At approximately 10:15 p.m. this date, DAN DAWSON, 3206 C Hudnall st., Dallas, Texas telephonically contacted this office and furnished the following information.

He advised that he formerly worked for O'Neal /ph/ Funeral Home of Dallas, Texas. He further advised that he no longer works for them. He did not furnish where presently employed.

Further advised that on November 22, 1963 (the day of the assassination of the late President Kennedy), he was on the radio at the funeral home, listening for calls. Stated received call requesting ambulance at corner of Elm and Houston streets, Dallas, Texas. Further pointed out that this was near site of assassination.

Stated dispatched an ambulance to the location and picked up victim of epileptic fit. Stated the ambulance he had dispatched to the scene then drove victim to Parkland hospital. While ambulance driver was in process of registering victim at hospital, VICTIM disappeared.

Informant could not furnish name of victim of any additional information. Stated that if we thought the above might be of pertinence to our investigation regarding this case, suggested we contact the ambulance driver: Aubrey Lee Rike, present address unknown. Also stated RIKE no longer works for the funeral home, but believes funeral home will be able to furnish address.

Stated he believed this incident may have been planned to distract attention from the "shooting" that was to follow.

ACTION: Contact RIKE for further information re the foregoing.

SUBJECT: LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka.

At approximately 9:10 A.M., May 12, 1964, Inspector JAMES R. MALLEY telephonically advised that he was now making arrangements for additional photography and on-the-scene drawings to be made at the site of the assassination and that it was tentatively planned that the Commission representatives, along with certain Bureau officials, would do such work at Dallas, Texas, on Sunday, May 17, 1964.

Mr. MALLEY stated that U. S. Secret Service is making arrangements to fly in an automobile on Saturday, May 16, 1964, to be used in the on-the-site studies. He stated the activities will probably take the entire day of Sunday and desired that Chief of Police JESSE CURRY, Dallas Police Department, be contacted to determine if such studies could be made during the entire day of Sunday or if Chief CURRY preferred another day due to the traffic situation in the vicinity of TSBD. He stated that if Sunday were not satisfactory, to ascertain from Chief CURRY what day would be best. He stated that it should be borne in mind that weather might be a factor with respect to the photography and that such studies had to be made no later than Tuesday, May 19, 1964, because of other commitments by Commission members.

Mr. MALLEY requested that ROBERT H. WEST, County Surveyor, be contacted to determine if he would be available on Sunday, May 17, 1964, to work with the people making the studies.

Inspector MALLEY stated that SA LYNDAL A. SHANEYFELT would come from the Bureau to perform the photographic work, assisted by ROY H. ROSE, who had previously been in Dallas with Inspector GAUTHIER. He stated Inspector LEO J. GAUTHIER would probably be coming to Dallas Saturday night, May 16, 1964, and that SA FRAZIER, a firearms expert, would also be coming down. Inspector MALLEY stated he was not sure if he were also coming to Dallas or not.

Inspector MALLEY stated that arrangements should be made with Mr. ROY S. TRULY, Warehouse Superintendent, TSBD, for use of the building on Sunday, May 17, 1964, and also to obtain his permission for the use of a room to set up certain photographic equipment, which room should be large enough to project movies.

Inspector MALLEY stated that a dummy the size of a man was also being shipped down to be used in the automobile being brought in by U. S. Secret Service.

Inspector MALLEY stated that every effort would be made to tie up only one lane of the street in front of TSBD at a time, if such was at all possible. Inspector MALLEY desired to be called back as soon as Chief CURRY and Mr. WEST could be contacted.

Chief of Police JESSE CURRY was immediately contacted and advised that Sunday, May 17, 1964, would be satisfactory and that rather than do part of it on one day and part on another, he believed that spending the entire day on Sunday would be satisfactory and that he would cooperate during whatever time was necessary for the Commission studies. Chief CURRY stated he would appreciate being advised as to the approximate time such studies would begin as soon as same was known.

Mr. ROBERT H. WEST, County Surveyor, telephone RI 8-4981, was contacted, and he stated that he, too, would

be available to assist in the studies on Sunday, May 17, 1964, and that should any specifics as to data to be needed should be available in advance, he would appreciate being advised. He also requested to be advised as to what time such studies would start on Sunday.

Mr. ROY S. TRULY at TSBD was contacted and stated that he would have the TSBD building available for the studies to be made and that any equipment or use of rooms to project movies could be arranged without any problem. He, too, was advised that as soon as a starting time for the studies was established, same would be made known to him.

At approximately 9:35 A.M., Inspector MALLEY was telephonically contacted and was advised of the results of contacts with Chief CURRY and Mr. WEST. Inspector MALLEY stated that tentatively the studies would be made on Sunday, May 17, 1964, and as soon as a definite time had been established and other details made known, he would furnish same to Dallas. He stated that at this time he did not know exactly when the various Bureau officials would arrive and that with respect to hotel reservations, he would let us know later.

