On 5/22/64 I received a call from Capt. GLEN KING of the Dallas PD, who stated that he had received a call from United Press concerning a story that was in one of the New York newspapers and was supposed to appear in the Sunday paper. This story in general claimed that they had a picture of OSWALD on the first floor of the School Book Depository Bldg. about the same time the shot was supposedly fired. KING stated that he knew this had been run out, but that he just wanted us to know about it.

Shortly thereafter, we received a call from EDDIE BARKER of KRLD concerning the same thing, and also one from ROY S. TRULY, Warehouse Superintendent, Texas School Book Depository, who stated he too had received inquiries from UPI concerning the same matter.

I called the Bureau and mentioned this to Section Chief W. A. BRANIGAN, who stated that he knew we had run it out, but of course he could make no comment on what we should tell the paper.

I thereafter called and talked to Inspector ROBERT WICK, who stated he was aware of this story going to be printed tomorrow; that the New York Herald Tribune had a full page ad in today's paper, which obviously was to sell the paper, as they said that they were going to print a picture which was the most controversial picture of the last decade. He stated that our answer should be, No comment.

Shortly after talking to him, I received a call from JERRY RICHMOND of the Dallas Times Herald, who is also the local representative for News Week. He stated he had received a call from News Week and that they had indicated to him that the story would have something in it to the effect that the FBI had been

Mr. L. W. SHANEYFELT, Bureau, called at 8:40 AM today and stated that he, RAY TRIPLET and ROY ROSE would arrive at 6:48 PM today via Braniff Airways, Flight 9. The remaining individuals will come in on Saturday. SHANEYFELT asked that 3 single rooms be obtained at the Adolphus Hotel. He mentioned that TRIPLET would be leaving Sunday afternoon whether they are through or not, and that ROSE and himself would be staying over.

I advised SHANEYFELT that I would have an Agent meet the three of them and bring them to the office.

SHANEYFELT stated they would want to set up a projector in the School Book Depository Bldg. to view the slides on site, if possible, and they want to spend most of the day at the Book Bldg. to get some basic information to help them on Sunday. They desire access to the building on Saturday morning.

I advised that Dallas Office has two Agents, who are about the size and appearance of CONNALLY and KENNEDY. Also, that we will get a surveyor, or if we are unable to, we will call Bureau back.

O'SHAY, 936 W. 8th Street, Dallas, Texas, telephone WH 2-3651, called Security Patrol Clerk PAUL STONE and advised that a BOB FITZPATRICK, formerly studying for the Jesuit Order of Priesthood at Springhill University, Mobile, Alabama, and presently planning to attend a school in Baltimore, had while at Springhill University served as an interpreter to MARINA OSWALD and entertained her while her husband, LEE HARVEY OSWALD, spoke to students at that school.

According to O'SHAY, FITZPATRICK's home is in Phoenix, Arizona, and he will be in Dallas for several days en route to Phoenix. O'SHAY stated that FITZPATRICK had expressed a desire that he wished to see MARINA OSWALD and talk to her if she would agree.

O'SHAY stated he desired the FBI to call MARINA OSWALD and advise her of FITZPATRICK's wish and also desired to know if the FBI approved.

O'SHAY was advised by Security Clerk STONE that the FBI could not approve or disapprove any contact by FITZPATRICK with MARINA OSWALD.

O'SHAY stated he already had the address of MARINA OSWALD in Richardson, Texas, and he knew a priest with whom MARINA OSWALD has been associated and he would contact this priest in an effort to determine if he could arrange for FITZPATRICK to see MARINA OSWALD.

Previous investigation reported in the report of SA JOHN J. SWEENEY dated 12/1/63 at Mobile, Alabama (100-10461-192, page 10), reflects interview with ROBERT FITZPATRICK with respect to his association and knowledge of LEE HARVEY and MARINA OSWALD.

Mr. JOSEPH A. SIZOO called from Bureau Headquarters at 4:45 PM today and referred to the previous call today from Mr. CLEMENT L. MC GOWAN regarding the letter of the President's Commission requesting deposition of SA C. RAY HALL. It is noted I requested that if possible it be determined what they desired SA HALL to testify to.

