With reference to the attached airtel requesting the Bureau to develop certain exposed film which was made at the Dallas Police Department 11-24 and 25-63 of papers and property of Lee Harvey Oswald and possibly his wife and possibly material belonging to Mrs. Ruth Paine, I talked to SAC Shanklin, Dallas, 11-29-63.

I called to SAC Shanklin's attention the fact that the Dallas Office was furnished the original material which was seized by the Dallas Police Department under search warrants executed 11-22 and 23-63 and pointed out that the original material had been photographed here at the Bureau. I inquired to know whether Dallas still desired to have the Bureau develop the exposed film according to their request. SAC Shanklin stated that Dallas had promised to give a copy of the photographs to both the Dallas Police Department and the Secret Service. In view of this commitment, SAC Shanklin stated that they still need three copies of the photographs of the material in Dallas although it did not matter whether these photographs were made from the exposed film submitted by Dallas or the original photographs made at the Seat of Government.

Miss ELIZABETH CAMPBELL's recollection concerning her departure from San Antonio on 12/22/62, about 8:00 pm on Continental Air Lines was confirmed by passenger manifest for Continental flight 57 which departed San Antonio 12/22/62, at 8:00 pm, 160 minutes late, for Los Angeles. A passenger named CAMPBELL, first name not recorded, was listed on the manifest, tourist class, two pieces of luggage.

JANICE HORNSBY, San Antonio, recalled meeting Miss CAMPBELL at San Antonio, International Airport on or about 1/2/63, and was certain that CAMPBELL was on American Air Lines upon return to San Antonio via Dallas, Texas.

American Air Lines representative advised that in January 1963, that line had a flight number 59, which originated in Chicago and stopped at Dallas and San Antonio en route to Mexico City. The flight departed Dallas for San Antonio shortly after 8:00 pm and arrived San Antonio about 9:12 pm. No passenger manifests maintained by American Air Lines at San Antonio on incoming flights; manifests on outgoing flights are destroyed after two or three months. American Air Lines tickets are filed at American Air Lines Treasury Department, 633 Third Avenue New York, New York; however, if ticket not sold originally by American, but some other carrier, the ticket would be retained in files of original selling carrier, in this case apparently Continental Air Lines, according to referenced teletype.

Continental Air Lines tickets are retained by MATT TRAVIS, Revenue Accounting Office, Continental Air Lines, Los Angeles, California, according to R. E. POWELL, Continental Air Lines, San Antonio Airport.

Your letter of December 3rd has been received, and I want to thank you for your best wishes and for your generous comments regarding our work.

My staff and I certainly share your concern over the brutal assassination of President Kennedy. In our free society, the extent to which our citizens are subject to surveillance is necessarily limited. Nevertheless, the identity of individuals, known to represent a potential threat, is called promptly to the attention of Secret Service, which has the responsibility to protect the President. We had no information indicating that Lee Harvey Oswald was a possible assassin.

In this regard, all citizens can be of utmost help by referring to proper authorities any information they might have of a subversive or criminal nature. Should you ever receive such data, please feel free to contact representatives of our office located at 201 East 69th Street, New York, New York 10021.

LETTERS FOR MARINA OSWALD, TO A UNIFORMED OFFICER AT THE IRVING,
TEXAS, PD, WHOM SHE BELIEVES WAS A CAPTAIN, WITH A REQUEST THIS
MATERIAL BE GOTTEN TO MRS. OSWALD. SHE WAS SENDING THE BOOKS
BECAUSE MRS. OSWALD USED THEM OFTEN WHEN LIVING AT THE PAINE HOME
AND MRS. PAINE FELT SHE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE THEM. ONE SHE DESCRIBED
AS A GENERAL HOUSEHOLD INFORMATION BOOK AND THE OTHER AS A CHILD

MRS. PAINE SAID SHE FIRST KNEW OF INSTANT NOTE WHEN IT WAS

LAST BY TWO SECRET SERVICE AGENTS WHOSE NAMES SHE CANNOT REMEMBER.

