The following pertains to the photographs of LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

Dallas should submit a copy of every photograph they exhibited to MARINA OSWALD. Each photo is to be numbered according to our identification system. Dallas should identify the investigative report and the page number where the particular photograph was shown to MARINA OSWALD.

The next request pertains to the other evidence, such as postcards, film, negatives, etc. that would have been shown to MARINE OSWALD. For example, if it is a postcard, send up a photograph of it, showing the number of the postcard, the investigative report and page number where this was shown to MARINA OSWALD. What they want here is to submit the same information as in paragraph immediately above.

The next request pertains to the cook book where the WALKER letter was found. The Commission wants to see the book itself. Bureau has in the Laboratory the WALKER letter, but they want to see the volume of the book where this letter was found.

[redacted] said he assumed [redacted] was referring to the statement that he was going to do something that is going to shock the country. He said [redacted] also mentioned that he was going to Reno for the holidays and would be in Los Angeles after the first of the year, and could be located through a friend (not identified) at [redacted] Avenue, Los Angeles 6, California. At 5:55 PM, this date, Asst. Director W. C. SULLIVAN called and referred to the fact that the Bureau was preparing information for the Commission regarding the various allegations to the effect that OSWALD may have been an informant of the FBI.

Mr. SULLIVAN stated that he desired that affidavits be secured from any Agent assigned to the Dallas Division who had talked to OSWALD at any time.

1. We should cover whether they did take any steps or make any effort to make OSWALD an informant or source. In other words, they did not try to develop him as an informant, if that is the fact.
2. They never paid him any money at any time.

Mr. SULLIVAN requested these affidavits be taken by me and forwarded to the Bureau as soon as possible.

