SHE WORE borrowed clothes at her husband's funeral Nov. 25, 1963. Her appearance had changed in recent months. She had been seen in Dallas nightclubs and attended musical programs.

She also had attended college for eight weeks in Michigan, taking an English course.

Much of her finances came from contributions and through the sale of articles her husband had written.

But she was shy in her appearances Tuesday.

At Durant, she slumped in the back seat of the 1965 red auto in which the group was riding. And at Sherman, two men—one of them believed to be Porter—entered the county clerk's office and presented the blood test blanks to Mrs. Mary Chumbley. She said Mrs. Oswald had to come in to personally apply for the license.

"Six or eight people were in the office at the time. No one else seemed to notice them," Mrs. Chumbley said.

A friend of Mrs. Oswald said no honeymoon was planned because Porter could not get off sufficient time from his job.

The two Oswald children were at her home with Mrs. Dorothy Peak, Mrs. Oswald's former hairdresser.

Marina Oswald, Electronics Man Married at Fate

An electronics technician and drag racer has taken Mrs. Marina Oswald as his wife, but not before eluding newsmen in a two-state, day-long automobile chase.

Kenneth J. Porter and his new bride got their blood test in Durant, Okla., Tuesday morning, their marriage license in Sherman, Texas, Tuesday afternoon, and then went on to Fate.

They were married in that Rockwall County village by khaki-clad tire store owner and Justice of the Peace Carl Leonard Jr., in a 10-minute ceremony at 6:45 p.m. Tuesday.

They finally went to the gray-black home at 1245 Donna St. in Richardson, which Marina

owns, for a few minutes' talk with newsmen, and left in their new red Chevrolet shortly before 9 p.m.

"They're going to head west," Richardson Police Chief J. W. Golden shouted to officers.

The car sped away to a honeymoon destination that the couple said had not been decided.

The 27-year-old Texas Instruments employe — divorced last year and the father of two — confessed that he hadn't known of the publicity that was in store for him.

"I didn't think there would be this much attention," he said on the steps of Marina's three-bedroom home after the wedding Tuesday night.

It was only about 100 feet away in the back yard patio of a house where Mr. Porter was staying—that he had met the 23-year-old widow of President Kennedy's assassin two months ago.

He had come riding up on horseback. She had liked him instantly. They went on fishing trips.

"I proposed about two weeks ago," said Mr. Porter, who has won many trophies as a drag racer.

The couple had planned to marry in Durant, but left after getting their blood tests because newsmen from several states were becoming thicker by the hour.

The Oklahoma blood report enabled them to get a license immediately in Sherman, thus avoiding the usual Texas waiting period.

It was only happenstance that the jittery young couple received

their vows from Mr. Leonard. After eluding several newsmen on a dirt road in North Texas, whimsy took them to the famous marriage county of Rockwall.

The Rockwall JP was not at home, and Sheriff W. J. Price escorted them to the neighboring village of Fate.

Mr. Porter, a six-foot, black-haired West Texan from Lamesa, seemed surprised by the turmoil.

Police Lt. H. D. Thomas of Dallas, who helped negotiate the brief interview, said Marina was bound from talking by a publishing contract.

WRITER ASSISTS

Mrs. Priscilla Johnson, a writer who has been staying with the Russian-born Mrs. Oswald to assist her in writing a book, was in touch with the bride and conveyed her terms for an interview to newsmen.

At first it was agreed that photographers would not shoot pictures of Marina's two children when they were moved from the house to an undisclosed place.

After Marina's arrival at the house, Chief Golden said she would consent only to pose briefly for pictures with her husband, with no questions to be asked.

"I FEEL WONDERFUL"

Her natural inclination to talk came through, however.

"I feel wonderful," she said in her still distinct accent.

"I met him right back there," she smiled, pointing to the backyard two doors away.

"We don't know where we're going," said Mrs. Porter.

The usually quiet Richardson block where newsmen waited for Marina for many hours took on a serio-comic, carnival setting.

Some neighbors showed resentment to the newsmen and refused to let them use their telephones.

"Why don't you let the poor girl alone," said one.