THESE MEN CAME TO HER HOME AND INTIMATED SHE KNEW OF THIS NOTE AND WAS SENDING IT TO MRS. OSWALD CONCEALED IN ONE OF THE BOOKS. MRS. PAINE SAID SHE VIGOROUSLY DENIED TO THEM AND SHE AGAIN VIGOROUSLY DENIED TODAY TO SA ODUM THAT SHE HAD ANY KNOWLEDGE WHATSOEVER OF ANY SUCH NOTE BEING IN EITHER ONE OF THE TWO BOOKS SHE GAVE TO THE IRVING PD FOR DELIVERY TO MRS. THIRTY LAST, AND LEFT WITH HIM TWO FOREIGN LANGUAGE BOOKS AND SOME LETTERS, WITH A REQUEST THIS MATERIAL BE DELIVERED TO MRS. OSWALD.

CAPTAIN BARGER SAID HE WAS RELIEVED BY ASST. CHIEF OF POLICE LEON POWERS AT ABOUT THREE PM ON NOV. THIRTY LAST. AT THAT TIME HE GAVE THE BOOKS AND ENVELOPES TO ASST. CHIEF POWERS AND TOLD HIM MRS. PAINE HAD LEFT THIS MATERIAL AT THE PD TO BE DELIVERED TO MRS. OSWALD.

ON INSTANT DATE, ASST. CHIEF OF POLICE POWERS ADVISED SA JAMES P. MOSTY, JR., HE HAD RECEIVED FROM CAPTAIN BARGER TWO BOOKS AND SOME CORRESPONDENCE WHEN HE /POWERS/ CAME ON DUTY AT ABOUT THREE PM ON NOV. THIRTY LAST. CAPTAIN BARGER TOLD HIM THIS MATERIAL HAD BEEN LEFT AT THE PD FOR DELIVERY TO MRS. OSWALD. CAPTAIN BARGER SAID HE HELD THE MATERIAL OVER THE WEEKEND AND ON DEC. TWO LAST HE SENT

DETECTIVE JOHN LOOPER OF THE IRVING PD TO THE US SECRET SERVICE OFFICE IN DALLAS TO DELIVER THIS MATERIAL TO THEM.

DETECTIVE JOHN LOOPER ON INSTANT DATE HAS ADVISED THAT ABOUT TWO PM ON DEC. TWO LAST HE RECEIVED FROM ASST. CHIEF OF POLICE POWERS TWO BOOKS AND AN ENVELOP WITH SOME LETTERS INSIDE, FOR DELIVERY TO THE US SECRET SERVICE OFFICE IN DALLAS. LOOPER SAID HE TOOK THIS MATERIAL TO THE SECRET SERVICE OFFICE IN DALLAS AND TURNED IT OVER TO A SECRET SERVICE AGENT WHOSE NAME IS NOT KNOWN TO HIM.

ON INSTANT DATE INSPECTOR TOM KELLY, US SECRET SERVICE, DALLAS, TEXAS, TURNED OVER TO SAS JAMES P. HOSTY, JR., AND JAMES J. WARD TWO RUSSIAN LANGUAGE BOOKS AND A RUSSIAN LANGUAGE NOTE IN A CELLOPHANE ENVELOPE. HE SAID THE NOTE HAD BEEN FOUND IN "THE THICKER" OF TWO BOOKS WHICH HAD BEEN RECEIVED BY SECRET SERVICE FROM THE IRVING PD FOR DELIVERY TO MRS. OSWALD. HE SAID THIS MATERIAL HAD BEEN RECEIVED FROM AN OFFICER OF THE IRVING PD ON DEC. TWO LAST.

SAS HOSTY AND WARD BROUGHT THE ABOVE MATERIAL FROM THE US SECRET SERVICE OFFICE TO THE DALLAS FIELD OFFICE.

