Inspector D. E. MOORE made telephonic inquiry 11:35 A.M., this date, and referred to our letter dated 6/5/64, to the Laboratory concerning exhibiting the Fair Play for Cuba Committee card to MARINA OSWALD. He desired to know if it had been determined from MARINA OSWALD why she signed the card and what were the circumstances.

Inspector MOORE was telephonically advised on this date at 12:00 Noon that MARINA OSWALD had signed the card at the request of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and he had told her the reason was none of her business. The 302 interview dated June 6, 1964, conducted on June 3, 1964, was dictated at this time.

Inspector MOORE called back at 1:37 P.M. and noted discrepancy in the referenced letter wherein it stated MARINA OSWALD was interviewed on June 4, 1964; however, the 302 indicates she was interviewed on June 3. He was advised that the interview was conducted on June 3 and the correction would be made in the Dallas letter, with Inspector MOORE making similar corrections at the SOG. He was also advised that MARINA had advised today that this card was signed by her during the month of July or August 1963, while in New Orleans, and that we would submit a 302 concerning this interview.

Subject interviewed Albuquerque today. At outset of interview stated does not like FBI or any law enforcement agencies. Stated he is going about the country seeking the truth, that he formerly sought religious truths, and is now seeking political truths, that he, Oswald, Buddha, Jesus Christ, and others like them are seeking the truth and as long as people like these are allowed to be around "there is hope for the planet." Said he traveled a great deal and his path could have crossed that of OSWALD's, but admitted he did not know OSWALD personally and had no information concerning him. Rambled in irrational manner.

In view of above and since no indication of threat against President or any knowledge of OSWALD, letterhead memorandum being disseminated to Secret Service locally and matter being closed.

[redacted] on 5/24/64, furnished an oral report to SA EDWIN D. KUYKENDALL. It was dictated on 5/26/64, to steno EVALYN MIDDLETON. It was typed on 6/1/64, and was authenticated on 6/3/64, by source in presence of SA EDWIN D. KUYKENDALL. The original is filed as [redacted] Source

Source in this report advised that at about 7:30 PM, Saturday, 5/23/64, approximately 40 persons were present at the Central Baptist Church, Plano, Texas. The pastor of the church, name unknown, introduced the first speaker, Dr. BILLY JAMES HARGIS. Some patriotic songs were sung. As persons entered the building literature of the Christian Anti-Communist Crusade was distributed.

HARGIS was the first speaker, reviewing material contained in leaflets distributed to those present. His discussion indicated objection to CASTRO in Cuba and indicated his anti-communist sympathies. HARGIS introduced CARLOS BRINGUIER as the person who debated LEE HARVEY OSWALD in 1963, on a radio program in Louisiana. HARGIS told about BRINGUIER finding out OSWALD was a "Communist Agent working with CASTRO," and said BRINGUIER has turned all of his information over to proper investigating authorities. He said this was two or three months prior to the day of President KENNEDY'S assassination.

CARLOS BRINGUIER then took the floor as the next speaker. He said his uncle, name unknown, was some kind of an official in Cuba before BATISTA was President in Cuba.

BRINGUIER said he was in Cuba at the time of the overthrow of the Batista Government by CASTRO and told how FIDEL CASTRO personally assassinated a relative of BRINGUIER by shooting him. BRINGUIER, in broken English, spoke about his leaving Cuba and coming to New Orleans, Louisiana, where he got into a store business with his brother-in-law. Then in the middle of 1963, LEE HARVEY OSWALD walked into his place of business and told him he was against FIDEL CASTRO and was interested in helping CARLOS BRINGUIER train exiled Cubans in a nearby training camp near New Orleans. BRINGUIER said he was suspicious of OSWALD already because a few days before that incident BRINGUIER and his friends had received information from someone in Mexico who was connected with Cuban activities, that there was a spy in the New Orleans area (pro-CASTRO). He said OSWALD, from his conversation, already knew about the existence of the secret training camp for exiled Cubans near New Orleans, where Cubans in exile were being trained to be returned to Cuba to fight the CASTRO Government. BRINGUIER stated he felt sure OSWALD was the CASTRO spy who had been reported to be in the New Orleans area. He claimed he told OSWALD his only interest in the organization known as "Cuban Student Directorate" was for the propaganda angle and not actually to help train people at the camp; that BRINGUIER'S associates would not need OSWALD. BRINGUIER claimed he was suspicious of OSWALD and did not want his services. OSWALD then left that store.

