Re Bureau airtel to Dallas and New Orleans, 3/24/64, enclosing a letter from the President's Commission dated March 20, 1964, requesting additional investigation.

A copy of this referenced airtel and the President's Commission letter is attached.

The following additional information is set forth for possible assistance in conducting the required investigation.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD's half-brother, JOHN EDWARD PICK, was born January 17, 1932. His brother, ROBERT LEE OSWALD, was born April 7, 1934. LEE HARVEY OSWALD was born October 18, 1939.

A review of the file in instant case reflects the following residence addresses for LEE HARVEY OSWALD since approximately 1945:

4801 Victor, Dallas, Texas -- where he resided for approximately one and one-half years prior to moving to Fort Worth. On April 18, 1945, he was residing at 4801 Victor, as indicated by Parkland Memorial Hospital records.

Grandbury Road, Route # 45, Benbrook, Texas, February 8, 1946 -- this is substantiated by treatment he received at the Harris Hospital from February 8, 1946, to February 12, 1946.

1505 8th Avenue, Fort Worth, Texas, January 27, 1947.

From the above, it appears that OSWALD could have attended a nursery school in Dallas, Texas, while residing at 4801 Victor, Dallas, Texas, and thereafter in early 1946 at Benbrook where he resided at Grandbury Road, Route Number 45.

There is attached to instant memo Verifax copies of pertinent interviews previously conducted, which should be thoroughly reviewed for assistance in conducting the requested investigation in referenced airtel. Immediately upon completing the requested investigation, appropriate FD-302's on multilith with two flimsy copies should be submitted in order that the desk may thereafter prepare the appropriate letterhead memorandum.

Mr. GEORGE SCATTERDAY, Acting No. 1, Division 6, made the following telephonic inquiries 3:00 PM this date.

Mr. SCATTERDAY referred to our airtel of the 25th enclosing the signed statements obtained from individuals at the Texas School Book Depository. The Bureau desires to know the following:

(1) Does the list of individuals interviewed contain any interviews not previously reported? If so, please identify. (Mr. SCATTERDAY was advised it did not contain any individuals not previously interviewed.)

(2) Do the statements furnished differ in any way with the information previously obtained and reported? If so, identify and point out differences. (Mr. SCATTERDAY was advised that the statements were taken in conjunction with the previous 302's and there were no discrepancies or additional information.)

(3) Mr. SCATTERDAY stated that if there was no difference, these statements would be furnished as they were received to the Commission and it would not be necessary for Dallas to furnish the statements in report form.

(4) Mr. SCATTERDAY made reference to the interview of STEVE WILSON being conducted at Corpus Christi, and requested that upon receipt of his signed statement, it be compared with the previous interview to insure there are no discrepancies or point out any additional information developed.

Mr. SCATTERDAY instructed that Dallas answer above questions by airtel and also advise as to the results of the check on WILSON's statement. In addition, the airtel should state that the statements obtained will not be placed in report form inasmuch as there are no differences or additional information.

On February 10, 1964 at Town Hall, 123 West 43rd Street, New York City, "An Inquiry into the Oswald Case" was held under the sponsorship of the "National Guardian." There were approximately 1,500 persons present.

The principal speakers for the evening and their pertinent remarks follow:

JAMES ARONSON, who described himself as editor of the "National Guardian," opened the meeting and described the difficult time the Guardian had in contracting with Town Hall officials for the use of the hall once it was announced that Mrs. MARQUERITE OSWALD would appear on the program.

ARONSON stated that the "National Guardian" utilized the services of the American Civil Liberties Union in forcing Town Hall to honor their agreement -- but not until after \$25,000 was placed in escrow against any physical damage done to the hall as a result of the meeting.

ARONSON introduced DAVID HABER as chairman of the evening. ARONSON described HABER as a Professor of Law at Rutgers University and a former law clerk for Justice HUGO BLACK of the Supreme Court.

HABER merely stated that the primary reason for his appearance was to express his opinion that more publicity of the "Oswald Case" was necessary in order to remove the aura of secrecy which surrounded the case.

HAPER introduced STAUGHTON LYND and JACK MENNES, co-authors of the "New Republic" article, "Seeds of Doubt." HAPER stated that LYND, professor of History at a college in Atlanta, Georgia, who would "next year" teach history at Yale University, would be the next speaker.

LYND began by qualifying himself as an American Revolutionary history specialist and opened with a criticism of the investigation of the OSWALD case. He described it as a "Hollywood production." LYND went into detail concerning the autopsy reports submitted on President KENNEDY, alleging that contradictions and discrepancies existed as to where the bullet entered and left the President's body.

LYND alleged that the Warren Commission instead of actually investigating the case on its own, independently, would, instead, accept FBI reports carte blanche when, in fact, the FBI was an interested party. LYND called this a gross dereliction of duty.

LYND alleged that certain, unspecified, government sources were seeking to conceal the conspiracy that resulted in President KENNEDY's death. He noted that the United States had lied about the U-2 incident, the Bay of Pigs disaster, and now the assassination of a President.

LYND was followed by MARK LANE whom LYND described as a civil rights attorney and fighter for tenant rights who had volunteered to defend LEE OSWALD.

LANE criticized the investigation conducted by the F.B.I., the Secret Service and the Dallas Police Department. He referred to affidavits allegedly obtained by him from sources in the Dallas Police Department and District Attorney's Office. He used blackboard drawings to present three possible versions of how President KENNEDY

could have been shot. His three possibilities were intended to show that OSWALD did not fire the first of the alleged three shots fired -- and, consequently, raised as a possibility the existence of a second marksman.

LANE played a tape recording of what he described as a telephone conversation he had with a "Miss Hill" of Dallas who said that she heard four to six shots.

LANE stated that an exhaustive search failed to turn up the taxi driver who was supposed to have transported OSWALD.

LANE stated that a paraffin test taken on OSWALD's face indicated that he had not fired the rifle. LANE flatly charged that the RIFLE supposedly used by OSWALD could not do what the F.B.I. and others said it could.

LANE said that the F.B.I.'s answer to why they had not followed OSWALD on the day of the assassination was that their jurisdiction was limited to investigation of spies and saboteurs and did not extend to investigation of non-conformists.

LANE said that one week before the assassination, BERNARD WEISSMAN, Patrolman TIBBETT and a third unnamed individual met at JACK RUBY's Carousel Club. LANE stated that he would reveal the identity of the third man in one week.

ANNETTE T. RUBINSTEIN was the next speaker. She was described as a former New York University teacher. She sought contributions for the "National Guardian" and asked those present to write their congressman in protest against the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

Mrs. OSWALD spoke last. She declared her son free of guilt and declared that justice had not been done in the investigation of the killing of her son. MRS. OSWALD thanked LANE and the "National Guardian" for their aid.