THE ABOVE RUSSIAN LANGUAGE NOTE WAS TRANSLATED AT THE DALLAS OFFICE BY SA A. BOGUSLAV. THE ORIGINAL AND THE CONTENT OF THE TRANSLATION OF THIS LETTER IS ALREADY AT SOG.

WITH RESPECT TO OBSERVATIONS OF PERSONNEL OF THE DALLAS OFFICE WHICH MIGHT ESTABLISH WHEN THIS LETTER WAS WRITTEN, THE FOLLOWING IS OFFERED.

A REVIEW OF THE ABOVE LETTER REVEALS THE FOLLOWING POINTS WHICH INDICATE IT WAS PROBABLY WRITTEN AT A TIME PRIOR TO ANY PLANS OF FORMER PRESIDENT KENNEDY TO COME TO TEXAS.

/A/ IN ITEM ONE IN THE LETTER, REFERENCE IS MADE TO A POST OFFICE BOX IN THE MAIN POST OFFICE ON ERVAY STREET IN DALLAS. OSWALD HAD PO BOX TWO NINE ONE FIVE AT THIS MAIN POST OFFICE ON ERVAY ONLY FROM OCT. NINE, SIXTYTWO TO MAY TWELVE LAST. POST OFFICE RECORDS REVEALED A SUBSEQUENT BOX RENTED BY OSWALD ON NOV. ONE LAST, THIS BEING BOX SIX TWO TWO FIVE AT THE TERMINAL ANNEX STATION WHICH IS ON HOUSTON STREET, QUITE SOME DISTANCE FROM THE MAIN POST OFFICE. POST OFFICE RECORDS REVEAL NO OTHER BOXES RENTED TO OSWALD. FOR DETAIL SEE PAGE ONE SEVEN SIX OF REPORT OF SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING DATED NOV. THIRTY LAST AT DALLAS.

/B/ IN ITEM FOUR THE LETTER STATES "RECENTLY I ALSO PAID FOR WATER AND GAS". OSWALD WAS NOT PAYING WATER AND GAS BILLS AT ANY RESIDENCE IN DALLAS FOLLOWING HIS RETURN HERE ON OCT. THREE LAST. SEE CHRONOLOGY ON PAGE THREE ONE EIGHT, ABOVE MENTIONED REPORT.

/C/ THE NOTE IN ITEM TEN STATES "YOU AND THE BABY", ETC. THE OSWALDS HAD A SECOND CHILD BORN OCT. TWENTY LAST / SEE PAGE THREE EIGHT FIVE, ABOVE MENTIONED REPORT / AND "BABY" WOULD PRESUMABLY BE PLURAL HAD THE NOTE BEEN WRITTEN ANY TIME SUBSEQUENT TO OCT. TWENTY LAST.

/D/ OSWALD ARRIVED IN DALLAS ON OCT. THREE LAST AND REGISTERED ON THAT DATE AT THE DALLAS YMCA AS A TRANSIENT GUEST. NOTHING IN THE EXTENSIVE INVESTIGATION THAT HAS BEEN MADE OF OSWALD/S ACTIVITIES INDICATES HE HAD ANY HOUSE ON WHICH HE HAD PAID RENT "ON THE SECOND", AS REFLECTED IN ITEM THREE OF THE LETTER.

MRS. PAINE SAID WITH RESPECT TO DELIVERY OF ABOVE MATERIAL TO THE IRVING PD BY HER, HER RECOLLECTION IS THIS DELIVERY WAS MADE NOVEMBER THIRTY LAST AT ABOUT FOUR THIRTY PM. IT IS NOTED CAPTAIN BARGER OF THE IRVING PD RECALLS THE MATERIAL WAS DELIVERED TO HIM BY MRS. PAINE AT ABOUT NINE OR TEN AM. AN EFFORT HAS BEEN

