Synopsis: In 9/62 NH T-1 and NH T-2 advised that on or about 5/28/62 they dined at Leningradsky Hotel, Moscow, Russia and were joined by an unknown man and woman at the dinner table. Sources stated that they felt the male was an American and attempted to engage him in conversation without success. Unknown male did state to sources "You don't know, I might be a spy". Sources described the unknown female as an upper class type of Russian girl. Sources furnished description of unknown male. On 12/6/63 sources advised that after viewing photographs appearing in a recent issue of "Life" magazine of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and his Russian wife, they felt reasonably certain that the couple with whom they dined at the Leningradsky Hotel was in fact OSWALD and his wife. Sources had no additional information to furnish at this time.

DETAILS:

On September 6, 1962, NH T-1 and NH T-2 furnished the following information:

They stated that during the late part of May, 1962, they took a pleasure trip to the Far East and through various countries in Europe, including Russia. They stated that one night, on or about May 28, 1962, they had dinner at the Leningradsky Hotel, Moscow, Russia. They stated that shortly after they were seated they were joined at the table by a man and woman and that the man explained to them in English that this was a Russian custom.

The sources stated that they attempted to engage in casual conversation with the man, but that he rebuffed any attempt at friendliness. He advised that because they felt certain from a general appearance that this individual was an American, NH T-2 stated that during the course of conversation that if this person did not want to be known as an American he should "hide the label on his jacket".

The unknown subject at this point stated to the sources "you don't know, I might be a spy". The sources stated that the subject would have no further conversation with them and shortly thereafter left the table with his girlfriend. They stated that subject's girlfriend appeared to be an upper class type of Russian girl.

They furnished the following description of the subject:

On December 6, 1963 sources advised that they had observed in a recent issue of "Life" magazine photographs of subject, LEE HARVEY OSWALD and his Russian born wife, and that they were now reasonably certain that the couple with whom they dined at the Leningradsky Hotel, Moscow, Russia, in May, 1962 was in fact OSWALD and his wife. These sources advised that they had no additional information to offer concerning the acts of either OSWALD or his wife on the one occasion of their meeting but that they felt it might be pertinent for the Government to know that OSWALD and his wife probably were in Moscow, Russia in May, 1962.

Synopsis: At approximately 11:30 a.m., 11/30/63, Mrs. JACK D. TIPPIT, Westport, Conn., received a telephone call from a woman who refused to identify herself on grounds she would be killed and who stated as follows: She knew subject's father and uncle who lived at 77th and 2nd Ave in Yorkville, New York City, that while living there both were unemployed, got their money from the Communists and spent all their time in Communist activity. Caller began talking disjointedly, mentioned WEINSTOCK, the editor of "Woman's World" and said that EMILE KARDOS was the head of the Communists. that this group in New York now has charts and maps and plans to take over the Government. Mrs. TIPPIT's husband, who was listening to the conversation, did not recognize the caller's voice, and felt she was a mature adult. TIPPIT felt he may have received the call as the result of an article in a local newspaper stating that he may be a distant relative of Dallas police officer TIPPIT.

DETAILS:

Date December 2, 1963

On November 30, 1963, Mrs. JACK D. TIPPIT, 164 Newtown Turnpike, Westport, Connecticut, advised as follows:

At about 11:30 a.m. on November 30, 1963, Mrs. TIPPIT received a telephone call from an unknown woman who asked if Mr. TIPPIT was a policeman and if he was related to the policeman TIPPIT who was shot in Dallas. Mrs. TIPPIT answered that her husband was not a policeman but was distantly related to the Dallas policeman TIPPIT and asked to whom she was speaking.

The woman said she could not give her name as she was afraid of being killed, that she was from New York and had to come "here" to make the call so that she could not be traced as she was in fear of her life. The woman asked Mrs. TIPPIT not to say anything to the press about a woman calling as they would know who she is and she would be killed.

The woman said she knew OSWALD's father and uncle who were Hungarians and Communists. The woman continued that OSWALD's father and uncle had lived at 77th and 2nd Avenue in Yorkville, New York City, that while living there both were unemployed, got their money from the Communists, and spent all their time on Communist activity.

The woman then began speaking indistinctly, disjointedly, and sounded very nervous. She stated she had two names to give to Mrs. TIPPIT and said something about WEINSTOCK, the editor of "Woman's World" but did not give further details. She mentioned the name EMILE KARDOS and said something about a brother-in-law. Mrs. TIPPIT said the woman never gave any reason for her call which sounded local. Mrs. TIPPIT thought the woman had an Austrian or German accent and that she sounded like a mature adult. Mrs. TIPPIT was positive that the woman did not have a youthful voice.

On November 30, 1963, JACK D. TIPPIT, self-employed cartoonist for national magazines, including "The Saturday Evening Post", 164 Newtown Turnpike, Westport, Connecticut, telephone number 227-2698, furnished the following information:

At about 11:30 a.m. on November 30, 1963, his wife answered the telephone and he heard her say that he, Mr. TIPPIT, was not a policeman and that he was distantly related to the Dallas, Texas, police officer, TIPPIT. When his wife asked the caller's identity Mr. TIPPIT picked up another telephone extension and listened to the balance of the conversation.

