LEO GAUTHIER called from the Bureau at 8:50 AM today and stated he needs more maps. He referred to the contour map which had been marked up, and he wants a clean one. He referred to sheet #1, showing the dimensions and gradings plan of Dealey Plaza. It is a scale of 1 to 20, drawn on 12/30/39. There are a couple of numbers under that - 482 written in ink, and below this is number 2D5-1.1. We probably got this about Dec. 3 or 4. It was prepared for the Dallas Park Board by HARE & HARE. It is about 20" X 24" and is not a blueprint. It is a contour map. We obtained most of this on 12/3/63 from Mr. MONROE MC CORKLE, Assistant Director of Public Works.

Mr. GAUTHIER said he is supposed to describe the Dealey Square, including the width of the street, curve of the street, etc. He requested that he be furnished the height of the buildings that border Dealey Square. He said the Building Inspectors might have the over-all height of the buildings. The buildings of which he wants the height are following:

- Texas School Book Depository Bldg.
- Dal Tex Bldg.
- Dallas County Records Bldg.
- Dallas County Court House
- Dallas County Criminal Courts and Jail Bldg.
- Post Office Bldg.
- Small Pioneer House
- New steel structure

On the west side of the Plaza there is nothing but the underpass and railroad. Mr. GAUTHIER said he did not need to have the overall height of that.

Mr. GAUTHIER also wants a general description of Dealey Plaza, when it was built, etc. SA CARTER advised him that the Dallas County Historical Society probably would be able to furnish this.

Mr. GAUTHIER requested that he be sent a couple of Enco maps.

I then talked with Inspector MALLEY who stated that with regard to witnesses to be interviewed by the President's Commission, it is not desirable for the FBI to be lining up any of these witnesses for them and tying us in with their activities to that extent. If they can't find somebody, we will try to help them out to extent of telling them where they reside or work and they can make arrangements to interview them.

Mr. MALLEY stated that Mr. LEIBLER of the President's Commission is coming to Dallas and requested of MALLEY that he be furnished photos of RUBY and OSWALD. These are being furnished to USA BAREFOOT SANDERS, 3/20/64 for Mr. LEIBLER upon his arrival in Dallas.

Regarding the mock-up which will arrive from Washington about 11:00 AM today, care of USA SANDERS' office, MALLEY instructed that Bureau personnel uncrate and set this up. The mock-up includes a drawer underneath with a key, and Mr. GAUTHIER instructed that all models be locked in this drawer when model not being used so that people won't walk away with same as souvenirs.

I advised that Mr. SANDERS would call this office when the mock-up arrives and Bureau personnel would handle the setting up of same.

This is to advise that on 3/19/64, Mr. C. J. PRICE, Administrator, Parkland Memorial Hospital, Dallas, Texas, advised his telephone number is ME 1-5050. He stated a letter had been received by the hospital addressed to "Custodian of Records" from the Commission which is investigating the assassination of President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY. This letter was signed by Mr. RANKIN and three similar letters were addressed to "Operating Room Personnel" not further identified. Mr. PRICE stated these letters advised that ALLEN SPECTER would arrive in Dallas on 3/20/64 and the letters contained attachments explaining the purpose of the investigating committee and copies of the laws that they were operating under. He said he had furnished copies of all reports and other information in the hospital records to the FBI, Secret Service, and CIA, and he felt that since he was not personally bonded that he would require the Commission to obtain any additional records by means of subpoena duces tecum.

Mr. PRICE said he was merely advising the FBI so they would be aware that the Commission is conducting an independent investigation. No action is being taken and this is merely a matter of record.

