY.

WILSON advised that he had spoken to the following Air Force personnel concerning his "troubles in San Francisco" but had not furnished information concerning his part in the assassination: P. A. MALLOY, JR., presently attending Air Police School, Lackland Air Force Base; J. L. HODGE, presently attending Aircraft Maintenance School, Air Force Base at Amarillo, Texas; and W. R. MC KAY, whose present whereabouts are unknown but who was a member of Flight 1452 and a co-trainee of WILSON.

On December 12, 1963, WILSON, together with several other men from his detachment, arrived at Chanute Field, Rantoul, Illinois, for assignment to that base. On December 13, 1963, WILSON was advised by his commanding officer at Chanute Field that he was to be sent to the hospital for certain tests after which he would probably be given a discharge as a "security risk". WILSON said he

had been admitted to the hospital and examined by several doctors following which on December 17, 1963, he had been given an honorable discharge from the United States Air Force.

WILSON advised that he arrived in Chicago, Illinois, at approximately 11:00 PM on the night of December 18, 1963. He said he planned to advise the FBI office of his contribution to OSWALD on the morning of December 19, 1963, and because of this decided to have one last "night on the town."

WILSON advised that on arrival in Chicago he contacted a cab driver, cab company unknown. This cab driver directed him to a house in an unidentified part of Chicago for a charge of \$20.00. When WILSON arrived at the house, driven there by the cab driver, he was directed to a second floor apartment. In this apartment were two colored prostitutes and two or more colored men. WILSON spent the night at this house, paying one of the girls \$120.00. On the following morning, December 19, 1963, he departed from this house after securing the name of one of the girls as JEAN and a phone number as 733-1570. He was told that he could contact the girls at this house in the future through the use of this phone number.

During the course of the interview with WILSON, he indicated that his reason for furnishing the information to the FBI was to "protect him in the future" if President JOHNSON were to be assassinated. He said he felt that he would be released after furnishing the information set forth above and that should President JOHNSON be assassinated in the future, the fact that he had voluntarily furnished information concerning his contribution to OSWALD would tend to preclude any arrest and/or conviction of him for the assassination of President JOHNSON.

WILSON indicated he was extremely irate over his discharge from the United States Air Force. He said that he had intended to make the Air Force his career and felt that he was serving the United States Government well in his capacity as an airman. He said that during his enlistment in the Air Force he had no longer entertained his animosity toward the United States Government although he still believed that our form of government was wrong. He said that since his discharge he felt he would return to the San Francisco area where, in all probability, he would reinstitute the DAW-White Resistance Army. He said he had no specific plans concerning President LYNDON B. JOHNSON since he did not know enough of the present President. He said that should President JOHNSON continue in the same course as regards to racial matters as his predecessor, JOHN F. KENNEDY, that it was possible he might consider the assassination of President JOHNSON to be necessary for the good of the United States.

WILSON did not specify all of the changes in government which he desired accomplished but specifically mentioned that his form of government would not tolerate free speech or freedom of the press. He further indicated that this form of government would allow no opposition and would have no hesitancy in killing persons who did not conform to the standards of his belief. WILSON pointed out that there were numerous individuals in this country who shared his beliefs and quoted GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL as stating that by 1975 "this country would be his." WILSON also stated that by 1975 "the Swastika would be flying over the United States."

While undergoing training in the Air Force, WILSON qualified as an outstanding marksman with a carbine rifle.

WILSON stated that he personally would probably not assassinate anyone but felt that certain people should be killed. He said he would not hesitate to assist someone to kill such persons. He added that he knew many individuals whose names he did not disclose who were proficient in the manufacture and use of bombs, explosives, and firearms and who could be called upon by him to utilize their knowledge on his behalf. At no time during his interview would WILSON disclose the identities of any of his associates who were involved either in his negotiations with OSWALD or any organizations opposing the government of the United States.

The following description of WILSON was obtained from observation and interview:

WILSON advised he had been informed by the Air Force that his true parents were EDWARD JOE WILSON and HELEN MC CLAIN. He stated that he had never seen either of his parents and believed both to be dead.