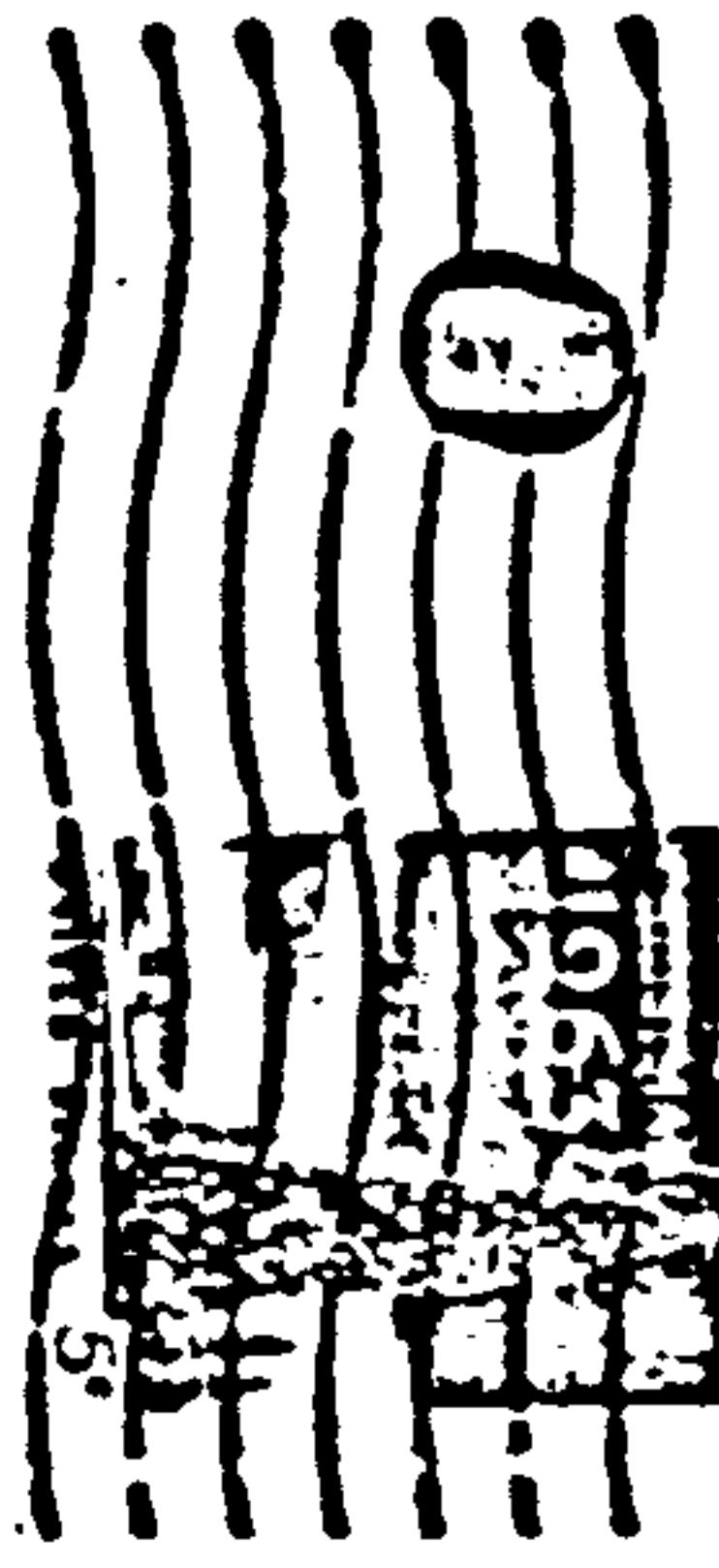
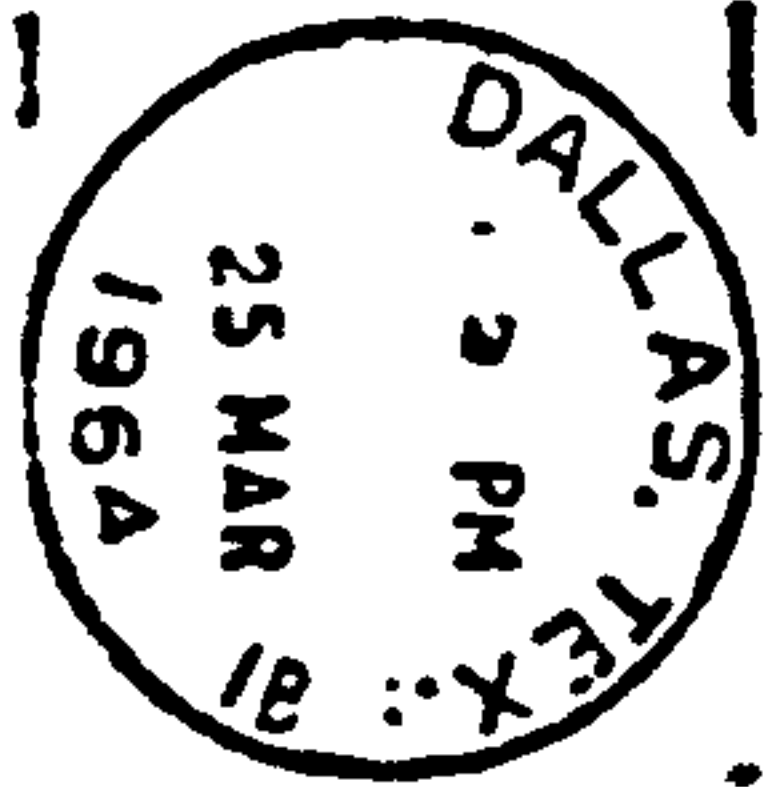

At 9:10 PM on 3-27-64 ED McDONOUGH, Mr. ROSEN'S Office, called.

The Bureau wants results of following investigation for delivery to the President's Commission no later than 3-31-64:

Bulab has processed a number of cartons, or parts of cartons, which were obtained from the area adjacent to the sixth floor window of the TSDB from which the fatal shots emanated. McDONOUGH did not know whether these were submitted by us, or obtained and given the Lab in some other manner.

In any event the Lab has processed them and come up with 19 identifiable latent fingerprint and 6 latent palm print impressions, not identified with OSWALD.

(1) Did any agency, local or federal, take elimination prints from all employees of the TSDB, especially those who would be working around cartons anywhere? If so, obtain these cards, or ascertain where they are.

(2) If above is negative we are to obtain the names of all employees of the TSDB as of 11-22-63, along with sufficient identifying information concerning each to permit a logical search of their names through the Identification Division. McDONOUGH emphasized we are not to make any effort to obtain fingerprints of all these employees - the idea being to take the names and identifying data and see if any of them have prints already in Ident. Those prints so found will be compared with the above mentioned latents.

McDONOUGH said Dallas had taken signed statements from some 72 employees of the TSDB. These should be checked, and if there is sufficient information in them to permit a good search through Ident, an additional contact with these parties is not necessary. The Bureau can just be referred to the information in the signed statement.

