





THE STRANGE DEATH OF JOHN F. KENNEDY

For many years there has been an awareness of the need for a thorough investigation and housecleaning regarding security risks in the Department of State. One of the key individuals responsible for permitting Lee Harvey Oswald to return to the United States from the U.S.S.R. was known to be a security risk and had been reported as such by the late Scott McLeod five years earlier, although the fact that he was a security risk had been known for sixteen years.

On October 31, 1959, Lee Harvey Oswald appeared at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow, at which time he turned over his U.S. passport, and submitted the following statement:

"I Lee Harvey Oswald do hereby request that my present citizenship in the United States of America, be revoked.

"I have entered the Soviet Union for the express purpose of applying for citizenship in the Soviet Union, through the means of naturalization.

"My request for citizenship is now pending before the Supreme Soviet of the U.S.S.R.

"I take these steps for political reasons.

My request for the revoking of my American citizenship is made only after the longest and most serious considerations.

"I affirm that my allegiance is to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

(signed) Lee H. Oswald"

In a report to the Department of State made on November 2, 1959 from the U. S. Embassy in Moscow by Richard Snyder and approved by Edward L. Freers, Charge d'Affairs, these facts were made known. The report and copies were sent to the Bureau of Security and Consular Affairs, Office of State Department Security, Central Intelligence Agency and other interested government departments. It showed that Oswald's manner was "aggressive, arrogant and uncooperative," and that he stated he had been a radar operator in the U. S. Marines and had already told Soviet officials that he intended to give them all the information he possessed. This would have included some very confiden-

tial data learned in the service. The report stated Oswald is "presently residing in nontourist status at the Metropole Hotel in Moscow."

In a report written on April 7, 1964 for the Warren Commission, John A. McVicar, now Principal Officer in the U.S. Consulate in Bolivia, and formerly assigned as Secretary-Counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow, pointed out: "Russian visas are given to tourists at \$30.00 per day for individual tours or the applicant must join a group. A regular visa is issued only after checking with Moscow and usually takes several months. "(Oswald ha obtained a visa at Helsinki immediately.) Mr McVicar also stated that Helsinki was a por of entry of the type the Russians themselves would have chosen for Oswald. Oswald entere the Soviet Union at Vyborg on October 16, 195 using U.S. passport #1733242 and had obtained: Soviet Visa #4173339 within less than forty-eig hours. In Moscow Oswald lived in the Hote Berlin and the Hotel Metropole.

On October 21, 1959, Oswald was admitted to the Botkin Hospital in Moscow for an allege attempted suicide. He had a small superficiatype cut on his left forearm, which required four stitches. He, nevertheless, remained in the hospital until October 28, 1959, and during a portion of this time was in the psychiatric division of the hospital.

It is a well established fact in intelligence circles that the Soviets make a practice of having a psychiatric study and interrogation made of defectors and candidates for intelligence train to help eliminate the possibility of their being double agents. Oswald's whereabouts became a mystery shortly after his hospital sojourns shown in a dispatch from R. E. Snyder, U. Embassy, Moscow, to the State Departmen Washington, D. C., dated March 28, 1960, which reads: "The Embassy has had no contact with Oswald since his departure from the Metropole Hotel in Moscow in November 1959 as has no clue as to his present whereabouts."

If the U.S. Embassy in Moscow considered Oswald as a U.S. citizen rather than a definite defector, they could easily have asked the Soviet Foreign Office as to his whereabouts, since the Embassy does keep track of U.S. citizens while they are in the Soviet Union.

Under date of March 28, 1960 the Department of State in Washington, D.C. sent a dispatch to the U.S. Embassy in Moscowas follows:

"An appropriate notice has been placed in the look-out card section of the Passport Office in the event that Mr. Oswald should apply for documentation at a post outside the Soviet Union."

After the assassination of President Kennedy, an investigation of the "look-out card" and what happened to it brought this reply from the State Dept. to the Warren Commission: "Miss Bernice Waterman prepared a 'refusal' sheet and an Operations Memorandum which show that she authorized the preparation of a lookout card; however, investigations, to date, fail to reveal any other indication or evidence that a lookout card was ever prepared, modified, or removed. -- it appears that someone in the Files or Clearance Section missed the 'Refusal' prepared on March 25, 1960, and failed to follow standard operating procedures to prepare a lookout card or that the 'Refusal,' after it lest the Foreign Operations Division, was misplaced or misguided in transit--"

Another explanation made by the State Department through Abraham Chayes, Legal Adviser, stated: "A'lookout card' was probably prepared on Oswald on the ground that he might have expatriated himself, but this cannot be determined with certainty and no such card is now in the 'lookout file'. A memorandum dated Mar. 28, 1960 from the Department to the Embassy in Moscow states that a card was prepared, and the customary forms dated Mar. 25, 1960 were completed directing the preparation of a card. The usual notation on such forms indicating filing of a 'lookout card' was not made, however, nor was a notation placed on the slip that the card was withdrawn, also a usual practice."