Mr. SIZOO stated they had discussed this matter and it is their considered judgment that they should not go back to the Commission, but go ahead and answer their questions the best we can. He noted that this is an amended request and the Bureau has already gone back to the Commission once. Mr. SIZOO said that the Director had noted on the letter, "Had I been told of this request at the outset, I would have had the reports given to the Commission. You seem to constantly lose sight of the fact that they are trying to harm the FBI." Mr. SIZOO said in light of this and in light of the fact that this is already an amended request, we should go ahead with it, and not try to find out what the testimony will pertain to or what they want it for. He stated they have plenty of material on the John Birch Society, Minute Men, or persons believed active in the CP on which they can ask questions.

I advised that we had not investigated the John Birch Society, but that we may have something on them from an intelligence standpoint.

GILBERT, Personnel Manager, Austin State Hospital, 4101 Guadalupe Street, made available a record which revealed that MARJORIE KAY SPENCE applied for a position on June 6, 1957, and on October 1, 1957, she was employed as a case worker. During the entire period that she was employed at the Austin State Hospital she was employed under the name of MARJORIE KAY SPENCE. The record reveals that she resigned on July 31, 1960, and her letter of resignation had the following note:

"We are moving to San Francisco where I have accepted a position as Chief of Social Service at Garden Hospital."

The record reveals that her husband was JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE, 2206 San Antonio Street, Austin, Texas.

Mr. GILBERT reviewed subject's file and indicated that subject had some difficulty in accepting responsibility



and following the policies of the Austin State Hospital. Mr. GILBERT said there is no derogatory information in the file concerning subject's loyalty to the United States.

EMPLOYMENT OF EX-SPOUSE, JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE

On July 11, 1963, Mr. FRANK HEJL, Personnel Manager, State Department of Health, State of Texas, advised that JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE has been employed continuously with the above State agency since December of 1958. Mr. HEJL said that JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE entered on employment as a power plant operator and is now a clerk, Grade III. Mr. HEJL advised that when JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE was employed in December of 1958 he listed his wife as MARJORIE KAY SPENCE. Mr. HEJL said that the file fails to reflect his present marital status although he noted that in 1961 he changed the number of dependents under withholding tax. Mr. HEJL stated that he has never had any reason to question JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE's loyalty to the United States and SPENCE is considered a satisfactory employee although he, SPENCE, has had some difficulty in connection with his debts.

DIVORCE RECORD

On July 11, 1963, Mr. JOHN DICKSON, Deputy District Clerk, Travis County, Travis County Courthouse, made available Docket Number 120609, JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE vs. MARJORIE KAY SPENCE: 98th Judicial District Court of Travis County, Austin, Texas. The record reflects that the petition was filed on January 12, 1961, by JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE alleging that defendant on divers occasions while plaintiff and defendant lived together was guilty of excesses, cruel treatment, and outrages toward plaintiff of such a nature as to render their further living together insupportable. The petition reveals that SPENCE and MARJORIE KAY SPENCE were married on September 27, 1950, and separated on August 15, 1960. The petition reflects that one child, SHERRI LYNN SPENCE, was born as a result of the above marriage and in 1961 was three years old.

The record reflects that the divorce was granted on June 12, 1961, by Honorable CHARLES B. TTE, District Judge, 98th Judicial District Court of Travis County.

CREDIT AND IDENTIFICATION RECORD

On July 10, 1963, Mrs. ANN BRUNER, Retail Merchants Association, informed that there is no record in the files of the Retail Merchants Association identifiable with MARJORIE KAY SPENCE or MARJORIE KAY BRILKE or MARJORIE KAY COLVIN. Mrs. BRUNER informed that the record reflects a credit record on JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE, wife, MARJORIE, 2206 San Antonio Street, and Route 7, Box 47A, Austin, Texas. The record reflects that in 1959 JAMES WAYNE SPENCE was employed by the State Health Department and his wife, MARJORIE, by the Austin State Hospital. The credit report reflects slow and unsatisfactory credit in Austin.

On July 10, 1963, Mrs. BOBBY GARRETT, Intelligence Section, Texas Department of Public Safety, informed that there is no record in the files of the Intelligence Section identifiable with subject under her present name or her former names.

On July 8, 1963, Mrs. JEAN TROWELL, Identification Division, Austin Police Department, informed that there is no arrest record in the files of the Identification Division identifiable with subject under her present name or her former names. Mrs. TROWELL said there is no arrest record on JAMIE WAYNE SPENCE, subject's former husband.