The woman said she could not give her name as she was afraid of being killed, that she was from New York and had to come "here" to make the call so that she could not be traced as she was in fear of her life. The woman asked Mrs. TIPPIT not to say anything to the press about a woman calling as they would know who she is and she would be killed.

The woman said she knew OSWALD's father and uncle who were Hungarians and Communists. Mr. TIPPIT was of the opinion that the telephone call from the woman was made locally and he believed that she had a Spanish accent. Mr. TIPPIT felt that the woman sounded like a mature adult and was positive that she did not have a youthful voice

Mr. TIPPIT pointed out that the "Norwalk Hour", a local daily newspaper published at Norwalk, Connecticut, in its issue of November 25, 1963 on page 1, contained a small article stating that JACK TIPPIT may be a distant relative of the Dallas policeman, TIPPIT, who was shot by OSWALD. Mr. TIPPIT said this article resulted from a telephone call he had received from a reporter who stated he was checking the telephone directory on all people in the area who might be related to TIPPIT. TIPPIT told the reporter he was distantly related to Officer TIPPIT and asked the reporter not to print it.

The above film contains exposures made at the Dallas PD on 11/24-25/63 of papers and property of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and possibly his wife, and possibly some material belonging to Mrs. RUTH PAINE of 2515 West 5th Street, Irving, Texas.

One portion of the above mentioned material was obtained by search warrant on 11/22/63 from OSWALD's room at 1026 North Beckley, Dallas, Texas by Dallas PD, another by search warrant by Dallas PD on 11/23/63 from Mrs. RUTH PAINE's home in Irving, and remaining portion on 11/22/63 furnished to Dallas PD voluntarily by Mrs. PAINE and Mrs. LEE HARVEY OSWALD from Mrs. PAINE's home.

The Bureau is requested to process the enclosed film and make three prints of each exposure, letter size, and return all prints to the Dallas Office for sorting and analysis. It is contemplated that the Dallas Division will furnish one copy of each such print to the local representative of Secret Service after prints are examined by the Dallas Office for content. From one set Dallas will remove all foreign language material for submission to the

On November 27, 1963, Dr. WILLIAM PRENDERGAST, Republican National Committee, Room 203 Caffritz Building, Washington, D. C., informed SAs STUART W. ANGEVINE and EUGENE C. GIES he had received information from sources available to him.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD had approached CARLOS BRINGUIER, Head of the Cuban Student Directorate (CSD), New Orleans, Louisiana, during approximately early August, 1963, and had offered a \$10 contribution toward the furtherance of the anti-Castro causes of that organization. Since he was a former United States Marine, he also offered to assist in the military training of members of this group. The CSD was suspicious of OSWALD, suspecting he was possibly a member of the CIA or FBI who was attempting to penetrate their organization. They forwarded his offer to CSD Headquarters, Miami, Florida, for consideration. In the meantime they placed OSWALD under surveillance.

Subsequently, OSWALD was discovered distributing pro-Castro literature on a street corner in New Orleans. When he was challenged by members of the CSD concerning this, he and these members became engaged in a fight which resulted in the arrest by the New Orleans Police Department.

As a result, a New Orleans Television station had OSWALD and members of the CSD appear on a television forum program scheduled for August 21, 1963. A filmed recording of this forum was made.

The particulars concerning this incident would be available to BRINGUIER and to JOSE ANTONIO LANUSA, National Head of CSD, Miami. TIA

ONE, FIVE SEVEN ENROUTE TO JAPAN. ABOUT CHRISTMAS, ONE NINE FIVE EIGHT, THEY RETURNED TO CALIFORNIA AND SERVED WITH THE MARINE AIR CONTROL SQUADRON NUMBER NINE, EL TORRO HELICOPTER FACILITY, SANTA ANA, CALIFORNIA. CAMARATA WAS DISCHARGED FROM THE MARINE CORPS IN SEPTEMBER FIVE NINE AND OSWALD LEFT SHORTLY BEFORE ON A HARDSHIP DISCHARGE.

CAMARATA STATES THAT OSWALD WAS RUMORED TO HAVE TAKEN A RUSSIAN LANGUAGE COURSE WHILE IN JAPAN AND ON HIS RETURN TO THE UNITED STATES HE SPOKE IN RUSSIAN, HAD HIS NAME IN RUSSIAN ON HIS JACKET AND LISTENED TO RUSSIAN PHONOGRAPH RECORDS. OSWALD DESCRIBED AS A QUOTE LOWER UNQUOTE. CAMARATA STATES THAT SCHRAND WAS KILLED WHILE SERVING ON SENTRY DUTY WITH OSWALD DURING MANEUVERS IN PHILIPPINE ISLANDS. THE DEATH OF SCHRAND WAS RULED ACCIDENTAL BUT IT WAS RUMORED OSWALD MAY HAVE BEEN RESPONSIBLE.

CAMARATA STATES DANIEL P. POWERS WAS STATIONED AT ATSUGI, JAPAN WITH OSWALD AND MAY HAVE INFORMATION CONCERNING OSWALD-S ACTIVITIES WHILE IN JAPAN. POWERS HOME IS AT OWATONNA, MINNESOTA AND HE WAS DISCHARGED FROM MARINE CORPS IN ONE NINE FIVE EIGHT.

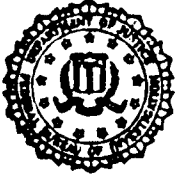