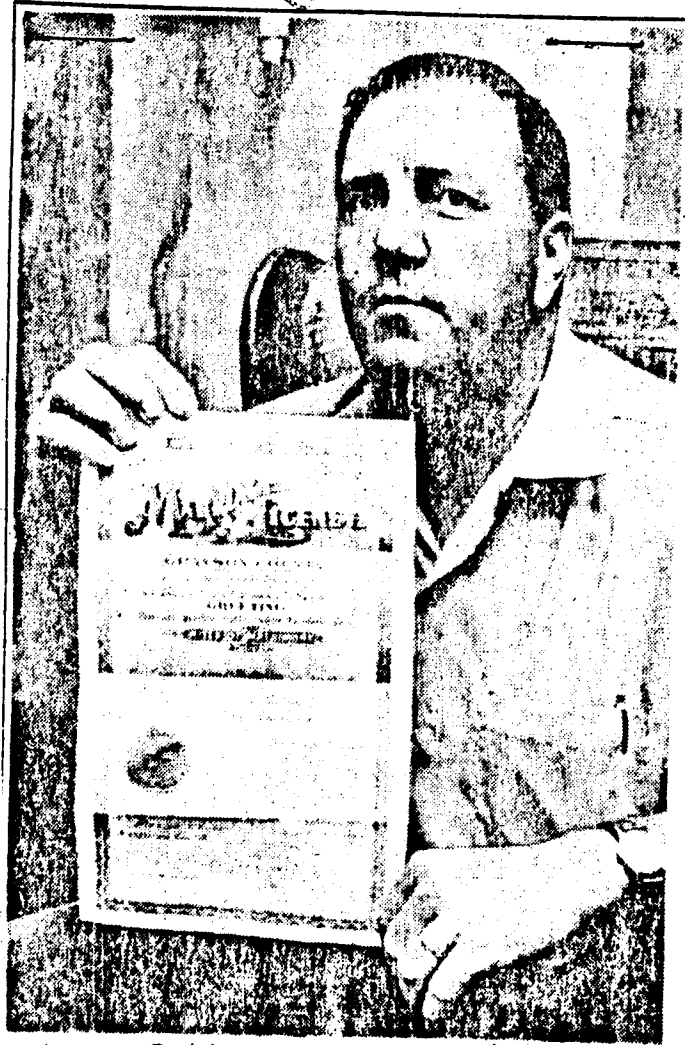
CHILDREN COME RUNNING

Meantime, several hundred children from blocks around cavorted unrestrained around the scene, pecking into the windows of the Oswald home, wrestling on the front lawn, and frightening newsmen with their speedy prowess on bicycles. A housewife in shorts took amateur snapshots of the proceedings. Lawn chairs were

lined up in strategic positions around the block.

A fat man in a white T-shirt protested loudly to Chief Golden on that the newsmen were disturbing the peace. The newsmen were weary of the chase and stood glumly around the area.

Only the fat man and the children could be heard as Marina and her new husband sped away.

The Dallas Office is in receipt of a handwritten letter addressed to the FBI, Dallas, and Department of State of the United States, Washington, D.C., signed by [REDACTED]

The letter is dated at Denver, Colorado, 6/24/65, and is postmarked at Denver on the same date. The writer enclosed a news article reporting the marriage of OSWALD and PORTER. She stated she was opposed to subject becoming a citizen of the United States because "she is an undesirable alien." The writer said that subject was as much to blame for the assassination of President KENNEDY as was her late husband. The writer stated she believed subject should be investigated again. She implied the money donated to subject had been donated by Americans who did not like President KENNEDY. She said she did not doubt but that subject is a communist. She requests that her letter be forwarded to the Secretary of State at Washington, D.C.

The Bureau is advised of the above in the event that this person corresponds directly with the Bureau or other Government officials in Washington.

At 2:45 P.M., 8-18-65, MARINA PORTER telephonically contacted SA WILL HAYDEN GRIFFIN and advised her husband, KENNETH JESS PORTER, had threatened MRS. PORTER and had said he had nothing to live for and locked himself in a bedroom with a revolver saying, "I'm going to kill myself."

The PORTERS now reside at 6448 Dunstan Lane, Dallas. It was pointed out to MRS. PORTER that the FBI had no jurisdiction, but would furnish the information to the Dallas Police Department and request that no publicity be given to the matter.

Assistant Chief of Police CHARLES BATCHELOR was furnished the above information, at which time he advised he would immediately dispatch four plainclothesmen in unmarked cars to the address. He stated he would attempt to handle this matter without any publicity.

The above information is furnished the Bureau for information, and no further action is being taken, UACB.

Marina Asks Peace Bond Against Mate

The widow of Lee Harvey Oswald asked a Dallas justice of the peace Wednesday for a peace bond against her husband of almost three months.

Mrs. Marina Oswald Porter told Judge W. E. (Bill) Richburg that Kenneth Jess Porter whom she married June 1, had slapped her and threatened to kill himself.

The 27-year-old husband was placed in county jail after he refused to come before Judge Richburg for a hearing.

In a signed affidavit to Judge Richburg, the 24-year-old Mrs. Porter said Porter had threatened to kill himself several times.

"We got in an argument today," she said. "He slapped me in the face and tried to get me to put the children outside so that he could be alone with the gun he carried."

"I am afraid that he might try to do me bodily harm," she added.

She said she had called the Federal Bureau of Investigation when he made threats Wednesday, and they sent the police to her home.

She and the children were in the judge's jury room when newsmen arrived. She requested through Judge Richburg that no pictures be taken of her children.

Porter was released from the Dallas County Jail about 11:25 p.m. Wednesday after a \$1,500 peace bond set by Judge Richburg was posted by his attorneys, Charles Tassmer and J. M. Davenport.

"How would you like living in a glass house for all the world to see?" said Mrs. Marina Porter, the widow of accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

Dressed in checked capri pants and a smudged white blouse, Mrs. Porter was directing the four moving men who were placing the Porters' possessions aboard a truck for the trip to Greenville.

The Porters had lived in their Dunstan Lane home in Northeast Dallas since their marriage last year. They had their first child on July 3. Mrs. Porter had two children, also, by Oswald.

Porter, an electronics technician, has some family in Greenville. He reportedly has a new job in that East Texas city. He formerly worked for Texas Instruments.
