As I explained to Mr. Malley, the Commission decises to work closely with your representatives in Mexico City and to consult with them regarding these matters. I would appreciate your cooperation in assisting these representatives of the Commission in whotever way possible during their assignment in Mexico City.

ReLHM is not fit to be furnished to Commission. statement in second paragraph, page two, that Woorhees departed from Mexico by Greyhound bus is incorrect. Fifth paragraph, page two, is not clear. Spell out exactly what you mean. Second paragraph, page three, re travel from San Luis Potosi to Nuevo Laredo and to Laredo is not clear and appears inaccurate in view of Voorhees' bus change in Monterrey. Statement, same paragraph, that "he alone left the bus" is not clear and this action is stated otherwise in second paragraph, page five. Last paragraph, page four, refers to U. S. Customs station at Muevo Laredo. Is this in Muevo Laredo or Laredo? Statement, same paragraph, about young American standing at U. S. Customs station appears at variance with Voorhees' statement that he felt certain the American stayed on the bus and with his comments that the American and other passengers stayed on the bus at Laredo to proceed to San Antonio or other points. Note in this regard that Laredo was destination of del Porte bus from which point it presumably returned

Score errors for preparation re LHM. Do not send another communication to Bureau for dissemination to Commission unless it is properly prepared and suitable to disseminate.

San Antonio endeavor to ascertain if Agapito Del Rio may be identical with the Mexican-American who sat across isle from Voorhees. Note comment of Voorhees concerning American eating banana while at U. S. Customs station and Del Rio's comments concerning man who went back to bus at Laredo to retrieve sack of bananas after stop at U. S. Customs station. Endeavor to identify and interview the U. S. Customs agent who talked to American male as described by Voorhees.

Following the list of passengers is the notation: "9 Laredo, 7 Monterrey."

The names of those above who listed their destination as Laredo were searched through the files of Central Office, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), Washington, D.C., on March 31, 1964, in an attempt to locate persons possibly identical with those listed on the bus manifest.

The bus manifest contains the name Constantino Garcia in two places.

On March 31, 1964, at the Central Office of INS, Washington, D. C., Mr. Abe Krichefsky, Contact Representative, furnished the following information to Investigative Clerk (IC) Dennis E. Addington, from I-94 forms (Arrival-Departure record for nonimmigrant) concerning one Constantino Garcia-Morales, born March 11, 1912, Mexico, D. F., Mexico.

One I-94 form indicated that he was admitted to the United States at Laredo, Texas, on October 3, 1963, on a B-2 visa (temporary visitor for pleasure), admitted until October 4, 1963. The visa was issued October 1, 1963, at Mexico, D. F., Mexico. He had passport number 57581 and his United States address was listed as Laredo, Texas. His permanent address was listed as Tempoala 51-5, Col. Independencia, Mexico, D. F., Mexico. The reverse side of this same I-94 form bore a stamp of E. DeWitt M (not legible), Attache, American Embassy, Mexico, D. F., Mexico, and contained a written notation under this stamp which Mr. Krichefsky said meant the Attache indicated on October 8, 1963 that Garcia-Morales departed the United States at Laredo on October 4, 1963.

Another form indicated he was admitted to the United States at Laredo, Texas, on October 24, 1963 on a B-2 visa issued October 1, 1963 at Mexico, D. F., Mexico, admitted until October 31, 1963. His United States address

appeared as Laredo, Texas, Hotel, and his permanent address was listed as Zemcoahula #51-5, Mexico, D. F. No information was available regarding his departure. He had passport number 57581.

Another form indicated he was admitted to the United States at Hidalgo, Texas, via International Bridge on November 17, 1963 on a B-2 visa, admitted until November 25, 1963. The visa was issued October 1, 1963, at Mexico, D. F., Mexico. He had passport number "Mex. Ord. PP #57581." His United States address was listed as hotel or motel, McAllen, Texas. His permanent address was indicated as Zempoala 51-5, Col. Independencia, Mecico 12, D. F., Mexico. No information was available concerning his departure.

INS Form I-190 (Application for Nonresident Alien's Mexican Border Crossing Card) revealed he was issued Border Crossing Card 1373182 on January 2, 1963 at Laredo, Texas. application listed his address as Zenpuala 51 Int 5, Mexico, D. F., Mexico, contained his picture and described him as 5 feet 6 inches in height, with brown hair, brown eyes and weighing 160 pounds. This form contained as part of it a statement that the person had never been arrested; refused a visa; apprehended by immigration officials in the United States; granted voluntary departure or excluded or deported therefrom; or been a member of a proscribed organization, except as stated below. Typed underneath this statement on the form appears the following: "male - married - alone - salesman." The bus manifest also contains the name Sra. Landeros. March 31, 1964, Mr. Krichefsky also furnished the following information to IC Addington from I-94 forms concerning one Juana Landeros-Garcia, born June 24, 1917 at Guanaguato, Gto. Mexico, Mexican nationality.

