On February 10, 1964, the facts in instant case concerning the naturalization of KAYE were discussed with GLENN CHOATE, Agent in Charge, U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service (USINS), Tucson, Arizona. CHOATE advised that the story told by KAYE would indicate that KAYE is not a naturalized citizen of the United States. CHOATE stated that he would send for KAYE's file and intended to review it before taking any action.

Date 2/3/64

ROBERT J. KAYE was interviewed at the office of the Tucson Resident Agency. He was advised that he had the right to consult an attorney, that he did not have to make any statement unless he desired to do so and that anything he said could be used against him in a court of law.

Robert J. Kaye KAYE advised that he is still residing in Apartment 9, 2116 East 17th Street, Tucson, Arizona, and that his telephone number is 624-2102. He is still employed as a vending machine service mechanic by Falcon Automatic, Inc., 727 South Campbell Avenue, Tucson, Arizona.

KAYE insists that he met the man known to him only as LEE (LNU) at Denver, Colorado. When he saw the picture of LEE HARVEY OSWALD on TV, he was of the opinion that OSWALD was identical with LEE (LNU). He now admits that he is not certain of this identification and that he very well could have been mistaken. KAYE was still unable to furnish the exact date of his meeting with LEE (LNU) at Denver, Colorado.

When questioned as to the identity or description of the man whom he was to meet in Mexico City, KAYE could not recall any details other than that LEE (LNU) told him that the man he was to meet had black hair, and a mustache, and would be wearing a trench coat and dark glasses. He denied that he had ever told the Secret Service Agent in El Paso that the man's name was "Francis," that he was six feet, four inches tall, skinny and had a long nose. He was unable to explain why he had furnished no description of this man at the time of his previous interview at Tucson, Arizona.

KAYE stated that he had forgotten to mention that he had appeared on TV and radio while in Denver, Colorado. He advised that these appearances were based on his experiences during the war. A few years ago, about the year 1960 or 1961, he had been interviewed on the "STARLY (Phonetic) ALLEN" show on Channel Seven in Denver, Colorado. Around the same time he was interviewed on two occasions on the LEE BURMAN show on Channel Two, also Denver, Colorado. KAYE also stated that about the same time he was interviewed by a BILL BARKER on NBC radio in Denver, Colorado. KAYE was unable to be more specific regarding these appearances.

KAYE advised that he had been with the U. S. Army in Europe and later with a tank battalion in Africa. He advised that he knew ROMMEL, the German Commander, very well and that because of this he was sent behind the German lines to determine when the Germans intended to attack. He advised that he obtained this information and that he sent it back to the Americans even though he was shot while doing so. He claimed to have been shot nine times during the war.

KAYE denied that he had been born in Russia and insisted that he was born in Poland. He advised that he was in England prior to being admitted to the United States through the War Relocation Authority. He finally entered the United States at Portland, Maine. While in England, he claimed that the Russian officers attempted to persuade him to return to Russia and on one occasion, promised him a motor rifle. He claimed that the American soldiers had him from the Russians whenever they would come around looking for him. When he arrived in the United States, he lived with Sergeant POLJE WAGNARSKI at 4621 or 2146 Gray or Gray Street, Chicago, Illinois. KAYE advised that he had used the name WAGNARSKI when he had entered the United States.

KAYE lived with WAGNARSKI for about a year and then was placed in a home for orphans in the Chicago area. He claimed to have been in the Illinois Research Hospital, Chicago, Illinois, for about a year, during the year 1946 or 1947, where he received treatment for wounds suffered during the war. He denied any history of mental instability or ever having been hospitalized in a mental institution.

KAYE claimed to be a citizen of the United States but was unable to furnish any details as to the date or place of naturalization. He stated that he thought he had been naturalized in Portland, Maine, when he entered the United States, but was unable to produce any evidence of this fact. He finally made the statement that he never failed to fill out a card and leave it at the U. S. Post Office every year. When advised that this would indicate that he was not a citizen, he offered no explanation other than to say that he thought he was a citizen.

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KAYE repeated that LEE (LNU) had stated at the time of their first meeting that he had recognized KAYE from having seen him on TV in Denver, Colorado. KAYE advised that he thought nothing of this statement since he had become quite famous as a result of his exploits during the war.

When told that the Secret Service Agent in El Paso, Texas, had stated that KAYE had not given him a map and a calendar, KAYE said, "I was sure that I had given them to him." He could offer no other explanation as to the disposition of the alleged map and calendar.

When it was suggested that his story was not true, KAYE became obviously upset and entered into a long discourse about his loyalty to the United States and the many services which he had rendered to the American Troops during World War II. He admitted that he might have been mistaken, but denied that he was lying.

KAYE's only explanation for the difference in the stories which he told to the Secret Service Agent in El Paso and the interviewing agents in Tucson, Arizona, was that he had a very poor memory and had great difficulty in recalling details. He was unable to explain why he considered his memory to be accurate in this instance.