Immediately after Oswald's arrest for the Kennedy assassination, Abba Schwartz, head of the Bureau of Security and Consular Affairs, reportedly removed Oswald's file, and it has never been returned, a reliable source states.

Oswald eventually turned up in Minsk, Russia, where he allegedly worked in the experimental

During the month of March 1961 Oswald met a Russian girl named Marina Nikolaevena Prusakova. By April 20, 1961 they had applied for permission to marry. According to statements given the Warren Commission by Marina, she was dating other men duris the month of March 1961; and Oswald was patient in Clinical Hospital #4 at Minsk. I was admitted at 10 A.M. on March 20, 198 had a nasal operation and an ear infection take care of, and was discharged from the hospit April 11, 1961. This would have allowed but very short time for a courtship between t niece of an important Soviet official and a ni Soviet citizen.

They were married on April 30, 1961. Marina, whose parents were deceased, had been living for the previous four years with her mother's brother, Lt. Col. Ilya Vasilevich Prusakov of the K. G. B. (Soviet Intelligence) who reportedly was in charge of security for the Soviet lumber industries in the area. She lived with her aunt and uncle, who were childless, in Apartment 20 at 39 Kalinin St., Minsk After her marriage, she and Oswald lived at Apartment 4 at 20 Kalinin St., Minsk. (In some documents their address is listed as House 4, Apt. 24, Kalinin St., Minsk.)

By some coincidence Oswald had already been a neighbor of Col. Prusakov before he met Marina. On Page 605 of Vol. XVIII of the Warren Commission Reports, Marina des cribes his apartment (in which they lived after their marriage) as follows: "He had a small darling one room apartment with a balcony, a bathroom, gas, kitchen, and a separate entrance, quite enough for two, especially if they were young."

Marina continued to work as an assistant in the pharmacy of the Clinical Hospital at Minsk, according to Soviet records supplied to the Warren Commission. According to Oswald's diary, he was very popular with Marina's uncle, Col. Prusakov, who used to give him vodka to drink free. Oswald referred to Col. Prusakov as "my father-in-law."

According to the State Department report to the Warren Commission, Exhibit #950, the Moscow Embassy had no knowledge of the address, activities or any other information about Oswald in the U. S. S. R. from the time he left the Hotel Metropole in Moscow in November, 1959, until they received a letter from him postmarked Minsk, U. S. S. R., date

he desired to return to the nited States. He closed the letter with the following paragraph, "I hope that in recalling the responsibility I have to America that you remember yours, in doing everything you can to help me since I am an American citizen."

On May 24, 1961 the U.S. Embassy in Moscow received another letter from Oswald which stated: "I am asking not only for the right to return to the United States but for full guarantees that I shall not, under any circumstances, be persecuted for any act pertaining to this case."---"I would not leave here without my wife so arrangements would have to be made for her to leave at the same time I do."---"So with this extra complication I suggest you do some checking up before advising me further."

On July 8, 1961 Oswald appeared at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow where he was interviewed and filled out a questionnaire form. He applied for a visa for his wife, Marina, a few days later.

On July 11, 1961 a three-page Foreign Service Dispatch, #29, was sent by diplomatic air pouch from the U.S. Embassy in Moscow to the Department of State in Washington, D.C. regarding the Oswald case. It was signed by Boris H. Klosson, Counsellor for Political Affairs. The subject of the dispatch was "Citizenship and Passports - Lee Harvey Oswald." It contained statements and comments by Mr. Klosson. This three-page dispatch paved the way for Oswald to return to the United States where he attempted to take the life of Maj. Gen. Edwin A. Walker, and succeeded in taking the life of President John F. Kennedy.

On Page 2, Paragraph 3 of Dispatch #29 is stated: "Oswald was married on April 30, 1961, to Marina Nikolaevna Pusakova, a dental technician." It is important to note that in this vital communication the name of Oswald's wife is not spelled correctly, nor is her occupation listed correctly. Klosson, who signed the dispatch on behalf of the Ambassador, allowed her name to be spelled "I'usakova" instead of "I'rusakova" and her occupation to be listed as "dental technician" instead of "assistant pharmacist."

