On this date I received numerous calls from newspapers, television and radio stations regarding the fact that they have received information from Washington to the effect that the rifle and pistol used by OSWALD in the assassination and the killing of TIPPIT had been returned to the Dallas Office. In a number of instances, they wanted to come over and photograph the guns.

I called the Bureau and talked to Inspector MALLEY and advised him of the above. He agreed that there was no reason why I could not confirm having the guns in my custody, but that I should just tell them that I have them in custody for the Department of Justice and any further comments concerning why, or what would be done with them should be discussed with the Department of Justice in Washington, and that I could make no further comment.

I pointed out to him that I had already refused to permit newspapers or television stations to photograph the guns and he agreed this was proper, but suggested I take it up with Inspector ROBERT WICK. I talked to WICK and he agreed that the above comments were proper. He also stated that under no circumstances should I permit pictures to be made of the guns or let them out of my hands. I advised him that several of the newspapers had indicated they were going to try to get permission either from the U. S. Attorney here or from the Department in Washington. He stated that if the USA made any such request, that of course I should turn him down, even if he said that the Department had so instructed him, and immediately advise the Bureau, and that they would then get in touch with the Department so that there would be no such photographs made. I advised him that the only persons who would see the guns would apparently be the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Unit man and possibly an outside appraiser, but that this appraisal would be made here in the office without any press coverage. He agreed.

STATEMENT OF TIM TIMMINS, ASSISTANT UNITED STATES ATTORNEY, CONCERNING FORFEITURE OF OSWALD WEAPONS

AUGUST 17, 1965

The Government is proceeding administratively under appropriate Federal statutes to give notice of summary forfeiture of the firearms seized on November 22, 1963 in connection with the assassination of President John F. Kennedy and the slaying of Officer J. D. Tippett.

Title 26
USCA
4. 7325

The procedure for this forfeiture requires the Treasury Department to advertise the weapons in a newspaper on three occasions for three consecutive weeks. This advertisement will give constructive notice to all claimants having an interest in these weapons. In addition, actual notice is being given to parties appearing to claim an interest in these guns. Any claimant will have thirty days in which to file a claim and cost bond. If such a claim is filed the Government will file a libel which will result in the issue being litigated in the United States District Court. If no claim is filed the Treasury Department will declare the firearms forfeited to the Government. The first newspaper advertisement will run tomorrow August 18, 1965.

The weapons are presently in Dallas for this forfeiture action.

He stated that he recalls that just prior to the assassination of President KENNEDY, he recalled hearing three high-powered rifle shots almost every afternoon for a period of two weeks, and that after the assassination, he did not hear these shots any more. [redacted] stated that the reason for his not previously furnishing this information was that he did not feel it was important enough, but due to his confinement in the hospital, he thought he should now furnish it to the FBI in the event his health failed. He requested to have an Agent personally contact him at the above hospital for more details.