Date 4/1/64

ROBERT J. KAYE was interviewed at the Tucson Resident Agency. He was advised that he did not have to make a statement, that he could consult an attorney if he so desired before making a statement and that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law.

KAYE resides at 2116 E. 17th Street, Tucson, Apartment 9, and is employed as a vending machine service mechanic by Falcon Automatic, Inc., 727 S. Campbell, Tucson, Arizona.

KAYE stated that he entered the United States at Portland, Oregon, in November, 1945, when he was ten years of age. After his entry and for a period of six months to one year, he lived with HEDIE KLONOWSKI at 4621 or 2146 Gray or Grace Street, Chicago, Illinois. KAYE stated that at this time he was enrolled in the St. Bernard's Catholic School located on Halsted Street, Chicago, and that he stayed there until 1951, when he was 17 years of age. KAYE related that for a period of 2 or 3 years thereafter, he remained in the Chicago area, working as a mechanic on juke boxes and pinball machines. He stated that he married when he was 20 years of age and lived on Woodstock Street near Montrose Avenue in Chicago.

According to KAYE, about 1954 he left Chicago and went to Colorado Springs, Colorado, where he stayed approximately one year and then went to Denver, Colorado. KAYE stated that in 1955 and 1956 he lived in a five-room apartment near First Avenue and 17th Street, Denver, and that he worked at the Beech restaurant, Denver, as a fry cook.

Thereafter, according to KAYE, for a period of approximately six months in 1957 he was living and working in Long Beach, California, and working as a fry cook for a restaurant chain known as the Hot Restaurants.

KAYE stated that about 1958 he was back in the Denver area, residing at a trailer park possibly in lot #5 at 13396 E. Colfax, Denver and that he was working at the Denver Hilton for approximately 7 months as a cook and thereafter at the Four Seasons Restaurant, Aurora, Colorado,

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as a cook for approximately six months. KAYE stated that nights he worked at McDonald's Drive Inn.

Continuing, KAYE explained that about 1960 he worked for the Uptown TV, located on about 3395 or 3385 E. Colfax.

KAYE stated that the Colorado Vending Company, owned by GLEN WELLS, was in operation for about 5 months in 1963, terminating in October, 1963. KAYE stated that this business was located in the garage of his, KAYE's, residence located at 90 S. Ogden, Denver, Colorado.

KAYE explained that for a period of several months in 1962 he had been under great mental strain and that he thought during this period that he was actually going "nuts". KAYE explained that in 1962 his wife had made a trip to Colorado Springs to visit some friends and that upon her return to Denver he, KAYE, discovered that she was pregnant. KAYE stated that this greatly alarmed him inasmuch as just prior to this period he was under doctor's care and his doctor had told him that due to his condition he would never be in a position to have additional children. KAYE stated that his wife finally told him that their fourth child, DANNY, was not his, KAYE's, child and that he then went to Colorado Springs, investigated the matter and discovered that his wife was telling him the truth. KAYE added, however, that his wife thereafter denied the incident. KAYE added that his wife, ALICE HARDT, who is about 25 or 26 years of age, is now residing at an unknown address in Las Vegas, with their four children, MICHAEL, age 5; BOBBIE LYNN, age 7; DANNY, age 2; and SANDY, age 4. KAYE added that he has had no contact with his wife since his trip to Mexico.

With reference to his background in Europe, KAYE stated that he was born in 1934 in Poland. KAYE related that in 1941 he was taken to Germany and placed in a work camp with his parents and three sisters. He stated that his parents were killed in 1941 or 1942 and that his sisters

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were killed in a bombing raid in 1942. KAYE explained that he was also wounded at this time and was kept by some Nuns in a convent until he was recovered. KAYE explained that at this time he was 7 or 8 years of age. KAYE explained that he then ran off from the convent and that he met some German soldiers who were going to the Russian front and that he joined them. KAYE related that he ran off from the Germans, went the wrong way and ended up with the Russians, thereafter spending several months with the Russian soldiers at the front lines. KAYE explained that he took off again, and this time joined the Hungarian forces, spending about 6 months with the Hungarians in and around Budapest. He added that he took off from the Hungarians, and again joined the Germans, this time traveling to Italy, Africa, Sicily, and Austria. KAYE explained that it was at this time during the winter of 1943 that he met German Commander ROMMEL in Africa.

Continuing, KAYE explained that about 1954, he finally met the Americans between the border of Italy and Austria and it was here that he first met EDDIE KLONOWSKI and that it was the soldiers of the 44th Division that smuggled him in a duffel bag into England and thereafter to the United States.