Klosson closed the long dispatch with the following: "Twenty months of the realities of life in the Soviet Union have clearly had a maturing effect on Oswald. He stated frankly that he had learned a hard lesson the hard way and that he had been completely relieved of his illusions about the Soviet Union at the same time that he

of the United States and the meaning of free-dom---" The report showed Oswald as havir earned only ninety rubles per month and having saved two hundred rubles for part of his return fare. This was also incorrect, as Oswald made much more than this and Oswald had lost none of his arrogance.

Since officials in the U.S. Embassy in Moscow were aware that the Soviets conduct training schools for agents and assassins to murder statesmen in the Free World, Klosson's uttendisregard for the truth and failure to verify facts concerning Oswald is especially sinister. Who is Boris Klosson?

Boris Hanson Klosson was born in Buffalo, N. Y. on January 21, 1919, the son of Michael I Klosson and the former Miss Kenena Hanson. He received a BS Degree from Hamilton College in 1940 and a MA Degree from Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy in 1941. He had studied for one year (1938-9) at the Institut Universitaire de Hautes Internationales, Gene Switzerland. On May 3, 1947 he married Miss Harriet F. Cheston. From 1942-3 he was an analyst for a U. S. Aircraft Company and then went into the U. S. Army, became a lieutenant and was assigned to the O. S. S.

In the O. S. S. he worked for and came under the influence of Gerold T. Robinson who was O. S. S. Chief of the U. S. S. R. Division of Re-Bearch and Analysis. Robinson was under investigation by U.S. intelligence agencies because of his pro-Soviet activities. He was a Director of the American-Russian Institute, 56 West 45 Street, New York, N.Y. (along with Avraham Yarmolinsky, father of Adam) This organization was cited as communist by the Attorney General of the United States. Th Senate Internal Security Sub-committee states it was closely linked with the Institute of Paci fic Relations. In 1946, in filling out a federa employment application, Klosson gave as a personal reserence his friend, tutor and asso ciate, Pros. Gerold T. Robinson.

Louise Morley, identified communist, who has taken the Fifth Amendment over forty time is also known as Mildred Vidor and Mildred Linton. She was long suspected of being engagin espionage activities on behalf of the Sovie Union. In 1943 she had made a trip out of the country under suspicious circumstances. Upo her return it was learned she had on her person a very confidential address book of contacts, among whom Boris Klosson was listed. Durit the couple of years that Klosson was active in

O. S. S., he was reported as Leing responsible for the leaking out to unauthorized persons of secret and confidential information to the detriment of the United States.

Klosson came into the State Department in 1945 and immediately was assigned with the Division of Lesearch on U. S. S. R. and Eastern Europe, doing highly confidential work. He was promoted many times and worked his way up to become Chief of the Research (Intelligence) Division for U. S. S. R. On July 26, 1959 he became First Secretary of the U. S. Embassy in Moscow and at the time of the report referred to was Counsellor for Political Affairs.

Klosson is now Counsellor and Consulat the U.S. Embassy in Kingston, Jamaica, having been assigned to this post October 14, 1962. Klosson, who speaks fluent Russian, had been reported by the F.B.I. in an investigation which showed derogatory information concerning his background. In 1956 the late Scott McLeod had reviewed his file and "Klosson" is one of the names on his list of 847 security risks in the State Department.

For conclusive evidence that Oswald was not rehabilitated or "relieved of his illusions about the Soviet Union" as security risk Klosson would have us believe, we submit the following letter, written by Oswald to the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C. less than two weeks before he murdered President Kennedy. It is dated November 9, 1963, and states:

"This is to inform you of recent events since my meetings with comrade Kostin in the Embassy of the Soviet Union, Mexico City, Mexico. (Kostin is a high official in the K.G.B.)

"Iwas unable to remain in Mexico indefinitely because of my mexican visa restrictions which was for 15 days only. I could not take a chance on requesting a new visa unless I used my real name, so I returned to the United States.

"I had not planned to contact the Soviet embassy in Mexico so they were unprepared, had I been able to reach the Soviet Embassy in Havana as planned, the embassy there would have had time to complete our business.

"Of course the Soviet embassy was not at fault, they were, as I say unprepared, the Cuban consulate was guilty of a gross breach of regulations, I am glad he has since been replaced.

"The Federal Bureau of Investigation is not now interested in my activities in the progressive organization 'Fair Play For Cuba Committee', of which I was secretary in New Orleans (state Louisiana) since I no longer reside in that state. However, the F.B.I. has visited us here in Dallas, Texas, on November 1st.

