For the information of the New York Division, Dallas is in the process of attempting to determine if all leads set forth in captioned case have been covered. In such review, Dallas has been unable to determine if the following leads set forth for the New York Division were covered and reported:

1. Re: PHILLIP LUCE

Boston tel to Bureau, New York and Dallas dated 11-29-63 which states on 11-29-63 [redacted] source on Permanent Student Committee for Travel to Cuba (PSCTC), New York File 100-150225, advised SA MICHAEL J. McDONAGH that [redacted] telephonically advised he had seen item in New York City newspaper that authorities were attempting to locate roommate of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, when OSWALD lived in Greenwich Village, New York City. Newspaper item describes person being sought, according to [redacted] generally coincides with description of PHILLIP LUCE, one of the leaders in PSCTC. [redacted] stated when appearing before HCUA in Washington, D. C., unrecalled representatives of this committee had mentioned LUCE had been connected with Citizens White Council (CWC). Newspaper item had mentioned OSWALD's former roommate had been connected with CWC. Boston file reflects PHILLIP LUCE is known to New York Office.

Report of SA RAYMOND J. FOX dated 12/13/63 at Denver contains results of investigation at Casper, Wyo., showing that remarks originally attributed to R. L. HIGGINS were actually made by ROBERT S. SCOTT. FD-302 of interview with SCOTT is set forth on page four of this report.

Re Professor JAMES BUSEY

Interview of Professor JAMES BUSEY was suggested solely as a means of establishing the date of a meeting between HENRY OXNARD and HARRY NIER. Since the time of this meeting was established through interview of individuals at the meeting and was later verified by OXNARD, no interview of Professor BUSEY was necessary.

Re JOSEPH McCLUSKEY

It is noted that McCLUSKEY in a letter to the U. S. Merchandising Corp., Denver, Colo., in 11/63, hinted at his being related to former President KENNEDY. No threatening or

derogatory statements were attributed to McCLUSKEY.

Page eight of report of SA RAYMOND J. FOX dated 12/5/63 at Denver sets forth results of interview with Mrs. ANTON GORYANZ, 1719 Pearl St., Denver, who is manager of the apartment house where McCLUSKEY resides. Mrs. GORYANZ advised that McCLUSKEY was a very strong supporter of former President KENNEDY but that he is a habitual liar and somewhat of a "nut." She stated that he had never had anything but good things to say about President KENNEDY.

Inasmuch as McCLUSKEY is not alleged to have threatened former President KENNEDY and subsequent investigation disclosed he was in fact a supporter of Mr. KENNEDY, no interview of McCLUSKEY appears necessary. In the event DALLAS feels McCLUSKEY should be interviewed, Denver should be so advised.

Re Major PETER H. DAVISON

New York airtel to the Bureau dated 1/8/64, sets forth results of investigation to locate ALEXIS H. DAVISON, who was formerly Embassy physician at Moscow. New York determined that ALEXIS H. DAVISON did not reside at New York but that a Captain PETER H. DAVISON did formerly live at the New York address set out for ALEXIS DAVISON. Major PETER H. DAVISON was interviewed 1/13/64 at the Air Force Academy, Colorado Springs, Colo., at which time it was ascertained that his brother, ALEXIS H. DAVISON, resides at 2634 Sharondale Drive, Atlanta, Ga.

By referenced airtel to Bureau 1/13/64, copies to Atlanta and Dallas, results of interview with Major PETER H. DAVISON were set forth and lead set out for Atlanta to interview ALEXIS H. DAVISON.

Inspector DON MOORE, Div. V, telephonically contacted the Dallas Div., 4:20 PM, this date. He referred to Dallas report in captioned case, wherein it was reported that the PD had obtained 3 metal boxes containing personal correspondence of Mrs. PAINE's. In addition, he referred to Bureau teletype, instructing that the original correspondence be obtained for the WARREN Commission and forwarded to the Bureau. By Dallas airtel to the Bu, 1/15/64, this correspondence was forwarded.

Inspector MOORE advised that the correspondence is being furnished to the Commission; however, referenced airtel did not reiterate that all the correspondence furnished was personal correspondence of Mrs. PAINE's. In addition, he stated that this airtel did not reveal that Mrs. PAINE had been informed the letters were obtained for the WARREN Commission.

Inspector MOORE stated he is certain that the above items have been covered and that all correspondence submitted was personal correspondence of Mrs. PAINE's and that she was informed that the correspondence was being obtained for the Commission and would be furnished to them. He stated that UAC by Dallas prior to 8 AM, CST, 1/21/64, he would consider that these points were covered.