Where no signed statement has been taken, or it is found there is not enough information in it, or submitted in conjunction with it, then the person must be recontacted to obtain this information.

I attempted to learn from McDONOUGH whether the Bureau wanted the above information on all employees of the TSD as of 11-22-64, including clerical, etc., or only on those which it can be determined would logically handle cartons somewhere in the building. He was a little vague on this, but thought we would have to get the information only on those who would logically handle cartons, since the prints, as available, are apparently to be used for elimination purposes; i.e., if all the latents found can be identified as those of employees, that will eliminate the possibility they were made by some outside accomplice. This point is something which should be clarified with the Bureau before we submit our final results.

On 3/25/64 Mrs. DOROTHY DUES, 2220 Colcord Avenue, Waco, Texas, telephonically advised the San Antonio Office that she has a friend, Mrs. LOUISE VANDEVORT, a registered nurse who lives in Waco, and on Monday night 3/23/64 Mrs. VANDEVORT informed her that she has a friend; who she did not identify, and this friend has a daughter who is employed as a telephone operator in Dallas, Texas. This daughter told her mother, who told Mrs. VANDERVORT, who told Mrs. DUES that about 20 minutes before President KENNEDY was assassinated a long distance telephone call was received by the Dallas, Texas Police Department from Chicago stating that President KENNEDY was going to be killed.

Mrs. VANDERVORT that about 20 minutes before President KENNEDY was shot she received a call from Chicago, Illinois, and the caller stated that the President would be shot in 20 minutes. Mrs. DUES said that the cafeteria where they were eating was very noisy and that Mrs. VANDERVORT was talking in very low tones and it was necessary for her to ask Mrs. VANDERVORT to repeat her conversation on several occasions. Mrs. DUES said that after thinking about this conversation overnight she decided to call and report the matter to the authorities. She said that she did not contact Mrs. VANDERVORT to determine she had heard her correctly.

On 3/25/64 Mrs. LOUISE VANDERVORT, 2020 Colcord Ave., Waco, Texas, who is employed as a registered nurse at the Hillcrest Hospital in Waco was interviewed by SA T. G. MC WILLIAMS, JR. and advised that she has a friend by the name of Mrs. FOSTER, who is an aid at Hillcrest Hospital and with whom she rides to work each day. She said that Mrs. FOSTER has a daughter who is employed as a PBX operator at the Dallas, Texas PD. daughter, RUTH LEE FOSTER, who is employed as a PBX operator at the City Hall in Dallas, Texas. Her daughter resides at 608 Willowood Street in Lancaster, Texas. Mrs. FOSTER said that her daughter was on duty the day that OSWALD was killed and shortly after OSWALD was killed her daughter told her that about 15 or 20 minutes after OSWALD was killed she received a long distance telephone call from a lady in Chicago, Illinois, who informed her that she had pictures of OSWALD's murder. Mrs. FOSTER said that her daughter did not tell her what action she took with respect to this call. Her daughter also told her that about 15 or 20 minutes after OSWALD was killed the switchboard at the City Hall was so swamped with telephone calls that it was necessary to call in other pbx operators to handle the calls. Mrs. FOSTER said that she did not tell Mrs. VANDERVORT that the caller from Chicago told her daughter that "OSWALD would not get out alive," nor did she tell anyone that this call warned that President KENNEDY was going to be assassinated.

The above information is being recorded on FD-302s and will be made a part of the report being submitted by the San Antonio Office. No further investigation is being made in connection with this incident and it is being left up to the discretion of the Dallas Office as to whether or not RUTH LEE FOSTER should be interviewed.

