On 8/5/66, Mrs. MAYBELL SLACK, 3506 Tom Green Street, telephone number GR7-4107, Austin, Texas, appeared in the San Antonio Office and furnished the following information:

Mrs. SLACK stated she felt she could have prevented the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY if her husband and family had listened to her. Mrs. SLACK explained that in 1963 she was employed by the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, Austin, as a telephone operator and on three or four occasions, starting approximately three weeks before the assassination, she placed several long distance, collect calls for a LEE OSWALD, once at the Texas School Book Depository Building, one at a number Mrs. SLACK assumed to be his home as a woman who spoke very broken English answered the telephone, and several to an unknown garage. Mrs. SLACK stated she listened to none of the conversations; however, "due to intuition" she felt something was going to happen but did not report it to anyone as her family told her people would think she was "crazy" if/she told any such story.

Mrs. SLACK then went on to relate information concerning a DONALD L. WILLIAMS and his family, who moved into an apartment house near the SLACK home in September of 1965.

Mrs. SLACK stated neighbors informed her SLACK was a student at the University of Texas; however, Mrs. SLACK later learned that he was not, but only associated with groups of university students. Mrs. SLACK stated she was convinced WILLIAMS was a Communist because he had large maps of Yugoslavia, pinned to his bedroom wall and because of numerous visits from "beatnick looking people" she knew he was a Communist. Mrs. SLACK stated

she discussed this matter with her family also, but once again was advised she only had a vivid imagination and to forget the matter.

Mrs. SLACK then returned to discussing the Presidential assassination by stating that several months prior to November, 1963, a man named ROY PAYNE moved in next door to her and almost immediately aroused her suspicions as he was a very quiet person.

Mrs. SLACK stated one afternoon, several weeks before the assassination, she and her husband were turning into their drive way when she noticed a group of college aged youths standing in PAYNE's yard, and one was a person she was to later learn was LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

Mrs. SLACK stated she is also convinced that an element of the Mafia is operating in her neighborhood, but would elaborate no further stating she had no definite information to prove this.

Mrs. MAYBELL SLACK is currently employed by the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company in Austin, Texas.

No additional action is being taken by the San Antonio Division UAC.



JAMES EARL JOHNSON, Superintendent, Rose Hill Burial Park, 7301 East Lancaster, advised that on approximately 11/21 or 22/66, MRS. MARGUERITE OSWALD contacted him and requested him to be on the lookout at LEE HARVEY OSWALD's grave for a wreath of flowers with/a card attached, signed "JR.". JOHNSON stated he was supposed to preserve the card for MRS. OSWALD.

JOHNSON related that on 11/23/66, he checked at OSWALD's gravesite and there was no wreath or any such card. However, this wreath was delivered on Thanksgiving Day, 11/24/66, and apparently had such a card attached. JOHNSON did not actually see the card but read about it in an article in the newspaper sent out by the Associated Press.

JOHNSON explained he was not on duty on 11/24/66 and the card has apparently disappeared as he can find no one that knows where it is. He assumed someone had given it to a representative of the Associated Press. JOHNSON said the flowers and card were delivered to the gravesite by florist

Fort Worth. JOHNSON understands an individual from California called the florist and had the card and flowers sent to OSWALD's gravesite.

JOHNSON had no additional information regarding this card or the name of the person sending the flowers.

On 11/29/66, Inspector JAMES MALLEY called and stated that there had been a piece in the New York Times indicating that some yellow chrysantheums had been placed on LEE HABVEY OSWALD's grave on Thanksgiving day, which was the Khird anniversary of OSWALD being killed. There was a note attached with these flowers which was allegedly signed "Junior." The note read in part, "LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Did he assassinate the President? Was he truthfully accused?" The note concluded again quoting, "He has left all the world confused." Inspector MALLEY Eaid that the paper also indicated that Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD had indicated that these flowers and the note were left by a former FBI Agent. He stated that President JOHNSON had evidently seen something about the story, and that he had been in contact with the . White House, and that they had received a request from the White House as to who this former Agent was.