One I-94 form indicated she was admitted to the United States at Los Angeles, California, on January 3, 1961 on a B-2 visa, admitted until January 31, 1961. The visa was issued at Mexico City on January 3, 196-. She had passport 45903 and her United States addresswas listed as Hotel Alexandro, Los Angeles, California. Her permanent address was listee as Bahia de Ballenas #28, Veronica Anzures. She departed the United States on January 16 1961 for Mexico, the port of departure not legible.

Another form indicated that she was admitted to the United States at Laredo, Texas, on June 26, 1961 on a B-2 visa, admitted until July 5,.1961. Her United States address

was listed as San Antonio, Texas, Hotel. Her permanent address and birthplace were previously listed. She departed the United States on June 28, 1961 via the International Bridge for Mexico at Laredo, Texas.

Another form indicated that she was admitted to the United States at Laredo, Texas, on December 22, 1962 on a B-2 visa, admitted until January 15, 1963. She indicated that she was touring for 20 days; that her passport number was 63426. She departed the United States at Laredo, Texas, on January 5, 1963 via the International Bridge for Mexico.

INS Form I-190 revealed she was issued Border Crossing Card 994789 on May 4, 1961 at Iaredo, Texas. This application reveals her place of birth as Guanajuato, Gto., Mexico. It contained her picture and described her as 5 feet 2 inches in height, with brown hair, brown eyes and weighing 149 pounds. In the space under the form statement that she had never been arrested, refused a visa or apprehended by immigration officials, as described above in the case of Constantino Garcia-Morales, appears the following notation: "Female - Single - Alone."

Mr. Krichefsky advised on March 31, 1964 that he was unable to locate any I-94 forms for Lee Harvey Oswald at Central Office, INS.

Mr. Krichefsky stated that he was unable to furnish any identifiable information concerning the other names appearing on the bus manifest as listed above.

The date stamp impressions on K74 are similar in size, style, and spacing to the questioned impressions on Q332 but these questioned impressions lack sufficient significant details to definitely establish whether the same rubber stamp was used on K74 and Q332.

The handwriting, format and appearance of the block of manifests, K74, agree with the handwriting, format and appearance of Q332. In addition indented writings and extraneous marks were noted on Q332 which indicate that this sheet was originally on top of the present top sheet in K74.



Mexico City has located the padded block of manifests from which Q 332 was apparently torn. Laboratory states that indented writings and other extraneous marks on the questioned manifest and on the top sheet in the pad of manifests indicates the questioned manifest was originally on top of the present top sheet in the pad. It is of interest that Laboratory has found on the present top page of the pad fragmentary indented writing on 16 out of 19 lines in the body of the manifest. One of the lines in which there is no observable indented writing is the line with the entry "Oswld." Other writings on this manifest by the man who made this entry show indentations on the present top sheet of the pad. While an examination of this sort cannot conclusively establish that the "Oswld" entry was written after the manifest was torn from the pad and, therefore, probably after the assassination, the examination nevertheless, shows that such could have been the case.

Mr. ALLEN SKIRNER, Chief of U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, Laredo, Texas, advised on Harch 24, 1964, that all Immigration and Naturalization Service records are forwarded to Washington, D. C., on the same date that that person enters the United States and that no index card or any other record of entries or exits through U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service is maintained at Laredo, Texas.

Mr. SKINNER further advised that Immigration and Naturalization Service maintains a Central Index in Washington, D. C., and that the names of persons on whom Immigration and Naturalization Service has records would appear in this Central Index in Washington, D. C.

Mr. SKINNER further advised that Immigration and naturalization Service Form I-94 is used at border-crossing points such as Laredo, Texas, only on aliens entering the United States. Mr. SKINNER explained, however, that persons flying into the interior of the United States are required to fill out Form I-94. Mr. SKINNER explained that the record pertaining to Form I-94's would be located through the Central Index in Washington, D. C.

Mr. FREDERICK WAYNE SONGER, Supervisor, Quarantine Inspector, U. S. Public Health Service, Laredo, Texas, furnished the vaccination log for August 23 through November 23, 1963. The vaccination log maintained by the U. S. Public Health Service is a log containing the names of persons vaccinated by the U. S. Public Health Service at Laredo, and, upon being vaccinated, the person is supposed to sign the vaccination log.

The names of all persons on the Transportes
Frontera Bus Lines reservations list containing the
name of "OSWLD" were checked in the vaccination log
under the date of October 3, 1963, and the only name
appearing in the vaccination log that could be identical
with any of the persons destined for Laredo was the name
CONSTANTINO CARCIA MORALES. It is noted that the
name of CONSTANTINO GARCIA appears twice on the
Transportes Frontera Bus Lines reservations list containing the name of "OSWLD" as holder of Ticket Numbers
10353 and 10352. It is also noted that Sra. (Mrs.)
MORALES' name also appears on this Transportes Frontera
Bus Lines reservation list containing the name of
"OSWLD" as holder of Ticket Number 10348.

The vaccination log contains no information other than the name of the person vaccinated.

Mr. SONGER explained that the only other record maintained by the U. S. Public Health Service, Laredo, Texas, is a surveillance log. The name and address of persons who cannot be vaccinated for some reason are entered in the surveillance log, and those persons are instructed that if they should develop a rash or any ether indication of disease within fourteen days, they

should report to their doctor for treatment. Mr. SONGER stated that no names were entered in the surveillance log for October 2 or October 3, 1963.