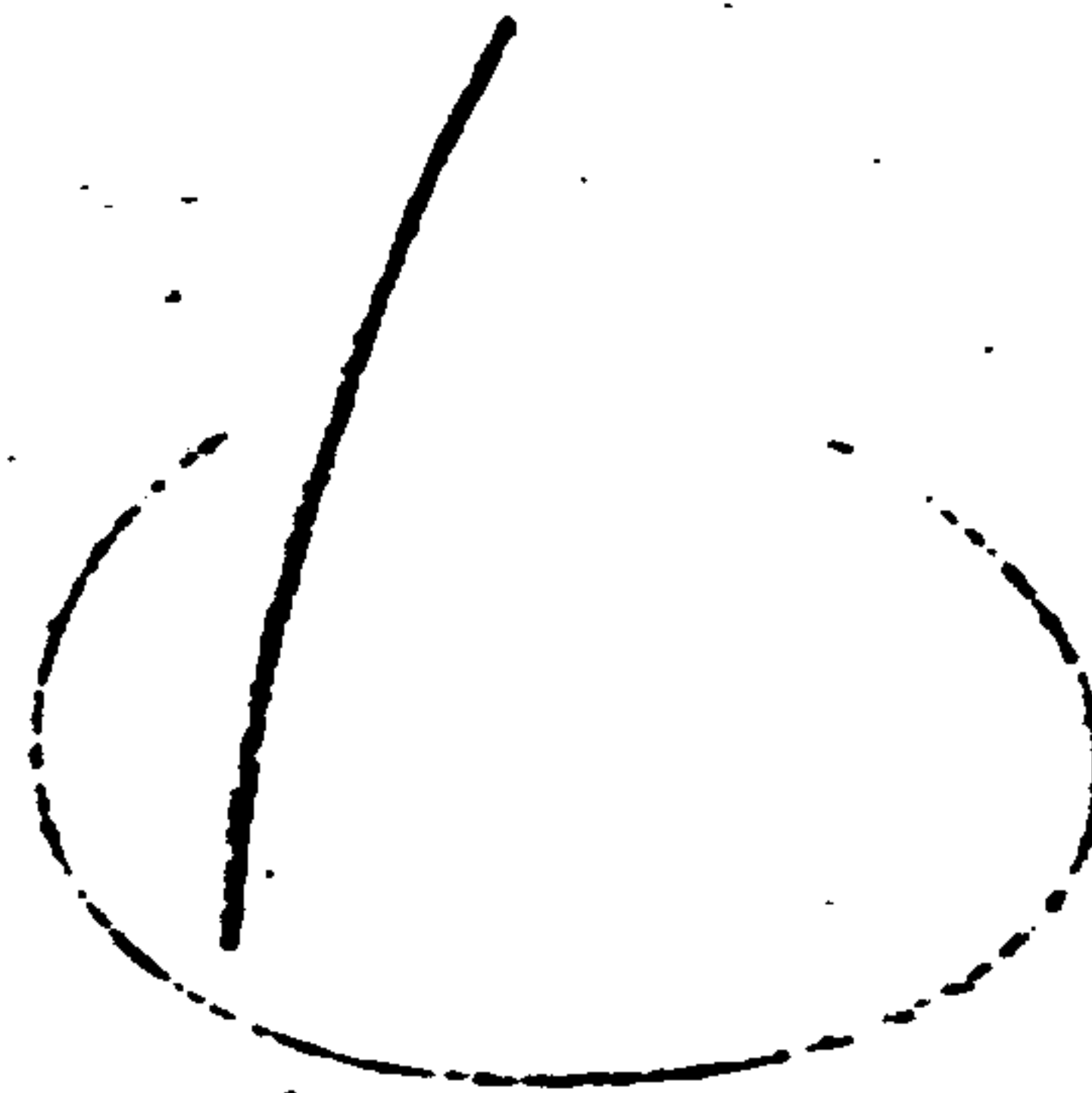

Lt. Carl Day of the Dallas PD advised this date that they had turned over all of the .38 caliber slugs and hulls that had been recovered from the revolver that Oswald used to kill Tippit. He stated that as far as he knew and the records of the Dallas PD reflect that the FBI is in possession of the recovered hulls and slugs. He stated that it is very possible that the slugs and hulls to this revolver were never found. Day states that the Dallas PD does not have any further information as to what may have happened to the other slug and hull if there was one that was fired which was unknown to them. Day pointed out that the hulls were found by individuals in the area whose names were previously furnished to this office. Day states that he has checked and they have no additional cartridges hulls or slugs that haven't been turned over previously to the FBI. It was explained to him the reason for making the inquiry and he stated that the Dallas PD could not shed any light on the Bureau's inquiry concerning any other hulls or slugs that might exist.

Supv. ROY H. JEVONS, FBI Laboratory, telephonically contacted this office, 10:30 AM, this date, and referred to Bureau communication concerning the Laboratory analysis of the bullets and cartridge cases surrounding the Officer TIPPETT murder. He stated the Laboratory has 2 cartridge cases of Remington-Peters manufacture and 2 cartridge cases of Western manufacture, which were furnished by the Police Department. In addition, they have 4 bullets reportedly recovered from Officer TIPPETT's body. One bullet is of a Remington-Peters manufacture and the other 3 are of Western manufacture.

From the above, it appears there may be one Western cartridge case missing, or possibly a missing bullet and cartridge case.

The Commission has requested as of this morning that we contact the PD to determine if they have turned over all of the bullets and cartridge cases recovered and that they be advised immediately.

Supv. JEVONS requested a telephonic reply, followed by a teletype today.

Inspector J. R. MALLEY called at 9:10 AM today and referred to Bureau call to Supv. HOWE on Friday night, 3/27/64 regarding latent fingerprints found on cartons at the Texas School Book Depository building. Mr. MALLEY inquired whether anything had been done as far as trying to get an answer on that. The question is whether or not we can or cannot come up with any of the people whose prints were on the cartons and what action has been taken with regard to elimination fingerprints. He mentioned that 19 identifiable latent fingerprints and six identifiable latent palm prints, as well as those of OSWALD were found. The Bureau wants an answer on this by 3/31/64.

I noted that we had obtained the birth date and the names of everyone in connection with the taking of the signed statements and that this would enable the Bureau to make a name search, but that elimination prints were not taken of these people, unless the Dallas PD took them.

Mr. MALLEY inquired as to when the miscellaneous report would be submitted and was told that it would be out today or tomorrow.

I advised Mr. MALLEY that USA SANDERS does not want to keep the reports we have submitted in his office where they would be accessible to employees and wants to return them to the FBI. Mr. MALLEY stated this would be alright and that we should obtain a letter from him, showing the date they were returned; further, they should be retained separately in our office so that when he wants them again, the same copies of reports can be returned to him.

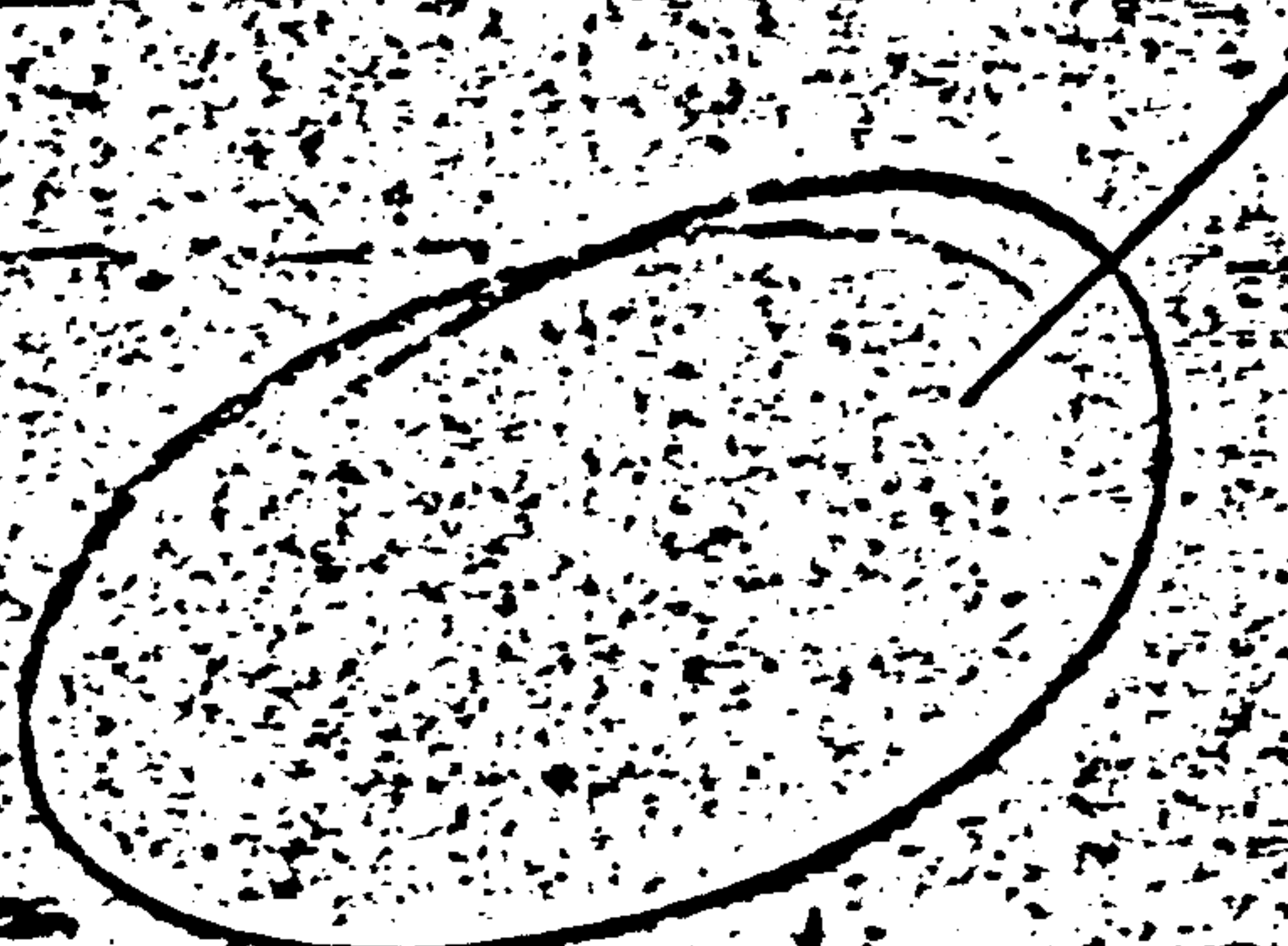

## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD was interviewed at her request at the Hollywood Plaza Hotel, 1637 North Vine Street, Room number 909, and she furnished the following information.

