Synopsis: GEORGE CLIFFORD PARISH, USN, and wife EMMA PARISH, Lee Hall, Va., state sister of EMMA, MARGE PIC, is married to Staff Sgt. JOHN PIC, USAF, San Antonio, Tex., who was half brother of subject. PARISHes never met subject, state in 1954 subject and mother visited the PICs in New York City. During visit, subject threatened MARGE PIC with knife. Thereafter, either DORIS EBEL, New York City, sister of MARGE, or JOHN PIC "kicked" OSWALD out of house. RAYMOND REFORD SANDS of Wichita Falls, Tex., visited in Newport News, Va., during period 11/20 - 24/63. SANDS remarked on 11/21/63, "Washington is going to fall. It is inevitable. It may be years. It may be months. It may be days." Lt. Col. JOSEPH N. SANDS, Ft. Eustis, Va., brother of RAYMOND, described him as religious fanatic and mentally disturbed; claims brother had been afforded psychiatric treatment in VA Hospital, Little Rock, Ark. RAYMOND claims he has extra sensory powers and knows President and Mrs. JOHNSON. RAYMOND claimed on recent visit to Washington, D.C. contacted Mrs. JOHNSON by telephone. Col. SANDS gave RAYMOND \$50.00 on 11/24/63, as RAYMOND indicated he was going to Little Rock, Ark. RAYMOND born 2/2/20, at Wichita Falls, Tex., and is a white, male, last known to be in Memphis, Tenn., not known to have been acquainted with subject.

On December 4, 1963, Lieutenant A. J. DILLON, Commanding Officer, USS BEARSS, Norfolk Naval Shipyard, Portsmouth, Virginia, telephonically contacted Assistant Special Agent in Charge ROBERT V. HANCOCK. Lieutenant DILLON stated that GEORGE CLIFFORD PARISH, a Chief Commissaryman assigned to the ship, had advised him that he is distantly related to LEE HARVEY OSWALD and desired to furnish information concerning OSWALD to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

CSC GEORGE CLIFFORD PARISH, Serial Number 557 02 36, U.S. Navy, advised that he is assigned to the USS BEARSS, Norfolk Naval Shipyard, Portsmouth, Virginia. He furnished the following information:

He was born August 23, 1925, Washington County, Florida, and is married to EMMA HENRIETTA PARISH, nee Fuhrman. They were married in March, 1949, in Yonkers, New York. They reside at 25A Rochambeau Village, Lee Hall, Virginia. He has served in the U.S. Navy from August 21, 1943, to June 4, 1946, and from November 12, 1947, to date.

PARISH related that his wife's sister MARGE PIC, nee Fuhrman, is married to Sergeant JOHN PIC, assigned to an unidentified Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas. JOHN PIC was a half brother of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. JOHN PIC, who is in his late twenties or early thirties, is the oldest of three children of the mother of OSWALD. The mother had been married at least twice.

Neither PARISH nor his wife, EMMA, ever actually saw OSWALD or spoke with him.

PARISH has known JOHN PIC for approximately 11 years. PIC served two "hitches" in the U.S. Coast Guard and then enlisted in the Air Force. He is a Pharmacist.

Mrs.

PARISH recalled that his wife, EMMA, told him that sometime during the mid 1950's OSWALD had visited JOHN and MARGE PIC at which time they were residing at 325 East 92nd Street, New York, New York. Following OSWALD's arrival, JOHN PIC had duty aboard a Coast Guard Cutter. During JOHN PIC's absence, OSWALD apparently threatened MARGE PIC with a knife; and, following JOHN PIC's return to New York, he "ran OSWALD out of the house." PARISH stated that his wife, EMMA, related this information to him, and his wife also subsequently mentioned to him that after OSWALD allegedly threatened MARGE PIC he (OSWALD) and the PICs did not get along together.

The last time PARISH saw the PICs was in 1958, when they were in Norfolk en route to Japan in connection with JOHN PIC's assignment in the Air Force. At the time the PARISHes visited with the PICs the PICs stated that they were going to visit some place in Texas on their trip to Japan.

JOHN PIC never discussed any member of his family with the PARISHes, and PARISH stated that he was unable to comment concerning any activities or beliefs of OSWALD. He stated that he most certainly could not offer any opinion whatsoever as to why OSWALD assassinated President JOHN F. KENNEDY.

