Rolland Gainsley, Chief, Ann Arbor Police Department, Ann Arbor, Michigan, has advised that through liaison with the University of Michigan (U of M), he has provided some assistance to that University in connection with visit of Oswald. He said U of M administrators were most concerned that some protection be afforded Oswald, and that possible measures be taken to insure her privacy and safety during her stay in this area. He said his department has discreetly covered her few public appearances at the time of her arrival, her "press conference", and have given some limited escort service on request.

He noted her area residence has not been made public, and efforts of her host church, University officials, and her counselor at the University, have all been aimed at maintaining her privacy. All of her correspondence arriving at the University is screened for her at her request by a University employee, she being given only that material which is personally meant for her.

Chief Gainsley noted the course of instruction being undertaken by Oswald is a most intensive course, demanding some seven hours of class and language lab work daily, six days a week. He said that in their limited experience to date, University precautions against this visit were unnecessary, as Oswald has created very limited interest locally after an initial flash of publicity. She has become lost on the Michigan campus as "just another student".

Bureau liaison learned from INS on 4/5/65 that Lois A. Turney, Information Section, INS, Washington, D. C., received an anonymous telephone call on that date containing a threat against the life of Marina Oswald. The telephone call was received at 1:20 p.m. by Turney from an unknown man. He said that if Marina Oswald becomes a U. S. citizen, he would kill her with his own hands. According to Turney, the man repeated this several times. Turney suggested the caller put his threat in writing and have it made a part of the records but the caller said he wouldn't sign anything. The caller also said that Marina Oswald had made enough money and INS should let her get out of the .country, like Liz Taylor has done.

INS advised Bureau liaison that it had notified Secret Service Headquarters. INS also stated it had notified its Dallas Office of the call and instructed its Dallas Office to advise the Dallas Police Department. You should immediately bring this information to the attention of appropriate Police Department responsible for law enforcement in Richardson, Texas, where Marina Oswald resides.

Presumably the FBI will keep close track of him inasmuch as it seems strange that he would marry someone like Mrs. Oswald. I am well aware of the sum of money she has, which would be an incentive for such a marriage, but it has always seemed suspicious to me that she was allowed to leave Russia with Lee Oswald and also that a well-educated woman like her would marry someone like Lee Oswald in the first time. I have never seen anything in writing, as to the excuse for her ability to leave Russia with him.

I don't know what field of work Mr. Porter is in but certainly he should not be allowed to enter any crucial industry!

This marraige to a young man, twice divorced, and now her claiming the rifle which killed the late President Kennedy because she has been offered \$20,000 for it, makes her an undesirable person for the United States and it is the opinion of many that her ties are with Soviet Russia. Also, this husband being an employe of Texas Instruments, a concern having millions of dollars worth of contracts for Government use instruments, makes one wonder if there isn't something which bears watching. I trust that your department and that of the Attorney General never let up in checking her movements if legally she cannot be returned to Russia. # Marina, Groom Put Trust in Fate

FATE - Fate (Rockwall County. Texas, that is) smiled on Marina Oswald and her new husband. Kenneth Jess Porter, by offering them privacy from pursuing newsmen for a simple wedding ceremony.

The 148 men, women and childrep of this rural community were not aware that one of the world's most famous women was being married by their justice of the peace at 6:45 p.m. Tuesday.

Scores of newsmen were roaming the north central part of Texas searching for the couple as 41year-old Peace Justice Carl Leonard Jr. kolemnized the marriage vows.

"She said she just wanted a simple ceremony, in a hurry, before the reporters caught up with her," Mr. Leonard said.

#### PLOWING INTERRUPTED

He was surprised to find who he was to many after leaving his plowing at the request of Rockwall County Sheriff W. J. Price.

"I didn't recognize Marina when I stepped out of my pickup until the sheriff introduced me," he said.

Sheriff Price, along with his daughter, Judy, a college sophomore, accompanied Marina, Mr.

Porter and two men and a woman from nearby Rockwall in the sheriff's car.

The office, in which the civil 'double ring" ceremony took place, is a small white frame building 12 feet by 12 feet. It is simply furnished with an old rolltop desk, a few chairs and a framed fire department citation on the wall.

Justice of the Peace Leonard. who said he was "naturally surprised," talked briefly with the pair and noted: "Marina was very pretty in a white dress and she said she was very, very happy." Mr. Porter wore a sports shirt.

LICENSE IN SHERMAN

They presented a Grayson County marriage license signed by Mary Chumbley and issued in Sherman earlier Tuesday.

Mr. Leonard, who also tarms and operates a tire store at Fate, has married 50 couples since becoming Justice of the Peace in 1957, and he said it was his policy never to disclose "how much the fee was in a wedding."

An unidentified woman was Marina's maid of honor and one of the two men with the couple, known to the Justice of the Peace, only as "Mr. Wooldridge," was the best man.

The tiny room was filled with the wedding party, which left Fate in the sheriff's car immediately after the ceremony.

"I read from the standard marriage ceremony 'what 'God has joined together let no man put asunder,' pronounced them man and wife, and they kissed and left," the justice of the peace said. and they were gone. It sure has telephone calls from all over the United States began then."

This was a quickie marriage. Just two weeks age, I heard Marina was going with an insurance salesman," said an insurance salesman," the grandmother, who has "dedicated my life to clearing Lee's name and setting history straight on the assassination." "The whole thing (Marina's marriage) was quite a shock to me. It does affect me because I am the grandmother of Lee's children. My only interest is in my grandchildren. I was shocked to learn that Mr. Porter is divorced and has two other children to support. That's something to consider," continued Mrs. Oswald.

Mrs. Oswald has not seen the grandchildren since Nov. 28, 1963, six days after the assassination in Dallas.

THE MOTHER of the assassin also said she was "shocked again" when she learned that Mr. Porter had not told his own mother of his marriage. "When a boy doesn't tell his motherwell, that's something to consider," she said.

Returning to the subject of her son, slain by Jack Ruby two days after the president was killed, Mrs. Oswald said "Lee's father was a wonderful person. I only hope Mr. Porter will he that kind of father to Lee's children."

Marina Oswald, widow of accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald was reported planning to remarry Tuesday in Oklahoma.

J. W. Golden, police chief in Richardson where Mrs. Oswald lives, said the widow and a 27year-old Richardson man came by the chief's office Monday.

"Mrs. Oswald and Kenneth Porter came by and said they had decided to get married June I in Oklahoma," said the chief.

There was no official confirmation of the actual ceremony in Ottahoma.

Mr. Porter is an employe of the Texas Instruments semi-conductor division.

Last week, Mr. Porter told a Times Herald reporter that he knew Mrs. Oswald and that they were neighbors.

He denied at that time, however, that they had marriage plans.

A worker in Mr. Porter's de-, partment at Ti said Mr. Porter wasnot at work Tuesday.

Chief Golden emphasized that Mrs. Oswald's informing him of her intention to get married was not in any official capacity.

"They just stopped by yesterday on a personal visit." he said. "It was just a personal thing."

He said he became acquainted with the widow because of her need for identification and other matters in the past.