KAYE stated that he realized that his story seemed fantastic but insisted that it was true in every respect, even considering the fact that he was born in 1934 and this activity took place in the period 1942-1945. KAYE explained that he was always close to the front lines and was shot once by the Americans in Italy when he was with the Germans, shot once by the Hungarians in Russia when with the Russians, shot once by the Russians in Russia when with the Germans, shot once by the Germans in Italy when with the Germans (shot by mistake here) and shot once by the Italians in Italy when with the Germans. KAYE stated that when with the Hungarians, Russians and Germans, he carried a "Tommy Gun" but that when he was with the Americans he used a Carbine. KAYE related that he had been shot a total of nine times and that in some of the above incidents

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he had probably been shot twice.

KAYE related that all information he had
furnished had been as factually correct as possible.

AT TUCSON, ARIZONA

1. Re-interview ROBERT J. KAYE, 2116 E. 17th Street, Apartment 9, to clarify the discrepancies in the story told by KAYE to agents of the Phoenix Division as compared with the facts developed by the El Paso Office and set out in this report.

2. Ascertain from KAYE more complete information regarding GLORIA, MIGUEL and RAOUL (possibly RAUL), mentioned in Phoenix report dated January 20, 1964, including exact residence of GLORIA and name and exact whereabouts of small club where GLORIA was employed as an exotic dancer, and furnish same to the El Paso Office.

3. If above leads are not productive, consider setting out a lead for the Los Angeles Office to attempt to identify RAOUL (possibly RAUL), who reportedly worked at the Beverly Hilton Hotel in Hollywood for a number of years as a waiter, in order that RAOUL may be interviewed regarding his knowledge of KAYE's activities in Mexico in the fall of 1963.

EL PASO

AT JUAREZ, CHIHUAHUA, MEXICO

1. Obtain from [redacted] any information developed by him regarding the activities of ROBERT J. KAYE in Juarez during the fall of 1963, including KAYE's alleged contact with persons known to KAYE as GLORIA, MIGUEL and RAOUL (possibly RAUL).

2. If identified and located, interview GLORIA, MIGUEL and RAOUL for any information they may have regarding KAYE's activities in Mexico in the fall of 1963.

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INFORMANTS

The individual mentioned in the body of this report as having requested that his identity not be divulged is [REDACTED] contacted on April 16, 1964 and May 11, 1964 by SA DONN K. SICKLES.

ADMINISTRATIVE

For the benefit of the Phoenix Office in connection with its re-interview of ROBERT J. KAYE, the following facts are noted, some of which appear to be in conflict with information previously furnished by KAYE as set out in referenced reports:

- 9/25/63 KAYE purchased a 1957 Ford in El Paso in exchange for a 1961 Thunderbird.
- 9/26-27/63 KAYE was registered at the YMCA in El Paso.
- 9/27/63 KAYE purchased a 1956 Oldsmobile in El Paso in exchange for the 1957 Ford.
- 9/29/63 KAYE personally talked to W.H. (BUD) CARLSON in Denver (according to CARLSON).
- 10/1/63 KAYE obtained an automobile permit for his 1956 Oldsmobile to enter Mexico, permit being obtained in Juarez.
- 10/15/63 KAYE's 1956 Oldsmobile departed from the interior of Mexico at Juarez.
- 10/23/63 KAYE sold the 1956 Oldsmobile at El Paso.
- 10/29/63 KAYE obtained a 15 day Mexican Tourist Permit in Juarez (records of Mexican Immigration contain no record to indicate KAYE ever used this permit).
- 11/24/63 KAYE was interviewed by U.S. Secret Service, El Paso.

Synopsis:

ROBERT J. KAYE sold a 1961 Thunderbird and bought a 1957 Ford in El Paso, Texas on September 25, 1963. KAYE sold the 1957 Ford and purchased a 1956 Oldsmobile in El Paso on September 27, 1963. KAYE obtained a permit from Mexican Customs, Juarez, Chihuahua, Mexico, on October 1, 1963 to take his 1956 Oldsmobile into the interior of Mexico. KAYE's 1956 Oldsmobile departed from the interior of Mexico on October 15, 1963. KAYE obtained a 15 day Mexican Tourist permit at Juarez on October 29, 1963. Records failed to indicate KAYE used this permit to travel into the interior of Mexico. Alleged acquaintances of KAYE in Juarez, namely GLORIA, MIGUEL and RAUL, not identified.

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DETAILSAT JUAREZ, CHIHUAHUA, MEXICO

On April 6, 1964, the below listed individuals were contacted and they advised that they had no information in the files of their respective offices identifiable with ROBERT J. KAYE, also known as ROBERT KLONOWSKI, ROMAN BOBBY SOKOLOWSKI:

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Captain ROBERTO FLORES MILLAN, Juarez Police
Department.

Detective RAMIRO URIBE, State Judicial Police,
Juarez, Mexico.

