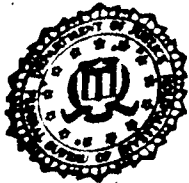

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION SHOULD BE SUBMITTED BY TELETYPE SUMMARY UNDER IS DASH B. FOLLOWED BY REPORTS. NO AIRTELS, LETTERHEAD MEMORANDA OR LETTERS SHOULD BE SUBMITTED.