Her permanent residence address is Post Office Box 9578, Fort Worth, Texas. She has been in the Los Angeles area since February 27, 1965 and plans to return to Fort Worth, Texas on March 11, 1965. She has been investigating the alleged responsibility of her son, LEE HARVEY OSWALD for the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, and believes that he was framed. She feels that the Federal Government also shares this view and may be secretly continuing the investigation of the matter; that possibly her son LEE and his wife were secret United States government agents, or that the entire matter was planned by certain people in government to place President JOHNSON in the Office of the Presidency. She considers MICHAEL PAINE her chief suspect as the true assassinator of President KENNEDY.

MICHAEL PAINE had a "second" car, an Oldsmobile, which was parked outside of his residence at 2512 West 5th Street, in Irving, Texas, during 1963, bearing 1963 Texas plates and apparently not used. In late November of 1964, she called the FBI in Fort Worth, and reported the matter to a Mr. CARTER, since she felt it strange that the car was not being used, and still bore 1963 Texas plates. Several weeks later, after she had contacted the FBI, she observed the car to have 1964 Texas plate, NY 9880. She considers this to be very peculiar.

She furnished to the Warren Commission during the course of her testifying a photograph of the assassination scene which she had obtained from an issue of the Saturday Evening Post about five days after the assassination. A copy of this photograph appears with her testimony in Volume 16 of the Warren Commission report. A copy of this photograph also appears in the publication, Four Dark Days In History, pages four and five. The extreme left side of this photograph (as one

(faces the photograph) bears the picture of an individual who she believes to be JACK RUBY. In subsequent photographs appearing in papers and magazines, the segment of the photograph bearing RUBY's picture has been deleted. In the above mentioned photograph bearing RUBY's picture, there is a hand in the vicinity of RUBY's head, and she believes that one of the shots taken at President KENNEDY came from a gun, held in this hand, the identity of this person not known to her. She feels that for some reason, the photograph which she originally furnished the Commission had been altered and she feels this should be investigated to determine the reason for so doing. She feels similarly that the photograph appearing on page 19 of Time magazine, dated February 14, 1964, depicting her son's arrest has been altered and possibly faked, since in various Time publications of a similar date, the face on the right side is partially, and in some instances, completely blacked out. She feels that some ulterior motive prompted the faking or altering of these photographs.

Another thing she feels to be very peculiar is the fact that the Warren Commission gave the wife of her son LEE red carpet treatment during the entire investigation, and the Commission gave her a rough time, in that the members appeared to have a hostile attitude toward her during the course of questioning her. She also feels that for some reason that bears investigation, the photograph of her son LEE appearing on the cover of the February 21, 1964, issue of Life was altered. She was at the PAINE residence on the night of the assassination, and recalled that about 2:00 a.m. on the morning of the following day, PAINE went into a room which she thought at the time was a bedroom, but since has found out the door to the room in question leads to the garage. She feels possibly that his purpose for going into the garage at this time was to plant for some reason, certain photographs of her son LEE which the Dallas Police found when they searched the premises the following Saturday.

Another very suspicious circumstance was the fact that Secret Service Agent MIKE HOWARD advised two reporters in Dallas that at the time of the assassination, he was at the Hotel Texas in Fort Worth when in fact, the assassination photograph showed him to be riding in the car directly behind President KENNEDY's car. Because of this, she questions his integrity, and believes it entirely possible that the Secret Service was involved in some type of conspiracy to get President JOHNSON into the Presidency. She also feels that since the Secret Service took herself, her son ROBERT and LEE's wife into protective custody during the period November 24, 1963, to November 28, 1963, the Secret Service may have known that her son LEE and his wife were secret government agents and for this reason, wanted to protect LEE's wife.

She feels that because of the above, the matter warrants additional investigation, and she plans to continue her efforts to prove her son was framed and did not kill President KENNEDY.