This matter was discussed with SAs GEMBERLING and DE BRUEYS and they advised that the items above were correct as stated by Insp. MOORE.

There is no doubt that the man whose finger pressed the trigger was Lee H. Oswald. As to who may have commanded him to commit this crime there is considerable doubt.

The F. B. I. has reported to the public that both Oswald and Rubenstein acted as individuals. That neither had any accomplices or was part of an organized plot either to kill the President or to silence his killer.

Frankly we doubt that this is true. While not presuming to second guess the nation's largest and best equipped investigative agency, their pat statement leaves too many questions unanswered--

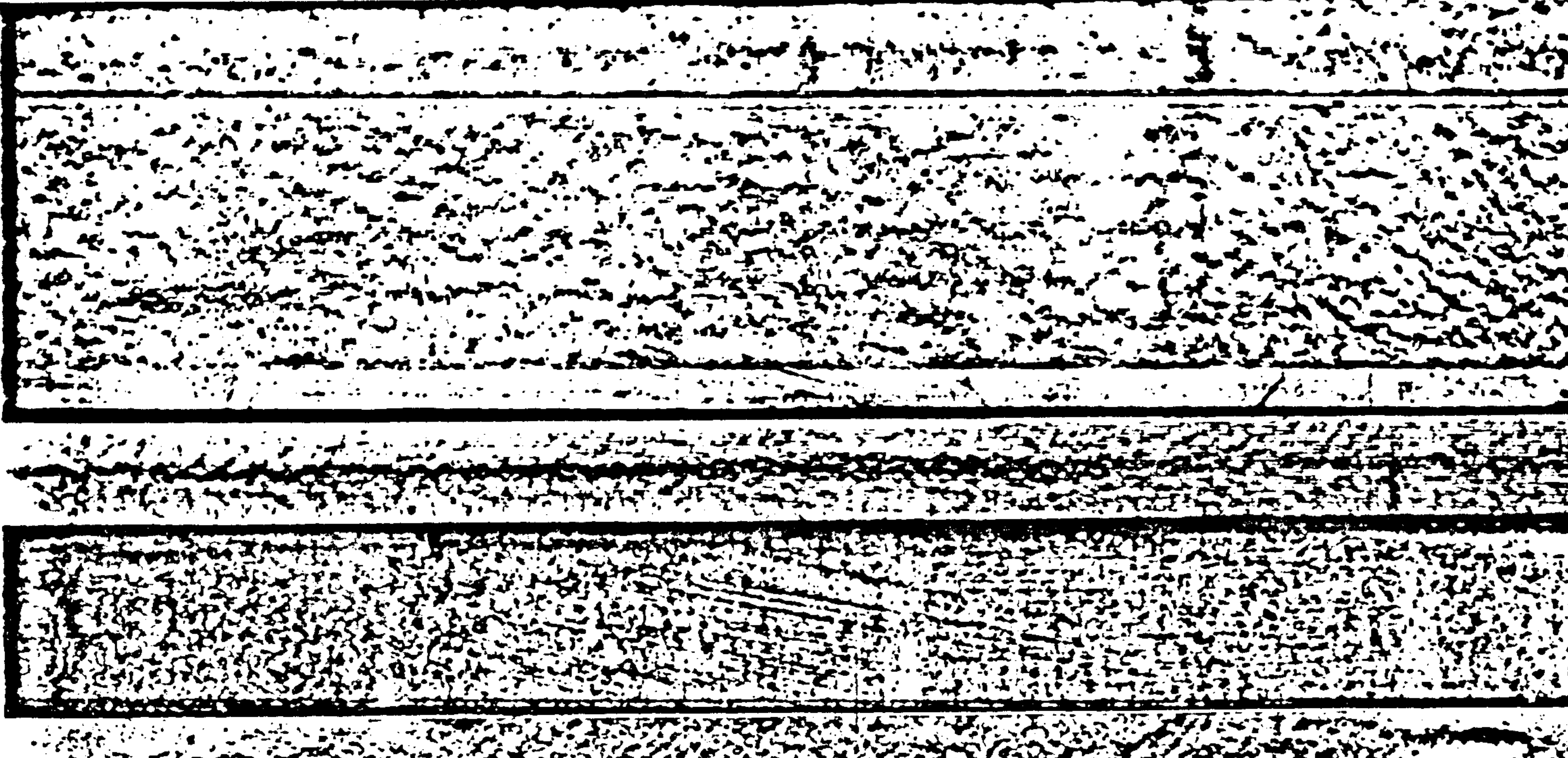
FOR EXAMPLE...

