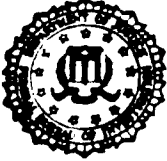

On December 5, 1963, WILLIAM JARMON, Assistant District Director on Citizenship for United States Immigration and Naturalization Service at San Antonio, Texas, advised that a check of their files reflects a pending file on FELIX ALONSO CERDA. The name CERDA is his mother's name and Mexicans, when entering the U. S. always use the paternal and maternal names in registering.

The file on ALONSO CERDA reflected that he was born February 6, 1885 at Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico, is a Mexican national and has filed petition number 40203 with the U.S. District Court Clerk at Laredo, Texas, for U.S. Citizenship. JARMON advised that as far as he can tell ALONSO CERDA will be granted U.S. citizenship during the next term of court in Laredo. The file in the possession JARMON revealed that he makes frequent trips into Mexico however, the means of travel was not shown. The file reflects that he resides at 1202 New York Street, Laredo, Texas.

This investigation was performed in order to endeavor to identify person entering Mexico September 26, 1963, or leaving Mexico October 3, 1963, at the port of Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas Mexico.

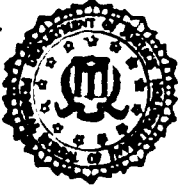

On December 5, 1963, ~~JULIA GARCIA~~, daughter of ~~JULIAN CANTU~~, was interviewed at 326 Guadalupe Street, San Antonio, Texas, and she advised that she knows ~~CARLOS VASQUEZ GALINDO~~. ~~He is~~ an uncle to her through marriage. She stated that he was born in Monclova, Coahuila, Mexico and came to the U.S. to reside as an immigrant around 1954. He spent several days with them and then found his own living quarters but she does not know where. She states that VASQUEZ GALINDO spends considerable amount of time in Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico with relatives but stated that she does not know the name of the relatives nor their address. She advised that the last time she saw him was about two to two and one half months ago when he paid them a visit and advised that he was going to Monterrey for a time. She has not seen nor heard from him since. She stated neither she nor her father have any idea how he traveled from San Antonio to Monterrey.

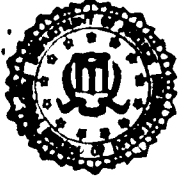

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

On December 4, 1963, LEONARD CASTILLO, identical with LEONARDO CASTILLO, was interviewed at Kelly Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas, where he is employed. He states that he resides at 2715 Morales Street, in San Antonio, with his wife ALVINA. He advised that he was born November 6, 1920, at New Braunfels, Texas.

CASTILLO states that on September 26, 1963, he drove, with his wife, from San Antonio, Texas, to Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico, on a holiday. They left San Antonio shortly after noon of September 26, 1963, and crossed the border at approximately 4:00 P. M. He was driving a 1955 Mercury Sedan with 1963 Texas license HE 4162. During the time that he was in Mexican Customs and Immigration Offices at the bridge in Nuevo Laredo, Tamps., Mexico, he saw no Americans, in fact he thought it strange that there were no tourists waiting in line when he arrived. He left Nuevo Laredo and proceeded directly to Monterrey, staying for two days at the Regina Courts located just north of Monterrey on the Laredo Highway. He did not pick anyone up while en route to Monterrey from the border.

Upon being exhibited the photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD he stated that he had never seen the person before but thought he bore a resemblance to the person who was arrested in Dallas, Texas, for the murder of a police officer and supposedly involved in the assassination of former President KENNEDY. When asked if he knew anyone by the names of OSWALD, LEE or HIDEELL, he advised to the contrary.

For the Bureau's information, it is to be noted that under Mexican Government procedures the duplicate of this tourist card is delivered by the bearer at the port of entry into Mexico and, therefore, bears only the date and seal of the Mexican Immigration Inspector, in this case HELIO TUEXI MAYDON, who handled the entry, and the place of entry. The original of the card, which is surrendered by the bearer upon departure from Mexico, bears both the stamp placed thereon at the time of entry and the stamp showing the date and place of departure and the name of the Mexican Immigration Inspector handling the departure.