On April 6, 1964, Miss CONSUELO MALDONADO,
Mexican Customs Service, Juarez, was furnished the information
that one ROBERT J. KAYE had in his possession as of November 24,
1963 a 15 day Mexican Tourist permit, number 662282, which was
supposed to have been issued to him at Juarez on October 28,
1963. Miss MALDONADO stated that she would check the records
of her office in an effort to locate additional information
regarding this matter.

On April 29, 1964, Miss CONSUELO MALDONADO,
mentioned above, stated that she had checked the records
of her office and had been unable to locate any 15 day
Mexican Tourist permit issued to ROBERT J. KAYE.

On May 8, 1964, Miss CONSUELO MALDONADO,
mentioned above, was shown a copy of a 15 day Mexican
Tourist permit, number 662282, issued by the Secretaria
de Gobernacion of the Mexican Government at Juarez, Chihuahua,
Mexico, on October 28, 1963, to ROBERT J. KAYE. KAYE's
occupation was listed as mechanic. He was described as
28 years of age, single, a North American. This document
contained the entrance date of October 29, 1963, and was
stamped to indicate that the bearer of the document traveled
by automobile. No return date was stamped on the document.

After viewing the above mentioned document,
Miss MALDONADO rechecked the records of her office and
ascertained that the above mentioned document was issued
to KAYE on October 29, 1963. She said that travelers
receive only one copy of a Mexican Tourist permit and that
this copy must be turned into the Mexican Immigration
authorities at Kilometer 28, south of Juarez, when the
traveler returns to the border area. In addition, she
pointed out that the traveler must display the Mexican
Tourist permit when passing the Mexican Immigration
station located at Kilometer 28, enroute to the interior of
Mexico. She said that the same procedure was followed

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by persons boarding an airplane at the Juarez airport for the interior of Mexico and upon returning to the Juarez airport. Likewise, documents of individuals traveling on Mexican Tourist permits are checked by the railroad authorities and bus lines upon their entry into Mexico and their return to the border area.

Miss MALDONADO indicated that it did not appear as though the above mentioned document was actually ever used by ROBERT J. KAYE. She said that she checked the records of her office and that there is no record to indicate that KAYE had turned in his Mexican Tourist permit upon his return to the border area of Mexico from the interior of Mexico. She pointed out that such entries were made regarding all persons who travel into Mexico and then subsequently return to the border area. She stated that the only way that KAYE could have maintained his Mexican Tourist permit in his possession after returning to the border area from the interior of Mexico was for the Mexican Immigration officer to inadvertently fail to pick up the document from KAYE, unless KAYE was able to illegally depart from Mexico.

Miss MALDONADO checked the records for entries and departures for the periods October 1, 1963 through October 15, 1963 and October 28, 1963 through November 15, 1963 and no record was located regarding KAYE, except for the record mentioned above. She added that the above mentioned permit issued to KAYE listed KAYE's destination in Mexico as Chihuahua, Chihuahua, Mexico.

On April 16, 1964 an individual who requested that his identity not be divulged, but who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he was not acquainted with an exotic dancer by the name of GLORIA, who was supposed to have been employed in a small club in Juarez during the fall of 1963 and with whom KAYE had claimed contact during his stay in Juarez. This individual indicated that he would check the records of the entertainers' union in Juarez in an attempt to identify the above mentioned individual by the name of GLORIA.

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On May 11, 1964 the above mentioned individual indicated that he had checked the records of the entertainers union in Juarez and ascertained that there was a group of about 20 to 25 GLORIAS listed in the records of the entertainers union. He said that he had not been able to ascertain which of these girls had had previous contact with ROBERT J. KAYE in Juarez during the fall of 1963. He said that he was making additional inquiry in order to identify the GLORIA with whom KAYE was in contact.

On May 8, 1964, JOSE DE LA LUZ ARREOLA, Mexican Customs, Juarez, made available the records of his office pertaining to foreign registered automobiles for which permission was granted by the Mexican Government to be taken into the interior of Mexico.

The above mentioned records contained the information that a permit, number 10548, was issued on October 1, 1963, between the hours of midnight and 8:00 a.m. to one ROBERT J. KAYE. This permit was issued on a 1956 Oldsmobile, motor number 596A4713, 1963 Texas license CE 6341. This record indicated that the above mentioned vehicle returned to the border area from the interior of Mexico on October 15, 1963.

In addition, a check was made of the records for the period September 1, 1963, through November 24, 1963, and no other information was located regarding ROBERT J. KAYE.

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On May 1, 1964, Special Agent in Charge, GEORGE WEISHEIT, United States Secret Service, advised that when he talked with ROBERT J. KAYE on November 24, 1963, KAYE told him that he had obtained the Mexican Tourist permit in his possession from the Mexican Immigration authorities in Juarez. Mr. WEISHEIT said he asked KAYE how KAYE happened to retain the Mexican Tourist permit in his possession and was told by KAYE that KAYE had just failed to turn it into the Mexican Immigration authorities. KAYE indicated to Mr. WEISHEIT

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that he had used the above mentioned Mexican Tourist permit in connection with his visit to Mexico City. After talking with KAYE, Mr. WEISHEIT formed the opinion that there was some question regarding KAYE's mental stability.

