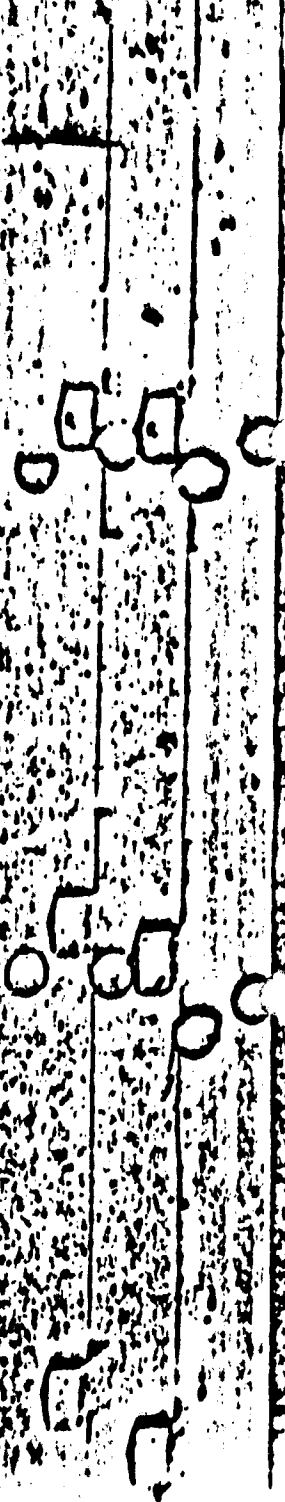

Re New Haven teletype to Dallas and New York 11/30/63.

Referenced teletype refers to an anonymous telephone call received by MRS. JACK D. TIPPIT, 164 New Town Turnpike, Westport, Conn., 11/30/63, from an unknown woman.

It appears the information provided by that unknown woman does not appear to be of any foundation and it is believed no further investigation need be conducted pertaining to that phase. OSWALD's father, ROBERT E. LEE OSWALD, died at New Orleans about 1939. One uncle, ILYA V. PRUSAKOVA, resides in Russia and apparently has not been in this country. Some other relatives, including one or more uncles, reside in the New Orleans Division.

UPI news indicated that Joseph Rodriguez Molina had been brought in by the Dallas Police Department and was a possible suspect in connection with the assassination of the President. The Dallas Office subsequently advised that Joseph Rodriguez Molina had worked in the same building with Lee Oswald and the police had interviewed Molina last night and searched his home with Molina's permission. They advised that the reason the police were interested in Molina was due to the fact that going back to 1955 he was alleged to have some leftist leanings.

Molina voluntarily came to the Dallas Police Department today and they were interviewing Molina. He has not been arrested and according to the police they have nothing to arrest him on at this time. Dallas is following this matter closely.

Due to the common name of the subject, he was not identified in Dallas.