Agent James.. Hasty warned me that if I engaged in F.P.C.C. activities in Texas the F.B.I. will again take an 'interest' in me.

"This agent also 'suggested' to Marina Nich layeva that she could remain in the United State under F.B.I. 'protection', that is, she could defect from the Soviet Union, of course, I and m wife strongly protested these tactics by the notorious F.B.I.

"Please inform us of the arrival of our Sovi entrance visa's as soon as they come.

"Also, this is to inform you of the birth, on October 20, 1963 of a DAUGHTER, AUDREY MAINA OSWALD in DALLAS, TEXAS, to my wife Respectfully,

(signed) L.H. Oswald"

At 11:15 a.m. Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD, 3704 Crestline Road, mother of SUBJECT, telephonically contacted the Fort Worth Resident Agency and gave writer the following information:

Mrs. OSWALD advised that in last weeks Fort Worth Star-Telegram there was an article about Mr. FRED KORTH, former President, Continental National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas and former U. S. Secretary of the Navy under the Kennedy Administration, in regards to his separation from his wife of twenty nine years. Mrs. OSWALD said this separation took place on April 30, 1963, in the 67th District Court, Fort Worth, Texas.

Mrs. OSWALD further advised that FRED KORTH, was released from his job as Secretary of the Navy, a few days before the assassination of President Kennedy, and that FRED KORTH was under investigation on November 20, 1963, by some investigative committee in Washington, D. C., in his "bungling" of his job as Secretary of the Navy. Mrs. OSWALD said that KORTH is a "sleeper" and is responsible, in her opinion, for the death of President Kennedy, as KORTH had a "motive for killing President Kennedy than LEE HARVEY OSWALD did as KORTH was on the spot." According to Mrs. OSWALD, KORTH was in so much trouble that the Continental National Bank would not take KORTH back into their employment because of the above information.

Mrs. OSWALD stated she would like to get the divorce records at the District Clerk's Office, but she is afraid she would be spotted by news reporters and that she would like to "keep her theories as quiet as possible". Mrs. OSWALD further advised that she was fired from her job on November 11, 1963, with one Mrs. CARTER, who are personal friends of FRED KORTH. Mrs. OSWALD said she believes further that the Carter's and Korth's are as much involved in the President's assassination as all these dates fit in with her Son, IEE HARVEY.

Mrs. OSWALD also stated that her Son, LEE, mentioned FRED KORTH two or three times in his interrogation, and is further reason for her to believe that KORTH is involved in the assassination.

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Mrs. OSWALD stated she also belives that other than FRED KORTH, that BILIE SOL ESTES and BOBBY BAKER are all involved in President Kennedy's assassination as well. Mrs. OSWALD said that she firmly convinced that CAROLE TYLER, the beautiful Capitol Hill secretary called as a witness in the BOBB Y BAKER investigation, was killed in a plane crash in the Atlantic Ocean last sunday near Ocean City, Maryland, was involved with the Presidential Assassination or else in knew something about it as the news media has been suppressing this news story, in order to keep her from telling "all she knows".

At 1:15 p.m. Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD, 3704 Crestline Road, telephonically contacted writer and related the following information:

Mrs. OSVALD stated she left her house early this morning in her automobile to run some errands and she noticed another car following her. She said there was a young man in this car wearing "plain clothes" and followed her for about fortyfive minutes after she first noticed him. Mrs. OSWALD advised he made no "bones" about following her and at first she thought he might be trying to kill her or make her wreck her car as he was following her so closely. Mrs. OSWALD stated she remembered hearing over the news about Vice President HUMPHRIES pending visit to Dallas and she said "she put two and two together" and decided she was put under a surveillance.

Mrs. OSWALD advised she went out to the Rose Hill Cemetary to visit if the grave of her son, LEE HARVEY, and this same car followed her even to the cemetary. Mrs. OSWALD stated she asked the "young man" in this automobile if he was surveilling her and he advised her that he was. Mrs. OSWALD said she told him that she was going to make him work for his pay today and she stated she drove for two solid hours all around the south end of Fort Worth.

Mrs. OSWALD stated she called Chief HIGHTOWER and ask him if she was under a surveillance. He said, "Yes," as they were requested by a Government Agency to keep her under surveillance the entire day.

Mrs. OSWALD stated she thought it was a crying shame they are keeping her under a surveillance for they "should watch the men in Washington, D. C. instead of MARGUERITE OSWALD", for there are men in Washington, D. C. who is responsible for the death of President Kennedy. Mrs. OSWALD further stated she believes the reason for the surveillance is that she "knows a lot" and knows the "complete story" and "the truth" of it all.

