The 10/24/64, issue of the "Amusement Business" magazine, published by Billboard Publishing Company, 2160 Patterson Street, Cincinnati, Ohio, contained an article entitled, "OSWALD MUSEUM". The article reads as follows:

"L. H. (Buddy) Hough, a fuel and gas businessman in St. Augustine, Florida, is assembling items for a Lee Harvey Oswald commercial museum. He already has the ambulance that carried the fatally wounded Oswald from the Dallas jail to Parkland Hospital, the handcuffs worn by Oswald when he was shot down by Jack Ruby, a library card used by Oswald in New Orleans, and he is negotiating for the furniture used in Oswald's room in Dallas and the car in which Oswald rode to work the morning of his assassination of President Kennedy".

This is submitted to the Bureau and Dallas for their information, no further action is being taken by the Cincinnati Division.

Mrs. HEGEMANN states that she may have seen OSWALD in San Antonio on the afternoon of 11/21/63, at about 3:30 or 4:00 p.m. She was accompanied by her maid, PAULINE SMITH, of 822 Perez St., San Antonio, telephone CA 7-9619.

PAULINE SMITH was not interviewed by the San Antonio Office, and will not be interviewed, UAC Dallas. It is believed that Dallas files undoubtedly reflect that OSWALD was at his job in Dallas on 11/21/63, during the pertinent period and, therefore, an interview with SMITH is not deemed necessary.

At 8:55 A.M. 10/29/64, DICK BAGLEY, Deputy USM, Dallas, telephonically advised that he had just received a telephone call from SAM GUINYARD, phone #WH-2-4535, who stated that he was the individual who identified OSWALD as the man that killed Dallas Police Officer TIPPITT.

GUINYARD stated that he has been staying at his father's residence (address not given) and last night four armed men came to his father's residence looking for GUINYARD. Said individuals asked (1) where GUINYARD was; (2) how long it had been since they had seen him, (3) when was he expected back.

In as much as there appears to be no federal violation involved or logical reason to believe that same is connected with captioned matter, same would be a matter to be handled by local authorities. Accordingly above information was telephonically furnished to M.W. STEVENSON, Deputy Chief of Police, Criminal Investigative Division, Dallas Police Department.

Inspector J. R. MALLEY telephonically advised at 1:30 PM this date that the Commission had contacted the Bureau regarding the survey bill submitted by Dallas County Surveyor ROBERT H. WEST. By background, Inspector MALLEY advised that Mr. WEST had mailed his bill in the amount of \$830 directly to Inspector GAUTHIER of the Bureau. This bill was forwarded to the President's Commission and they in turn advised that they desired to have an itemized statement. The Commission was requested to communicate directly with Mr. WEST concerning this request, which they did.

The Commission has now advised that they have not received an answer from Mr. WEST and that the Commission, intended to finish all business within the next two weeks. They advised that to facilitate matters for Mr. WEST, it would be best for him to submit his bill promptly.

Mr. WEST was contacted by SA BURNETT at 2:49 PM, at which time he advised he was not certain as to the form in which the Commission desired the bill to be submitted, and he requested that the Commission so advise.

He also requested that inquiry be made of the Commission to determine if they would furnish him a copy of his "Print of Survey".

This information was relayed to Inspector MALLEY and he suggested that Mr. WEST communicate directly with the Commission by long distance telephone. Mr. WEST was recontacted and he advised he would call the Commission today.