Section Chief WILLIAM BRANNIGAN called at 4:00 PM today and referred to report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING dated 3/10/64. He stated pages 45 and 46 contain a listing of the evidentiary material, and items 232 through 248 and items C, D, E, J and K are marked deleted. Mr. BELMONT raises the question, "Why were they deleted?" The impression can be received that we are holding back something from the Commission, unless there is an explanation in the report. The Bureau does not desire that the Commission ask any questions about this, and Dallas should either furnish amended pages 45 and 46 and renumber the exhibits so that all exhibits are accounted for, or else we should explain why some of the exhibits are missing. We can point out for example that C is the same as D, or whatever the situation is. This is much more preferable to explain it than to mark it deleted. He stated after items C, D, E, J & K, these are marked deleted.

Mr. BRANNIGAN also referred to item AA on page 46. We show this as being a letter in Russian from the U. S. State Dept. The Bureau cannot identify this letter, but the possibility exists that we are making reference to the last page of exhibit U, which is described as a letter in Russian from U. S. State Dept. to MARINA OSWALD. This exhibit U as they have it at the Bureau is a 4-page letter in Russian from the U. S. State Dept. to MARINA OSWALD. The Bureau notes that page 3 ends with a signature, and the 4th page starts off (Mr. BRANNIGAN didn't finish this). We are to take a look at exhibit U and count the pages. Determine whether 3 or 4 pages. If we only have 3 pages, then better identify AA. It might be that it was the 4th page of exhibit U. Bureau cannot identify item AA. This letter is not translated.

Instead of using word "deleted", state this has been reported as item _____ in _____

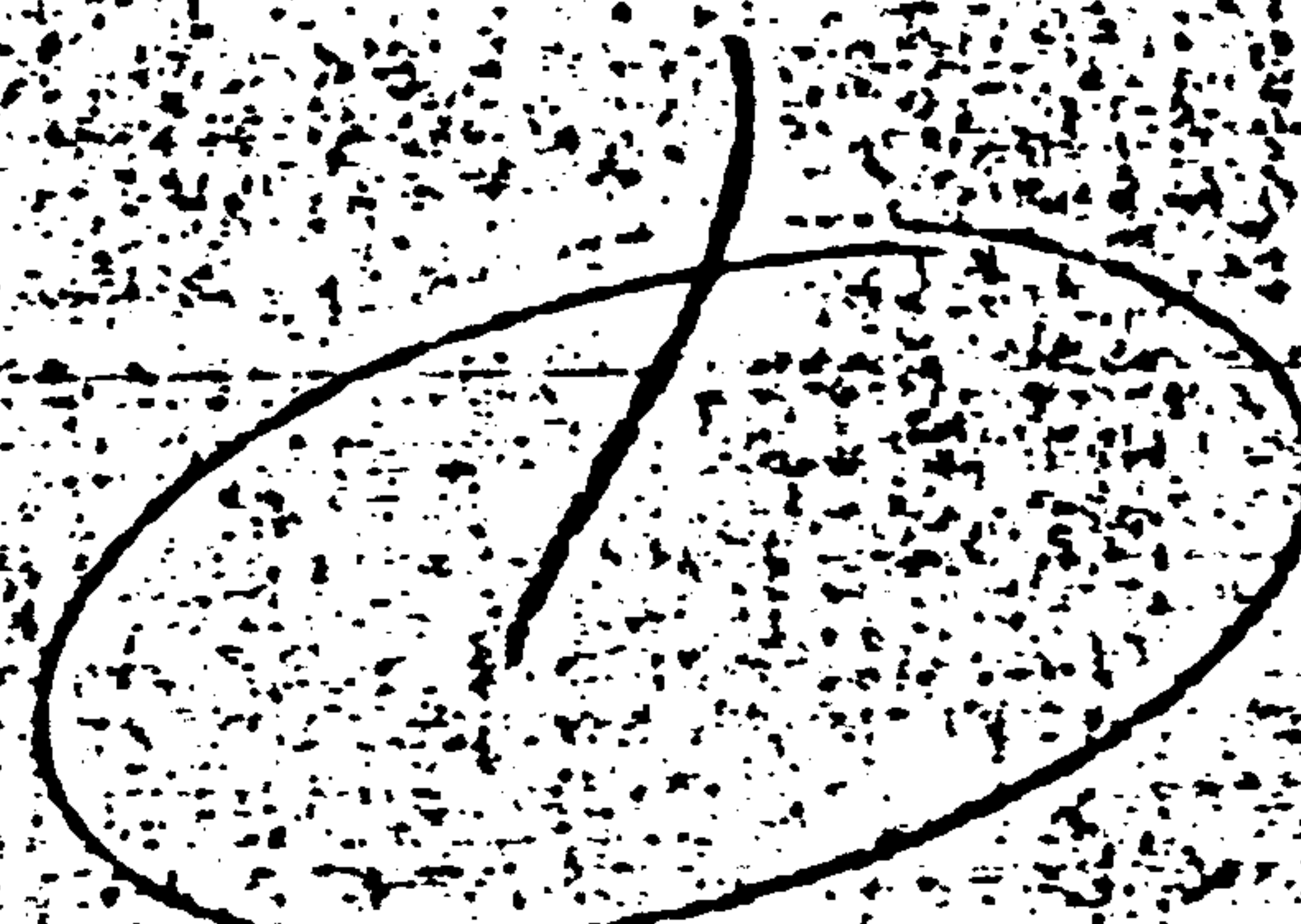
At approximately 8:30 A.M. this date, Inspector MALLEY telephonically advised that "yesterday there was a story in the Dallas papers indicating that BELLI went to Mexico..... Some character in Dallas called the State Department yesterday and the State Department called the Bureau." MR. MALLEY was advised by SAC SHANKLIN that according to the newspapers, BELLI has been dismissed as attorney.