I advised Inspector MALLEY that I knew nothing about this particular story, but that I had been in touch with on Friday of last week on another matter, and he had mentioned the fact that there was some story about a tremendous number of people visiting OSWALD's grave on the third anniversary, and that they had checked this out and found that there was only a normal number. MALLEY asked that I have an Agent contact the Superintendent of Rose Hill Burial Park and try to determine what the facts were in this case. The results of the investigation by SA ARNOLD J. BROWN are in his memorandum dated today, and these facts were furnished to Inspector MALLEY telephonically. I also advised Inspector MALLEY that I had contacted SAC Contact, on a very confidential basis, and he advised me that there was a UPI Story out of Los Angeles on 11/27/66 as follows:

"A 38-year old California man who claims he once worked as an undercover agent for the FBI says he is the person who left flowers on the grave of Lee Harvey Oswald. Harry Dean of Alhambra California disclosed his identity late Saturday.

"The yellow chrysantheums appeared on Oswald's grave in Fort Worth on Thanksgiving day, the third anniversary of the accused assassin's death.

"The flowers carried a cryptic note which was signed "Junior." The note read in part --- quote 'lee Harvey Oswald. Did he assassinate the president? Was he truthfuldy accused.' The note concluded, again quoting, 'He has left all the world confused.'

"Dean said he once worked as an undercover informant for the FBI under the code name 'Junior.' Dean says he personally thinks Oswald had nothing to do with the assassination of President Kennedy and that he was framed by other people involved."

Inspector MALLEY stated that I should have an Agent contact the Florist Contact in Fort Worth and she if he would furnish details as to where the flowers . were sent from. SA B. TOM CARTER/contacted at would not furnish the name of the florist ordering these flowers. He did indicate that the order came from the Florists Transworld Delivery Service, headquarters of the organization in Detroit, and he advised that he knew the name of the florist ordering from the number, and that it did not necessarily mean that the flowers were ordered from Detroit. He would not admit that they came from California. He stated he received this order and indicated it was by wire sometime before Thanksgiving, and that he was told exactly what to put on the note, and that he typed up the note with a typed signature of Junior on it. He then called the superintendent that he knows, namely, Mr. JAMES EARL JOHNSON, possibly the day before Thanksgiving, and then Again on Thanksgiving to ditermine if there were a number of people around, as he did not want to get any publicity. When assured that there were not, he personally delivered the flowers and the note and placed them on OSWALD's grave. stated the only way he



would furnish us the name of the florist was to write the florist and see if he had no objections. I furnished the above information to Mr. MALLEY, at which time Mr. MALLEY stated it was not necessary to have this done. They have checked on DEAN, and he is well known to the Los Angeles Office as a complete nut having been in the past admonished on numerous times to not claim any connection with the FBI. He also mentioned that he thought he had been interviewed in Chicago in connection with alleged information he might have on the Fair Play for Cuba Committee at one time. He advised it would not be necessary to furnish anything in writing to the Bureau as he has to get a memorandum immediately to the Bureau in order to answer President JOHNSON's inquiry.



SA B. TOM CARTER telephoned the Florist and told him not to write a letter but he did point out to him that the United Press had a story that a man in California had admitted sending the flowers. Stated that he did not want his name used but that this order did come from a florist in Alhambra, California at a cost of \$8.00. I advised Inpsector MALLEY of the above telephonically.

MALLEY, SOG, telephonically requested that efforts be made to locate any correspondence in our files on captioned matter which would indicate instructions were given by SAC J. GORDON SHANKLIN to all Agents on the morning of 11/24/63 to the effect that no Agents should go near the Dallas PD on that morning when OSWALD was being moved from the Dallas City Jail to the Dallas County Jail.

Inspector MALLEY advised that in the event any correspondence had been furnished to the Bureau (report or otherwise), he desired to know the date and caption of such communication.

At 1:47 PM, 12/15/66, Inspector MALLEY was advised that a memo in file by SAC SHANKLIN, dated 11/24/63 (serial 410, of 89-43) recorded the: fact that SAC SHANKLIN had telephonically advised the Bureau about the unknown caller who, on the night of 11/23 - 24/66, warned of possible harm coming to OSWALD as he was being moved. Inspector MALLEY was advised that a handwritten notation on this memo by SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING reflected the following:

"All Agents advised by SAC early 11/24/63, to stay away from PD during removal of OSWALD."