The following individuals were contacted on the dates noted and they advised that there was no information contained in the files of their respective offices identifiable with ROBERT J. KAYE under the various names used by KAYE:

Mrs. WINIFRED FRASER, Office Manager, Traveler's Aid, contacted May 7, 1964.

WILLIAM BOEMPER, Rescue Mission, contacted on May 7, 1964.

Mr. GRANT ^VKIMBALL, YMCA, El Paso, advised that the records of his office reflect that one ROBERT J. KAYE of Denver, Colorado registered at the YMCA on September 26, 1963 and remained at the YMCA during the night of September 27, 1963. He said the record indicated that KAYE resided at 95 South Ogden Street, Denver, Colorado. Mr. KIMBALL said that there was no additional pertinent information in the files of his office regarding the individual by the name of ROBERT J. KAYE, for the period from September 15, 1963 through December 15, 1963.

The records of his office reflect that ROBERT J. KAYE, 95 South Ogden Street, Denver, Colorado, traded in a 1957 Ford, Fairlane, orange over white, 1963 Texas license CF 941, motor number D7DI224947, to El Paso Ford on September 27, 1963 and purchased at the same time from El Paso Ford a 1956 Oldsmobile 93, black, motor number 569A4713. KAYE was allowed \$295.00 on the 1957 Ford and purchased the 1956 Oldsmobile for \$495.00, paying the difference in cash.

On October 23, 1963, KAYE sold the 1956 Oldsmobile back to El Paso Ford for \$75.00. KAYE told Mr. FRAZIER that he needed the money in order to return to Denver, Colorado. In connection with the resale of the 1956 Oldsmobile to El Paso Ford, KAYE listed his name as ROBERT JOSEPH KAYE.

No one accompanied KAYE to El Paso Ford during the transactions that KAYE had with El Paso Ford in connection with the purchase and sale of the above mentioned automobiles. KAYE indicated that he was from Denver, Colorado, but was living at the YMCA in El Paso. KAYE made no mention of any friends in El Paso or Juarez and never gave any indication that he planned to visit Mexico. KAYE made no mention of any employment on his part in the El Paso-Juarez area.

The license number on the 1956 Oldsmobile was 1963 Texas license CE 7341.

Mrs. MILDRED GLENN, Auto License Bureau, El Paso County, City-County Building, made available the records of her office, which were found to contain the following information:

1963 Texas license CF 941 was registered on January 24, 1963 to a 1957 Ford, four door, motor number D7DT224947, with Sandy's Auto Sales, 1200 E. Paisano Drive, El Paso, being listed as the registered owner of this vehicle.

On October 1, 1963 the ownership of the above mentioned vehicle was transferred from Sandy's Auto Sales to ROBERT KAYE, 415 Montana, El Paso. On December 10, 1963, the ownership of the above mentioned vehicle was transferred from ROBERT KAYE to El Paso Auto Center (El Paso Ford).

Collector's receipt D421574, dated October 1, 1963, reflects that Sandy's Auto Sales sold the 1957 Ford to ROBERT J. KAYE for \$400.00. KAYE's address was listed on the receipt as 415 Montana, the address of El Paso Ford. The collector's receipt reflects that LOUISA UPCHURCH, El Paso Ford, 415 Montana, notarized the sale of the 1957 Ford by Sandy's Auto Sales to ROBERT J. KAYE on September 30, 1963.

Mrs. MILDRED GLENN, mentioned above, stated that the transfer of title of an automobile is not necessarily recorded in the files of her office on the same date that the sale is actually made. She pointed out that the 1957 Ford may have been sold by Sandy's Auto Sales on one date and that the recording of the sale may have occurred on a subsequent date.

Mr. ISIDORE SANDOVAL, owner, Sandy's Auto Sales, 1200 E. Paisano, advised that he sold a 1957 Ford, motor number D7DI224947, to one ROBERT J. KAYE on September 25, 1963 in exchange for a 1961 Thunderbird, Colorado license plates, motor number IY71Z149498. KAYE listed his residence as 95 South Ogden Street, in Denver, Colorado.

KAYE told Mr. SANDOVAL that he had come to El Paso, Texas from Las Vegas, Nevada, where he had lost all of his money. He said that he wanted to sell the Thunderbird because he needed some money. Mr. SANDOVAL gave KAYE \$2300 for the Thunderbird and then KAYE turned around and purchased the above mentioned 1957 Ford from Sandy's Auto Sales for \$700.00.