PARISH related that sometime during the 1950's Mrs. PARISH called his attention to articles in a newspaper reflecting that OSWALD had defected to Russia. PARISH claimed that he was unaware that OSWALD had married or in fact had even returned to the United States until the news was received that he had assassinated the President.

W. F. Johnson
Following the news linking OSWALD to the assassination, both Mr. and Mrs. PARISH felt a certain amount of compassion toward Mr. and Mrs. PIC and wondered how they were getting along. Mrs. PARISH telephoned another sister, DORIS EBEL, who lives on 172nd Street, New York and whose husband, JOHN EBEL, is the personal chauffeur for HOWARD JOHNSON, who operates a chain of restaurants. DORIS EBEL related to Mrs. PARISH that she had telephoned MARGE PIC and MARGE PIC at the time related that subsequent to the assassination she and her husband JOHN PIC were under close surveillance by either the FBI or the Secret Service. DORIS EBEL also mentioned that she "had been talked to" and PARISH assumed that perhaps the FBI had talked to her.

A few days after the assassination Mrs. PARISH directed a night letter to MARGE PIC in San Antonio asking MARGE PIC to call her. MARGE PIC subsequently talked to Mrs. PARISH and told her that she and her husband JOHN PIC were under some sort of protective surveillance.

PARISH stated that although he was not in possession of any information concerning OSWALD which he

considered pertinent to the crime, he felt that because he was a distant relative of OSWALD he wanted to volunteer whatever information he did know concerning the man.

EMMA HENRIETTA PARISH, nee Fuhrman, the wife of GEORGE CLIFFORD PARISH, 25-A Rochambeau Village, Lee Hall, Virginia, furnished the following information:

She advised that her sister, MARGE PIC, is married to JOHN PIC, who was a half brother of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. JOHN PIC is a Staff Sergeant in the Air Force and resides at 7306 Westville, San Antonio, Texas.

Mrs. PARISH claimed that neither she nor her husband, GEORGE, ever met OSWALD. She advised, however, that she and her husband are very friendly with JOHN and MARGE PIC. JOHN PIC never discussed any members of his family with the PARISHes.

Mrs. PARISH recalled that in June, 1954 OSWALD and his mother visited JOHN and MARGE PIC at 325 East 92nd Street, New York, New York. At the time, JOHN PIC was on sea duty with the United States Coast Guard. OSWALD had an argument with MARGE PIC and "pulled a knife on her." MARGE PIC called her sister DORIS EBEL, nee Fuhrman, and later DORIS EBEL berated OSWALD and "kicked" OSWALD out of the house. Since that incident the PICs had very little to do with OSWALD.

She related that on December 3, 1963, she had talked to DORIS EBEL on the telephone, and Mrs. EBEL related that she had been talked to by the Secret Service and that their mother, MARY FUHRMAN, Post Office Box 495, Selden, Long Island, New York, was to be interviewed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation on December 4, 1963. DORIS EBEL resides at 178 East 73rd Street, New York, New York. She related that she has a third sister, NANCY RICO, who resides with her mother on Long Island.

Mrs. PARISH stated that on December 4, 1963, she talked via telephone with MARGE PIC. MARGE related to her that when her husband, JOHN, learned that OSWALD may have assassinated President KENNEDY, he promptly told his commanding officer that he was a half brother of OSWALD and that thereafter, the commanding officer restricted him to the base where he was assigned. Mrs. PARISH could not recall the name of the base. She stated that MARGE PIC apparently only saw OSWALD on one occasion and that was during the time he threatened her in New York City.

Mrs. PARISH stated that someone, identity not recalled, sent her a newspaper clipping several years ago reflecting that OSWALD had defected to Russia and that she thereafter called this to the attention of her husband.

She advised that because she did not personally know OSWALD and knew of no personal information concerning him, she could not furnish any additional pertinent data concerning him or offer any reasons as to why he may have assassinated President KENNEDY.