In addition, the attention of Inspector MALLEY was also called to pages 408 and 409 of the report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING dated 11/30/68 (89-43-1768) wherein it was reflected that SAs IVAN D. LEE and ROBERT M. On January 8, 1967, at 10:40 p.m., Security Clerk WILLIAM RAYMOND JUDD réceived a telephone call at the Pittsburgh Office of the FBI from a male who identified himself as ROBERT C/BEECH_1431 · Pittsburgh 34, Pa., telephone/(unlisted) 884-0974. BEECH advised he telephonically contacted the "Pittsburgh Press" and the "Pittsburgh Post-Gazette," January 8, 1967, to determine if they would be interested in his knowledge of LEE HARVEY OSWALD while assigned with the United States Marine Corps in Japan during 1957, or early 1958. BEECH stated that the interest exhibited by the two papers gave him doubt as to the propriety of such a disclosure. He was instructed to callathe City Editor of each paper on January 9, 1967. BEECH declined to furnish his name, address, etc., to either paper. -He stated that he was motivated in making the above calls in that he is short of money (specifically, a month behind on his car payment).

Further discourse with BEECH determined that he is not at all certain that the individual he has in mind was in fact OSWALD. He does recall of an individual who was in his radar group (interceptor unit) and assigned to his barracks. This individual had illegal possession of a .22 caliber pistol with which he sustained a self-inflicted wound. BEECH stated that as a result of this incident this individual was removed from his group and he did not see or hear of him thereafter. He stated the name OSWALD and the photographs of him bring this individual to mind. BEECH could not recall the spelling of the name of the base to which he was assigned in Japan.

On January 9, 1967, Special Agents EDWARD L. STEWART and WILLIAM J. QUINN located and interviewed BEECH at his place of employment, Career Personnel Service of Pittsburgh, Jenkins Arcade Building, Fifth and Liberty, downtown Pittsburgh.

Having been advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents, BEECH voluntarily furnished the following information:

During his period of active service with the United States Marine Corps, he was stationed in Japan with a fellow Marine, who may have been identical to the subject. He could not be at all aure of the dates involved, but thinks it may have been in late 1957, or early 1958, when he came in contact with this individual. REECH said he was a radar technician attached to the United States Marine Corps Air Control Squadron One, with headquarters at a naval air station located near Atsuigi (phonetic), Japan. This other Marine, known to BEECH only as (first name unknown) OSWALD, was a radar operator with the same unit. BEECH pointed out he was not friendly with this OSWALD person, knew him only casually, even though they did live in the same barracks room. At this time BEECH was a corporal, and he believes ' OSWALD was either a corporal or a PFC. He knows nothing concerning this person OSWALD's background, prior to their meeting in Japan. In fact, the only incident concerning this person which sticks in his mind is the following:

One night while they were in the barracks along with several other Marines, OSWALD was sitting on his bed, cleaning a pistol, when it discharged. BEECH and several other Marines, hearing the sound of the weapon, hurried over to OSWALD's bunk, and noted an obvious gunshot wound in his left inner forearm. He stated the most peculiar thing about the incident to him was OSWALD's reaction. The latter, sitting there with this obvious wound, said very matter of factly, "I believe I shot myself." BEECH further recalled that the weapon was not a Marine Corps issue and he believes it was a .22 caliber pistol. That night OSWALD was taken from the barracks for treatment and never returned to reside there again. He understood that OSWALD received some sort of disciplinary action for possession of a privately owned weapon and he thinks he

recalls having observed this person named CSWALD in the mess hall a short time after the above incident with a Marine Corps Friso Chaser, leading him to believe that OSWALD was give ome brig time.

BEECH could furnish absolutely no other information concerning this Marine named OSWALD. He recalled that at the time of the assassination of President KENNEDY and the period shortly thereafter when photographs of LEE HARVEY OSWALD appeared, that these photographs brought to mind the person with whom he was stationed in Japan, although he could not say for sure that the Marine he knew as (first name unknown) OSWALD was identical with IEE HARVEY OSWALD. He said his reason for not coming forth with the above information at any time since November 22, 1963, was because uninking about the Marine with whom he was stationed and the possibility that he was identical with LEE HARVEY OSWALD, he experienced very base emotional response and feit he would like to kill him if he met him."

BEECH said he is positive he never read anywhere or heard from any source that LEE KARVEY OSWALD ever suffered a self-inflicted wound while serving in the United States Marine Corps.

He explained to the interviewing Agents that he and his wife are currently undergoing a rough period financially and have fallen behind on their car payments. Therefore, they felt that by contacting the local newspapers anonymously they might be able to sell the above information regarding the Marine he knew as OSWAID. However, after setting an interested reaponse from two newspapers contacted, they feit they should seek the advice of the FBT, before going any further.