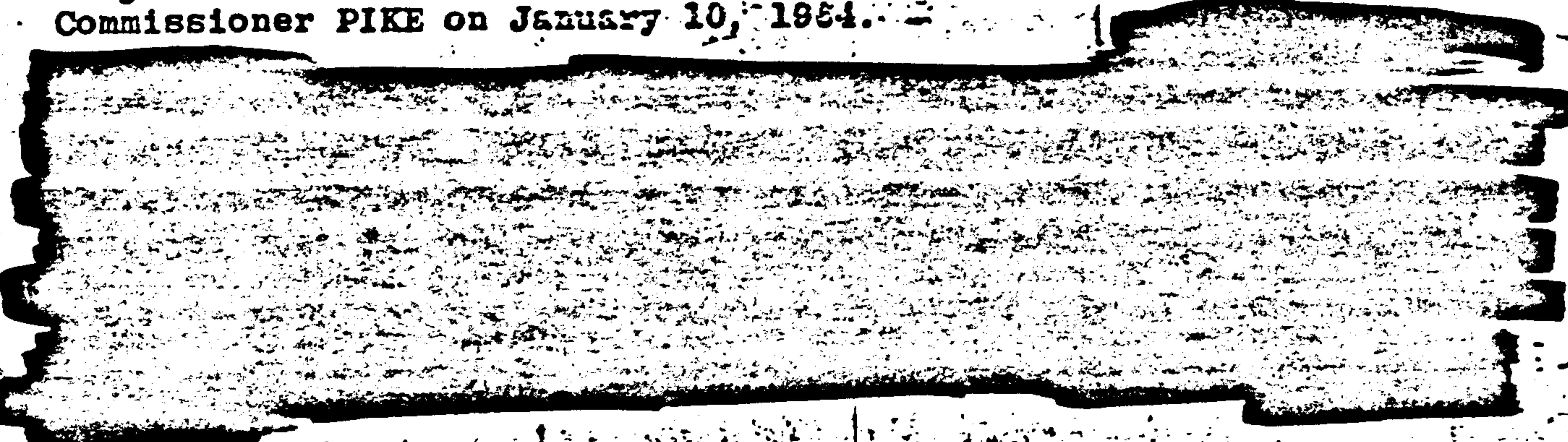

Per Bureau instructions, the local office of the Secret Service, Chicago, Illinois, was immediately advised on December 19, 1963, of WILSON's remarks including his threats against President JOHNSON. Special Agents EDWARD TUCKER and JOSEPH NOONAN, Secret Service, came to the Chicago Division Office and participated in the interview with WILSON. At the conclusion of this interview, Agent NOONAN signed a complaint charging disorderly conduct against WILSON with the Chicago Police Department. WILSON was then removed by the Chicago Police Department to their headquarters, 1121 South State Street. On December 20, 1963, WILSON appeared before a local magistrate, who ordered him held for psychiatric examination. On this same date, Secret Service Agents secured a Federal warrant against WILSON charging him with the threat against President LYDON B. JOHNSON.

On January 3, 1964, WILSON appeared before United States Commissioner C. S. BENTLEY PIKE on a charge of threatening President JOHNSON. At that time, WILSON was ordered held under \$25,000 bond and a psychiatric examination was ordered for the subject. WILSON is scheduled to make a second appearance before Commissioner PIKE on January 10, 1964.

The following investigation was conducted at Chicago, Illinois by SAs KAT I. SHERROE and WILLIAM E. BRUNNER:

he stated that [redacted] a North Side, [redacted] the first floor apartment at 2 [redacted] West [redacted]. [redacted] stated that he has not seen [redacted] only three during the past six months. To [redacted] knowledge, [redacted] employed as a cab driver by an unknown cab company in Chicago and [redacted] owns a 1958 or 1959 black Cadillac.

advised that he seldom sees [redacted] therefore,

He stated that he has never seen anyone in the apartment during the day but there has always been evidence that the apartment is occupied at night by one or more females, names unknown. He stated that the two beds, one in each bedroom, have usually been used and not made up. He stated that he has observed women's sheer undergarments in the bedrooms as well as contraceptives and other paraphernalia to indicate the place was used for purposes of prostitution.

[redacted] stated that he has found numerous business cards and he has observed books with telephone numbers with "referral notations" after the names and numbers such as: "Bob 432-1478 - \$50.00."

He stated that [redacted] built a bar in the dining room of the apartment and keeps it stocked with gin, vodka, scotch and whiskey. He also stated that there are two telephones in the apartment; one in the living room by a photograph set and the other in a bedroom. [redacted] said that the phone in the living room has no number on the dial; however, the phone in the bedroom bears the number 733-1570.

[redacted] advised that, to his knowledge, [redacted] is not married. He stated that he is strongly of the opinion that [redacted] uses the apartment as a "late hour house of prostitution." [redacted] advised that he has not seen anyone come in or go out of the apartment but this [redacted]

On December 19, 1953, Sergeant DAVE COFFEY, Vice Control Division, Prostitution and Obscene Matter Unit, Chicago Police Department, advised that they had previously received information that the first floor apartment at 2119 West Crenshaw was a house of prostitution. Sergeant COFFEY stated that Vice Detectives have "sat" on the place on one or two occasions from 8:00 P.M. to 11:00 P.M. and they have observed no activity. Sergeant COFFEY stated that, if the place is used as a house of prostitution, it is probably on a very select basis and it is not in operation every night. Sergeant COFFEY advised that Chicago Police Department Vice Detective

would endeavor to determine the identify of [redacted] and ascertain if he operates a house of prostitution at 2119 West Grenshaw. He stated that if they were successful in their investigation, they would notify the Chicago Office of the FBI.

It should be noted that telephone number 733-1570, the number on the phone in the above apartment, is that furnished to WILSON as a number where he could reach the prostitute with whom he spent the night of December 18, 1963.

On 1/9/64, Inspector JAMES R. MALLEY stated that RANKIN, the Attorney for the Commission, had been looking over the Dallas Police Department logs immediately after the assassination of the President. He stated that these logs had been secured apparently by Secret Service, and one of the questions that RANKIN was asking was how the Police got out a broadcast of a possible suspect at 12:43 PM, shortly after the President's assassination, of a white male, about 30 years of age, etc. He requested that we check with the Police to determine the source of their description at that time. As MALLEY recalled, it was noted that there was a Police officer, of course, who contacted OSWALD shortly after the shooting along with the manager of the building, and he was advised that OSWALD was one of the employees; and it was later determined that all of the employees were in the building except OSWALD, but it was thought that this was quite some time after 12:45 PM.