She advised that the following are her brothers, but that to her knowledge they have never had any contact with OSWALD and knew of no information concerning him:

RAYMOND REFORD SANDS

Private First Class LEROY HARVEY PHILLIPS, Army Serial Number RA 196 97 022, A Company, 69th Signal Battalion, Fort Eustis, Virginia, advised that on November 21, 1963, he went to Schugam Loan Office, near 36th Street and Washington Avenue, Newport News, Virginia, to pawn a camera. While in the pawn shop, he noticed an individual who was pawning a watch for \$5.00. PHILLIPS said he did not know this individual, but the two acknowledged that the other was present through a friendly smile. He said after the two of them departed the pawn shop they went into an unknown restaurant or bar nearby and sat down together and started to converse. PHILLIPS said that when the two of them parted ways on November 21, 1963, this individual handed him a small card with the name RAYMOND R. SANDS, care of HELEN T. WHITEHEAD, Post Office Box 51, Hazen, Arkansas, written on it.

PHILLIPS said he was with SANDS from approximately 9:00 A.M. in the morning until 2:30 P.M.; when he, PHILLIPS, caught a Greyhound Bus to go to Fort Eustis. He said when they first engaged in conversation the conversation was of a general nature, but gradually SANDS took complete command of the conversation, and he, PHILLIPS, said very little.

PHILLIPS related that he learned that SANDS had written some poems of a religious and sentimental nature, and that he was trying to get them published. He said SANDS told him he had been to Washington, D.C. for about seven days and had just arrived in Newport News. He said through conversation, it appeared that SANDS had been to Newport News before and was familiar with the city.

PHILLIPS said after having some refreshments in the first place in which they engaged in conversation, they went to another place, name of which he does not recall, and SANDS had two beers, stating that he suffered from a vitamin deficiency, and he needed the beers since they were good for him. PHILLIPS said in this restaurant SANDS had two draft beers, and he, PHILLIPS, had a cup of coffee. After SANDS consumed two beers, they left this restaurant and went into another place where SANDS purchased a bottle of wine of an unknown brand.

PHILLIPS said after SANDS purchased the bottle of wine they walked in the area of Newport News High School and then to a Texaco service station where Firestone products are sold, near 34th Street and Huntington Avenue, and went into the men's room and took several drinks from the wine bottle. He said all during the walk and the visits with SANDS in the restaurant, SANDS talked constantly and always appeared to be nervous. He said during the conversation, exact location he does not recall, SANDS made a statement, "Washington is going to fall. It is inevitable. It may be years. It may be months. It may be days."

PHILLIPS said from the conversation with SANDS, SANDS did not appear to have any hatred or malice toward anyone, but many of his statements, none of which he can recall, were in disagreement with some of the United States Government policies. He said when SANDS was not discussing his poetry he was quoting from the book of Revelations of the Bible, and it appeared to him at times that the man was a religious fanatic, and passed to him two religious tracts entitled "Why Join the Church" and "You Can Win Others", which had on them the stamp of the Calvary Baptist Church, 4700 Huntington Avenue.

PHILLIPS further related that while on their walk near Huntington Avenue the two of them went into the Catholic church where SANDS knelt in prayer for a short time. After visiting the Catholic church, SANDS told him that he was staying at the Tidewater Hotel in Newport News, but had a brother who was a Lieutenant Colonel at Fort Eustis. SANDS told him that he was not going to contact his brother but did not state why the contact would not be made. He said when they parted ways, SANDS gave him a dime and asked him to call his brother when he returned to Fort Eustis. PHILLIPS said, however, he has not contacted SANDS' brother at Fort Eustis.

PHILLIPS said also that SANDS made the statement that President KENNEDY would have been better off if his brother had not been killed during World War II. After this comment, SANDS handed him a Salem cigarette pack and told him to keep the pack since green was a sign of good luck. He said SANDS also gave him a broken key and told him to keep the key since that key had opened up something for

him and maybe it would open up something for PHILLIPS, and should he receive something as a result of having the key, he should then pass it on to someone else.

PHILLIPS described GANDS as being a white, male, 50 - 52 years of age, about 5' 10-11", thin arms, 160 - 170 pounds, wearing an old grayish-brown hat with a broad brim, stating he wore this hat for sentimental reasons. He wore a two piece suit, which appeared to be possibly a brown sport coat or a suit coat and a pair of bluish pants. He said at times he would wear dark glasses and told him he would not be around the area very long.