A few days later a friend of BRINGUIER told BRINGUIER he had seen OSWALD a few blocks away carrying a sign announcing he was for CASTRO. BRINGUIER went to the place where OSWALD was carrying the sign and both recognized each other. He said OSWALD seemed surprised to see BRINGUIER there. BRINGUIER added he got mad and called OSWALD a traitor and communist; whereupon, OSWALD turned his face to him and told him to go ahead and "hit him." BRINGUIER claimed he then realized OSWALD was trying to be a martyr and wanted BRINGUIER to hit him in order to gain sympathy. By that time a crowd had gathered. BRINGUIER claimed he told OSWALD he was through and might as well leave New Orleans. This occurred in about August, 1963, according to BRINGUIER.

A few days after the above incident OSWALD sent a Marine training book to BRINGUIER by some other individual as a present. He said that inside the cover was the same name that reportedly was the name in which a rifle was purchased by OSWALD that was used to assassinate President KENNEDY. That name was HIDEELL (phonetic). BRINGUIER claimed

He turned this book over to investigative authorities and that he has told his full story to authorities about his associations with OSWALD. He said that just before OSWALD left New Orleans, he challenged OSWALD to a debate on radio concerning CASTRO. They thereafter debated on a radio program, with OSWALD being for CASTRO and BRINGUIER being in favor of overthrowing CASTRO'S Government. Following that radio program OSWALD departed from New Orleans and BRINGUIER claimed he has not had any contact with him since. BRINGUIER suspected that OSWALD had entered Mexico shortly thereafter.

BRINGUIER talked about having helped train exiled Cubans in the New Orleans area. He said "we" and "our people" had recently burned some sugar cane fields or mills in Cuba. He said the exiled Cubans are still planning to slip back into Cuba and burn and blow up things. He said "they" are now ready to revolt against CASTRO and are awaiting the command to go ahead, but said August 1, 1964, is the deadline by which time this action would take place. He said the Cuban exiles are all prepared, ready and willing. He talked as if this training program is still being carried on, although, was not specific in stating where it is carried on presently. He said it was quite a program.

BRINGUIER had a record for sale for \$4.00, which allegedly contained a conversation between himself and LEE HARVEY OSWALD, in which OSWALD allegedly admitted being a Marxist or Communist and admitted working as an agent for CASTRO in the United States. BRINGUIER was also selling leaflets for 25 cents per copy. He did not specify any efforts toward recruiting anyone to help overthrow CASTRO'S Government, but was selling the above described items in an effort to raise money.

BILLY JAMES HARGIS then took the floor and talked more. He criticized the civil rights bill that was up before Congress.

He spoke about four books he had written that were for sale. He took up a collection from the group with contributors placing the names, addresses, and amounts of contributions on envelopes enclosing same. HARGIS said the money being raised by him was to begin 100 new radio broadcasts with the object of having 1,000 radio broadcasts regularly in Texas

Dealing with his Christian Anti-Communist Crusade activities. HARGIS mentioned that CARLOS BRINGUIER works for him on a salary basis. HARGIS said nothing about recruiting persons for activities in Cuba. HARGIS said BRINGUIER was there for the purpose of telling the story about communists being right "on top of us" and how communism was responsible for killing President KENNEDY. HARGIS said BRINGUIER and their group were trying to awaken the public to the communist menace. He said his organization was working in Florida a great deal pushing for contributions and selling his material. Several persons apparently made contributions.

BILLY JAMES HARGIS and CARLOS BRINGUIER appeared to have one or two other persons traveling with them in a Dodge Mobile Home (truck and house trailer combination). One young American looking man 19 or 20 years of age served as usher at the meeting. Another Spanish or Cuban looking young man about 30 lead the singing of patriotic songs at the beginning of the meeting, after which he sat down in the audience with a female who did not appear to be Cuban or Spanish. A man named G. P. or T. P. COMER, who claims to have a radio broadcast on station KSKY (Dallas) every Sunday morning, and a male individual named () RUSHING from South Dakota were present at the meeting. It is not known whether they were traveling with the HARGIS group. Also present was one Reverend BURKET (phonetic) of Dallas who was identified by HARGIS as his advance man in Dallas who served to set up his appearance prior to HARGIS' arrival. He did not indicate that BURKET was his advance man elsewhere.