ANDREWS subsequently advised that this contact by BERTRAND must have been dreamed by him while under heavy sedation. Male in photographs of OSWALD and CHARLES HALL STEELE, JR., possibly passing out FPCC handbills in front of International Trade Mart on 8/16/63, not identified. CELSO MACARIO HERNANDEZ, who was arrested by NOPD on 8/9/63 when he, CARLOS BRINGUIER and MIGUEL CRUZ became involved in an argument with OSWALD over OSWALD's handing out pamphlets, stated inasmuch as he could not speak English, he had no intelligible conversation with OSWALD. He recalled OSWALD wearing a placard around his waist on which was written "Viva Fidel". DAVID CHARLES MIEHER, JR., News Editor, Radio Station WJDX and WLBT-TV, Jackson, Mississippi, stated he has heard FRED L. BEARD, Manager of these stations, comment in reference to the KENNEDYS to the effect "the only way to get them out of office would be to kill them". MIEHER stated that BEARD has been very critical of the KENNEDYS but considered such comments to be BEARD's way of expressing BEARD's belief that the KENNEDYS would continue to be elected if they ran for office. [BEARD] say that [BEARD] was going to kill any of the KENNEDYS or anyone else, and has never known [BEARD] to do anything physically violent or to threaten anyone with physical violence. Individuals at Jackson who know [BEARD] do not recall [BEARD] as ever being involved in any acts of physical violence, nor have they heard [BEARD] make any statement which would indicate that [BEARD] would participate or conspire with anyone to assassinate President KENNEDY or anyone else. Contacts at additional Latin American Consulates in New Orleans developed no information that OSWALD contacted these consulates.

Assistant Principal WILFRED O. HEAD, Warren Easton High School, 3019 Canal Street, furnished the following information which he said was an interpretation of LEE HARVEY OSWALD'S individual profile chart for the Cooperative Achievement Test administered to him during October, 1954 by a Mr. LANSFORD, named by HEAD as a former instructor of Beauregard Junior High School, no longer teaching in the New Orleans school system.

HEAD said that normally a student taking this test would exhibit scores in the four test areas of English, Reading, Mathematics, and Vocabulary but explained that in the case of OSWALD, no indication was available that he had taken the English portion of this test. He listed OSWALD'S numerical score ratings as 49 in Reading, as 43 in Mathematics, and as 48 in Vocabulary and offered the following interpretation set out below:

He advised that this particular test had been given to thousands of students in Louisiana and to millions of students on a national level and rated OSWALD'S performance in terms of a percentile scale for the local area of Louisiana in which the test was taken. He stated that when compared with a "local norm" average, OSWALD'S score of 49 in Reading ranked in the 88th percentile, that his score of 43 in Mathematics ranked in the 30th percentile, and that his score of 48 in Vocabulary ranked in the 82nd percentile.

HEAD stated that when these scores were rated in terms of a "national norm" that OSWALD'S score of 49 in Reading ranked in the 86th percentile, that his score of 43 in Mathematics ranked in the 26th percentile, and that his score of 48 in Vocabulary ranked in the 84th percentile.

Assistant Principal WILFRED O. HEAD, Warren Easton High School, 3019 Canal Street, made available to the FBI an entire cumulative record for LEE HARVEY OSWALD revealing his attendance at Beauregard Junior High School from January 13, 1954, until June 10, 1955, as well as for attendance at Warren Easton High School from September 9, 1954, until October 14, 1955, in order that Photostats might be made for use by the FBI. A review of the complete contents of this cumulative record was made, and the following descriptive summary inventory set out below resulted from that review:

One Cumulative Record

It is noted that while one side of this record indicates grades received by OSWALD while in attendance during 8th and 9th grades at Beauregard Junior High School, the reverse of this record bears a notation "incomplete" revealing that this student left Warren Easton High School before the end of the session when grades are regularly awarded. This record lists personal descriptive information as well as the transfer of this student on September 18, 1956, to Arlington Heights Junior High School, Fort Worth, Texas.