Inquiry was made of Mr. MALLEY as to whether Mr. NIX, Mrs. MUCHMORE and Mr. ZAPRUDER would be needed on the scene to specifically pinpoint where they were standing at the time they took photographs, and he stated as of this time this would not be necessary. He stated that with respect to the camera of ORVILLE NIX, same was now in the possession of the FBI Laboratory and that Mr. NIX should be advised that his camera was still needed, and that in the event his vacation approached prior to the return of his camera, arrangements could undoubtedly be worked out whereby he would rent a similar camera and the Commission would pay for such rental.

Mr. NIX was telephonically advised of the foregoing information concerning his camera.

At 11:05 AM, on this date, Section Chief BILL BRANIGAN of the Bureau advised as follows:

We have been requested to submit a memorandum as to why the interview of Chief CURRY was not included in a report. The following is the memorandum which we propose to submit:

"In the interview Chief CURRY emphatically stated that he never received or heard of a letter from the Justice Department, and he was never requested by an official of the FBI not to arrest OSWALD or RUBY. Chief CURRY described the allegation as absolutely false.

"The Dallas teletype of 5/7/64, concluded that unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau the results of this interview would not be included in a report or a letter-head memorandum. The Director noted: "Of course, it must be in a report so we can send it to the Commission."

"On May 8, SAC SHANKLIN was telephonically instructed to include the interview of Chief CURRY in an FD-302, as an insert in the next investigative report to be submitted by the Dallas Office in their investigation of the OSWALD case. SAC SHANKLIN noted that the complete results of the interview were incorporated in the urgent teletype sent to the Bureau and he was of the belief that the Bureau would send the results to the President's Commission by letter. The results of the interview of Chief CURRY were incorporated in a letter which was sent to the Honorable J. LEE RANKIN of the President's Commission on 5/8/64. The Commission is therefore cognizant and their files reflect the denial by Chief CURRY that a letter was sent to him requesting the police not to arrest OSWALD or RUBY."

ACTION: This is for information.

Mr. BRANIGAN stated that unless he heard from the Dallas Office by 1:00 PM, Dallas time, the above memorandum would be sent to the Director.

Supervisor WENDELL SHANEYFELT, Photography Section, FBI Laboratory, telephonically contacted the Dallas Office at 11:30 A.M., 5/15/64, advising that the Bureau is in receipt of a multipage letter from the PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION regarding a photograph that has been identified as depicting the residence of GENERAL EDWIN WALKER, Dallas, Texas, Dallas Inventory No. 369. SHANEYFELT stated that the photograph includes an automobile on which the license number has been obliterated.

SHANEYFELT stated that the Commission has requested that they be advised of the circumstances under which instant photograph was obtained. Further, requested that the automobile depicted in the photograph be identified, and in this regard suggested that GENERAL WALKER would be able to identify the car as well as the house depicted in the photograph.

MR. SHANEYFELT stated that a copy of the letter and a copy of pertinent photograph were forwarded to Dallas by Airmail this date, but was furnishing the above information by telephone.

ACTION:

SAC SHANKLIN suggested that no investigative action be taken prior to receipt of the Commission's letter and the Bureau's forwarding communication, and stated that UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES should GENERAL WALKER be contacted prior to him, SAC SHANKLIN, clearing such contact with the Bureau.