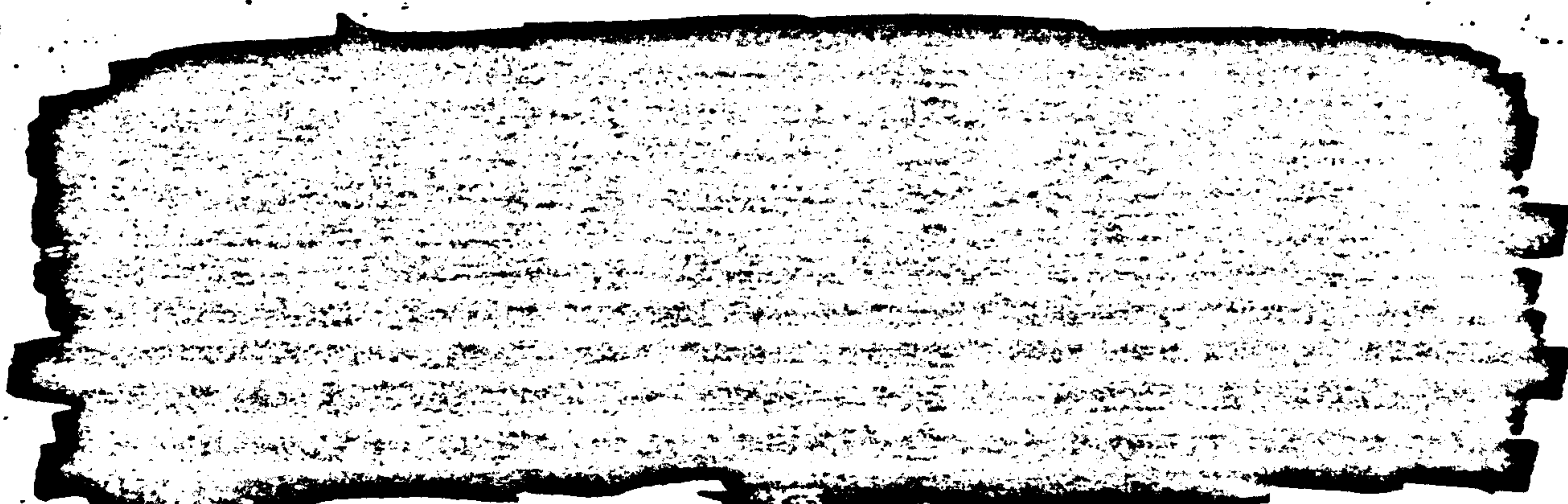

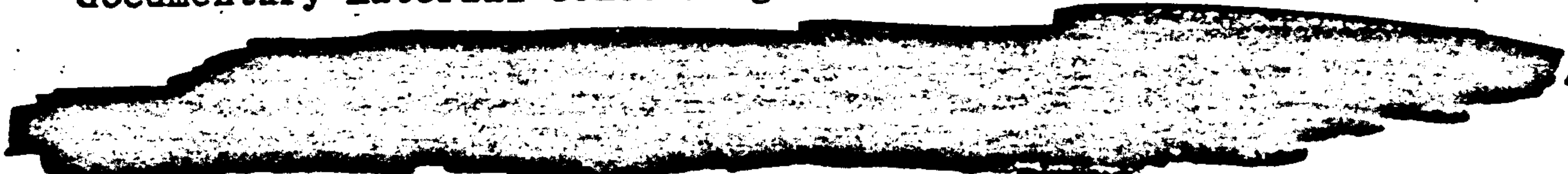

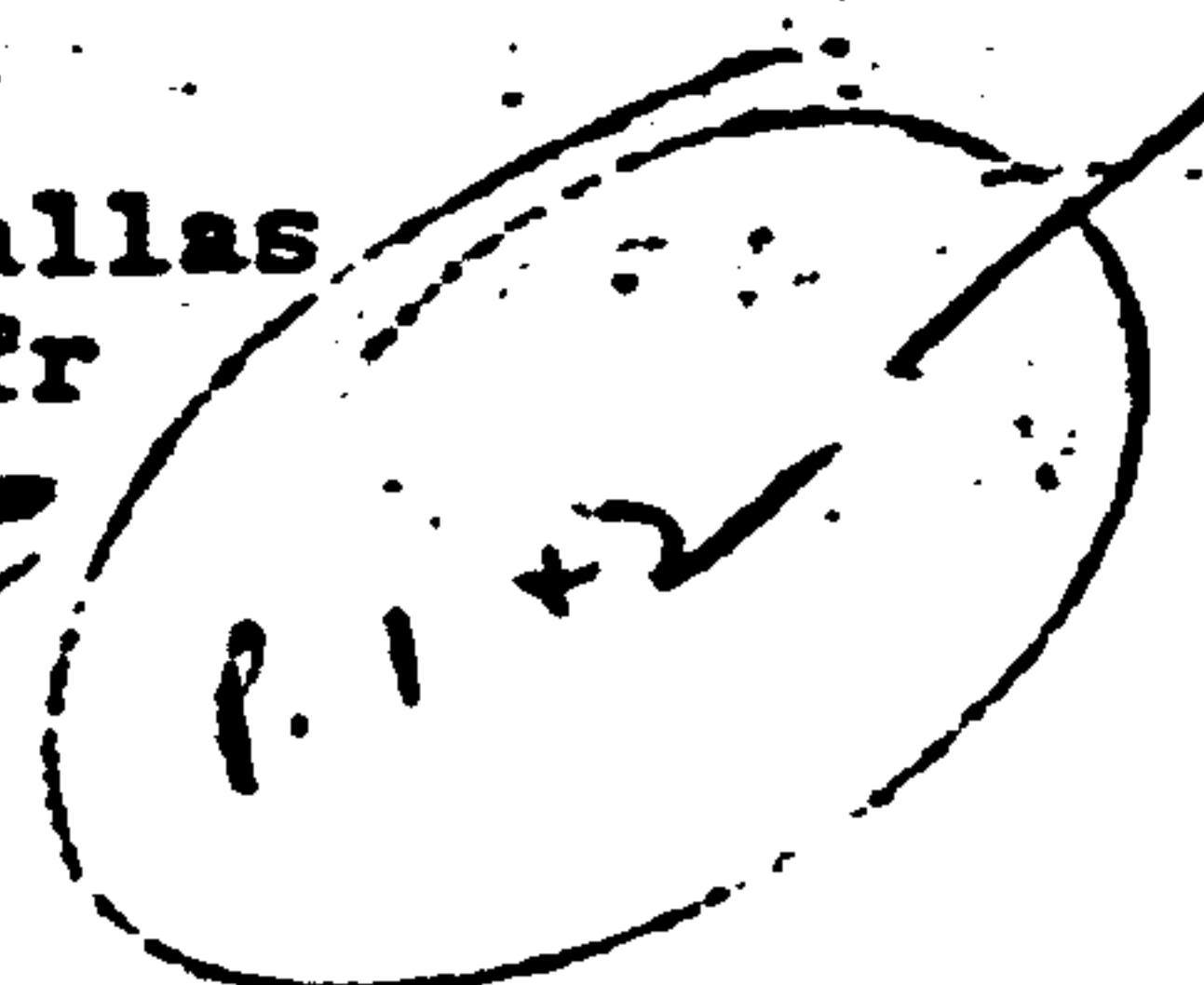

On 3/31/64 I furnished the following information to Mr. W. A. BRANNIGAN.

Mrs. PAINE had been interviewed and stated that back some time ago she had permitted ISAAC DON LEVINE to look at six letters which were personal in nature, from MARINA to Mrs. PAINE. Four of these letters were written to Mrs. PAINE while MARINA was in New Orleans and the other two were written by MARINA to Mrs. PAINE while MARINA was in Dallas before they went to New Orleans. She said the letters were strictly personal in nature, and that LEVINE did not have them sufficient time to make any notes off of them. She stated that these are the six letters which she turned over to the Warren Commission while she was testifying, reluctantly since they were very personal in nature and dealt with marital troubles between her and her husband, and MARINA and LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

Mr. BRANNIGAN wanted to know why we had not gotten the letters, and he was told that Mrs. PAINE had declined to furnish the same, saying they were strictly personal in nature, but that if forced to, she would make them available to the Commission. He stated this made us look in somewhat of a bad light, if Mrs. PAINE would permit a newspaper reporter to check the letters and not let us have them.

I also advised Mr. BRANNIGAN that we had contacted MARINE OSWALD, who stated that ISAAC DON LEVINE had contacted her on several occasions when she resided at the MARTIN residence and at the FORD residence with respect to writing a book. She does not have a contract with LEVINE, and does not expect to sign one with him or to authorize him to write anything concerning her, and that she had not given LEVINE any material whatsoever, such as letters, photographs or other documents. She has talked with LEVINE on a number of occasions thereafter concerning her background and her life with LEE HARVEY OSWALD. I also advised Mr. BRANNIGAN that MARINA's Attorney, WILLIAM MC KINSEY had stated they were not going to authorize LEVINE to publish anything and that if he did so, it would certainly be without his consent.