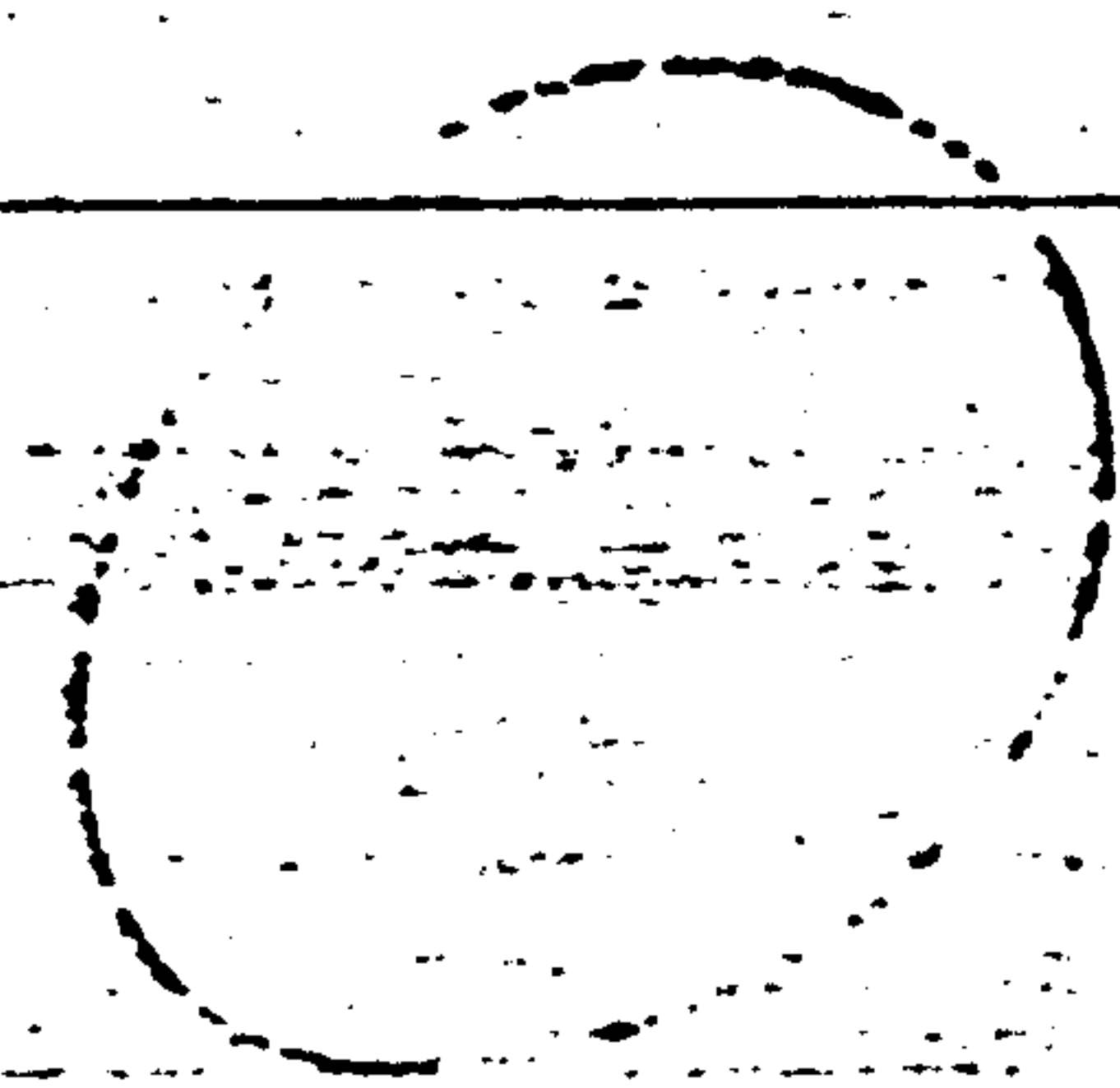

At 9:15 AM, 1/29/64, Inspector JAMES R. MALLEY telephonically stated that the Bureau was contemplating turning over to the Commission all of the material that had been taken from the PAINE residence and the OSWALD residence, as well as other evidence. He wanted to know if we had reviewed this material for the purpose of any leads.

I contacted SA GEMBERLING and SA HEITMAN. They advised me that, of course, the material had been so hastily sent to the Laboratory that we did not get a chance to review it prior to its being forwarded, but that we have gone through the list of the material and where we felt appropriate, leads have been set out and run out, and that the Laboratory reports, as well as the various writings translated from Russian have been set out in reports. It was pointed out to MALLEY, however, that the pictures of the various items were not too good and that we are still going through the material, but generally speaking, we think we have set out all immediate leads.

On 1/28/64, SA ALFRED D. NEELEY obtained from RAY ZAUBER, Editor and Publisher, Oak Cliff Tribune, a bi-weekly newspaper, copies of the paper from 11/21/63 through 1/27/64. ZAUBER was contacted on the basis (1) he had been subpoenaed as a defense witness in connection with the recent bond hearing and (2) DENSON, a private investigator for RUBY's attorneys, had previously informed the attorneys were concerned with some articles in ZAUBER's paper purportedly written by a "ranking law enforcement official" and considered "inflammatory" by them.

ZAUBER told SA NEELEY he had no doubt been subpoenaed in view of a defense effort to get a change of venue on the basis RUBY could not get a fair trial in Dallas County. ZAUBER was never called to the stand during the hearing.

Examination of the newspaper discloses a regular column by ZAUBER called the "Scratch Pad" and that ZAUBER had concerned himself with the assassination of President KENNEDY and the shooting of OSWALD in this column. In addition, the paper includes fifteen "chapters" of a series of articles. It was observed that "Chapter 1" of the series states in the nature of a foreword that the article was submitted by a "prominent law enforcement official in Dallas as a matter of chronological information to the Tribune". Certain of the subsequent "Chapters" likewise give credit to the law enforcement official.

ZAUBER, when queried by SA NEELEY, ^{LAW ENFORCEMENT} logically stated he had personally written the articles in question although saying he "had help" and inferred his principal source of contact and presumably his "help" has been Captain FRITZ, Dallas Police Department, whom he knows and admired for many years (ZAUBER was formerly a Police reporter on a Dallas daily). In the same conversation, ZAUBER is referring to

the articles, said in substance "I've got to sell newspapers".

Examination of the articles indicates ZAUBER, while factual on bare essentials, raises numerous questions, often set forth in question form so phrased as to infer to the reader that ZAUBER perhaps has information to support a particular theory. His articles infer the existence of a Communist conspiracy, the linking of OSWALD with RUBY, attempted suppression of full facts by public officials, good treatment of OSWALD by the "liberal press", suppression of "conservatives" or "right wing" element, etc.

The writer finds no basis for investigative leads from examination of the articles in question.





On 1/31/64, RUTH PAINE, Irving, Texas, advised she received a letter from J. P. MC CULLOUGH, Insurance Department, Texas Employment Commission, TEC Building, Austin, Texas, inquiring as to whether Mrs. PAINE might know the identity of an individual who had written to TEC from Irving, Texas, or Dallas, Texas, in late October, 1961, inquiring about his unemployment claim.