It is noted that on December 7, 1963, HEAD explained that the abbreviation "Re ad" regularly represented "Re Admitted" and added that his interpretation of the numbers set forth opposite this abbreviation would represent a total listing of the school days for a given school year. He further stated

that regularly 180 days appear in the school year and it was a state law that a number of school days in any given year must not fall below 170. HEAD stated that therefore the numbers listed opposite this abbreviation indicated the number of school days that OSWALD attended for a given school year.

It is also noted that under a heading marked "Total Units", a notation appears for 1953-54, Report 3 of P/71.8. On December 7, 1963, HEAD interpreted the letter "P" to mean that a posting had occurred and that the notation of 71.8 total units represented a numerical academic average for OSWALD covering the period for this student at Beauregard Junior High School from January 13, 1954, until the end of the academic year 1953-54.

It was noted that the reverse side of this Cumulative Record referred to above bears a notation "incomplete" relative to OSWALD's studies at Warren Easton High School; however, the following identifying data appears on this record in the space allotted for "High School Record":

He further indicated that he liked the subjects civics, science, and mathematics best and liked the subjects of English and art least. He indicated that his first vocational choice was biology and second was mechanical drawing. He indicated that after completing high school he intended to enter military service but likewise indicated "undecided". He stated his general health was good, although he observed that his ear drum in his left ear was abnormal. He listed his recreational activities as reading and out-door sports and further listed a specific interest in football.

On December 7, 1963, HEAD stated for information that OSWALD was awarded $5\frac{1}{2}$ points and explained that these points were equivalent to credit units and added that in order for a student in a Louisiana high school to graduate from high school, 17 credit units were needed. He stated that the notation $5\frac{1}{2}$ on this record showed that when OSWALD entered Warren Easton High School he had accumulated this amount of credit units, and further explained for information that all students entering this high school after completing the ninth grade in another New Orleans school usually have accumulated $4\frac{1}{2}$ to $5\frac{1}{2}$ credit units.

Mrs. ~~MARY HOFFMAN~~ BELLOTT, residence 832 City Park Avenue, New Orleans, Louisiana, was contacted at Beauregard Junior High School, 4621 Canal Street, and advised that she has been a teacher at this school for more than 11 years. She stated that following the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, at Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963, when the face of LEE HARVEY OSWALD was widely displayed through newspaper and television coverage, she remembered the name of OSWALD as having at one time been a student in one of her classes, at this school, although she stated she did not remember instructing this student, nor did she remember seeing his face around the school.

She stated that Mr. JOHN MARTIN, Principal of this school had informed her that during the academic term beginning in September, 1954 and ending in June, 1955, OSWALD had been a student in her mathematics class and she recalled advising MARTIN similarly as set out above.

She stated that she was unable to furnish any information relative to this student's attitudes, friends, academic ability, general demeanor or school conduct and added that she could only advise that all she could recall from an association with the student by the name of OSWALD was that this person had done satisfactory work in his studies.

She stated she could furnish no additional information.

Mrs. BAUER E. (HELEN) DUFOUR, residence 6018 Colbert Avenue, New Orleans, teacher, Beauregard Junior High School, 4621 Canal Street, was interviewed at this high school and advised that she has been associated with this school since 1952 and regularly instructed students in English studies.

She stated that she was somewhat surprised to be informed recently by the principal of this school, Mr. JOHN MARTIN that a review of his records revealed that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had attended her English classes from September, 1954 until June, 1955, and she explained she was at a loss to explain that she had no recollection of either the name OSWALD or identification of his facial characteristics, from representations of his photographs through news coverage with any person who attended this school.

She stated that MARTIN had informed her that this student attended her classes. She stated that she had no reason to doubt the truth of this fact, but explained for information that undoubtedly this student had not called attention to himself by being a disciplinary problem and neither had he distinguished himself in his academic studies.