The two portions of the tourist card were made available to this office on 12/3/63 by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] requested that these documents be returned to him as soon as possible since they are official records of the Mexican Government and under Mexican law are not supposed to be released to outsiders.

Inspector Malley called from Dallas this morning to advise that Mrs. Oswald has been receiving numerous offers from the press and James Martin, who, out of sympathy, has been furnishing an apartment to Mrs. Oswald, has been acting as her manager.

Inspector Thomas Kelly of the Secret Service in Dallas advised today that Martin has been insistent on being permitted to talk to Mrs. Oswald and of making final arrangements so that she can capitalize on the press offers, one of which is in the amount of \$12,000. In view of Mrs. Oswald's difficulties with the English language, Martin is desirous of utilizing George A. Bouhe, a Dallas resident who speaks Russian, in the arrangements. Malley advised that we have previously interviewed Bouhe who was an acquaintance of the Oswalds.

Inspector Kelly feels that Secret Service has no alternative but to agree to this arrangement as they do not feel they can continue to hold Mrs. Oswald for an extended period of time. Kelly asked our Dallas Office if we had any objection to this arrangement.

Malley said that he advised Kelly that this was a matter for the Secret Service to decide and he told Kelly that he thought Kelly should clear this with Secret Service Headquarters in Washington. Malley said he was furnishing the above for information in the event Secret Service should be in touch with us. I told Malley I was in agreement with his action; that this was a matter for Secret Service to handle and resolve.

The Director advised that he had talked to Katzenbach, who had been talking to the White House relative to the report we are to render in the Oswald case. It is Katzenbach's feeling that this report should include everything which may raise a question in the mind of the public or the press regarding this matter, including such things as the return of the passport to Oswald in Moscow, and the furnishing of money to him by the State Department for the purpose of returning to the U.S. If the State Department regulations or law required State to do these things, we should get a copy of the law.

This report will have to contain anything of relevance to the case. We should get from the Defense Department Oswald's record and disciplinary action and discharge. We should cover the angle of Oswald going down to Mexico City, and his contacts down there.

In other words, this report is to settle the dust, in so far as Oswald and his activities are concerned, both from the standpoint that he is the man who assassinated the President, and relative to Oswald himself and his activities and background, et cetera.

At such time as the report is finished, Mr. Katzenbach will go over it, and will furnish it to other officials of the government, such as McCone of CIA, the Secretaries of Navy, Defense, and State, so that they can look it over and make sure they agree and do not have any objections.

The above change will, of course, require more time for the preparation of this report. However, the Director desires that it be out as quickly as possible. Division Six will continue to handle the portion of the report dealing with the assassination attempt and the evidence gathered to show that Oswald is responsible. This means that we will have to carefully check the evidence and Oswald's possessions that the police are now turning over to us, to see if additional information should go into the report from this.

Division Five will handle the other part of the report, which will show the background, associations, et cetera, of Oswald. We must be certain that anything that is put into the report can be backed up, as it will be subject to minute scrutiny from the press and the public. For Division Five's part of the report we should be certain also that we get back-up material, such as the law relied on by State to give

Oswald's passport back to him, et cetera. We should be certain that agents thoroughly go through Oswald's effects to see if they can pick up any correspondence with the Communist Party, the Soviet Embassy, et cetera.

This is a difficult report to prepare, but we will have to concentrate our full attention on it in order to produce the desired results.

At 6:32 p.m. on November 27, 1963, SAC Johnson of Chicago called and talked to Supervisor E.V. Turner in my absence and advised that a former criminal informant, [REDACTED], who has had a recent history of financial difficulties and possible instability, reported [to the Chicago Agents who formerly handled him] the following information:

He is acquainted with a prostitute of Spanish extraction who is associated on a daily basis with John Rossin, Chairman of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) in Chicago. Rossin, [REDACTED] has in the past expressed hatred for the Kennedy family, including President Kennedy, and admiration for Castro. Rossin recently, subsequent to the assassination, was interviewed on television and denied knowing Oswald. However, according to the prostitute [REDACTED] Rossin told her that he does know Oswald and has periodically furnished him money over the past five months.