Announcements were made that HARGIS's group next day would make appearance in Garland, Texas, and thereafter would be in Dallas a few days. In early 1964, the Christian Anti-Communist Crusade is to have a national convention at the Baker Hotel, Dallas, with Governor GEORGE WALLACE of Alabama, being one of the speakers, according to an announcement. The meeting adjourned at about 10:00 PM.

Informant further advised that one J. B. DENNIS, 1012 West Saner Street, Dallas, Texas, recently received by mail a copy of "The Thunderbolt" for April, 1964, a publication issued by the National States Rights Party. That publication contains an article that is substantially the same information that was given in the above meeting in Plano. In the article

appeared a photograph of CARLOS BRINGUIER which was shown herein as CARLOS BOINGUIES, and under his name appeared the words "Cuban Student Directorate." That photograph is of the person named CARLOS BRINGUIER, who spoke at the HARGIS meeting at Plano on May 23, 1964.

Source on 6/3/64, furnished to SA EDWIN D. KUYKENDALL a copy of the April, 1964, issue of "The Thunderbolt." Pages three and four of that publication issued by the National States Rights Party contains an article entitled "Proof OSWALD a Communist Agent" by CARLOS BOINGUIES of the "Cuban Student Directorate." (Pages three and four of that publication have been placed in the 1A section of Dallas file 105-1354. The remainder of that publication has been destroyed.)

Source also furnished to SA EDWIN D. KUYKENDALL on 6/3/64, a copy of the May, 1964 issue of a magazine entitled "Christian Crusade" published by BILLY JAMES HARGIS, which publication was distributed at the above described meeting at Plano, Texas, on 5/23/64. (Pages 3, 18, 19, 30, 31, 32, 33 and 34 of that publication are being placed in the 1A section of 105-1354).

It is to be noted that pages 18 and 19 of the above described issue of "Christian Crusade" states that the Christian Crusade Anti-Communist Youth University will have on its faculty, Summer, 1964, eleven individuals including Dr. BILLY JAMES HARGIS, Dr. CARLOS BRINGUIER, New Orleans, Louisiana, and General EDWIN A. WALKER of Dallas, Texas. Page 27 of that publication furnishes data concerning the forthcoming national convention of the Christian Crusade, August 7 - 9, 1964, Baker Hotel, Dallas, Texas. Pages 30 - 34 contain an article entitled "OSWALD; A CASTRO Agent in the United States" by Dr. CARLOS BRINGUIER. Page 32 of that article contains an advertisement about a phonograph album entitled "The President's Assassin Speaks", which is for sale for \$4.00 by the Christian Crusade, Box 977, Tulsa, Oklahoma. It states this is a recording of the radio debate between OSWALD and Cuban Freedom Fighter CARLOS BRINGUIER with introductory remarks by BILLY JAMES HARGIS. Photographs of BRINGUIER appear on pages 33, 31, and 19 of that publication. General EDWIN WALKER appears on page 19 of that publication.

Source had no additional information.

Source in this report advised that the BILLY JAMES HARGIS group, including CARLOS BRINGUIER made an appearance at 7:30 PM, 5/25/64, at the Community Hall, also known as City Hall, 4100 block Clarendon, Cockrell Hill, Texas. About 60 persons were present:

BILLY JAMES HARGIS opened the meeting and after a short speech and taking of a collection for Christian Anti-Communist Crusade activities, turned the meeting over to CARLOS BRINGUIER of the Cuban Student Directorate with headquarters in Miami, Florida. BRINGUIER was selling yellow leaflets in connection with telling his story to the group. He was selling the leaflets at .25 cents per copy and said he was trying to accumulate money to help in the coming invasion of Cuba by Cuban exiles by August 1, 1964, as has been planned. He told substantially the same story that he gave at Plano, Texas, on the night of 5/23/64. He stated in connection with that story that there are about 4,000 Cuban exiles in New Orleans who are his followers and associates. In talking at Plano on 5/23/64, about the Marine book that LEE OSWALD had given to him in the middle of 1963, at New Orleans, he said the name shown inside the cover of that book was HIDEELL (phonetic). At the meeting, however, in Cockrell Hill he did not state the same thing, but said literature OSWALD was passing out in New Orleans bore the name of A. J. HIDEELL. BRINGUIER claims to hold a doctor's degree and claims he receives a salary from

