Mr. DECLAN FORD, 14057 Brookcrest, Dallas, Texas, who is the agent and advisor of MARINA OSWALD, advised $2 / 1 / 65$ MARINA OSWALD's present plans are to return to Richardson, Texas, at the end of February, 1965. He stated he does not have a great deal of information concerning MARINA OSWALD's present activities other than she is attending her classes at University of Michigan. FORD said he did not know of any acquaintances MARINA OSWALD had in Ann Arbor or Detroit, Michigan, at the time she entered the University of Michigan. He stated he could not identify any person who might be a brother of a close friend of MARINA OSWALD'; in Dallas.

FORD advised his wife and he, along with MARINA OSWALD, had attended a New Year's Eve party with various actors from the Dallas Theater Center. He advised MARINA OSWALD had become acquainted with various of these actors and it is very possible one of these actors had a friend or relative in Detroit with whom he suggested that MARINA contact upon her arrival in Michigan.

Wolland Gainsley, Chief, Ann Arbor Police Department, Ann Arbor, Michigan, has advised that through liaisonwith the University of Michigan ( $U$ of M), he has provided some assistance to that University in connection with visit of Oswald. He said $U$ of M administrators were most concerned that some protection be afforded Oswald, and that possible measures be taken to insure her privacy and safety during her stay in this area. He said his department has discreetly covered her few public appearances at the time of her arrival, her "press conference", and have given some limited escort service on request.

He noted her area residence has not been made public, and efforts of her host church, University officials, and her counselor at the University, have all been aimed at maintaining her privacy. All of her correspondence arriving at the University is screened for her at her request by a University employee, she being given only that material which is personaily meant for her.

Chief Gainsley noted the course of instruction being undertaken by Oswald is a most intensive course, demanding some seven hours of class and language lab work daily, six days a week. He said that in their limited experience to date, University precautions against this visit were unnecessary, as Oswald has created very limited interest locally after an initial flash of publicity. She has become lost on the Michigan campus as "just another student".

Re: Marina Nikolaevna Oswald

The above source on recontact February 10, 1965, advi sed that a comment was made on the NBC Networkmerevision program "That Was The Meek That Was", February 9, 19G5, to the effect that two Michigan coeds had "beaten up" Harina Oswald. Source advised that considerable press concern resulted from above report and the matter was carefully looked into by University authorities and local law enforcement agencies. Source stated there was no assault of Oswald and the report was completely unfounded and without basis in fact.

Source advised that Oswald continues her enrollment at the $U$ of $M$ and that she is scheduled to complete her course in the English Language Institute February 26, 1965.

Bureau liaison learned from INS on $4 / 5 / 65$ that Lois A. Tunney, Information Section, INS, Washington, D. C., received an anonymous telephone call on that date containing a threat against the life of Marina Oswald. The telephone call was received at 1:20 pom. by Tourney from an unknown man. He said that if Marina Oswald becomes a U. S. citizen, he would kill her with his own hands. According to Turney, the man repeated this several times. Tunney suggested the caller put his threat in writing and have it made a part of the records but the caller said he wouldn't sign anything. . The caller also said that Marina Oswald. had made enough money and INS should let her get out of the .country, like Liz Taylor has done.

INS advised Bureau liaison that it had notified Secret Service Headquarters. INS also stated it had notified its Dallas Office of the call and instructed its Dallas Office to advise the Dallas Police Department. You should immediately bring this information to the attention of appropriate Police Department responsible for law enforcement in Richardson, Texas, where Marina Oswald resides.

I have read in the papers that Mrs. Marina Oswald, widow of Lee Oswald, has married Kenneth J. Porter, electronics worker.

Presumably the FBI will keep close track of him inasmuch as it seems strange that he would marry someone like Mrs. Oswald. I am well aware of the sum of money she has, which would be an incentive for such marriage, but it has always seemed suspicious to me that she was allowed to leave Russia with lee Oswald and also that a well-educated woman like her would marry someone like Lee Oswald in the first time. I have never seen anything in writing, as to the excuse for her ability to leave Russia with him.

I don't know what field of work Mr. Porter is in but certainly he should not be allowed to enter any crucial industryb

Many American people arc worried about Mrs. Marina Oswald and wonder if there is not some way that she may be deported to Russia. We are sorry for her experience as the wife of the late Kr . Oswald and this sympathy was show in the many gifts to her at the time of his death.

This marraige to a young man, twice divorced, and now her claiming the rifle which killed the late President Kennedy because she has been offered $\$ 20,000$ for it, makes her an undesirahle person for the United States and it is the opinion of many that her ties are with Soviet Russia. Also, this husband being an employ of Texas Instruments; a concern having millions of dollars worth of contracts for Government use instruments, makes one wonder if there isn't something which bears watching. I trust that your department and that of the Attorney General never let up in checking her movements if legally she cannot be returned to Russia. I am not the type of person ${ }^{\text {who }}$ sees Communism in everything which happens, but when a person has been reared under that source, there is a question if he or she ever becomes anything Lucile except a Communist.

As Marina Oswald hopefully began a new life today as the wife of a Dallas electronics vorker, Mrs. Marguerite Osvald prolested any possible changing of the names of Lee Harvey Oswald's two children.
'Lee's children are very acalthy in their own right. If 'Iarina's husband adopts Lce's "hildren, he might get control if their moncy," said the moth$r$ of President Kennedy's asassin.
"I have a right to speak out in this point. I'm those chilIren's grandmother," she said. Mrs. Oswald also saidme the vould have hoped that Marina :ould have married an older "tan with "no prio family."

KENNETH J. PORTER, 27, 'ivorced and the father of two hildren, married Oswald's idow yesterday in a quiet cetenony in the office of a peace instice in Fate (Rockwall bunty).
 heard Marina was going with an insurance salesman," said the grandmother, who has "dedicated my life to clearing Lee's name and setting history straight on the assassination."
"The whole thing (Marina's marriage) was quite a shock to me. It does affect me because I am the grandmother of Lee's children. My only interest is in my grandchildren. 1 was shocked to learn that Mr. Porter is divorced and has two other children to support. That's something to consider," continued Mrs. Oswald.
Mrs. Oswald has not seen the grandchildren since Nov. 28, 1903, six days after the assassination in Dallas.

THE MOTILER of the assassin also said she was "shocked again" when she learned that Mir. Porter had not told his own mother of his marriage. "When a boy doesn't tell his motherwell, that's something to consider," she said.
Relurning to the subject of her son, slain by Jack Ruby two days after the president was killed, Mrs. Oswald said "tee's father was a wonderfill person. I only hope Mr. Porter fuill he that kind of dutherner Lec's children."