MR. MALLEY further said an allegation had been received that an individual in Irving, Texas, has made comment to the effect that he observed OSWALD on one occasion wearing gold colored leather shoes and during the discussion with OSWALD, OSWALD said he got the shoes in Mexico. The Commission indicated they have not run across any exhibit to that effect, that he did have such shoes, or if such shoes were available. MR. MALLEY was advised by SAC SHANKLIN that all outer clothes and all of OSWALD's shoes were sent to the Laboratory. Also, that if we did have them, that they have been sent to the Laboratory.

Inspector J. R. MALLEY advised today that in talking to the Commission this date, it was indicated that they were going to send teams of two or three lawyers into Dallas, possibly beginning next week, for the purpose of taking depositions. They have contacted USA BAREFOOT SANDERS for some possible space in the Federal Bldg. He doesn't know the result. They also brought up to him the fact that they might be wanting to contact the FBI here for help, and he suggested that they talk to me or ASAC CLARK. He stated that if they wanted any mammoth project or any real big deal, we should take it up with the Bureau, but that possibly they might just want to know where a witness could be located or how to get in touch with him. We will just have to use our own judgment on the requests they make.

They also pointed out that the majority of the reports in these cases have been written by GEMBERLING and CLEMENTS and wanted to know if they would be available for help. MALLEY stated he told them that they would be available somewhere in the area. I pointed out to him that we certainly didn't want CLEMENTS or GEMBERLING over helping them take the depositions or assisting them, and he agreed.

A meeting sponsored by the "National Guardian" was held at Town Hall, 113-123 West 43rd Street, New York City on Tuesday Feb 18, 1964. The meeting started at 8:15 and ended at 10:45 P.M. A gentlemen who seemed to be in charge of Town Hall (a regular employee) pleaded with people to be patient about entering, etc. - as there were 1500 seats available - At 6:45 P.M. the last ticket at \$2.50 was sold and a sign posted at the Box Office window "Loge seats only- \$5.00 per ticket". The Hall was sold out to full capacity and there were a few standees in the lobby.