BILLY JAMES HARGIS for his present speaking activities. Later in the meeting an unidentified person in the audience asked how long the President's Commission investigating the assassination of President KENNEDY had talked to BRINGUIER and it was said that BRINGUIER was interviewed three hours; that the Warren Commission wanted to call BRINGUIER again to testify in the future. BRINGUIER indicated he did not want to discuss there his testimony before that commission.

BRINGUIER did not openly solicit persons at this meeting toward assisting in the alleged forthcoming invasion of Cuba, or for membership in his organization known as Cuban Students Directorate.

Source on 6/3/64, furnished to SA EDWIN D. KUYKENDALL a copy of a yellow leaflet entitled "OSWALD: A CASTRO Agent in the United States" by CARLOS BRINGUIER, and which reflects it is a Christian Crusade publication, Tulsa, Oklahoma. Source orally stated these leaflets were sold by CARLOS BRINGUIER at the above mentioned meeting at Cockrell Hill, Texas, and also by BRINGUIER on 5/23/64, at Plano, Texas, for .25 cents per copy. (That leaflet is being placed in the 1A section of 105-1354.)

On the afternoon of June 17, 1964, telephonic contact was had by ASAC KYLE G. CLARK with Inspector JAMES R. MALLEY at the Bureau concerning the following matters:

In connection with the copy of the Bureau's letter to the President's Commission dated June 16, 1964, concerning the major case prints being taken of certain employees of the Texas School Book Depository, it was pointed out that the date in the second paragraph, line 4, reflecting date of contact with Mr. ROY S. TRULY should be June 12, 1964, instead of June 11, 1964. Mr. MALLEY was advised that Dallas airtel to Bureau of June 12, 1964, (100-10461-6647) had erroneously reflected such date of contact as June 11, but that the LHM submitted by Dallas dated June 16, 1964, reflected the correct date of contact as June 12, 1964.

It was pointed out to Inspector MALLEY that in connection with Bureau letter to Dallas, 6/15/64, under the LEE HARVEY OSWALD caption enclosing an undated memorandum of 11 pages in the assassination case and an updated

It was pointed out that Dallas had previously completely documented sentence by sentence the complete letterhead memorandum in the assassination case and that the copy of such memorandum containing the noted documentation had been sent to the Bureau early in the investigation.

He stated that with respect to the memorandum pertaining to the RUBY case, it was indicated therein that RUBY was acquainted with a gun dealer by the name of JACK SCARAMUZZO, which had not been checked out. (SA CLEMENTS has advised that this has now been checked.)

Inspector MALLEY was also asked about the Bureau airtel to San Diego dated June 17, 1964, in the assassination-captioned case which deals with a miscellaneous allegation concerning one ARTHUR GILBERT IMHOFF and Arizona License EZY 958. It was pointed out to Inspector MALLEY that this Bureau airtel instructed that since the investigation was being submitted in appropriate letterhead memorandum that it would not be necessary for Dallas to subsequently submit such information in report form. This not being consistent with the current instructions known to Dallas with respect to the inclusion of all miscellaneous allegations in report form caused the question to be raised and Mr. MALLEY stated that in this particular allegation it would not be necessary to include in a report and such instructions will be complied with.

Inspector J. R. MALLEY called at 3:50 PM today and stated that the Commission is trying to tie in the two interviews with Mrs. EDITH WHITWORTH and Mrs. HUNTER. He noted that they are the only two who have placed OSWALD with going to the gunshop where the tag shows up in OSWALD's name. Mr. MALLEY said they are trying to get away from the possibility that OSWALD had actually had any work done in the work shop. They are aiming to get whatever they can to show the basis for these interviews. Mr. MALLEY inquired as to whether the notes taken by himself and by me were still available or whether they had been thrown away. I advised that I had reviewed all these notes and as they now were "completely cold", they had been thrown away. He then inquired if Dallas Office had checked with all the Agents who were on the interviews, and I advised that we had only checked with SA GRIFFIN. Mr. MALLEY said if GRIFFIN doesn't remember how this lead came about, he may have to check all the hospitals for records of babies born on Oct. 20 and try to run down the families and see if they have another child about the same age of the older OSWALD child. Mr. MALLEY said this lead may have been based on a newspaper story appearing somewhere; that there may have been a lead card made up and it has now been destroyed, but there should have been something on the administrative page to show the basis for it.

