HARDWICK WAS THEN LEFT IN NEW BRAUNFELS TO PROCEED WITH DEER HUNT. OTHER FOUR STUDENTS STARTED BACK TO AUSTIN, TEXAS, IN PHILLIPS CAR AND EN ROUTE PLANNED TO TRY TO PLAY JOKE AT SOME STORE AT KYLE, TEXAS, INDICATING THEY HAD BEEN HUNTING AND WERE LEARNING OF ASSASSINATION FOR FIRST TIME, THEN PRETENDING THEY WERE ALL WELL ACQUAINTED WITH LEE HARVEY OSWALD. THEY HAD AGREED AMONG THEMSELVES THAT IF THEY COULD GET STORE OWNER TO MENTION NAME OSWALD TO THEM THAT THEY WOULD AGAIN ALL PRETEND TO KNOW HIM.

IN KYLE, TEXAS, THEY ENTERED A GENERAL STORE HANDLING MOSTLY GROCERY ITEMS AND OBSERVED TV SET WITH NEWS OF ASSASSINATION. THEY THEN EXPRESSED IN VARIOUS TYPE PHRASES TO THE OWNER OF THE STORE THEIR PRECONCEIVED PLAN.



PURPOSE:

This is to recommend that Governor and Mrs. John B. Connally of Texas be interviewed in connection with their knowledge of the assassination of President Kennedy.

BACKGROUND:

As you are aware, Governor Connally was wounded in the assault which took President Kennedy's life. While initially in critical condition, he was released from the Parkland Memorial Hospital, Dallas, Texas, on 12/5/63. Mr. William O. Stinson, Administrative Assistant to Governor Connally, has advised Agents of our Dallas Office that Mrs. Connally would be available for interview by the FBI if so desired. We refrained from interviewing either Mrs. Connally or the Governor immediately after the assault or during Governor Connally's convalescence since it appeared to be an inopportune time. It is possible Governor Connally and his wife could logically be called by the Presidential Commission as witnesses to the assassination. Therefore, it is felt we would logically be expected to have interviewed both the Governor and his wife, and further, it is a logical investigative step.

In order to round out our investigation it is recommended these interviews be conducted at this time, provided our Dallas and San Antonio Offices are not in possession of any information which would preclude such interviews.

ACTION:

If you approve, the attached teletype will be sent to our Dallas and San Antonio Offices instructing these interviews be conducted.



OBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT

Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach called me at 10:45 p.m., 12-5-63. He told me that Sandy Smith of the "Chicago Sun-Times" had called Guthman several times relative to the attempted assassination of General Edwin A. Walker by Lee Harvey Oswald. I told Katzenbach that we too had received a number of calls, however, had refused to make any comment whatever in this matter although we knew the story was getting out. Katzenbach told me that Pierre Salinger of the White House had called him and wanted guidance on what to say in the matter. Katzenbach told Salinger inasmuch as the story was apparently already out that Salinger should go ahead and merely confirm the fact that apparently there was evidence that Oswald had made an assassination attempt upon General Walker's life.

Katzenbach told me that the Associated Press (AP) had picked up a rumor that the FBI report on the assassination of the President and the murder of Oswald was now over in the Department. He wanted to know if we had received any inquiries in this regard. I told him we were deluged with inquiries during the past several days as to when the FBI would complete the report, however, we had made no comment and intended to stick by this. He stated that Senator Russell, at the Presidential Commission meeting yesterday, 12-5-63, had been somewhat sore that information contained in the report was leaked out. Katzenbach stated he told Russell that Director Hoover had assured him that the FBI was not giving any information to the press and that he further stated he would check with the FBI to make certain that this was not being done. I asked Katzenbach if he had any information that facts given to the press were coming from the FBI. He stated he had none and that was not the purpose of his call. He indicated he merely wanted to advise me of Senator Russell's feelings. I told him he should keep in mind that almost every police officer in the Dallas Police Department has been furnishing information to the press. I mentioned that Henry Wade, the prosecutor, the Chief of Police and Captain Will Fritz had had a field day in giving out all available facts. I mentioned there were still a considerable number of reporters in Dallas and that the evidentiary reports which we had furnished the Dallas Police Department were still being quoted on a daily basis. Katzenbach stated he knew all of this but that he had been unable to convince Russell that such was the case. I further told Katzenbach

that before looking at the FBI as to possible "Leaks," he should carefully examine his own house. I told him I was quite thoroughly familiar with the way Guthman and Rosenthal dealt with the press and that as he well knew the wire service people stayed constantly in Guthman's private office. I told him it was quite obvious to me how the AP had learned that the report had been sent over to the Department.