On the day that Oswald was captured it was widely announced on national radio and TV that he had also killed a Dallas Policeman and a Secret Service Agent.

During subsequent news coverage, there was no further mention of the Secret Service Agent. So far as we can tell, there was no official "correction" of these first reports. The subject was just quietly dropped.

To judge the possible reliability of these reports requires some knowledge of the steps taken by the Secret Service in guarding the President. As just one example, all the man-hole covers along the route he is expected to travel are sealed down well ahead of time. Each major building (or series of small buildings) is assigned to one agent whose responsibility it is to check the building and its occupants before the President passes and to guard it while he goes by.

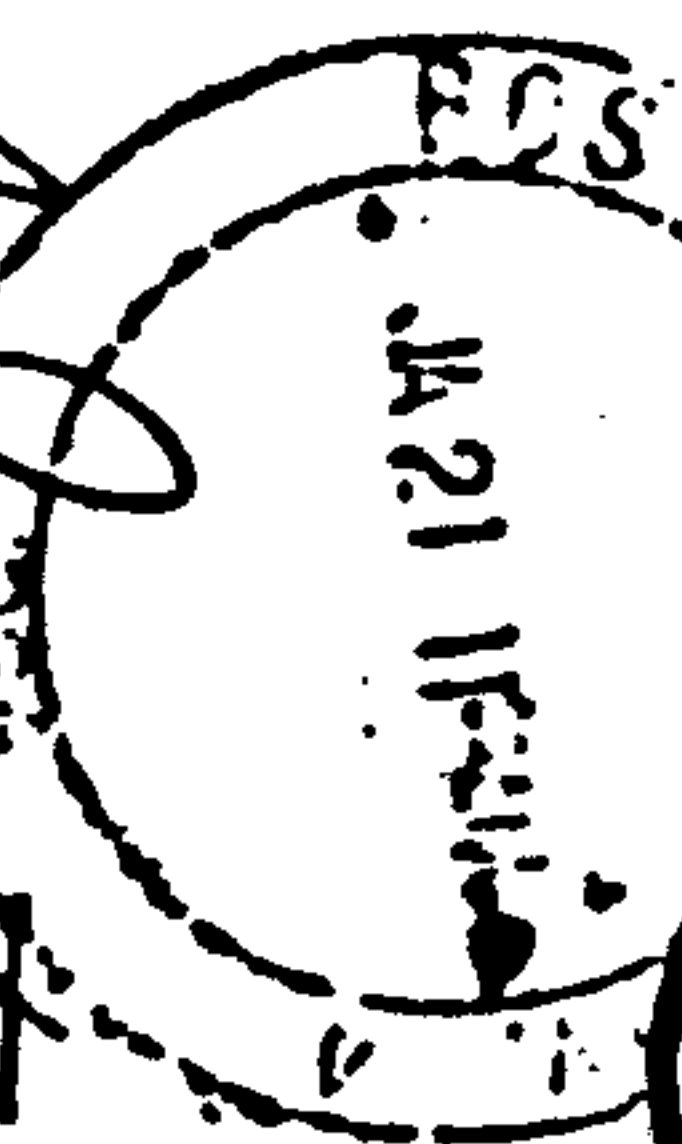
It is true that the extensive travels of the large Kennedy family had placed a strain on the Secret Service. Even so it seems strange that so perfect an ambush site as the School Book Depository Building should be left unguarded. Our information is that the building was not left unguarded. That, in truth, the particular Secret Service man who had been assigned to that building was found dead, lying behind a stack of packing cases a few feet from the rifle used to kill the President.

On January 13, 1964, Sergeant LESTER ROBERTSON, Texas Rangers, advised the writer telephonically that on Saturday, January 11, 1964, an individual telephoned him and after talking briefly said he would have to call back. ROBERTSON had to leave but on his return January 13, 1964, found a note concerning the call of the individual which in substance was as follows:

JOHN VALENTINE, 186 - 13th Street, Apartment 1, Atlanta, Georgia, who said he was passing through Dallas, claimed he overheard DAVID MILLER, 366 Lake Drive, Hamphill (?), Georgia, tell MILLER's wife he had married her only to keep her mouth shut regarding the attempt on Governor CONNALLY's life. He said MILLER was about 24 years of age, driving a green and white, 1956 station wagon (unknown make), and is a brother-in-law of BOB WALKER of Irving, Texas. MILLER has supposedly only recently moved to Georgia.