The indices of the San Antonio Office are negative on this subject.

The information operator of the telephone company, Dallas, on 10/15/63, advised she has a listing for CHARLES COPELAND, 3810 Inwood Road, Dallas, FL 7-1940 (residential).

*re* [redacted] made on 10/15/63, to MRS. CHARLES COPELAND, 3810 Inwood, Dallas, FL 7-1940. She stated her husband, CHARLES E. COPELAND, was not at home at that time but could be reached at his office on Maple Avenue at ME 1-1450.

Observation of 3810 Inwood Road revealed that address is Trade Winds Luxury Apartments. On 10/15/63, the building directory at that address showed apartment 116 was occupied by MR. and MRS. CHARLES E. COPELAND.

CHARLES EDWARD COPELAND has been the subject of a security investigation and was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on June 10, 1953, at which time he stated that he had been a member of the CP for approximately 20 years, from 1943 to 1945. He stated he had opposed the CP since 1945. There is no information in Pittsburgh file contradictory to this statement.

The 7/13/53 issue of the "Pittsburgh Post-Gazette," a daily newspaper published at Pittsburgh, contained an article which set forth that CHARLES COPELAND, President of District 10, International Union of Electrical Workers, IUE-CIO, would fly to Dallas, Texas, on Monday, (7/22/53), to take over direction of the union's new District 10. COPELAND, who served as President of Local 501, East Pittsburgh, will serve as President of District 10 by appointment of JAMES E. CAFFEY, International IUE President. District 10 embraces IUE unions in North and South Dakota, Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Texas. District 10 was created last month although authorized in 1950.

Pittsburgh does not have a current description of COPELAND but that available shows he was born 11/5/10, at Jeannette, Pa. and resided at 303 Silvia St., Jeannette. He is 5' 10 1/2" tall, has fair complexion, blue eyes, light hair, wife-Florence, and Social Security number 23-10-0201.

Dallas is requested to verify subject's employment at District 10, IUE at Dallas and ascertain residence in order that FD-123 may be submitted.

member. He admitted he had associated with communists in unions  
in the Virdon, Illinois, area in the past. He said he was in Russia  
for about 25 days in 1929. In 1951 he said he had been a subscriber  
to the "Daily Worker." He described himself as a socialist, but  
said he is a determined and bitter enemy of communism. He, during  
each of those interviews, offered his assistance to the FBI in  
any way he could assist. Since coming to the Dallas Division he has

Dallas file 122-37, reflects HAROLD JEROME HANN, JR., in November, and December, 1962, was employed by the United Furniture Workers of America, AFL-CIO, Local 376, Dallas and Athens, Texas, which employment was through the efforts of subject MAYER, an organizer employed by that union. The investigation concerning HAROLD JEROME HANN, JR., is still pending, there being some evidence HANN was a CP member during the required period under the Internal Security Act of 1950. There is no indication subject MAYER has been a CP member, according to Dallas files, since coming to Dallas several years ago. MAYER has not been either on the Security Index or the Reserve Index of the Dallas Office.

For the information of recipient offices, a characterization of CLARENCE HENRY KAYER is as follows:

ROBERT COPPEY, 223 East Market Street, Bloomington, Illinois, on December 8, 1950, advised he had become interested in the Communist Party (CP) through influence of HANK MAYER during the 1930's. MAYER then was a coal dealer living at Bloomington. COPPEY denied he ever was a CP member but stated HANK MAYER, who in 1951 resided in Shavertown, New York, had been a CP member.

CLARENCE HENRY KAYER, also known as Hank Kayer, on September 8, 1951, was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI at Shavertown, New York. He stated he had been accused many times of being a communist and had studied communism and has read Marx and Lenin. He advised he came in contact with communists in Illinois in about 1930, but denied ever being a member of the CP. In a later interview on January 31, 1952, KAYER advised he is a socialist but denied ever having been a member of the CP. On September 13, 1951, KAYER, in an interview, advised he had been a subscriber to the "Daily Worker." He maintained, however, that he is a determined and bitter enemy of communism.

The "Daily Worker" is a former East Coast communist daily newspaper.

San Antonio and Houston are furnished information copies in order that those offices will know the subject's identity.