I advised that I would call SA JIM KENNEDY, Austin, and see if he remembers the basis of the interviews.

Mr. MALLEY said they have a good point in trying to cut down any _____ between the furniture store people sending them down to the gunshop. MARINA says she was not along; but it is authentic to this girl's story. She asked when their child was born, and they came back with the answer Oct. 20, and she says she recalls it well because her grandchild was born Oct. 20, the date the OSWALD baby was born. Mr. MALLEY said "We may have to end up saying that is the basis on which we went out to see these people" and the Commission may still come back and want us to check hospitals to see if it was possibly someone else.

Mr. MALLEY requested that he be advised to whether our checks with these people

It is noted that the interview with Mrs. WHITWORTH on 12/14/63 was conducted by SA WILL HAYDEN GRIFFIN and SA JAMES KENNEDY. It is also noted that the President's Commission has referred to report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING, 12/23/63, page 65, which sets forth an interview with Mrs. EDITH WHITWORTH, who runs a furniture store in Irving and who allegedly referred OSWALD to a gun shop sometime prior to the assassination. The Commission would like to know the basis for our going to Mrs. WHITWORTH. It was noted that the Bureau has a memorandum from Assistant Director C. D. DeLOACH to Assistant to the Director JOHN P. MOHR, dated 12/6/64 to the effect that Miss GEAN CAMPBELL of the London Evening Standard reported that she had been in Dallas for eight days covering the assassination, and that she had interviewed Mrs. WHITWORTH and that Mrs. WHITWORTH had allegedly claimed that she had recognized OSWALD's picture after it came out as a person she had referred to a gun shop.

A check of the indices fails to reveal the basis for this interview.

SA WILL HAYDEN GRIFFIN and SA JAMES KENNEDY have advised me that this interview was conducted on Saturday, December 14, and to the best of their recollection, they had a lead to interview Mrs. WHITWORTH based upon information furnished by some reporter to the effect that sometime prior to the assassination, Mrs. WHITWORTH is alleged to have told this reporter that after pictures of OSWALD came out in the paper she recalled his having been in her furniture store and that she had referred him to a gun shop. They both advised me that they went to the wrong furniture store across the street at first and were referred over there. It would definitely appear therefore that this lead given to them was based upon a telephone call from the Bureau in regard to the contact by GEAN CAMPBELL.

At the time of the conversation, it was apparent she was either feeling very badly, which she said she was, or had just awakened which is very probable. It could be she could not hear the doorbell ringing if someone had been at the door.

Chief GOLDEN, Richardson PD, telephonically advised 9:00 a.m. that contact had been made with the individuals previously referred to and it was determined they were employees of the RAI Corporation, Italiana Radio and T.V., 717 5th Avenue, New York. The individual referred to with the Cuban accent was the T.V. producer, ENGO BIAGI. He advised the Richardson PD that efforts had been made through MARINA's attorney to arrange for a television interview; however, MARINA's attorney had refused and after being refused, BIAGI and his associates had proceeded to MARINA's residence in effort to obtain photographs of her while she was outside the house. BIAGI told the PD that they had rang the doorbell; however, MARINA refused to answer. They informed the PD they were presently en route to KRLD TV in an effort to obtain suitable TV information.

Chief GOLDEN stated address was furnished to these individuals and they were observed to depart in a 1963 Oldsmobile convertible, yellow body, white top, bearing 1964 Texas license PU 4770.

Chief GOLDEN immediately dispatched a radio car and they have advised him that two of the younger men are in the car outside the house and the other two presumed to be in the house. Chief GOLDEN stated efforts will be made to determine the identity of these individuals.

How Much Credibility Will The Warren Commission Report Give This Witness?

Dear Mrs. West:

The following quote by Ruth Paine in your REMBOOK article is interesting:
"I didn't try to preach to Lee (Oswald) about right or wrong. I simply told him that I was the kind of person who had never been able to lie."

