A review of the LEE HARVEY OSWALD and assassination cases reflected that the individual referred to by MARGUERITE OSWALD was actually WILLIAM RAY DOBKINS and that he had been interviewed by Bureau Agent and definitely established that he was employed as a bakery in Monahans, Texas, at the time and subsequent to the shooting of President KENNEDY. The various references containing information on WILLIAM RAY DOBKINS was furnished the Bureau by teletype 11/12/65 with the recommendation that no further action be taken, UACB.
