Inspector JAMES R. MALLEY called at 11:30 AM today and advised generally as follows:

we had had with MARINA OSWALD yesterday where she came up with additional material, he (MALLEY) thinks it would be well for Dallas Agents to go out and ask her if they could go through all boxes, drawers, etc. to see that she does not have something else that we should know about. This would eliminate any possibility of her having anything else we should have known about. MALLEY added that he had just had a long session this morning with the Commission and they said "What else does that woman have that we should have?"

I advised that we had tried to keep her cooperative and that we would have Agents go out and talk to her to see if she will permit the above.

The Commission would like a statement to put in their report to the effect that she has given everything and anything she possesses to the Bureau for the use of the Commission.

Inspector MALLEY called on morning of 8/28/64 and stated we will have a letter from the Commission as soon as the Bureau gets copy of it, about Monday, regarding fingerprints in which Commission is interested. He said Commission is particularly interested in palm and latent fingerprints which were found on the boxes on the 6th floor of the Texas School Book Depository. MALLEY stated as we will recall, there were 6 palm prints and 19 latent fingerprints which were identified as being on the boxes. Of that number, they identified 2 palm prints of OSWALD and either 2 or 3 latent fingerprints impressions, leaving 4 unidentified palm prints and 16 or 17 latent fingerprints.

Dallas at one time attempted to get TRULY to let us take major prints from all-employees of the Texas School Book Depository and he balked on that request and said we were utilizing too much of the employees' time, but he furnished names of those individuals that he thought would have had some logical reason to be on the 6th floor. There were 12 and we submitted those prints for examination and they were eliminated.

The question has been raised by the Commission as to what can be done to try and identify those latent impressions and the palm prints which remain unidentified on the boxes.

RANKIN says as long as this remains unsolved, the seven members of the Commission raise the question which could be in the minds of the public reading the report, that there has been a co-conspirator who has not been eliminated, and what did we do in completely trying to resolve this 100-10461-7706

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We are also to try and check to determine if possibly there were newspaper men on the 6th floor. I said I thought there were possibly one or two who did manage to get up to the 6th floor.

MALLEY said there is also the possibility that some employees of the Texas School Book Depository who might have had access to the 6th floor were laid off, fired or quit a short time prior to the assassination. They might have had something to do with stacking the boxes in that area.

The additional question is raised as to whether the boxes were stacked over from some other part of the building while they were paneling the top of the floor. The question there is, did all the moving of the boxes on that floor take place by the company employees or were they possibly moved by employees who were laying the floor?

If we can identify anybody who had access to touching the boxes, we are to get their fingerprints and send them in for elimination.

If any of the Agents may have touched the boxes, we are to submit their prints for elimination purposes, if this has not been done.

Inspector MALLEY wants major prints of Agents up on that floor so they can be eliminated. We want to be able to say that not only did we check other people's prints, but those of our own Agents. The Commission needs a record to show that we have made an effort.

There were only 19 latents and 6 palm prints, but you cannot take an individual latent print and tell whether it is from one hand or six different people's hands. If we finally find an individual we can identify as having handled the boxes, we can possibly eliminate half the prints.

We are to ask TRULY, "Do any of the people who handle the boxes wear gloves; do they always wear gloves, or only sometimes?

not identified the prints with the people whose names TRULY gave us. The people who work in the building are still possible people who could have touched the poxes and unless TRULY is in the position to make the positive statement that they were not on the 6th floor, then we should obtain fingerprints, etc.

Mr. MALLEY said that if we have trouble with TRULY on this, to let him know that either Mr. MALLEY will call TRULY or have the Chief Justice call TRULY and explain to him the purpose of this. We are to try to show him what the problem is.

If we can't eliminate the prints on the basis of the foregoing, then we are to check back on his records and try to find out who brought in the shipment of the particular boxes; that is, what trucking company or what railroad, etc.

Inspector MALLEY called today and inquired concerning the rifle in question. He wanted to know if when we got the rifle from the Dallas PD, was it fully assembled in its entire length, or was it broken down?

This is based on the fact that Lt. DAY says that when he examined the rifle, he came up with this latent print on the barrel under the part where the stock fitted around the barrel. Lt. DAY didn't tell the Bureau about this until Nov. 26 or 28, when we started asking specific questions, and it actually came about because the Dallas PD turned over to us some photographs which they had made of the trigger guard assembly, and they came back and finally admitted to us that they had this latent palm impression which DAY had lifted from the barrel.

Mr. MALLEY continued that the Commission said that on Saturday, the 23rd, Chief CURRY went on either rado or TV and made the comment, "Yes, we do have prints and they have been sent to the FBI for examination." However, on Sunday night WADE announces that they would have some palm impressions from the gun. The Commission is looking at this with a very dim view as to whether Lt. DAY actually removed the print from the gun itself, or got a palm print some place else, which the Dallas PD is attributing to be on the gun. The Dallas PD had a latent impression which they removed from the gun, which they finally turned over to us and the Bureau definitely identified it as beig OSWALDS. The Bureau is unable to do anything with the prints under the trigger guard.

photographing, or was intending to photograph, and that he then lifted the impression. They do not know whether he was asked the question as to whether he did or did not photograph it.

If he actually photographed it before he lifted the print, this will eliminate all the questions that the Bureau has about this latent print on the gun. We are to go to Lt. DAY and in connection with the palm print which he lifted from the gun, ask him, "Did you or did you not photograph it before you lifted the print?"



For the information of the San Antonio Office, it is noted that one of the leads being covered by the Dallas Office at this time in instant case pertains to an allegation that an individual called "OZZIE", who is alleged to be possibly identical with the subject, was a close associate of one "JERRY TOLLIVER" (phonetic) and they both associated with each other in Dallas upto the time of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

The above allegation has been received from a current inmate of the Dallas County Jail who has a poor reputation for telling the truth.

"JERRY TOLLIVER" had been unsuccessful; however, on 8/31/64, a police officer who is familiar with the source of instant allegation, advised that he had learned from one of his informants that an individual called "JERRY TOLLIVER" does actually exist but has not been seen during the past month in the Dallas area.

I do not remember but a small part of what he and I said in our rather long conversation, he said I have just gotten out of a Hospital and hitch-hiking my way to amarillo, he soon began to talk about our Elovernment and what our sovernment Officials in Washington stand for, and what they are doing, and he said a poor young-man does not have much chance, then I tried to encourage him to no affect, and I asked him if he drank beer, he said sometimes, I said lets go have a beer, I purchased him 2-cans of beer while he and I were in the beer bar he began talking about rich men, saying they have many times more than they need and are making it harder for we poor people I am going to go to killing them every good chance I have, I am going to get that rich-man H. I. Kunt down at Pallas. Then, by what I have been told mr. Kunt began making his wealth the hard way by working on a ranch when he was a poor young-man and has give quite a sum of money to poor people and to the benefit of poor people in other ways, then 100-10461. 7736. he said I will leave him alone.

I do not remember how this young-man looked and I did not when I saw a ficture of Oswald who supposedly killed President Kennedy, and since President Kennedy was hilled I have wondered if this young-man was Oswald, that I feel sure I will not ever know. Of course if this young-man was Oswald then Mr. Hunt is safe from him. I sam proud of what I said and did in Mr. Hunts behalf, I would do the same for anyone because I wish everyone well.