We wonder if this statement was as amusing to Lee Oswald as it is to us? In February, 1964, we traveled to Dallas to talk to Mrs. Paine. During the course of our visit Mrs. Paine told us a number of things DIRECTLY OPPOSED to those she told you. While we realize that Mrs. Paine was under no obligation to tell us anything at all, the fact of the matter is SHE DID. Therefore, either in her conversation with us or in her conversation with you, SHE LIED. Does this not negate her self-revealing statement: "I (am) the kind of person who has never been able to lie?"

Exactly how much credibility will the Warren Commission give a witness of this type? If Lee Oswald had lived and gone to trial, Mrs. Paine's pathetic assessment of her own "superb" personality would have been cut to ribbons under proper cross examination. As it is, the Warren Commission (and President Johnson whom the Warren Commission represents) is leaving itself wide open to an inordinate amount of historical criticism by accepting testimony from this type of witness.

Our human pity for Mrs. Paine's delusions and personality defects does NOT extend to the Warren Commission which as an impersonal body should know better.

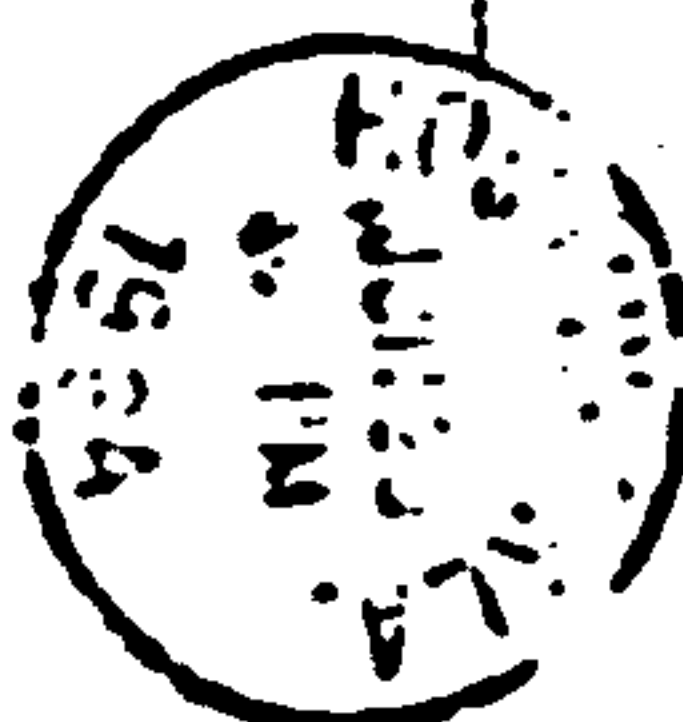

Inspector MALLEY requested expeditious handling for the location of any news release or quote on such a story that can be furnished to the Commission.