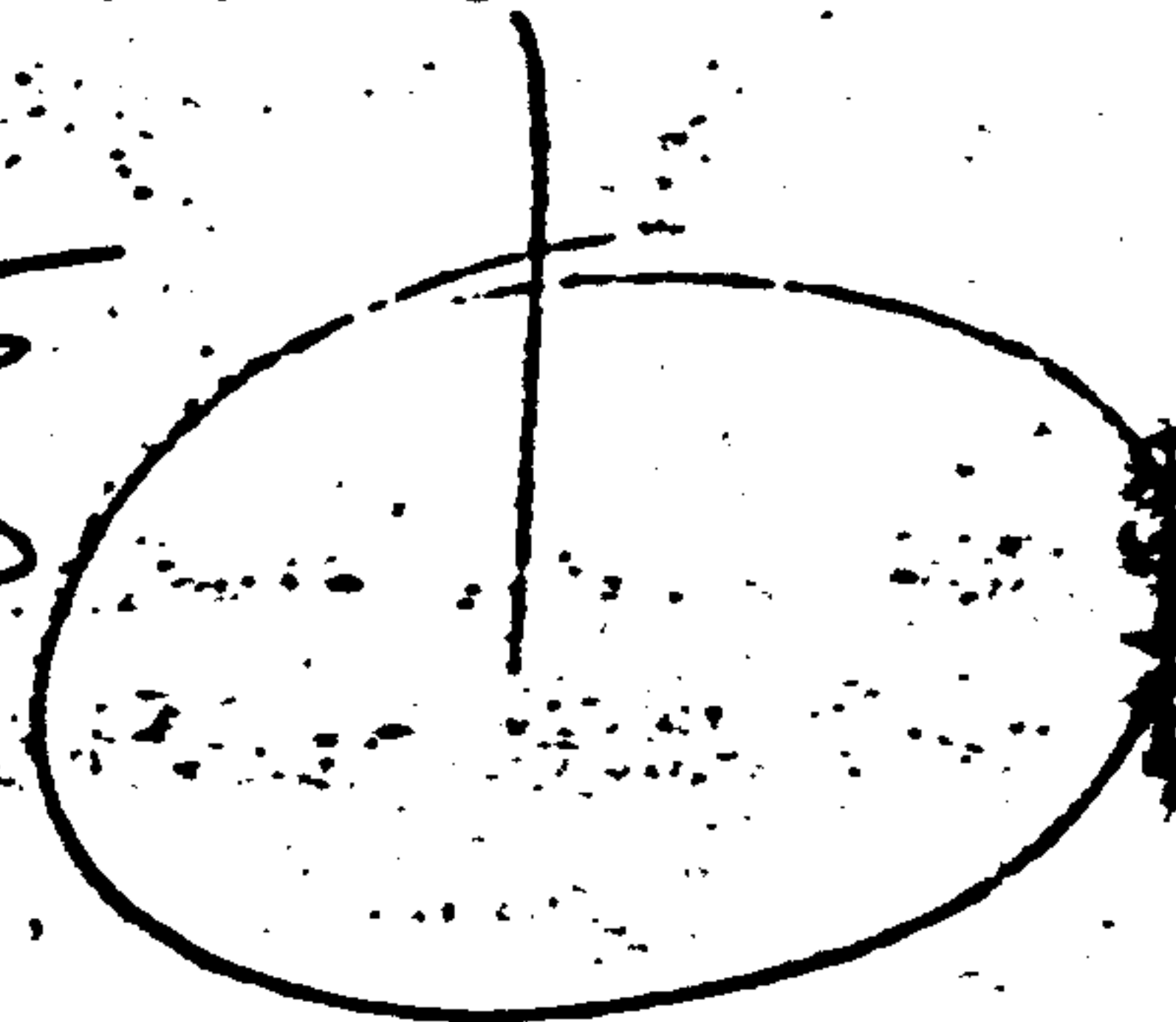

I told Mr. BRANNIGAN that we had not been able to conduct the interview of RUTH PAINE this morning as she was teaching school and did not want to be interrupted, but that she would be interviewed today if possible.

Assistant Director IVAN CONRAD telephonically contacted this office at 12:25 P.M., April 2, 1964, and made reference to our teletype of April 1, 1964, concerning the paper samples as obtained from Lieutenant DAY of the Identification Division of the Police Department. He advised that our teletype states that the Police Department furnished item identified as K-2 from four open rolls. In fact, they submitted only one piece of paper, so how could it come from four rolls? He also referred to this teletype and the statements regarding item identified as K-52 wherein we state the paper came from the same rolls. Again, there is only one piece of paper coming from more than one roll.

Mr. CONRAD stated the Laboratory needs clarification on this matter promptly as the Bureau is on record as stating we have one piece of paper which is like the specimen in question and another piece which is not like it. He stated in all probability there were four rolls of paper and the above K-2 and K-52 were obtained, one from one roll and one from another.

Mr. CONRAD again requested expeditious handling as the Laboratory expert is to testify on April 3, 1964, before the Commission concerning this examination.

At 4:15 p.m., on 4/1/64, USA BAREFOOT SANDERS called and then put Mr. LIEBLER (Phonetic) of the President's Commission on the phone.

Mr. LIEBLER said he had today talked to individuals with the Irving Sport Shop, specifically Mr. GREENER and Mr. RYDER, and for some reason which he did not fully explain, "this bothers him." He said he would like an opportunity before going back to Washington to sit down with the Agents who handled the interviews of GREENER and RYDER and other individuals connected with the Irving Sport Shop to "kind of get their evaluation or impression of the situation."

Mr. LIEBLER said he had also talked to Mr. DAVIS of the "Sports Drome Rifle Range." He said in connection with the OSWALD investigation information had been received concerning some "big, bearded fellow" who had been at the Sports Drome and was in some way related to the allegations OSWALD had been at the Sports Drome. DAVIS told LIEBLER today he had recently seen this "big, bearded fellow", had gotten the license number of his car, and had given this to, he thinks, "Agent BROWN." Mr. LIEBLER seemed to think this referred to SA CHARLES T. BROWN, JR. *not sure really*

I told Mr. LIEBLER Mr. BROWN was not in the office and I was not sufficiently acquainted with the intimate details of the matters about which he was asking to tell him anything concerning them.

Mr. LIEBLER wanted to know whether DAVIS had given us the license number, whether we had identified the "big, bearded fellow" and, if so, what had been learned from him.

I told Mr. LIEBLER he would be called back at Mr. SANDERS' office concerning his request.

USA BAREFOOT SANDERS was telephonically contacted 4:55 p.m. this date to determine the length of time Mr. LIEBLER will be in town in the event Agents are able to confer with him in compliance with his request. Mr. SANDERS advised Mr. LIEBLER planned to leave Dallas on the morning of 4/2/64. Mr. SANDERS was advised that he would be contacted first thing on the morning of 4/2/64 and advised if the conferences could be arranged.