Mr. M. L. MURPHY, Assistant Deputy Collector, U. S. Customs, Laredo, Yexas, on March 24, 1964, caused a check to be made of Customs records for any baggage declarations made with U. S. Customs by persons returning to the United States from Mexico at Laredo, Texas, on October 3, 1963. Mr. MURPHY advised he could not locate the name of LEE HARVEY OSWALD or the names of any persons appearing on the reservations list of the Transportes Frontera Bus Lines containing the name of "OSWLD" among the names of persons executing baggage declarations on that date. Mr. MURPHY stated that U. S. Customs would have no other records pertaining to entries by persons from Mexico other than the possible baggage declarations.

Jack Ruby was to take over in case Lee Harwy Oswald should miss the target or reported to the police before accomplishing his assignment.

These seven men who masterminded President Kennedy's assassination are plotting another crime because they know that they have managed to remain undiscovered. Also this grime is being planned against the Kennedy family.



However, in view of this writing to the AG and an indication he may again write at a later date as well as the possibility this matter could result in a request for investigation by the President's Commission. It is felt effort should be made to locate and interview Gamez.

- 2. During both interviews with AGAPITO DEL RIO, he left the impression of being an extremely calm and unperturbed individual. He was not observed to smoke during either interview. It is pointed out that referenced LHM describes "Mexican-American" as a chain smoker, and a person who appeared to be very nervous.
- 3. AGAPITO DEL RIO advised that he made the trip from Mexico City to San Antonio, Texas, alone. Referenced LHM reflects that the "Mexican-American" was traveling with his wife.

From a review of recent communications in this case, it would appear that the "Mexican-American" and his wife, mentioned in LHM, may very well be identical with Mr. and Mrs. JOSE/BARRIGA. In this regard, it is to be noted that DEL RIO, on 3/31/64, advised that there was a couple aboard the bus whom he believed to be Latin Americans but who spoke English. He noticed that this couple spoke with an individual on this bus described by DEL RIO as the only person who did not appear to be of Latin American extraction.

In view of the above, San Antonio is taking no further action to determine if DEL RIO may be identical with the "Mexican-American," UACB.

Enclosed for WFO, San Antonio and Dallas are one copy of Legat, Mexico City, 4/7/64 letter and letterhead memorandum and T photographs of records of the Transportes del Morte bus line. Mote that the 7 photographs have been designated Exhibit D-202. The 4/7/64 letterhead memorandum and 7 photographs were furnished to the President's Commission on 4/13/64. Note that the 4/7/64 letterhead has been amended by changing the word "them" at the end of the second full paragraph, page 10, to "him;" by changing "Transported" in fifth paragraph, page 25, to "Transportes;" and by changing the word "whom" in eighth line, first full paragraph, page 29, to "who." In addition, Bureau has numbered the photographs D-202 and has indicated on page 33 that the letterhead memorandum has seven enclosures.

WTO check I-94 forms at Central Office, Immigration and Maturalization Service (INS), concerning all those individuals appearing on the Del Norte lines manifest who were destined to Laredo and points beyond, exclusive of the De Cubas, Van Der Vorm, Del Rio and Barriga, all of whom have been interviewed. The records need not be checked concerning Ruiz Meza, whose interview is reported in enclosed letterhead memorandum and whose reservations appears on the passenger list for seat 15 under the entry "A. Viajes." Note that the name Paula Rusioni was previously furnished to WFO as Rusconi. In addition, WFO check against INS records the individuals from the Teeder bus who were destined to Laredo and points beyond. (See pages 17 and 18 of letterhead memorandum.)

Check records relating to all individuals who departed from Muevo Laredo 10/3/63 regardless of citizenship and nature of travel document in their possession.

It will not be necessary for Dallas to re-report the information in Legat's 4/7/64 letterhead memorandum.

NOTE:

On two buses on which COswald traveled from Mexico City to Laredo 10/2-3/63, there are a total of 29 individuals who traveled with him during portions of this trip. Twenty of these people were destined to Laredo or points beyond. We want to locate as manyy of these people as possible to interview to determine if they can place Oswald on the bus. We have to date located one eyewitness who places Oswald on bus.

It will be recalled that a manifest of the bus line Transportes Frontera allegedly for a bus trip from Mexico City to Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, on October 2,3, 1963, contained among other names that of Angel Perez, Seat Number 13. No destination was indicated for him nor was a ticket number listed.

On April 1, 1964, through cooperation of John W. Lewis, Supervisor, Master Index Unit, Central Office, Immigration and Naturalization Service, a search was made of all records of temporary visitors from Mexico (1-94 Forms), also all records of such nonlmmigrant visitors who were in the category of "overstays", also all cards in master index, under the name of Angel Perez. It is estimated that somewhat in excess of 3,000 cards were examined and no record was located for an entry of a Mexican citizen named Angel Perez who entered the United States at Laredo, Texas, on October 3,4, and 5, 1963, or November 2, 1963. This master index also includes aliens who have become naturalized citizens in the United States.