Katzenbach reiterated that he had no complaints against the FBI. He stated again that the purpose of his call was to tell me about Senator Russell's feelings.

He added that he had another reason for calling and that was to determine if we could give him any ideas as to how Warren Olney could be dropped as Chief Counsel of the Presidential Commission. I told Katzenbach of our feelings concerning Olney. He stated that he was presently working through Congressman Hale Boggs and he thought he was going to be successful in getting Olney's name removed from consideration. He told me that Boggs was very sympathetic.

Katzenbach mentioned that Waggoner Carr, the Texas State Attorney General, would like very much to see the Director on Friday, 12-6-63. I asked him what for. He stated that Carr had no particular motive in mind other than to indicate to the press later on that he had discussed matters with the Director. I told him I could see no percentage in the Director's seeing Carr, that we were the investigative agency and that Carr's dealings should be with the Department and the Presidential Commission. Katzenbach indicated that the White House might think otherwise. He stated that the President was most anxious for Carr to be given attention in Washington inasmuch as Carr was running for office next year. I told Katzenbach I knew this, however, I still felt that the Director should not be injected into this matter. Katzenbach stated he would attempt to dissuade Carr from seeing the Director, however, Carr was quite persistent.



SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT

Walter Jenkins called me from the White House at 9:00 P.M., last night, 12/9/63. He stated the President would like to see, this morning, a copy of any correspondence possessed by the FBI in which Lee Harvey Oswald wrote to Senator John Tower of Texas. I told Jenkins there was such correspondence and that I would get it over to him on the morning of 12/10/63.

The correspondence is attached. It has no evidentiary value and as a result has not been included as a part of our report on the assassination. It merely concerns a letter from Oswald to Senator Tower written from the Soviet Union begging the Senator to intercede in getting him out of the Soviet Union. Tower referred the matter to the Department of State after his secretary wrote him a note that he should not get mixed up in this matter. Following the assassination of the President, Senator Tower's office called me and made this correspondence available to us.

I will deliver this correspondence to Jenkins this morning if there are no objections.

Jenkins also asked me last night if our report had been delivered to the Chief Justice. I told him, as he well knew, the report had left the FBI several days ago. I told him also that the Deputy Attorney General had delivered the report to the Chief Justice that afternoon, 12/9/63. I also mentioned to Jenkins that apparently members of the Commission were already leaking the contents of the report inasmuch as I had heard several radio news programs mention items which had not been released to the press before.

Jenkins asked me if a press release had been released by the Department concerning the delivery of the report to the Chief Justice. I told him there had been no release because of a disagreement on policy between Abe Fortas and Ted Sorenson of the White House. Jenkins stated the President did not know this. Jenkins asked for our view point on a press release. I told him confidentially that the Director strongly

Inspector Malley at Dallas advised tonight that a telephone call had just been made to the Dallas Office by Mr. Kelly, head of the Secret Service in Dallas. Kelly advised that Mr. Martin, who had befriended Mrs. Oswald with an apartment, had now apparently become her business manager. The Secret Service was advised tonight by Mr. Martin that he was arranging a press conference for Mrs. Oswald to be held tomorrow.

Mr. Kelly explained that while the Secret Service was holding Mrs. Oswald in protective custody, he did not feel they could refuse to allow the press interview and wanted to know if the FBI would object to such a press conference. Mr. Kelly was advised that since Mrs. Oswald was in the protective custody of the Secret Service, it was strictly up to the Secret Service and was their responsibility. The danger of allowing such a conference was pointed out and it was repeated that the decision and responsibility was completely that of the Secret Service who have Mrs. Oswald in protective custody. It was the belief of the Dallas Office that the Secret Service was attempting to have the FBI object so they could blame any refusal to allow such a conference on the FBI.

Immediately upon receiving the above information, it was discussed with Assistant to the Director Belmont, following which he contacted Special Agent Orlin H. Bartlett and related the above information and instructed Agent Bartlett to contact Chief of the Secret Service James Rowley and determine what action Rowley was going to take. Mr. Bartlett called Mr. Belmont back and advised he had contacted Mr. Rowley who agreed that such a conference would be dangerous and was very appreciative of the Bureau calling this to his attention. Mr. Rowley was immediately having instructions issued to Mr. Kelly in Dallas that such a press conference was not to take place at the present time.