KAYE contacted Sandy's Auto Sales a day or two prior to the actual purchase of the 1957 Ford. During that period of time, KAYE indicated to Mr. SANDOVAL that he was staying in a motel in El Paso, exact location not stated. KAYE also indicated that he was making trips to Juarez everyday. KAYE did not mention the name of any person or persons with whom he might have had contact in Juarez nor did he indicate the places that he was visiting in Juarez. He did state that he had a girl in Juarez but did not mention her name or furnish any additional information regarding her.

Several days after purchasing the 1957 Ford, KAYE returned to Sandy's Auto Sales. At that time, KAYE had an automobile which he said he had purchased from El Paso Ford. KAYE never returned to Sandy's Auto Sales after the last mentioned occasion. Mr. SANDOVAL had no further pertinent information regarding KAYE or his activities while in the El Paso area.

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On May 6, 1964, Special Agent in Charge, GEORGE WEISHER, United States Secret Service, El Paso, made available a report prepared by the United States Secret Service at Denver, Colorado regarding ROBERT J. KAYE which was found to contain the following information:

KAYE's United States Immigration and Naturalization file A-6208760 reflects that he was born on December 24, 1934 in Khar'kov, Russia, having entered the United States on November 18, 1945 at Portland, Maine.

KAYE's residence in Denver was listed as 95 South Ogden, and an associate of KAYE was listed as GLENN A. JENKINS, 67 South Ogden, three doors away from the KAYE residence.

Representatives of the United States Secret Service in Denver held lengthy interviews with Mrs. GLENN A. JENKINS on November 29, 1963 and with her husband and Mr. W. H. (BUD) CARLSON on December 1-2-3, 1963, at which time the following information was developed regarding KAYE:

GLENN A. JENKINS operated a route under the name Colorado Vending Company in Denver. JENKINS operated this route for the R.F. Jones Company, which was managed by CARLSON, mentioned above.

In June, 1963, KAYE applied for a job and went to work for JENKINS in connection with his vending route.

KAYE left Denver in August or September, 1963, in a 1959 Ford station wagon and drove to Tulsa, Oklahoma, where he visited Mrs. BESSIE MOYEN, a reported multi-millionaire who had known KAYE's parents in Poland or Germany. Three or four days later KAYE returned to Denver with a 1951 Thunderbird, with Oklahoma license plates which he claimed to have received as a gift from Mrs. BESSIE MOYEN along with \$5,000.

KAYE's wife, Mrs. ALICE KAYE, received a letter from KAYE postmarked September 27, 1963 at El Paso, Texas which contained \$250.00, and an Allstate Insurance policy on the Thunderbird dated August 30, 1963, and a note which stated "be home soon".

KAYE was in Denver on September 29, 1963 and talked with CARLSON on that date. Shortly after October 1, 1963, KAYE left Denver and abandoned his family. Mrs. KAYE did not hear from KAYE for several weeks and then moved to Las Vegas, Nevada where she could be contacted in care of Mrs. SUE KLUKAS, 3815 Nellis Boulevard, Las Vegas, Nevada.

After Mrs. KAYE left Denver, the members of the JENKINS family recalled that a letter or statement was delivered to KAYE's former residence, 95 South Ogden, which apparently had been sent by an optometrist in Fort Worth, Texas. This communication was forwarded to Mrs. KAYE in Las Vegas.

No further information had come to the attention of CARLSON or Mr. and Mrs. JENKINS regarding KAYE.

BOEGER their file on ROMAN "BOBBY" SOKOLOWSKI, aka Robert Klonowski, Robert Kay, Number A-6-208-760. No additional information was contained in the file except for the following sworn statement given by SOKOLOWSKI on 4/2/64 to the USINS.

Q. What are the names of your parents and of what country are they citizens?

A. I don't know their names and I don't know their citizenship. I think they were Polish. They died in a prison camp in Munchen, Germany, during World War II.

Q. Were either of your parents ever in the United States?
A. I don't think so.

Q. To your knowledge, were your parents ever citizens of any country other than Poland?

A. I don't know.

Q. When and where did you enter the United States as a legal immigrant?

A. At Portland, Maine, November 19, 1945, on the SS "James Swan", a United States ship.

Q. Were you admitted at that time as a resident alien?
A. I was admitted as a refugee.

Q. Have you ever been outside of the United States since that time?

A. Only to Mexico.

- A. I don't think I should tell you; it might hurt me if I did.
- Q. Did you contact anyone from Russia or any Communists when you went to Mexico in November 1963?
- A. No.
- Q. Did you contact any subversive or political organizations that desired the overthrow of this Government when you went to Mexico City, in 1963?
- A. No.
- Q. Have you ever belonged to any Communist organization?
- A. No.
- Q. What kind of government do you believe in?