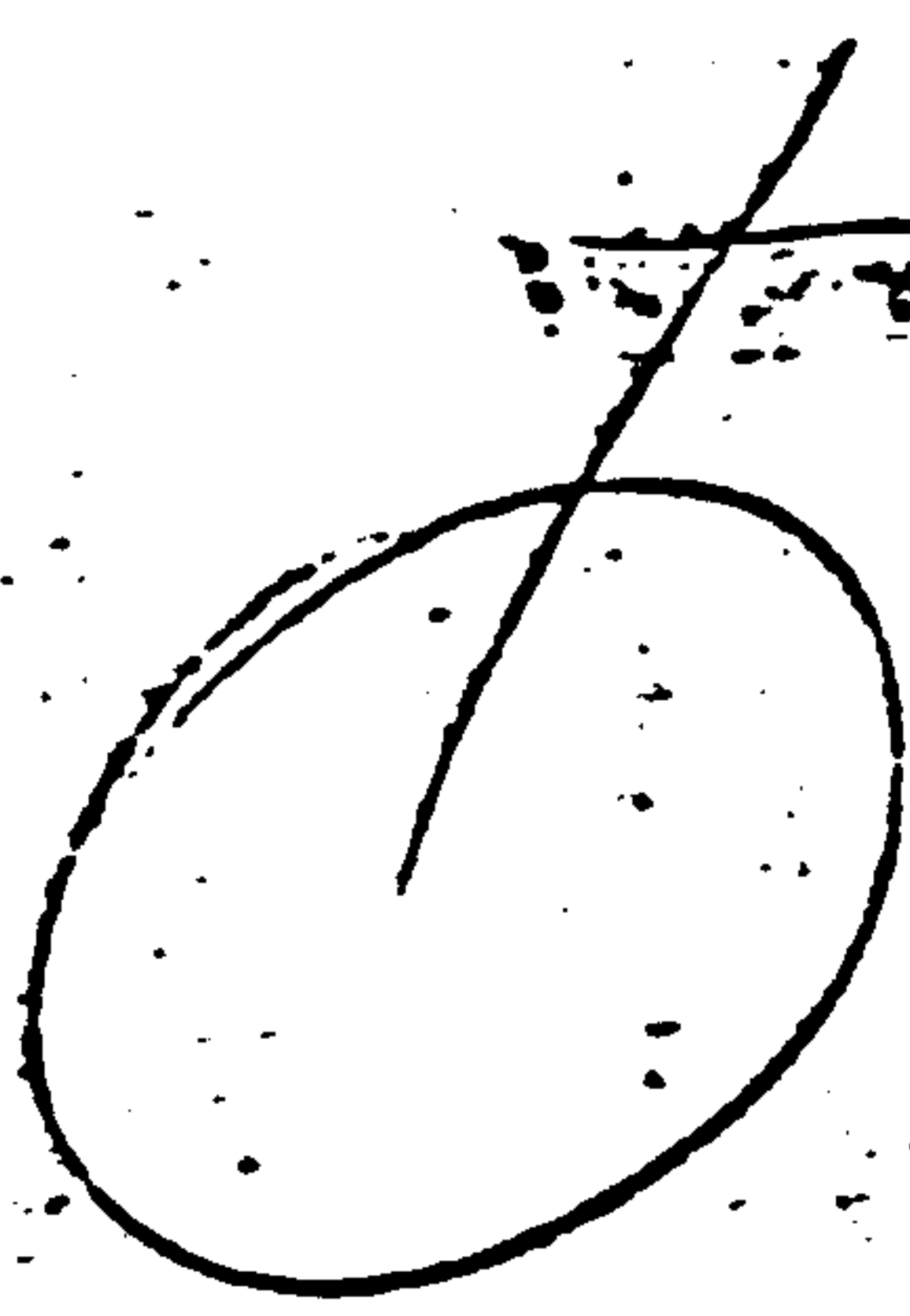

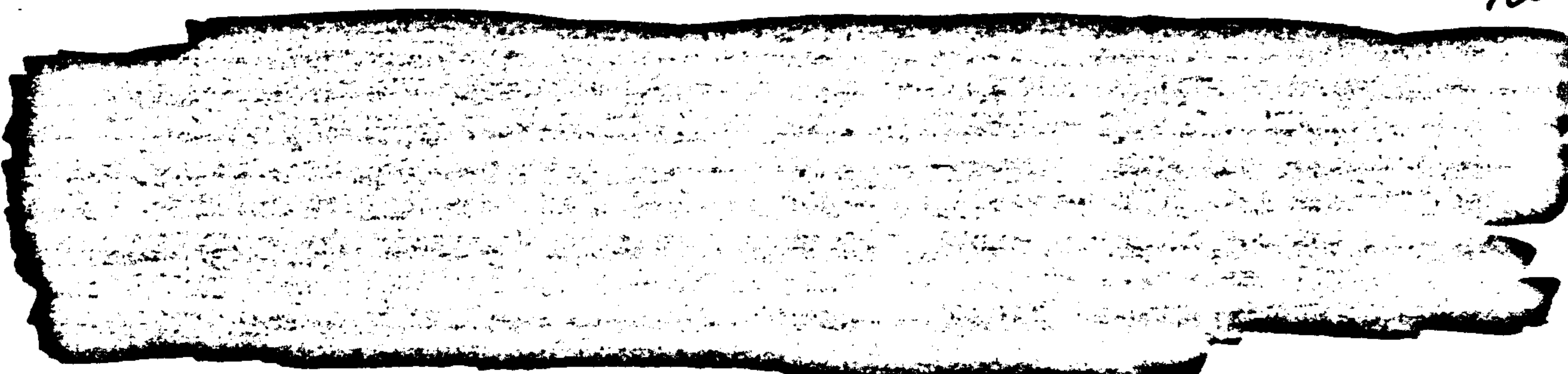

ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS

The following is information regarding ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS of Monroe, North Carolina

On June 15, 1955, WILLIAMS voluntarily appeared at the Charlotte Office of the FBI, at which time he denied ever being a member of the CP, but stated he had met individuals who were members but declined to name them. He said at one time he was invited by the "Michigan Edition of the Daily Worker" to become a member of the "Daily Worker" staff in New York. He said that while he was in the State of West Virginia, he had made a speech before an open forum which pertained to the Negro situation and following the speech an organizer for the CP of West Virginia approached him and offered him a free subscription of the "Daily Worker." WILLIAMS further stated he had never been a member of the CP, however, in 1953 he had been selected as an individual who should attend the Jefferson School of Social Science in New York City. He attended one session of classes at the school for one night and it was his observation the information being taught was not "good," and he discontinued his attendance without completing the course. He did not elaborate on his statement that the information being taught was not "good."

Jefferson School of Social Science in New York City has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast daily newspaper which suspended publication January 13, 1955.