Mrs. OSWAID avised that she was at her residence and she was going to have another glass of ice tea and was going to drive over most of Fort Worth so the man surveilling her would have something to do and was going to make him earl his pay for the day. Mrs. OSWAID said she was so furious about the entire matter and had a good mind to write President JOHNSON and the Attorney General. The writer informed Mrs. OSWAID ***Extraction*** that IOC-10461-2799

the Attorney General of the United States does not have the authority in such matters as this comes under the jurisdiction of the Secret Service. Ers ONVALD then stated she hadn't really made her mind up as to whether she would write anyone about this matter as was only a thought.

Mrs. OSWALD stated she has had enough grief during the past one and a half years without more insult to injury and that she is tired of being treated this way.

The writer informed Mrs. OSWALD of the FBI not having any jurisdiction in these matters and she stated she thought she would call Mr. SORRELS, Agent in Charge, Secret Service, Dallas, about the above matter. Mrs. OSWALD stated she thought the FBI could have possibly instituted this surveillance on her and was the reason for her calling.

Before Mrs. OSWALD discontinued her conversation she advised she was leaving her residence and give the young man, who is surveilling her, a run for his time and money, and "After all" she said, "This is good for the book I'm going to write" and "I have taken two photographs of him."

On this date at approximately 9:30 stated that the assassination of President John F. Kennedy was a communist plot which had developed in the Kremlin. He stated that JOLIET POYNTZ was a female Russian agent who had hypnotized Lee Oswald and Jack Ruby.

He further stated that there are over one million Americans being held captive in Communist Mental Health hospitals located in the United States.

He also stated that he was the inventor of missiles and that the

communicate had beat him up and burned 15 of his 30 factories.

On 6-3-65 Mrs. RUTH SIMNS Sec. to Congressman GRAHAM PRUCELL Wichita Falls, Texas advised she wished to talk to an agent. She was immediately contacted and related the following.

Mrs. SIMMS stated while in the Congressmans office in the Post-Office Building during the noonhour a strange man had come in and proceded. to tell that a man FNU OMIA who works in the State Mental Hospital at Tulsa, Okla. had told him a Russian woman named JULIET POYNTZ had hynotized LEE 33-33 HARVEY OSWALD and this had caused OSWALD to shoot President KENNEDY.

Mrs. SIMIS stated the man told her the state mental hospitals were; filled with anii-communists and the institutions are communist controlled.

She advised the man appeared to be a white male about 60-65, grey hair, about 5'7", brown eyes, wore glasses and one eye, believed the right was crossed. He was very dirty and unkempt and appeared to be a mental case according to Mrs. SIMMS.

The man said his brother owned the B and H Lumber Yard at Denton, Tex. and he was on his way there. He gave his home address as 4236 South 36th South Tulsa.Okla.

Mrs. SIMMS advised the man informed her he had told this story to the FBI in Dallas, Tex. Ft Smith, Ark., and Tulsa, Okla.

It is recommended no further action be taken since this man is in the apparently a mental case.

On 6/24/65 a woman who identified herself only as Mrs. BESSIR WILKINSON, 9503 Laneyvale, Dallas, appeared at the office. Her first request was to be permitted to look through the LEE HARVEY OSWALD files and the reports of investigation.

It was explained to her that this could not be done and she was requested to advise the purpose of her request.

She explained that she had been thinking for a long time that she might know something about the OSWALD case, and the more she has thought of it, she believes that on the day of the assassination she saw MARINA/OSWALD ||shortly before the assassination on the corner of Ervay and Main Street right in front of the H. L. Green stofe. Mrs. WILKINSON stated that she was there and had her little transistor radio up to her ear following the progress of the parade; that several people would come up and ask her where the parate was at the time, etc., but that some 4 or 5 minutes before the assassination, a woman that she now believes to have been MARINA OSWALD appeared to be real excited, with a flushed face, and said something to her about the parade, and she wanted to make certain by looking over our reports that we had exhausted all possibilities in determining just where MARINA OSWALD was at the time of the assassination.

when asked as to why she had not mentioned this before, she stated that she didn't know, but that she felt it was never too late. She then took out of her handbag the transistor radio that she claimed to have been using on the day of the assassination and stated it was not working now, but that if I desired, I could have the radio and send it in for examination as she believed the radio may have been used by MARINA as some form of signal. She was thanked, but her offer was declined.

This woman would not give any information about the hereelf except the fact that she is unemployed and has had numerous jobs in the past. She appeared to be about 60 to 65 years of age, 5'5", 160 lbs. She also appears to be about 50 lbs.