In this letter, MC CULLOUGH indicated that this unknown individual referred to OSWALD as a person who had appealed to Governor CONNALLY to have his discharge rescinded and indicated that he himself had not appealed to Governor CONNALLY on his unemployment since "the other person" had not received consideration from Governor CONNALLY. The writer of that letter implied he was resigned to desperate action in obtaining his right.

Mrs. PAINE advised that she did not know who this could be and that she had written a reply to Mr. MC CULLOUGH dated 1/31/64, stating this, that it is possible LEE OSWALD might have written such a letter himself under an alias and suggesting that Mr. MC CULLOUGH contact the local office of the FBI.

RELATING TO FIREARMS

The following statutes are contained in Volume I, Vernon's Texas Penal Code, Chapter Four, captioned Unlawfully Carrying Arms, under articles 483 through 489c.

Article 483. 475.338,318 - Unlawfully carrying arms

Whoever shall carry on or about his person, saddle or in his saddlebags, or in his portfolio or purse any pistol, dirk, dagger, slung shot, blackjack, hand chain, night stick, pipe stick, sword cane, spear, knuckles made of any metal or any hard substance, bowie knife, switch blade knife, spring blade knife, throw blade knife, a knife with a blade over five and one half (5½) inches in length, or any other knife manufactured or sold for the purposes of offense or defense shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) or by confinement in jail for not less than one (1) month nor more than one (1) year. As amended Acts 1957, 55th Leg., p. 806, ch. 304, Sec. 1.

Article 484. 476.339,319 Not applicable

The preceding article shall not apply to a person in actual service as a militiaman, nor to any peace officer in the actual discharge of his official duty, nor to the carrying of arms on one's own premises or place of business, nor to persons traveling, nor to any deputy constable, or special policeman who receives a compensation of forty dollars or more per month for his services as such officer, and who is appointed in conformity with the statutes authorizing such appointment; nor to the Game, Fish and Oyster Commissioner, nor to any deputy, when in the actual discharge of his duties as such, nor to any game warden, or local deputy Game, Fish and Oyster Commissioner when in the actual discharge of his duties in the county of his residence, nor shall it apply to any game warden or deputy Game, Fish and Oyster Commissioner who actually receives from the State fees or compensation for his services. Acts 1871, p. 25, Acts 1819, p.:194.

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Article 485. 477,340 Carrying arms in any assembly

If any person shall go into any church or any religious assembly, any schoolroom, ballroom, or other place where persons are assembled for amusement or for educational or scientific purposes, or into any circus, show or public exhibition of any kind, or social gathering, or to any election on the day or days of any election where any portion of the people of this State are collected to vote at an election, or to any other place where people may be assembled to muster or perform any other public duties, and shall have or carry about his person any pistol or other firearm, dirk, dagger, slung shot, sword cane, spear, brass knuckle, bowie knife, or any other kind of a knife made and manufactured for the purpose of offense and defense, he shall be fined not less than one hundred nor more than five hundred dollars, or be confined in jail not less than thirty days nor more than twelve months, or both. Acts 1871, p. 25; Acts 1915, p. 132.

Article 486. 478,341 Not applicable to whom

The preceding article shall not apply to peace officers or other persons authorized or permitted by law to carry arms at the places therein designated. Acts 1871, p. 25. Revision 1879.

Article 487. 479, 342 Arrest without warrant

Any person violating any article of this chapter may be arrested without warrant by any peace officer and carried before the nearest justice of the peace. Any peace officer who shall fail or refuse to arrest such person on his own knowledge, or upon information from some reliable person, shall be fined not exceeding five hundred dollars. Acts 1871, p. 26.

Article 488. Dope seller carrying arms

Whoever shall carry on or about his person a pistol or any other weapon or arm mentioned in the first article of this chapter while possessing for the purpose of unlawful sale, furnishing or giving away any drug, narcotic, derivative or preparation or marijuana mentioned in article 720 of this Code, shall be confined in the penitentiary for not less than one nor more than ten years. Act June 18, 1923, p. 164.

Article 489. 1048 Sale of weapon to minor

Section 1. Whoever shall knowingly sell, or offer for sale, give or barter, or cause to be sold, given or bartered to any person within this State, a switch blade knife, spring blade knife or throw blade knife, or knuckles made of metal or any hard substance shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) or be imprisoned in jail for a period of time not to exceed one (1) year or by both such fine and imprisonment. It shall be a defense to this Act if such switch blade knife, spring blade knife or throw blade knife shall be an antique bought and sold by collectors of such items.