The June 11, 1960, issue of "The Crusader," a weekly newspaper published in Monroe, North Carolina, by ROBERT F. WILLIAMS, stated that WILLIAMS left Monroe on Thursday night, June 9, 1960, for New York City and contemplated a plane trip to Cuba. The June 18, 1960, issue of "The Crusader" contained an article stating that WILLIAMS had called Monroe, North Carolina, from Havana, Cuba, on June 13, 1960, and stated, "I wish every American Negro could visit Cuba and see what it really means to be treated as a first class citizen."

On August 10, 1960, a third source advised that on August 7, 1960, he attended a meeting at 116 University Place, New York City, at which time ROBERT WILLIAMS was introduced as a Negro leader from Monroe, North Carolina, and that WILLIAMS had just returned from an extended tour of Cuba where he observed the revolution firsthand and participated in the July 26, 1960, celebration in the Sierra Maestra. WILLIAMS then spoke on the topic "The Campaign Against Progress." WILLIAMS stated that he visited Cuba to see the advancement of the Cuban Revolution and was very impressed by its success; "Today in Cuba one does not see any racial discrimination and that the United States Government and the State Department are making a definite effort to keep Negroes out of Cuba." WILLIAMS stated further "The progress of the revolution can be seen all over--if this is Communism, then I vote for Communism."

An article appearing in the July 26, 1960, issue of the "Durham Sun" a Durham, North Carolina, newspaper, carried an article written by DREW PEARSON, dateline New York City. According to the article, WILLIAMS had visited Cuba several times

and had invited CASTRO to visit him in North Carolina. The article further reflected that WILLIAMS stated he had received a telegram from CASTRO stating that the State Department would not let him move outside of Manhattan and could not visit WILLIAMS in North Carolina.