Information contained above was telephonically furnished to Inspector J. R. MALLEY at 5:00 p.m. this date. Mr. MALLEY advised that Mr. LIEBLER should be advised tactfully that if he has determined or uncovered discrepancies in information furnished by Mr. GREENER and Mr. RYDER then the Agents would be more than happy to discuss the matter of differences and we would conduct any additional inquiry he desired. However, if it is solely Mr. LIEBLER's desire to obtain the Agent's personal opinion, or an valuation of GREENER and RYDER, then he should be advised that the Agent's reports are the basic facts and the Agent has no personal opinion concerning the information furnished by these individuals.

With regard to the "big bearded fellow," Mr. MALLEY advised that it will be permissible to inform Mr. LIEBLER orally of the results of the interview with this individual whose identity has been determined as MICHAEL BENTLEY MURPHY. Mr. MALLEY instructed that this information is to be furnished orally only and nothing is to be put in writing. Mr. LIEBLER is to be advised that the results of the interview with MURPHY will be furnished him in the next report.

Mr. MALLEY concluded by stating that unless we are advised to the contrary, the above procedures are to be followed in regard to Mr. LIEBLER's request.

At 8:15 AM, 4/2/64, I (ASAC CLARK) telephonically contacted USA SANDERS in effort to locate Mr. LIEBLER, of the Commission. He advised that Mr. LIEBLER was out at the time and he would have him call. Mr. SANDERS also advised that Mr. LIEBLER planned to leave Dallas to return to Washington approximately noon today, and that two additional attorneys were planning to leave Dallas tomorrow.

At 10:45 AM, this date, Mr. LIEBLER called and inquiry was made of him as to his specific request regarding his statement that he wanted to "kind of get the Agents' evaluation of the situation." Mr. LIEBLER said he had a feeling that possibly RYDER may have made up the repair ticket in question, in order to get publicity, and he wanted the Agents' impression to determine if they thought he may not be furnishing the entire truth. Mr. LIEBLER was advised that all the information developed during the interview with RYDER has been furnished in report which he has available and that the Agents will be in no position to furnish their personal opinion as to whether RYDER was telling the truth.

Mr. LIEBLER then made inquiry as to the determination of the chronology of the interview with RYDER. He stated he would like to know if RYDER was interviewed by FBI Agents before or after his having a repair ticket for an individual by the name of OSWALD was published in the newspaper. He stated this request was based on a conflict that he had developed through interview with RYDER and information furnished by a newspaper reporter. He stated he could not recall the name of the newspaper reporter. In substance, he stated he would like to determine for sure if RYDER made up the ticket to get publicity. This is the reason he wanted the chronology of our interview and the newspaper publicity.

Mr. LIEBLER was advised that a search of our files as to the date of the interview and the date of newspaper publicity would be made and he would be advised. He stated that, inasmuch as he was leaving for Washington at

12:30 today, it would be agreeable with him if this information would be furnished to him in Washington, D. C.

Mr. LIEBLER then made inquiry as to his previous query set forth in Paragraph 3 of this memorandum. Mr. LIEBLER was advised that the information concerning the license number as furnished by DAVIS had not been furnished to SA CHARLES T. BROWN, JR.; however, it had been furnished telephonically to our Night Security Clerk. Mr. LIEBLER was advised that the "big, bearded fellow" has been identified in interview. Thereafter the information contained in the 302 of MICHAEL BENTLEY MURPH, interviewed 3/16/64, was orally furnished to Mr. LIEBLER. He was also advised that this information would be set forth in our next report.

Mr. MALLEY requested the answer to two questions:

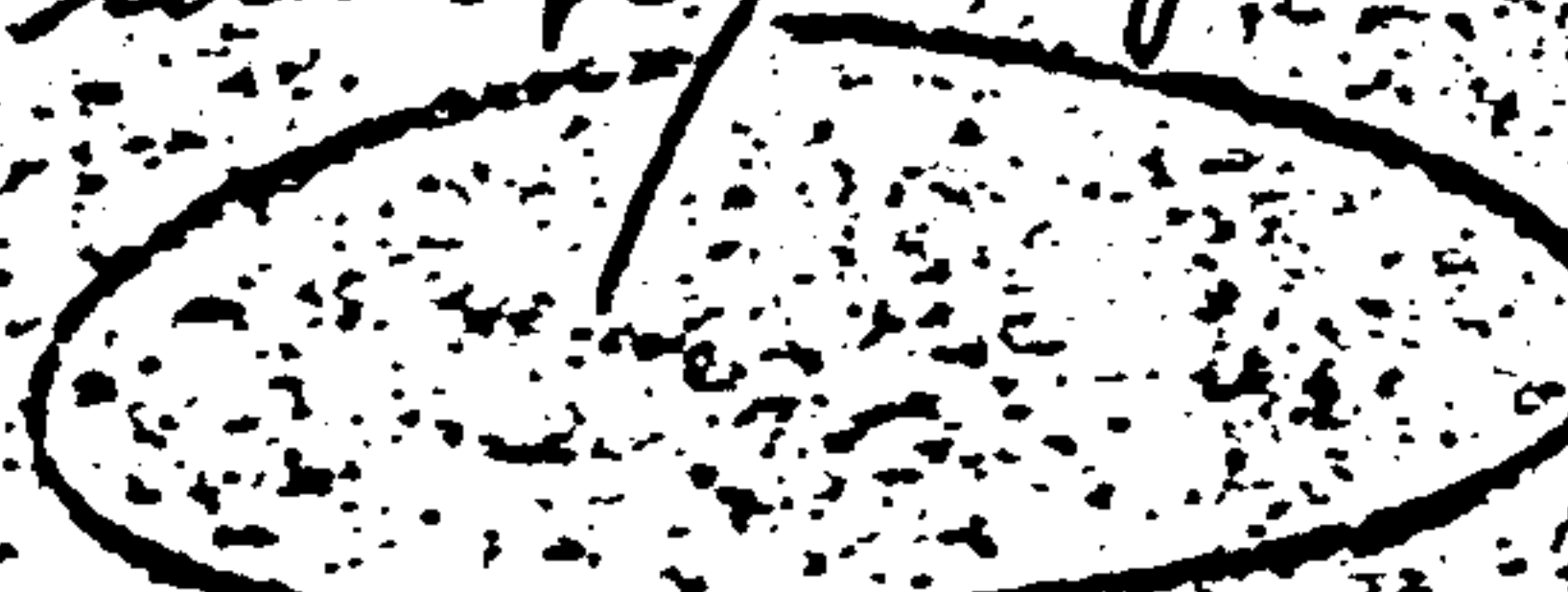
(1) Did we interview this man RYDER at Irving Sport Shop prior to the time the information appeared in the newspaper?