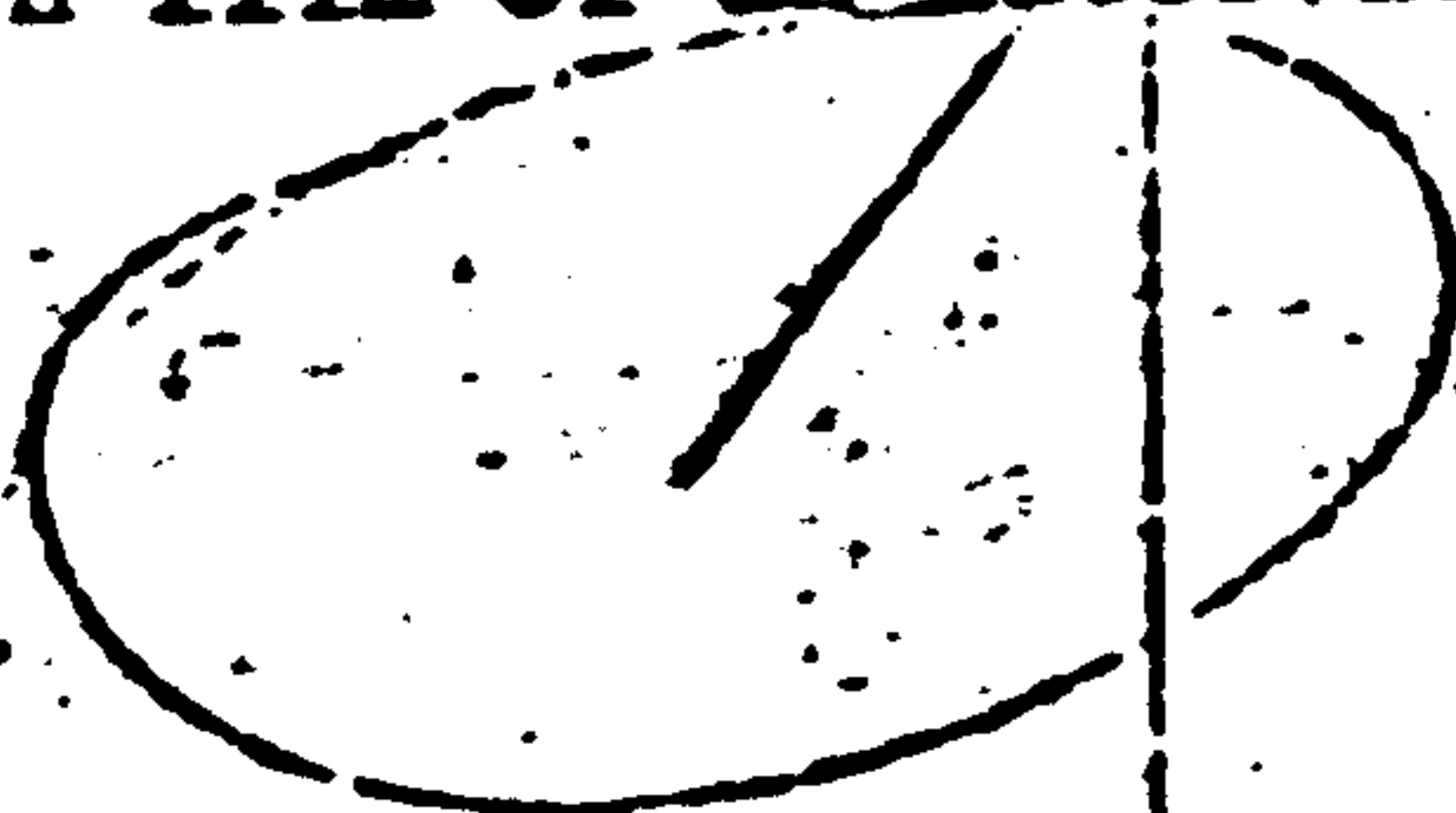
He instructed that in the event of his absence such information should be related to Section Chief REA SCHRODER.

(3) *VM* On 6/16/64, SA IVAN D. LEE contacted EDDIE BARKER News Manager, KRLD TV and Radio. He advised that ADLAI STEVENSON gave a speech in Dallas on the night of October 24, and on October 25, one of WALKER's aides (name unknown) called BARKER and advised that General WALKER was flying three American flags upside down on his front lawn as Dallas was a city in distress.

BARKER advised he would not give publicity to this act and the unknown aide called him numerous times for the following three days. BARKER continued that on Monday, October 28, United Press ran a picture of the flags being flown upside down on the United Press wire. He said CBS called him and requested that he take some television film of an interview with WALKER including the flags.

BARKER went to the WALKER residence and when he requested the General to stand beside the flags during the interview, he (the General) went into a raving rage, got into his car, and drove off. BARKER did not conduct an interview nor did he take any film. To BARKER's recollection, the flags were flown upside down for approximately five days.