She stated that of the many students instructed over her 33 year teaching career in New Orleans Public Schools, she was able to recall thousands of children instructed, although she added, in this case she was unable to furnish any information whatever.

DEAN ANDREWS, Attorney at Law, Room 628, Maison Blanche Building, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised that he returned to work December 2, 1963, after being seriously ill at Hotel Dieu Hospital, New Orleans, Louisiana. He advised that he had been hospitalized with pneumonia November 20 through 29, 1963, and during the time he was in the hospital he was under heavy sedation.

Mr. ANDREWS advised that on the night of November 23, 1963, between the hours of 6 and 9 p.m. he was awakened by the telephone in his room at Hotel Dieu. He advised he answered this telephone from a sound sleep and an individual who advised his name was CLAY BERTRAND asked him if he would be interested in defending LEE HARVEY OSWALD on the charge of murder of President KENNEDY in Dallas, Texas.

Mr. ANDREWS advised that he told the individual who called him that he would give consideration to defending OSWALD and that BERTRAND told him on the telephone that he would call him back. ANDREWS advised that BERTRAND has never called him back. ANDREWS advised that he was not furnished a telephone number where he could reach BERTRAND or any other identifying information other than the name CLAY BERTRAND. ANDREWS stated that the name CLAY BERTRAND seemed familiar to him and so did the voice.

ANDREWS stated that since he has returned to his office and has been attempting to recall this telephone conversation, "It seems like a dream to him". ANDREWS stated that the principal reasons why he feels that the telephone call was not a dream was because of the action he took in contacting Mr. SAM "MONK" ZELDEN, President of the New Orleans Criminal Bar Association and a close personal friend on Sunday, November 24, 1963 by telephone, reaching him at the New Orleans Athletic Club and discussing with him the propriety of defending OSWALD and asking ZELDEN if he would be interested in assisting in the defense. ANDREWS recalls this call and further recalls that it was

Attorney ZELDEN who told him that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been shot and that this news had just come over the television station.

ANDREWS advised that in addition to talking with ZELDEN, he had discussed receiving this call from CLAY BERTRAND with his investigator, Sergeant R. M. DAVIS, United States Army Retired, and his secretary, EVA SPRINGER, as *Louisiana* well as his wife. ANDREWS stated he could not pin point the time he discussed this call with DAVIS or his wife and secretary.

Mr. ANDREWS advised that he has no recollection of calling the Federal Bureau of Investigation or the United States Secret Service on November 25, 1963, but he does recall being interviewed by both representatives of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the United States Secret Service. He advised that he was under heavy sedation at the time of these interviews and was a very sick man.

Mr. ANDREWS advised that he recalled LEE HARVEY OSWALD coming to his office on three to five occasions on or about the last week of June, 1963, and speaking with him regarding the possibility of ANDREWS assisting him in correcting a Bad Discharge from the United States Marine Corps. OSWALD was also interested in determining his status as a citizen of the United States and determining whether he had disavowed his citizenship in Russia.. He was also interested in the immigration status of his wife in the United States. ANDREWS advised that OSWALD arrived at his office late in the evening after 5 p.m. and before 6 p.m. and as a result his secretary had left and there was no record made of his visit in the appointment book and he, ANDREWS, made no file on OSWALD's visit.

ANDREWS advised that OSWALD on the first occasion that he entered his office arrived at the same time as four other individuals whom he recalls as "gay kids", that is, French Quarter sex deviates. ANDREWS advised that he did not

recall who these individuals were, what connection they had with OSWALD, or any information why they were all in the office at the same time. On another occasion ANDREWS advised that he recalls OSWALD entering the office at the same time a Mexican looking youth, who appeared to him to be "gay", entered the office. This Mexican youth had a "butch hair cut" which is a very short hair cut and while OSWALD was speaking with ANDREWS, he remained in the outer office. ANDREWS advised that he did not know this Mexican looking youth and has not seen or heard of him since this visit from OSWALD and could not identify him even if he should see him again.