ROBERT J. KAYE was interviewed at the Tucson Resident Agency. He was advised that he did not have to make a statement, that he could consult an attorney prior to making any statement and that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law.

KAYE stated that it was impossible for him to furnish any additional information relative to the identity of GLORIA (LNU), an exotic dancer he met at a small club in Juarez, Mexico or MIGUEL (LNU), the individual who accompanied him from Juarez to Mexico City. In addition, KAYE stated that it was impossible for him to furnish any additional information relative to RAOUL (LNU) or RAYL (LNU), the individual he stayed with for several days in Chihuahua, Mexico.

KAYE stated that he had carefully reviewed the information he had previously furnished to the FBI and that he was certain he arrived in El Paso, Texas, the end of October, 1963. KAYE insisted that he had worked for the Colorado Vending Company and for GLENN A. JENKINS during the period January or February, 1963 to the end of October, 1963, and that during that period he had resided at 95 S. Ogden, Denver, Colorado. KAYE stated that he was positive that he arrived in El Paso the end of October, 1963. KAYE stated that during the period January, 1963, to October, 1963, he had not made any trips whatsoever outside of Denver.

KAYE was queried relative to his mode of transportation to El Paso and he stated that he was driving a 1961 Thunderbird, which he had purchased in Denver for \$2,700.00. Upon questioning as to where the 1961 Thunderbird was purchased in Denver, KAYE stated that actually he had made one trip outside of Denver during the period January, 1963, to October, 1963, that being a trip to Tulsa, Oklahoma, where he purchased the 1961 Thunderbird. KAYE stated at that time he owned a 1956 Ford station wagon and he drove that car to Tulsa, and traded it in for the 1961 Thunderbird. KAYE stated that he received a credit of approximately \$900.00 for his vehicle and that he borrowed \$700.00 from another party in Tulsa to complete the down payment on the purchase of the vehicle, the total price of the vehicle being \$2,700.00. KAYE refused to identify the party who loaned him the \$700.00 but added that

he had repaid the money shortly after he returned to Denver. KAYE stated, however, that he had never received any additional funds from this source and had never entered into any business relationship with this individual.

KAYE stated that the information previously furnished to the FBI was as factually correct as possible and that he could only reaffirm his previous statements to the effect that he had left Denver during the latter part of October, 1963.

KAYE is presently residing at 2814 S. 6th, Tucson, Arizona, telephone 623-5009 and is still employed by Falcon Automatic, Inc., 727 S. Campbell, Tucson, Arizona.

The report of SA CALVIN W. EVANS 6/10/64 at Phoenix requested Los Angeles to identify RAUL or RAOUL (LNU), who worked as a waiter at the Beverly Hilton Hotel and with whom ROBERT J. KAYE reportedly stayed in Chihuahua, Mexico.

The 302 covering the interview of KAYE at Tucson on 1/9/64 reflects that in November, 1963, KAYE allegedly left Mexico City alone by bus and traveled first to Chihuahua, where he stayed for two days at the home of a man named RAOUL (LNU). RAOUL had worked at the Beverly Hilton as a waiter and spoke good English. KAYE claimed to have come to know RAOUL through GLORIA, who was an exotic dancer at a small club in Juarez, Mexico.

The personnel files on all the individuals with the first name of RAUL were pulled for background information. The records covering the vacation periods of the RAULs were examined and some interviews were conducted.

The only RAUL (LNU) who seemed to be similar to the individual whom we are trying to locate was a bus boy by the name of RAUL RODRIGUEZ WONG.

RAUL RODRIGUEZ WONG was generally known as RAIL WONG. He is described as follows:

[REDACTED] the Beverly Rodeo Hotel, 360
North Rodeo Drive, Beverly Hills, advised on 6/24/64 that RAUL
WONG worked at the hotel as a bus boy until the latter part of
May, 1964, when he quit, advising that he was going home to

visit his family. [REDACTED] recalled that WONG made some reference to El Paso and to Mexico.

[REDACTED] personnel records for the Beverly Rodeo Hotel. This hotel is run by the Republic Construction Company, 9201 Wilshire Boulevard, Beverly Hills. On 6/24/64 she advised that RAUL R. WONG had last been employed by the Beverly Rodeo Hotel from 12/13/63 to 5/20/64. His last address was 1455 North Logan Street, Los Angeles. He was employed as a bus boy.

On 6/24/64 135 South Hope Street was observed and it is now non existent, all buildings having been razed as a result of the Bunker Hill Urban Renewal Program which has been going on for the past two years.

[REDACTED] 1455 North Logan Street, Los Angeles, was interviewed on 6/25/64 by SAs CHESTER C. ORTON and FREDERICK E. RODERICK. SA RODERICK conducted interview in the Spanish language.