*UNLESS ADVISED TO CONTRARY BY BUREAU

SAC Johnson advised that Chicago has Agents on the streets looking for [REDACTED] and when she is found she will be interviewed concerning this matter. He requested authority on a UACB basis to interview her with the use of a polygraph if regular interview did not resolve the matter. He also requested permission on a UACB basis to interview and polygraph Rossin if the interview with [REDACTED] does not resolve the matter. He advised a written waiver consent would be obtained before the use of a polygraph, and Rossin would not be interviewed late at night.

In describing Rossin, Johnson said that he had formerly been a Communist Party (CP) organizer in St. Louis; left the CP in the middle 1950's after the Hungarian uprising; and had been Chairman of the FPCC in Chicago since its inception about 1959. He runs theaters, catering to Latin-American pictures, is boastful and arrogant.

ACTION TAKEN:

Johnson was advised that unless he was instructed to the contrary by 9 p.m. Central Standard Time, he was authorized to take the action indicated above. You were then advised of Johnson's request and our instructions to him.

We have been attempting to obtain from the Mutual Broadcasting Company the tape of a broadcast by ~~Sergei Flegers~~, a commentator who on Sunday, 11/24/63, made certain references to the movements of Lee Harvey Oswald in and out of the Soviet Union. He also indicated certain training received by Oswald. His reports were reportedly based upon "Viennese intelligence sources." At Mr. Belmont's request, I got in touch with our contact at the Mutual Broadcasting Company, ~~Bob Hurleigh~~, President, Mutual Broadcasting Company, on Sunday night, 11/24/63, and asked him to obtain the tape for us and also to identify Flegers' sources as much as possible.

Having received no word from Hurleigh, I again called him on Wednesday night, 11/27/63, and told him we needed the above information as expeditiously as possible. Hurleigh apologized and stated the tape would be in our hands no later than today, 11/29/63.

I received a call at 12:50 p. m. from Charles King, News Director, Mutual Broadcasting Company, of New York. King stated he had the tape in his possession and would make it available to us immediately. I told him that we would have a representative of the New York Office call at his office immediately in order to procure the tape. He stated it would be left at the reception desk at 1440 Broadway, on the 20th floor.

Mr. King also stated that Flegers actually received information from Viennese intelligence sources. He stated that Flegers was en route to Paris, by way of a number of other countries, however, had talked to Mutual Broadcasting Company offices in New York about this matter. Flegers did not desire to mention his sources on the phone. He stated, however, that he knew the FBI representative in Paris at the American Embassy and that he would contact Mr. Philcox either on Sunday night, 12/1/63, or Monday morning, 12/2/63, and furnish him all information necessary.

Mrs. ~~ALLRED~~ thinks she remembers seeing the name LEE HARVEY OSWALD on one of her husband's envelopes. Her husband absconded with \$34,000 belonging to Mrs. ~~ALLRED~~ and his present whereabouts are unknown. ~~ALLRED~~ had made frequent trips to Mexico. The "Los Angeles Times" issue of 12/2/63, Part I, page 14, carries an article headlined "Placer of Anti-Kennedy Ad Departs in Mystery." The article carries the byline of RONNIE DUGGER at Dallas. It states that a telegraph delivered in the middle of the night resulted in a man calling himself BERNARD WEISSMAN and his "sidekick" WILLIAM BURLEY, hastily moved out of their apartment on Reiger Street in Dallas the day before Thanksgiving. The article reflects that WEISSMAN is described as a slender, dark eyed, dark haired man. BURLEY is described as a tall, blond man who wore black horn-rimmed glasses. The article reflects that WEISSMAN placed a full-page anti-KENNEDY advertisement in the "Dallas News" for publication the day the President was killed at Dallas. The ad was signed the "American Fact Finding Committee," an unaffiliated and non-partisan group of citizens who wish the truth, BERNARD WEISSMAN, Chairman, P.O. Box 1792, Dallas 21, Texas. He gave the Advertising Department an address at an apartment house on Reiger.

The article reflects that the FBI has interviewed the proprietress of the house where WEISSMAN and BURLEY resided on Reiger Street.