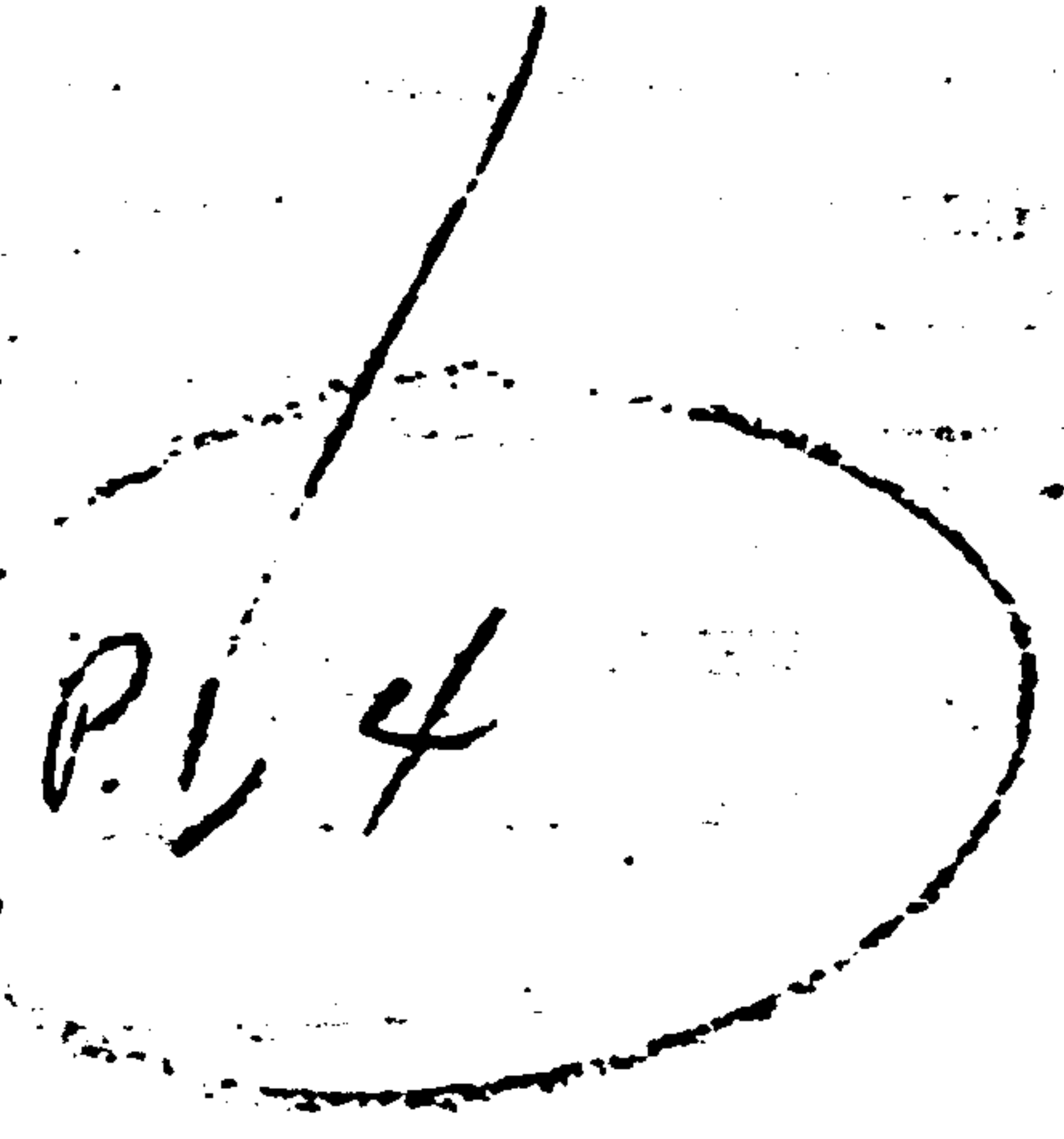

Inspector MALLEY called at 4:00 PM today and stated he was referring to a former Agent by the name of EVELLE YOUNGER. MALLEY stated that DREW PEARSON told C. D. DE LOACH at 4:30 PM on May 13th he had received a tip that one JOSEPH BALL of the Warren Commission had come to the Dallas Office of the FBI and asked for the loan of a car so that he could interview people in connection with the assassination of the President case. PEARSON stated that the FBI in Dallas delayed for approximately 24 hours and then flatly told BALL he could not have the car.

PEARSON stated he did not plan to use this; however he just wanted to tip me ^(MALLEY) off that the Dallas Office was being a little high handed with the Warren Commission. MALLEY stated he told PEARSON this was not a matter of being high handed; that we had the understanding that the Secret Service was doing the driving for the Warren Commission and therefore it was needless to involve two agencies in this matter.

Inspector MALLEY instructed that I talk to all Agents and Clerks who might have been on the desks or taking such a request, and to call the Bureau tonight. If MALLEY is not there, give the information to TOM WESTFALL, who will be on night duty this week.

BALL was described as a successful attorney out in the California area.

Mr. MALLEY said that TOLSON had put the notation on the memo, "Was there a 24 hour delay on our part?" The Director says "I want to know."

I mentioned that ASAC CLARK was out of town, but that I would call him and obtain the requested answer tonight.