This Act shall not apply to antique or curio firearms which were manufactured prior to 1898 and which may have, as an integral part, a folding knife blade or other characteristics of items prohibited by this Act.

Section 2. Whoever shall knowingly sell, give or barter, or cause to be sold, given or bartered to any minor a pistol, dirk, dagger, slung shot, blackjack, hand chain, night stick, rifle stick, sword cane, spear, bowie knife or a knife with a blade over five and one half (5½) inches in length, without the written consent of the parent or guardian of such minor, or of someone standing in lieu thereof, shall be fined not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200), or be imprisoned in jail for a period of time not to exceed one year or by both such fine and imprisonment. As amended Acts 1961, 57th Leg., p. 558, ch. 261, Sec. 1.

Article 489b. Machine guns

Definition

Section 1. "Machine gun" applies to and includes a weapon of any description by whatever name known, loaded or unloaded, from which more than five (5) shots or bullets may be automatically discharged from a magazine by a single functioning of the firing device.

"Person" applies to and includes firm, partnership, association or corporation.

Penalty

Section 2. Whosoever shall possess or use a machine gun, as defined in Section 1, shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction thereof, shall be confined in the State Penitentiary, for not less than two (2) nor more than ten (10) years.

Sale, penalty

Section 3. Whoever shall sell, lease, give, barter, exchange, or trade, or cause to be sold, leased, given, bartered, exchanged, or traded, a machine gun as hereinabove defined to any person shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction thereof, shall be confined to the State Penitentiary, for not less than two (2) nor more than ten (10) years.

Exception of peace officers and others

Section 4. Nothing contained in Section 2 of this Act shall prohibit or interfere with:

1. The possession of machine guns by the military forces or the peace officers of the United States or of any political subdivision thereof, or the transportation required for that purpose.

2. The possession of a machine gun for scientific purpose, or the possession of a machine gun not usable as a weapon and possessed as a curiosity, ornament, or keepsake.

3. The possession of machine guns by officials and employees of the Texas State Prison System.

Sale to certain officers as not prohibited

Section 5. Nothing contained in this Act shall prohibit or interfere with the sale, lease, barter, exchange or gift of a machine gun as defined in this Act, or the transportation required for such purpose to the Adjutant General of the State of Texas, the duly qualified and commissioned Sheriff of a county in Texas, to a duly qualified and commissioned Chief of Police of any municipality within the State of Texas, the duly authorized purchasing agent for the Texas State Prison System, the military forces or peace officers of the United States. Acts 1933, 43rd Leg., 1st C.S., p. 219, ch. 82.

Article 489c. Possession of firearms by persons convicted of felony involving use of firearm

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person who has been convicted of burglary or robbery, or of a felony involving an act of violence with a firearm under the laws of the United States or of the State of Texas, or of any other state, and who has served a term in the penitentiary for such conviction, to have in his possession away from the premises upon which he lives any pistol, revolver or any other firearm capable of being concealed upon the person. As amended Acts 1957, 55th Leg., p. 50, ch. 28, Sec. 1.

Section 2. Anyone violating any of the provisions of this Act shall be guilty of a felony, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary for not less than one (1) nor more than five (5) years.

Section 3. Definitions. The following words and phrases when used in this Act are defined as follows, to wit:

(a) "Pistol," "revolver" and "firearm" means a weapon capable of being concealed upon the person and shall include all firearms having a barrel of less than twelve (12) inches in length.

(b) The use of the masculine gender includes the feminine gender.

Section 4. The penal provisions of this Act shall not apply to any person commissioned as a peace officer, employed as a guard or watchman nor to any person who has not been convicted of a penal offense during the five-year period next immediately following his discharge or release from the penitentiary. D. E. MOORE of Bureau headquarters, at 4:45 PM today advised as follows:

The Nation, Jan. 27, 1964, contains an article captioned "OSWALD and the FBI" by HAROLD FELDMAN. In a portion of this article appears the following:

"On January 1, LONNIE HUDKINS of the Houston Post, published a story under the headline: 'OSWALD Rumored as Informant for U.S.'. HUDKINS found that OSWALD did know Agent HOSTY. He had HOSTY's home phone, office phone and car license number -- this on the authority of WILLIAM ALEXANDER, Assistant to HENRY WADE, Dallas District Attorney. ALEXANDER had attended the grilling of OSWALD on November 22 and 23. HUDKINS notes that if the FBI had OSWALD under surveillance, the watch could not have been too close or they would have known about the rifle and other matters; but, as the Sheriff's Deputy put it, "You just wouldn't think to check out one of your own stoolies. HUDKINS quotes WADE, himself a former FBI Agent as saying, "It may be true, but I don't think it will ever be made public if it is."