Chief of Police A. A. MAUNEY, Monroe, North Carolina, advised SA ROGER E. SCHULTZ in August, 1961, that true bills of indictment were returned by a Union County Grand Jury, Monroe, North Carolina, on August 28, 1961, against ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS and on August 31, 1961, against HAROLD REAPE, RICHARD CROWDER, JOHN C. LOWRY and WILLIE E. MALLORY, charging two counts of violation of the North Carolina State Kidnaping Statute in connection with the kidnaping of Mr. and Mrs. G. BRUCE STEGALL at Monroe, North Carolina, on August 27, 1961, following a race riot at Monroe on August 27, 1961. Chief MAUNEY advised that REAPE, CROWDER and LOWRY were in custody and that WILLIAMS and MALLORY had fled.

On August 28, 1961, an authorized complaint was filed before United States Commissioner ROBERT L. SCOTT, Charlotte, North Carolina, by SA GORDON S. CASE charging WILLIAMS with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution in violation of Title 18, Section 1073, United States Code, in that WILLIAMS fled the State of North Carolina to avoid prosecution for the crime of kidnaping. On August 28, 1961, Mr. ROBERT L. SCOTT issued a Federal warrant charging the above violation and forwarded same to the United States Marshal, Western District of North Carolina, Asheville, North Carolina.

Chief of Police MAUNEY subsequently advised that according to information received by him, WILLIAMS had fled to Cuba where he is still living.

On 2/5/63 Mrs. DORTHEA MILES advised that HENRY MAYER, who formerly resided at 5330 Junius Street, Dallas, Texas, had given a change of address to 5611 Linell Street, Dallas, with the date not being recorded.

On 1/31/63 Mr. J. G. VICKREY, Identification Bureau, Dallas PD, and EDNA MAE CARTER, Records Section, Dallas PD, reported that they could find no information concerning MAYER.

It was observed on 2/1/63 that the United Furniture Workers Union of America is located in the Labor Temple in Dallas.

In connection with the case entitled "HAROLD JEROME MANN, JR., aka., ISA, 1950-LABOR," Dallas file 122-37, SA LEWIS D. KUYKENDALL determined that MAYER is employed as an organizer with the United Furniture Workers of America, AFL-CIO, Local 376, Dallas and Athens, Texas. His work is of a temporary nature and he is currently residing at Athens, Texas.

On 3/7/63, [redacted] who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised he had not been in contact with MAYER in recent weeks and did not know his current address, although he was last known to be employed as a labor organizer for the Furniture Workers Union in Dallas. Informant claimed that MAYER is not a member of the CP in Dallas and had been a member in Dallas during the past several years.

In view of the above, it would appear that MAYER does not fit the criteria for inclusion on the Reserve Index or the Security Index and therefore it is suggested that this case be closed.

MRS. BIRDIE E. BELCHER, Retail Merchants Credit Association, Dallas, on 1/15/63, advised SA EDWIN D. KUYKENDALL that FRED WARD HUDSPETH, wife MILLIE born 7/12/09, formerly resided at 4215 Eycliff, Dallas, but as of 9/62 resided at 3863 Walnut Hill Lane, Dallas, and continued to be employed by Southwest Novelty Company, Dallas, telephone NH 6-2944. He had a son, age 19, in 1957. No derogatory data appeared.

The current Dallas telephone directory and the 1962 Dallas City Directory reflect subject resides at 3863 Walnut Hill Lane, Dallas. City Directory indicates he is employed by Southwest Novelty Company and his wife's name is MILLIE. The Crisscross Telephone Directory for 1962 does not list NH 6-2944, alleged number of Southwest Novelty Company.

A review of instant file and of the Dallas indices provides no indication subject has engaged in activities of any subversive organization subsequent to the last report submitted in this case. It appears, however, he continues friendly with NATALIE and ELWOOD ROSS, CP members.

Dallas report of SA JAMES P. HOSTY, JR., 11/30/60, reflects subject then was being placed on the Reserve Index, Section B, because of his reported past CP membership and his continued association with CP members in Dallas. There appears to be no change between then and now regarding his sympathies and, therefore, it is recommended subject be continued on the Reserve Index, Section B.

It does not appear that subject has potential for development as an informant or source of information. Also it does not appear he qualifies for the Security Index.