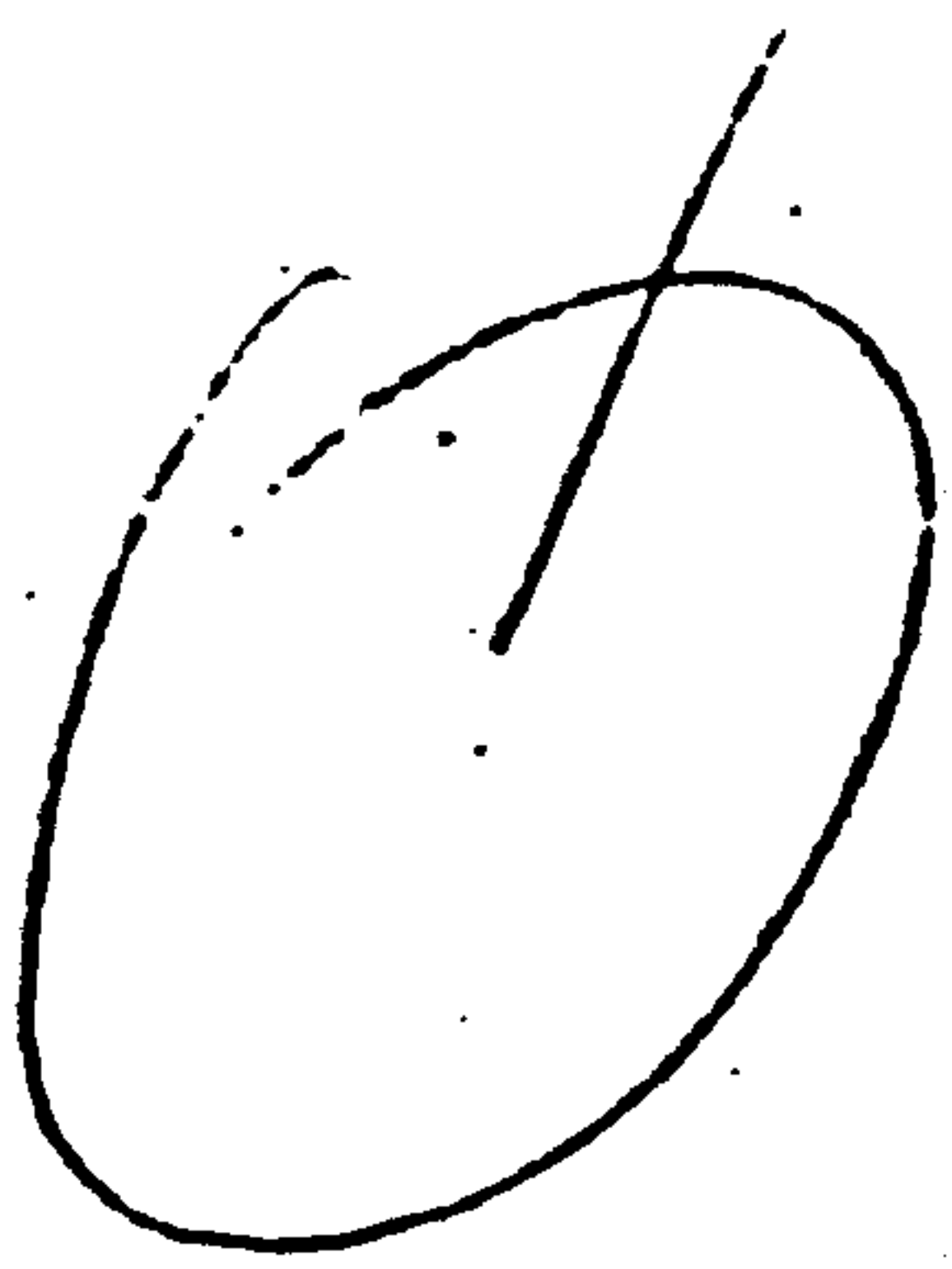

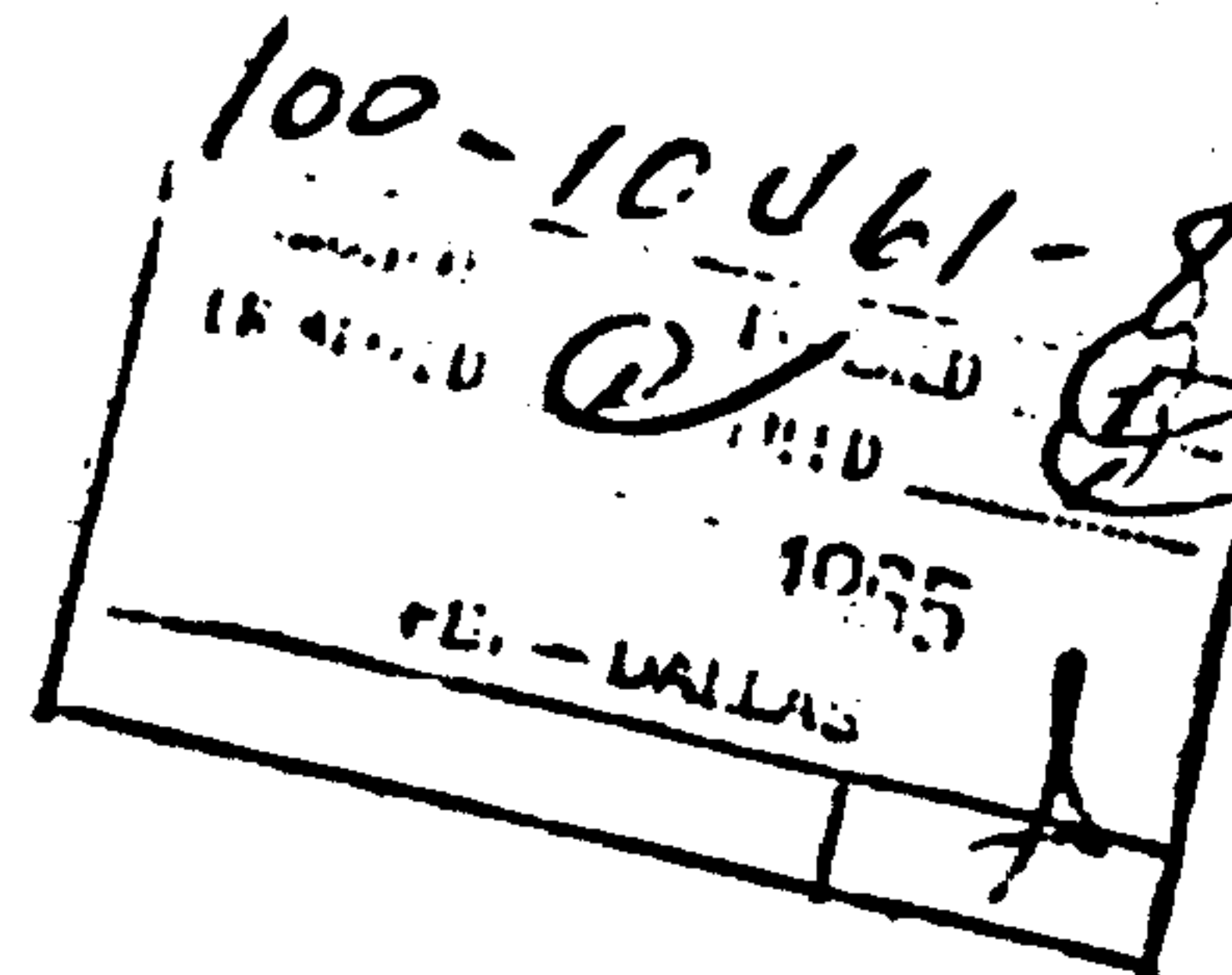

At 1:55 P.M., 11/11/65, Supervisor J. H. KLEINKAUF, Division 5, at the Bureau, telephonically contacted the Dallas Office and advised SA CORNELIUS W. SHEA that on 11/11/65, ~~MAR~~ MARGUERITE OSWALD, mother of subject, telephonically had contacted the Bureau on that date giving her telephone number as PErshing 7-7677, Ft. Worth, Texas.

MARGUERITE OSWALD reportedly stated she had just returned from Monahans, Texas, where she had been in contact with WILLIAM R. BOBKINS, 415 South Main Street, Monahans, Texas. She stated BOBKINS physical description was also identical to that of her son, LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She stated BOBKINS was a former Marine and he was discharged about the same time as LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She stated BOBKINS had traveled to Mexico City by bus about the same time OSWALD had done so in about 1963. She stressed the point that many of the allegations concerning LEE HARVEY OSWALD's travels could apply to BOBKINS and that the authorities had made a grave mistake. She stated it was her understanding that in 1963, after the assassination, BOBKINS had been interviewed by the FBI and police but that the information obtained had been ignored. She insisted that BOBKINS be interviewed as soon as possible. She stated that when BOBKINS was contacted by her RONNIE DUGGINS, a newspaper reporter with the "Texas Observer" of Austin, Texas, was with her.

Supervisor KLEINKAUF requested that Dallas advise whether BOBKINS had been interviewed together with a statement as to whether reinterview would or would not be adviseable at this time and that if an interview was deemed adviseable, Bureau authority should be requested.

On the morning of 11/12/65, Mr. CARLTON WILSON, United Press International (UPI), telephone RI 1-4085, telephonically contacted ASAC KYLE G. CLARK, inquiring as to whether the FBI had interviewed a WILLIAM DOBKINS during the course of the assassination investigation inasmuch as they had received information concerning MARGUERITE OSWALD's allegations and were considering