Mr. ANDREWS advised that OSWALD was to bring to his office copies of his discharge from the United States Marine Corps, a record of his serial number and any other papers he had as well as the necessary expense money to enable him (as OSWALD's attorney) to write to obtain the necessary records. ANDREWS advised that OSWALD never brought the records or the necessary money to pay for obtaining a copy of the records and therefore no action was taken by him.

ANDREWS advised that OSWALD came to his, ANDREWS', office the last time approximately July 9, 1963. ANDREWS stated that nothing of importance was discussed and OSWALD did not bring his necessary records and did not bring necessary funds to enable him, ANDREWS, to take any action for OSWALD. ANDREWS stated that he next observed OSWALD on Canal Street several weeks or a month later near the Maison Blanche Building passing out some "Friends of Cuba Literature". ANDREWS stated that he stopped and spoke to OSWALD and told him he "must be crazy" to be passing out this literature. ANDREWS said he also asked him in "jive talk" when was he going to bring him the bread or in normal English, when was he going to bring the money to finance his case. ANDREWS

advised that OSWALD could "really dig hep cat talk", that is understand jive talk or the slang expressions used among the sex deviates of the French Quarter. ANDREWS advised that OSWALD indicated that he did not have the money to pay the expenses for the obtaining of his military record and made a remark that passing out these handbills "was a job". ANDREWS stated that at no time did OSWALD indicate for whom he was working or indicate that he was being paid to pass out "Friends of Cuba Literature".

ANDREWS advised that this meeting on Canal Street was the last time he saw LEE HARVEY OSWALD, but from some source he learned that OSWALD had been arrested for getting into a fight. He advised that he did not represent OSWALD in court.

ANDREWS advised that he has carefully searched the various files and records of his office in an effort to identify CLAY BERTRAND and he has been unable to do so. He stated that he has every reason to believe that he has met CLAY BERTRAND before and the name seems to be familiar to him but to date he has been unable to identify CLAY BERTRAND as being identical with any individual he knows. ANDREWS advised that he would make every effort to identify CLAY BERTRAND by searching his memory and files of his office.

ANDREWS advised that he had reviewed a series of still photographs taken from film photographed by WDSU cameraman of LEE HARVEY OSWALD passing out literature in front of the International Trade Mart and in one corner of the photograph shown him by the Secret Service was a picture of CLEMENCIA ALMEIDA, 929 Gravier Street, New Orleans, employed by M. L. QUEEN, 338 International Trade Mart, New Orleans, Louisiana, telephone 523-6995, who is a client of his. ANDREWS advised that none of the other people in these photographs were identical with CLAY BERTRAND and he does not know any of the people in the photographs except OSWALD whom he immediately recognized.

Mr. ANDREWS repeated at the conclusion of the interview that this entire incident could have been dreamed by him in view of the physical condition he was in at the time. He stated however, that he believes he did received a call from an individual that he recalls as CLAY BERTRAND and he feels he will be able to identify CLAY BERTRAND either from material that is in his files or recognize him.

Mr. ANDREWS stated that he has a mental picture of CLAY BERTRAND as being approximately 6'1" to 6'2", brown hair, excellent appearance, well dressed and although a homosexual is not obvious and probably has a good job in the city. ANDREWS stated that this is a mental picture and he cannot in any way recall where the description came from or how he recalls BERTRAND.

Mr. ANDREWS stated that the telephone call he received was in his opinion a local call. He advised he could not determine how the caller was able to locate him at the Hotel Dieu Hospital. He stated that his residence telephone is unlisted and his office was closed on Friday and Saturday, November 22 and 23, 1963. ANDREWS stated he does not have an answering service. ANDREWS advised that prior to entering the hospital it was necessary that he postpone several cases and notify his clients that he was in the hospital and this is the only way that the individual using the name CLAY BERTRAND could have learned that he was in room 202 of Hotel Dieu Hospital.