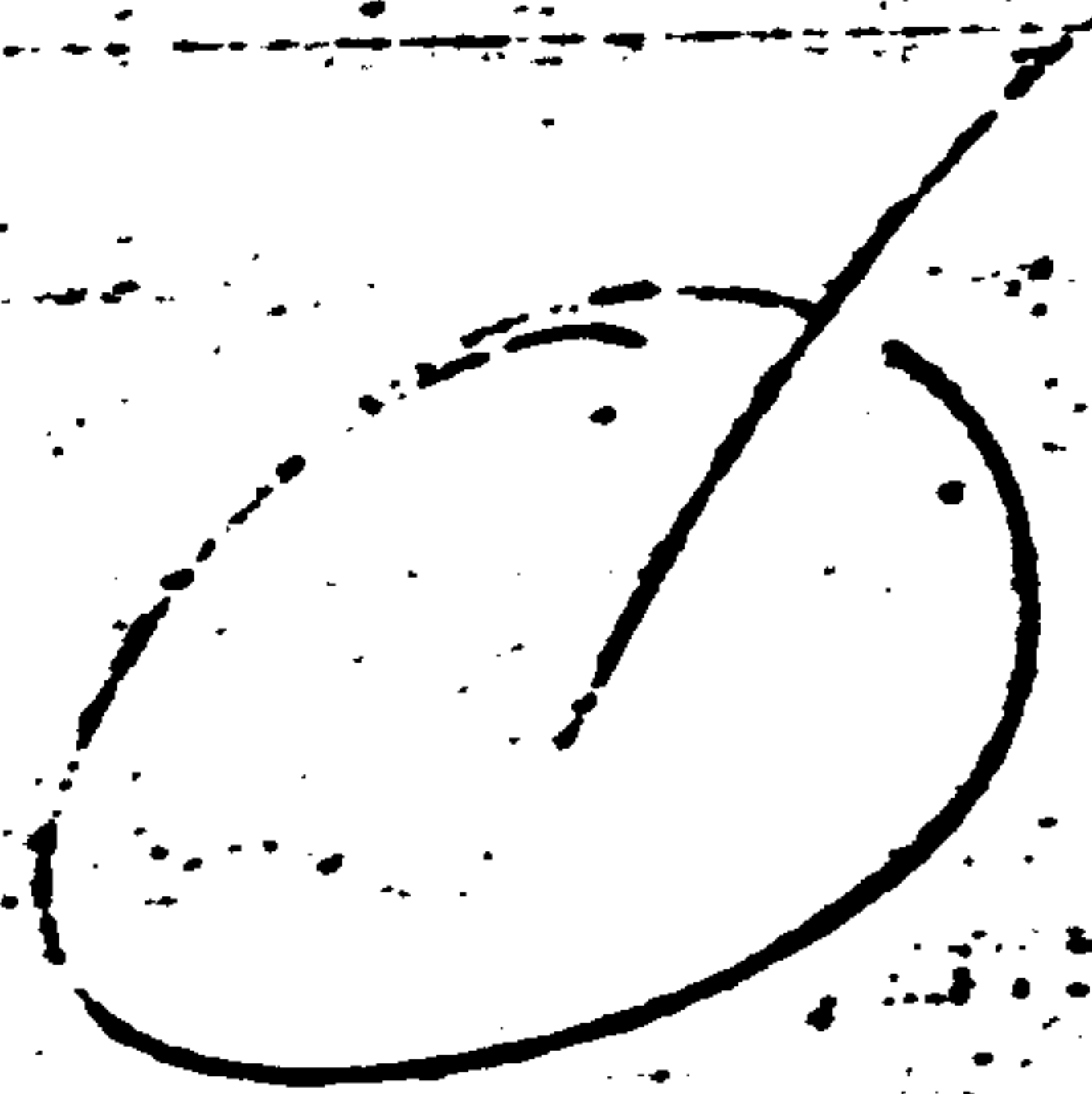
On 6/24/64, Detective H. BURRIS, Dallas Police Department, Burglary and Theft, advised he and Detective TOMMY TAYLOR also of Burglary and Theft, contacted a [redacted] Texas. BURRIS described [redacted] as a white male, age 53, who is blind. They contacted [redacted] in view of a letter he had written to the District Attorney in Fort Worth in which he stated he [redacted] was involved in the recent church burglaries and arsons in Dallas, Texas. BURRIS stated when they contacted [redacted] he started telling them all about his knowledge of communists and stated he had some letters written in Braille dated August, 1963, which stated OSWALD or a CHARLES WILLIAMS would kill President KENNEDY when he came to either Fort Worth or Dallas. BURRIS advised he and TAYLOR obtained these letters in Braille which [redacted] claimed alleged the above and they are presently at the Dallas Police Department, Burglary and Theft Division. BURRIS stated he and TAYLOR will be available for interview on June 26, 1964, and will make the Braille letters available to the Bureau.
