DAVID AUGUST ELSILA states LEE HARVEY OSWALD unknown to him.

## DETAILS:

On November 26, 1963, JAMES DEGERT, Reporter, "Pontiac Press", Pontiac, Michigan, daily newspaper, advised that he had attempted to interview one DAVID BLSILA concerning the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) and concerning whether ELSILA was acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSVALD. DYGERT advised that ELSILA gave some answers that he, DYGERT, considered evasive concerning his knowledge of OSVALD. He advised, however, that MISILA finally did tell him that he definitely did not know OSWALD personally.

MAVID AUGUST RESILA, 2616 Carland, Eylvan Lake, Michigan, was interviewed at his residence by SAS BOBERT M. SMITH and LAWRENCE M. COOPER, JR.

RISILA advised that he did not know LET MARVEY OFWALD and had never heard of him prior to the assassination of President JOHN P. MENNEDY. He said he did not know anyone who would be acquainted with OFFALD and is positive OFFALD was never present at any affair attended by RISILA. He said that based on pictures of DFFALD, he is positive he had never seen him.

ELSILA stated he had no knowledge of any kind concerning the assassination of President EENNEDY and could offer no information concerning the matter.

BISILA said that OSVALD had not, to his knowledge, been in either Havana, Cuba, or Helsinki, Finland, when BISILA had been there.

ELSIIA was advised of the purpose of the interview at the outset and he advised he would answer any questions about OSVALD or the assassination, but would not answer any other questions.

## APPENDIX

## PAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening In Cuba," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralise the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Benate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANTOS-BUCH identified himself and ROBERT TABER as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and TABER obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the afore-mentioned advertisement.

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. However, during the past year this source observed there has been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that today their influence is negligible.

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that the National Headquarters of the FPCC is located in Room 329 at 799 Broadway, New York City. According to this source, the position of National Office Director was created in the Fall of 1962 and was filled by VINCENT "TED" LEE, who now formulates FPCC policy. This source observed LEE has followed a course of entertaining and accepting the cooperation of many other organizations including the CP and the SWP when he has felt it would be to his personal benefit as well as the FPCC's. However, LEE has indicated to this source he has no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. LEE feels the

SPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cubs and the United States and support the right of Cubans to manage their revoluation without interference from other matiens, but not support the Cuban revolution per se.

The CP and the SWP have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.
