Mrs. GEORGE A. HOORE, 4109 Stanford Street, Chevy Chase, Marvland, telephonically advised that at approximately 4:30 P.M. - on November 22, 1963, she was watching television, probably either Channel 4 or Channel 7 from Washington, D. C., and saw a film clip of the action immediately after the shooting of the President. This film clip showed a policeman getting on a motorcycle and then showed a swing around of the buildings in the area and during this time she observed in the window of one of the buildings, a short dark complexioned woman with a high hairdo, struggling with a man much taller than she was over a gun. She stated the gun was either a rifle or a shotgun. She stated that also in this window there were two or three other people starding behind the man and woman who were struggling. She was not sure what floor of the building the window was on, nor could she describe the building.

Ars. HOORE said that she was reporting this matter since she had not heard this particular scene referred to in any news release since that time. She stated she was an artist and remembered the scene very clearly.

All film clips taken of the area where the President was shot (near intersection of Elm and Houston Streets, Dallas) by news media and local Dellas television stations have been reviewed by SA ROBERT M. BARRETT and SA IVAN D. LEE. No film clip has been observed or brought to the attention of the Dallas Office as described by Mrs. GEORGE A. MOORE, 4109 Stanford Street, Chevy Chase, Maryland. In addition to the above, all local processing plants for movie film, color film, and photography prints have been alerted to advise the Dallas Office upon the receipt of any photographs depicting the area in and around Elm and Houston Streets just prior to or after the shooting on November 22, 1963. All such movie film and photographs which have been brought to the attention of the Dallas Office have been reviewed, and no photographs have been located corresponding with those described by Mrs. MOORE.

On December 3, 1963, EDDIE BARKER, News Director, KRLD Radio and TV, and ROBERT WALKER, News Director, WFAA Radio and TV, both Dallas, each advised that the film clip as described by Mrs. MOORL has never come to their attention. DL 89-43 JJW:mam 1

On November 23, 1963, HENRIETTA JONES, 1814 Trunk, Dallas,/ HA 1-3718 (negro domestic employee employed by Dr. CARPENTER, 4300 Lorraine, Dallas) telephonically advised SA EDWIN D. KUYKENDALL that at about 9:35 AM, November 22, 1963, she was at the lunch counter of H. L. Green Company, Main at Ervay, ground floor (not the basement), counter nearest Main Street, and noticed a white girl, employee of that counter, eating breakfast at the counter. Something was said about President KENNEDY arriving that day. JONES said she had recently written a letter to the President about not being able to obtain welfare and had received a reply from President KENNEDY. She said she was proud of the letter she had received. The white employee sitting at the counter was described as a blond, about 25 years old, 5 feet 2 inches or 5 feet 3 inches, weighed about 120-130 pounds, thin, possibly wears dress size 11 or 12, and remarked to JONES substantially as follows: "KENNEDY is coming to town and you had better be careful what you say because there will be some bloodshed and no telling what else might happen." JONES has no idea what she meant, but she wanted to report same, as it is possible she may have overheard something someone said that would be pertinent to the assassination of President KENNEDY.

The following investigation was conducted by SA'S ROBERT E. BASHAM and JAMES J. WARD:

AT DALLAS, TEXAS

Mr. SAM JOHNSON, manager, lunch counter, H. L. Green Company, Main at Ervay, advised on December 4, 1963, that he has

Mr. JOHNSON advised he would estimate that of his 78 employees, at least 40 of them are blonds, natural or otherwise, and the majority of them are approximately 5 feet 3 inches and weigh around 130 pounds.

Mr. LLOYD W. HILBERT, 1440 West Gambrell, employed 100 University Drive, advised that on November 18, 1963, he was in a meeting with GEORGE SAULIANIAN and JOHN ADGER in the lobby of the Blackstone Hotel, Ft. Worth, Texas.

HILBERI stated has overheard an individual making a telephone call to North Manchester, Indiana. He stated that he was standing close by and introduced himself to this individual and asked the individual if he was from North Manchester, Indiana. This individual bad said, "I have been there." HildSRT stated that the individual apparently was making a porson-to-person call to someone at the Indiana - Lawrence and Trust Company, North Manchester, Irdiana, HILPERT stated that he did not hear any conversation that this individual had with the party on the other end of the line. Pe stated that the man gave his name as OSWALD. HILBERT stated have a sine that the individual stated his first name, but HILPEPT did not recall it. HILPERT stated that this individual was computed along, and they did not actually engage in any conversation between about the time he spoke to this individual, the convection was made on the other end of the line. He stated that the individual was dreated in a blue military type of uniform and was holding his hat.

HILBERI stared he had approached this individual as HILBERT had provide ly resided in North Machbester, Indiana.

HILPERT and that this individual had the same general physical appetiance of 45E OFMAID, but he could not identify the pictures of OBWAID that he has seen in the newsparsers and on television as being the individual with whom he spoke in the lobby of the Blackstone Hotel. HILBERT stated if was his recollection that the conversation with OBWALD occurred at approximately 4:30 to 4:45 F.M.: or November 15, 1963.

Mr. GEORGE SAULTANIAN, 4851 East Line Road, employed 100 University Drive, advised that he recalled that LLOYD HILBERT had spoken to an individual in the lobby of the Blackstone Hotel, Ft. Worth, Texas, or November 18, 1963, and this individual was in a military uniform.

SAUITANIAN believed the individual was a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force.

SAULTANIAN advised that it was his recollection that this individual identified himself by name as LEE OSWALD. He stated this immediately came to his mind when he heard the news broadcast that LEE OSWALD had been accested and subsequently charged with the assassination of Fresident KENNEDY.

SAULTANIAN stated as he recalled when Mr. HILBERT spoke to the individual who stated his name was OSWALD, that it was approximately 2.00 P.M. SAULTANIAN was questioned further about the time of the conversation took place. SAULTANIAN recall just what time the conversation took place. SAULTANIAN insisted that this individual introduced himself as LEE OSWALD.