[REDACTED] is not related to WONG. Several years ago [REDACTED] operated a rooming house on South Hope Street and at that time WONG was a roomer from time to time during the time that he lived in Los Angeles. Subsequently, [REDACTED] moved to her current address and WONG helped her move. At different times during the past two years he has resided at her address and has used it as a mailing address; however, he has not lived there during 1964.

WONG's father is Chinese and his mother, whose maiden name is RODRIGUEZ, is a Mexican. WONG is one of five children. WONG's family is well known in Chihuahua, Chihuahua, Mexico. WONG's wife is EMELIA GONZALES. She believes that WONG has about four children.

During the time that she has known RAUL WONG, he has made a number of trips from Los Angeles to Chihuahua. He normally enters and leaves the United States through El Paso. She believes that he has some friends in El Paso. She could not recall that he has any relatives in El Paso.

In May, 1964, RAUL WONG visited her and stated that he had quit his job at the Beverly Hills Hotel and was going to return home and live with his family in Chihuahua, Chihuahua.

WONG always represented himself to her as a waiter and did not mention that he was merely a bus boy. To the best of her knowledge, WONG is still residing in Chihuahua, Chihuahua, Mexico. She has not heard from him during the month of June, 1964.

It should be noted that RAUL WONG terminated his Beverly Hilton employment on 8/29/63 and left to visit his mother. His next employment in this area was when he was rehired on 12/13/63 by the Beverly Rodeo Hotel. From these records it would appear that it was possible for him to have been in Chihuahua, Chihuahua, in November, 1963.

No further investigation is being conducted by Los Angeles on the other RAULs, UACB. No report is being submitted UACB because this is an administrative matter to identify a RAUL (LNU).

In view of the fact that RAUL RODRIGUEZ WONG appears to be the individual from CHIHUAHUA, Chihuahua, Mexico, it is requested that the Bureau give consideration that he be interviewed.

For the information of Legat, Mexico City, the following items are enclosed: one Xerox copy each of reports dated 1/15/64 at El Paso, 1/20/64 and 4/2/64 at Phoenix, 5/13/64 at El Paso and 6/10/64 at Phoenix and airtel Los Angeles to Bureau dated 6/23/64; two copies of identification record of Robert J. Kaye, true name Roman Sokolowski, under FBI Number 820902E, and two copies of a photograph of Kaye taken by Phoenix on 1/9/64.

The enclosed reports set forth pertinent data concerning Kaye's claim to have met Lee Harvey Oswald in Denver in early 1963 and to have been propositioned by Oswald to travel to Mexico to pick up papers in Mexico City from one "Francis." On pages 6 and 7 of enclosed Phoenix report dated 1/20/64 Kaye is reported as having stated that when he entered Mexico at Juarez on his claimed mission he met an exotic dancer named Gloria with whom he stayed for two or three days. He also claimed to have met one Miguel in Juarez with whom he traveled to Mexico City on his mission. Kaye claimed that on his return from Mexico City he stopped at Chihuahua, Chihuahua, where he stayed for a period of time with one Raoul who previously worked as a waiter at the Beverly Hilton Hotel in Los Angeles. He further claimed that he met Raoul through the exotic dancer Gloria. Kaye stated that after leaving Chihuahua he returned to Juarez where he again stayed for a few days with Gloria. Upon entering the U. S. and selling a car, he claimed to have returned to Juarez in an effort to obtain a job where he again lived with Gloria for a couple of weeks.

Despite fact that Kaye's claims as to his activities both before and after the assassination have been largely discredited.

Bureau believes it advisable to attempt to locate the Raoul with whom he claimed residence in Chihuahua and Gloria, the exotic dancer who resides in Juarez. Note that Raoul, according to Los Angeles 6/26/64 airtel, is apparently identical with Raul Rodriguez Wong, a Mexican Chinese who was born 2/2/32 of a Chinese father and a Mexican mother. Rodriguez Wong is said to be a member of a well-known family in Chihuahua.

Legat, Mexico City, endeavor to locate Rodriguez Wong and interrogate him concerning the claims of Kaye. Endeavor through Wong to identify Gloria and Miguel. Ascertain if Rodriguez Wong can furnish any information concerning Kaye's claimed reason for his visit to Mexico. Display Kaye's photograph to him. Please handle expeditiously.

NOTE:

Kaye has told a wild story of having met a man he believes to be Oswald in early 10/63 in Denver who hired him to go to Mexico City early 10/63 to pick up unidentified papers from one Francis which were to be delivered to an unnamed individual in Amarillo for which he was to be paid \$3000. The man he met in Denver, according to Kaye, introduced himself only as "Lee." This story has been largely discredited and Kaye has been established to have obtained \$5000 from a Tucson widow in a con-game type of operation prior to leaving for Mexico. He apparently did enter Mexico at Juarez in 10/63. We have been attempting to identify Gloria and Raoul and Los Angeles has now apparently identified him. Hence, advisable to interview him.