Mr. JAMES ARONSON addressed the audience to explain the hardships the "Guardian" had experienced in securing the Hall for the meeting. He stated that in January a contract or reservation had been made for Feb. 18th - But a short time before the meeting, DEAN DRAKE, from the Board of Trustees, at N.Y.U. decided to rescind the contract. After much negotiation, N.Y.U. asked for a bond of \$25,000. Then Mr. JAMES HESTER, President of N.Y.U., still not pleased with the subject matter for the meeting- rescinded the contract. After much-to-do the "National Guardian" took their difficulties to EDWARD ENNIS, of the National Civil Liberties Union- who lent his assistance in securing the Hall, but the "National Guardian" had to deposit \$25,000 in cash at the bank as security against damage, etc. Mr. ARONSON stated that the complete story of National Guardian's controversy with N.Y.U. would be published in the "National Guardian" issue of Feb. 21st. Mr. ENNIS was in the audience, he was asked to stand up and received due applause. There were 50 seats allotted to the Press, local, National, and foreign. There were many photographers on the stage- The first 3 rows were reserved for the Press. A very attractive dark-haired young woman, acting somewhat like "head-usher" challenged the Press for seat arrangements, and she gave to each Press person an envelope, which contained a copy of Mr. LANE's brief and other pertinent information. It was announced that there were more envelopes in the lobby but not enough to go around and they were snatched up by those more accessible to the table and pre-knowledge of the contents.

Mr. ARONSON introduced Professor DAVID HABER, instructor of law at Rutgers University, chairman of the meeting. Prof. HABER started to speak with what sounded like a British accent,

then gradually relaxed into what sounded like a German or Russian accent. He talked about the assassination of Mr. KENNEDY as appearing as a conspiracy, or a Federal conspiracy- and he was of the opinion that enough action has not been taken to ferret out the participants in the conspiracy. That the U.S. government has been too lax in its efforts and investigation of the assassination and the Secret Service and the F.B.I. should have done a better job of bringing the participants to justice. He was of the opinion that some people in high places are trying to sweep the evidence "under the rug" instead of bringing it out into the open. That the U.S. stands to lose prestige abroad and confidence at home by not having this problem solved in the legal and traditional way.

Professor HABER introduced Professor STAUGHTON LYND, - who teaches American History at a college somewhere in Atlanta, - and stated that Professor LYND expects to teach or fill the chair in the History department at Yale U. next semester.

Professor LYND spoke about the article "Seeds of Doubt" carried in "New Republic" issue of Dec. 21, which he, JACK MINNIS, and RICHARD DUDMAN, (the Washington correspondent of the St. Louis Post-Dispatch) wrote. Prof. LYND stated the Alfred Dreyfus case was analogous to the LEE OSWALD case in the assassination of Pres. KENNEDY. Prof. LYND appears to be a sincere, young American person, deeply interested in justice and the American way of life. During the question and answer period a reporter questioned Prof. LYND as to his statement that Chief Justice WARREN was dishonest. Prof. LYND replied that he merely used the Dreyfus case as an analogy to illustrate that records may get lost, become mixed up, and often get to the wrong people, and if the LEE OSWALD case is allowed to drag on without an honest and thorough investigation that mistakes can happen- "Mistakes, that even you, or I, or the Chief Justice could make."

RICHARD DUDMAN was supposed to be on the stage- He was asked to take a bow but his seat was behind the lectern, and not many people could see him. (This could have been JACK MINNIS and not RICHARD DUDMAN- they mentioned so many names so many times in connection with this article-)