SAC SHANKLIN should ask WADE's Assistant, WILLIAM ALEXANDER and also WADE re quotes attributed to them. Submit results of contacts by teletype.

The following information is from an article in Saga Magazine, author, former SA WILLIAM W. TURNER.

(1) Former SA TURNER claims shortly after assassination "I was sitting by the desk of Dallas Police Officer T. F. MOORE who had been assigned to take all telephone calls relating to the

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assassination." Question: Did TURNER contact MOORE, when, how did TURNER identify himself, what information was furnished to TURNER, and why? This requires interview with Officer T. F. MOORE.

(2) TURNER quotes Dallas Traffic Patrolman W. E. BARNETT concerning BARNETT's activities at scene of assassination. BARNETT, after determining shots had been fired from Texas School Book Building, immediately covered the rear of the building to prevent the assassin from escaping. BARNETT's reason for covering the rear rather than the front was explained by saying since the Dallas Police Department had not been advised of a potential assassin being employed in the building, then obviously the assassin had to be a stranger and would attempt to escape from the rear rather than the front door. Question: Was BARNETT contacted by TURNER, when, and what did BARNETT tell TURNER, and why?

(3) TURNER quotes Capt. GLEN KING of the Dallas PD as having told him that Dallas Police Department had no record on OSWALD. Was KING contacted by TURNER, when, and what did he tell TURNER, and why?

(4) TURNER claimed two FBI Agents talked to OSWALD's mother in an attempt to locate OSWALD in Dallas and she told them where he lived. Question: Did Dallas interview OSWALD's mother in attempt to determine OSWALD's location in Dallas and if so, what were the results, and when was this attempt made?

(5) Did we have mail cover on OSWALD at Dallas at any time? If so, give dates.

(6) On any contact by Dallas with MARINA OSWALD prior to the assassination, did Dallas assure her that "Her husband's new job at the Texas School Book would not be endangered by the FBI"?

The following investigation was conducted by SA CLARENCE E. NEWTON, JR.:

At Castle Air Force Base, California

On 1/28/64, HAROLD KORSLUND, -OSI, advised that Lt. JAMES R. OSWALD, AFSN 70450A, was temporarily assigned to the 329th Bomb. Sq. as a student until 3/5/64. From a review of records regarding OSWALD at this base, there is no indication of any connection between him and deceased subject.

On 1/28/64, Lt. JAMES R. OSWALD advised that he was assigned to Carswell Air Force Base at the time of the assassination of former President KENNEDY, and in fact, was attempting to obtain a transfer from this base because of having the same name as OSWALD. He said he is no relation whatsoever to the subject, has never been remotely acquainted with him, and had no connection whatsoever with LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

MR. WILLIAM BRANNIGAN of Bureau called at 10:45 AM 2/3/64 in connection with the allegation that SA HOSTY's name, telephone number and his car license number with one digit off were found among the effects of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. BRANNIGAN stated the Bureau had previously learned that SA HOSTY furnished his name and telephone number to Mrs. PAINE, and that SA HOSTY did not know how Mrs. PAINE or MARINA OSWALD got the license number of his car. He guessed the fact that when he was out in the area, one or both of them might have copied it down. Mr. BRANNIGAN requested we interrogate Mrs. PAINE re this.

I advised Mr. BRANNIGAN that Mrs. PAINE had been interviewed and that she has stated she did not copy down the license number of HOSTY's car. BRANNIGAN asked if we had ever asked Mrs. PAINE how LEE HARVEY OSWALD got the name and address. He was told that Mrs. PAINE said she gave it to him and told him the date that HOSTY was out there, and it bears the date November 1, but we have never asked MARINA about the license number. I advised BRANNIGAN that I thought if Mrs. PAINE had given it to him, she would have told us. Mrs. PAINE did give HOSTY's name and telephone number of OSWALD, but she did not copy down the license number, and thinks MARINA might have obtained it.

Mr. BRANNIGAN stated the following is the way above information is going to be set out in a brief for the Director:

Mrs. PAINE said she gave HOSTY's name and telephone number to OSWALD. She did not copy down the license. She does not know how OSWALD got this. Mrs. PAINE does think that MARINA might have and Dallas has not yet questioned MARINA as to how this was obtained.

LEAD: When Mrs. OSWALD returns to Dallas, question her as to how HOSTY's car license number was obtained.