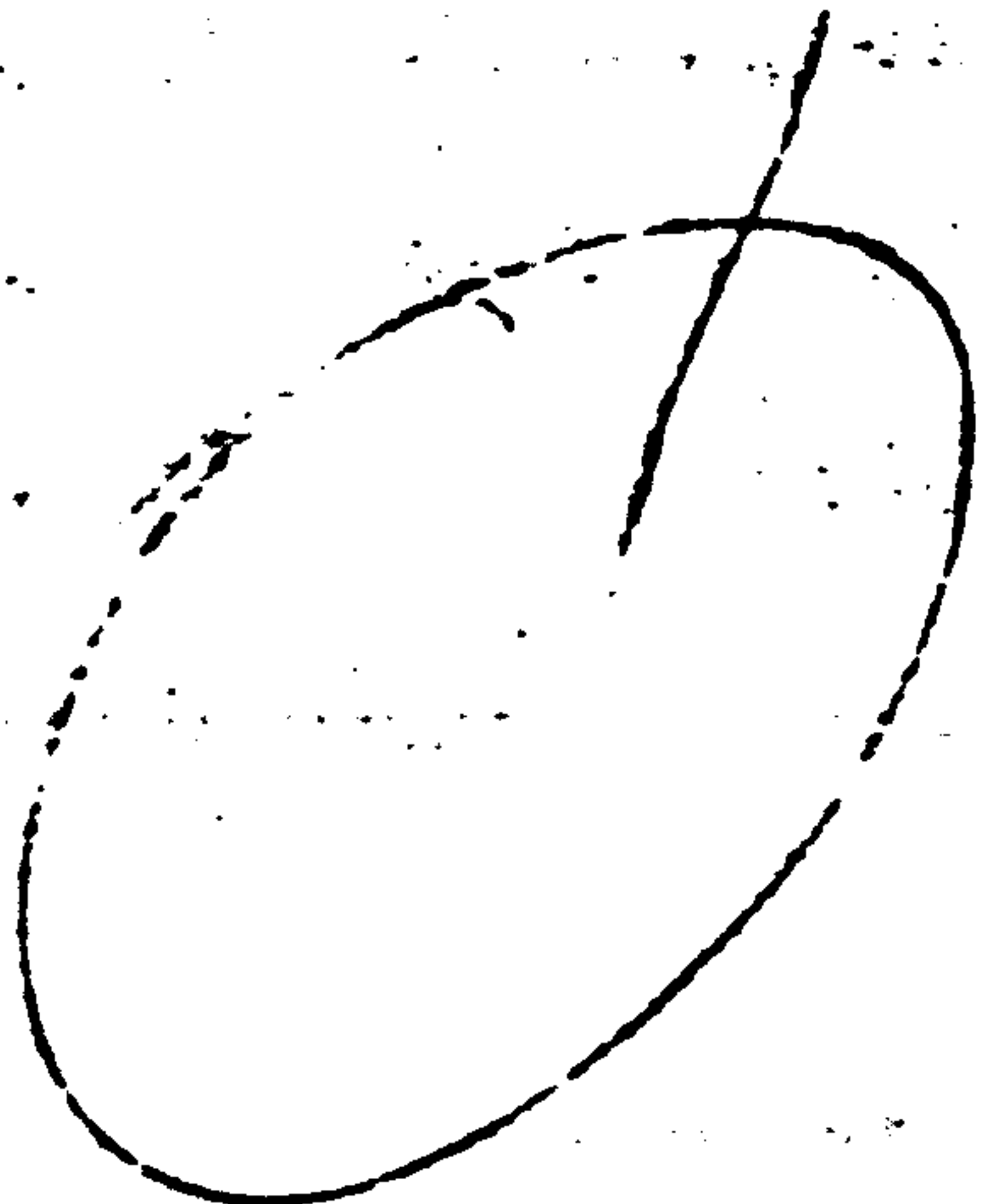

Dallas Office presently has two 4 X 5 Speedgraphic cameras in good operating condition. One of the cameras is new and recently received from the Bureau.

We also have one wide angle lens for the 4 X 5 Speedgraphic camera. It is also noted that the film pack supply (black and white) is ample. In the event they desire color shots, we can purchase the film here or they may want to supply their own from the Bureau.

Dallas Has one Huskey (Quickset) tripod, which should be satisfactory. We also have a Graflex Pro type tripod, slight smaller and lighter in weight than the Huskey.

Dallas has 35 mm Praktina Camera equipped with a six inch lense and a Biotar 2/58 lense.

Dallas has a 16mm Bolex movie camera with the extra lense and equipment. however this equipment is on loan to the San Antonio, Division.

At 9:00 AM today I talked with L. L. SHANEYFELT of Bureau Laboratory regarding my conversation with GEORGE SCATTERDAY of 5/14/64 concerning camera and tripod requirements. I advised SHANEYFELT that we had two 4 X 5 Speedgraphic cameras and that one of them is new, just recently received from the Bureau. I also advised him that we have one Maskey quickset tripod and also a smaller, lighter one, one wide angle lense for the 4 X 5 Speedgraphic, an ample supply of black and white film.

Mr. SHANEYFELT said this is all he needed to know re the equipment in Dallas and that he had boxed up a lot of equipment which he will send on down to the Dallas Office ahead of the time they intend to use it. He stated they may come the weekend of May 23rd, but this is not definite.