The next speaker was Mr. MARK LANE, the attorney for Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD, secured for her through the "National Guardian." He spoke about various radio broadcasts, press reports, and their many contradictions. Contradictions and changes, which he believed were brought about by the F.B.I. and the Secret Service, and then the local police in Dallas- who were suppressed by some one in higher authority. He also spoke about the article in Life Magazine by WALDO?? He stated that a MARY WOODWORTH from the Dallas paper reported the gun shots came from the overpass. Four witnesses questioned by F.B.I. Mr. LANE has been in Dallas and has retraced the late President's motorcade route, and has interviewed people who were on the street when the assassination occurred. Mr. LANE interviewed a teacher in Dallas - she said she had been followed- taken by F.B.I. She repeatedly stated that there were 4 to 6 shots fired- She had taken snapshots of the motorcade and the incident. Her film was confiscated and has never been returned. Mr. LANE played his tape recording machine - and the lady speaking says 3 shots- 3 shells- etc., and is indignat because Secret Service and F.B.I. acted as if she was stupid or an idiot, so she said she stopped talking. On the tape Mr. LANE is interviewing a lady- and one of his questions starts "And Miss HILL"--Mr. LANE has recordings of his interviews. "Bullet hit her side"- "and she was on the side where the Book Depository is located"- (FBI made so much fun of her, she shut up- or the Secret Service). Mr. LANE spoke of the taxicab driver "DARRYL CLICK" who was supposed to have driven LEE OSWALD to his room to change his clothes and pick up another gun. He said the Taxicab Assn and the Union have no such person as "DARRYL CLICK" and he has not been located. Mr. LANE further stated that F.B.I. Agent HOSTEE investigated LEE OSWALD the week before Mr. KENNEDY was due in Dallas. F.B.I. knew all about him, his living conditions, and that he worked at the Book Depository Bldg. "So they let LEE OSWALD walk along the street with an Italian carbine wrapped in a brown paper, how silly can one get." Mr. LANE drew outlines on a blackboard indicating and showing how impossible it was for LEE OSWALD to fire the shots from the 6th floor of Book Depository Bldg.

Mr. LANE spoke about OSWALD's association with "Fair Play for Cuba"- Mr. LANE has collected information from Chicago, Dallas and also has a copy of an article that he said was published in Dallas the day before the assassination but has disappeared since

the assassination. Mr. LANE secured his copy from an Italian newspaper- This article has two side view sketches of Mr. KENNEDY and is headed "Wanted for Treason"- Mr. LANE spoke about BERNARD WEISSMAN, Officer TIPPITT and a third person ("whom I will not mention now" said Mr. LANE.) who met in the Carousel, the week before the assassination. The Carousel is the strip-tease club owned and operated by JACK RUBY. Mr. LANE spoke about the bullets and their paths of entry- and how the local police had reported one direction of entry- saying they should know as they handle shootings daily- After a newspaper woman had inquired from a Mr. PERRY in Dallas he changed his theory and said they were exit bullets- He made much about the third bullet that was found on the caisson under Mr. KENNEDY's back after he had died. This "found bullet" would account for the third shot- but he claims this incident was also hushed up.

ANNETTE T. RUBENSTEIN was the next speaker- She is a professor at N.Y.U. and is an author of several books. She spoke about injustice and indifference to the fate of individuals. She said the "National Guardian" has always stood for fair play for all citizens.- She emphasized the "Guardian's" efforts in behalf of the 6 Negroes in Trenton in 1948- railroaded for robbery, rape and murder. Also for ANNA LOUISE STRONG- falsely condemned without being heard. The ROSENBERG Case- falsely accused as spies- SOBEL still in prison - flimsy evidence- Then she spoke about the \$25,000 in cash which the "Guardian" posted for the meeting to take place. This money was not all of the "Guardian" She asked for contributions- starting with a request for \$500- (more) then \$100 (several) coming down to \$45, to \$1. etc. and then change which the ushers were not prepared to handle as no baskets went by-

She made a quotation from either FALPH WALDO EMERSON or HOREAU, about "Freedom of speech and freedom of conscience but having the prudence not to use either one-". She appealed to people to write to their Congressmen to defeat the budget allowance to the "Un-American Activities Committee" as this committee is opposed to American Bill of Rights.

Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD was the next speaker. She wore a trim black outfit - high heel black shoes, and black leather gloves. She received quite an ovation from the audience - some giving her a standing ovation. She spoke about the counsel engaged for her daughter-in-law being unfavorable to the F.B.I. and the Secret Service. She said she had appealed to Mr. RANKIN in Washington, and to President JOHNSON, to give her son the right to a fair investigation but received no help so she wrote to the Guardian and Mr. LANE volunteered. She stated that she had known that her son LEE was a Marxist, etc., but she always felt he had a right to his opinion as every one else has. She claimed that a proper investigation will prove that her son was a member of the C.I.A. and the F.B.I. She further stated that in 1959 after receiving letters from her son from Russia she went to Washington - with some of these letters - and they admitted he belonged to C.I.A." but sometimes their people defect too."

Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD stated that she had documents to prove her statements. She invited the newsmen to research the press reports for 1959 to prove her statement. She kept repeating "that I believe in the American way" - and all she wants is "the American way" to prove her son innocent - She also stated that "MARINA and I loved LEE, just as much as Mrs. KENNEDY loved her husband". She said that when some one pressed her for a reply to the question "Did you send Mrs. KENNEDY a message of condolence". She replied, "No, because she didn't send me any." No one took her up on the sequence of deaths here. Mrs. OSWALD made remarks to the effect that MARINA was kept incommunicado for 9 weeks and now all her testimony has been changed. Mr. LANE said this too.

There were so many photographers one people in the audience got annoyed while Mrs. OSWALD was speaking and the audience shouted at the photographers to move because they were sick of them. But MARGUERITE didn't mind - she said she will keep pestering people in high places until her son receives the investigation done in the American way. She said that she has received more than 1500 letters of help - All letters are answered personally. Her address is P. O. Box 9578, Fort Worth, Texas.

One of the reporters directed a question to Mrs. OSWALD. He was slow in forming his question and was urged by Mr. LANE to hurry on as the meeting had to be adjourned soon - The question started - "The press reports you many divorces ----" The crowd shouted at him- one woman kept saying- "you animal, you animal"- Mr. LANE asked them not to do it- "do not let it be said, we fight among ourselves"- MARGUERITE was willing to answer the question- she seemed more than willing- but the audience disturbance didn't permit it- One gentleman a former resident of Dallas could not understand how LEE OSWALD got to the theater where he was captured in such a short time- and the place where he reportedly boarded the bus- When the head usher was finished admonishing the little reporter who asked MARGUERITE about her divorces- this Dallas person asked his question- The little reporter with the big question threw his coat down and exclaimed "You communists are all alike"- This same reporter had a small tape recorder on the stage just below the lectern- besides he had a camera too.

As the people left the meeting it was really snowing and then raining.

The following was telephonically given to Supvr. LOEFFLER at 2 P.M.

Reference was made to letter dated 3/20/64, from RANKIN.

"As you know, among the many allegations appearing in the press has been the assertion that one or more of the shots fired at the President came from the vicinity of the triple overpass, toward which the car was headed.

"We would like your Bureau to interview all those persons who were in the vicinity of the triple overpass and the adjoining railroad tracks. These interviews should include not only their recollection of the shooting itself, but also their recollection as to who else they saw in the vicinity and whether there were any actions of a suspicious nature after the shooting, such as running away, sudden departure by auto, et cetera. The Commission feels that a thorough investigation of the triple overpass area is of extreme importance in view of the wide circulation received by the stories mentioned above."

MR. MALLEY added that initially there was much speculation that possibly someone had fired a shot from the overpass which has caused the Commission to request the foregoing. He states that Supervisor DICK ROGGE and himself have read considerable concerning people

near and around the bridge and perhaps additional information will be forthcoming on interviews conducted recently. MR. MALLEY requested that we identify the portions in the report wherein persons were interviewed who were on the overpass, namely, any police officers, news media representatives, or railroad police, or civilians who may have been at the overpass. MR. MALLEY stated that he would like to have enough information to avoid our having to retrack our steps to comply with the Commission's request as set out above.

MR. MALLEY feels that this can be done by citing the areas in the report where these people were interviewed. Importantly, he wanted to know "did we interview everyone lawfully on the bridge." Further, "do we know of anyone who hasn't been interviewed."

MR. MALLEY stated he would like an answer to the above, however, if it entails a long teletype, it may be preferable to call him, or DICK ROGGE in his absence.