PHILLIPS stated that at no time did the man indicate that he had been acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

Mr. DAVID JUSTICE, Manager, Tidewater Hotel, 24th Street and Washington Avenue, Newport News, Virginia, advised that records at the hotel reflect that one RAYMOND R. SANDS registered at the hotel at 6:50 P.M. on November 20, 1963. JUSTICE said SANDS checked out of the hotel on November 22, 1963, time not recorded. Registration card reflects the name RAYMOND R. SANDS, care of BESSIE E. YOUNGKIN, care of Lieutenant Colonel J. N. SANDS, Quarters 2768, Fort Eustis, Virginia, representing White Store, Inc. SANDS occupied Room 122; and while at the hotel, he made a telephone call on November 20, 1963, to telephone number 5034, Hazen, Arkansas.

JUSTICE stated that he has no idea as to the current whereabouts of SANDS. He further advised that while at the hotel, SANDS gave one of the bellboys a check for some food which he had sent to the room, but the manager who was on duty at the time went to the room and told SANDS they would not accept a check for food; therefore, the check was returned to SANDS and cash obtained for the food.

Lieutenant Colonel JOSEPH N. SANDS, 2768 Fergusson Circle, Fort Eustis, Virginia, assigned as Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 Division, Fort Eustis, Virginia, advised that RAYMOND REFORD SANDS is his brother. He said that his brother had recently contacted him while visiting in Newport News, Virginia. SANDS advised that their mother is BESSIE E. YOUNGKIN, and she resides with him at Fort Eustis.

Colonel SANDS said that his brother contacted him by telephone at his office at Fort Eustis on November 20, 1963, and at that time he told his brother he did not want him to contact him and for him not to come to his residence at Fort Eustis under any circumstances. He said prior to November 20, 1963, his brother had passed through Newport News stating that he was en route to Washington, D.C.

Colonel SANDS said his brother had been discharged from the Veterans Administration Hospital, Little Rock, Arkansas, where he had received treatment as a psychiatric patient. He said prior to that time his brother had been a mental patient in a mental institution at Norman, Oklahoma, and had also received some psychiatric consultations when he had returned from overseas duty with the United States Marine Corps in 1945.

Colonel SANDS said that he knows that his brother had stayed at the Tidewater Hotel in Newport News on his last visit to Newport News. He said prior to his coming to Newport News, he had received a call from Memphis, Tennessee, from his brother stating that he was coming to see him en route to Washington, D.C. He said that at that time he told his brother that he did not desire to see him and for him not to contact him should he come in the area. He stated, however, that his brother continues to call him inasmuch as their mother resides with him. He said during several telephone conversations with his brother, his brother has told him that he had some poems that he wanted to sell and that on the visit prior to the one of November 20, 1963, his brother said that he was going to Washington, D.C. to see President KENNEDY and Vice President JOHNSON. Colonel SANDS related that his brother had told him that he had met Vice President JOHNSON and Mrs. JOHNSON while he, RAYMOND SANDS, was employed in Austin, Texas, and JOHNSON was a Senator

at the time. Colonel SANDS stated, however, he does not know whether his brother is actually acquainted with President and Mrs. JOHNSON.

Colonel SANDS said on the visit to Newport News, Virginia, during the period beginning November 20, 1963, his brother telephonically advised him that while in Washington, D.C. he had had a telephone conversation with Mrs. JOHNSON but was not able to see President JOHNSON.

Colonel SANDS said that his brother is definitely a religious fanatic and mentally disturbed. He said during one of the recent telephone conversations with his brother, his brother quoted Scripture to him and made the statement, "Of course you are familiar with the story of Cane and Able in the Bible." He said that his brother told him that he had extra-sensory powers and had been in direct communication with higher powers and had knowledge so great that if he revealed it, it would mean instant death to him. He said his brother also told him that through his direct communication with higher powers, he has visioned that Colonel SANDS and his wife would die on a certain date. SANDS stated, however, that he has never known of his brother to commit any act of violence or have any firearms or knives on his person.

Colonel SANDS stated that to the best of his recollection his brother was in the United States Marine Corps between 1942 and 1945 and has no medical disability, although he did receive some psychiatric treatment while in the Marine Corps. He said that his and his brother's home is in Wichita Falls, Texas, and his brother has worked in Wichita Falls, Albuquerque, New Mexico, Austin, Texas, and possibly in and around Dallas, Texas. He said the last employment he knew of that his brother had was a job with Sears, Roebuck and Company, Lubbock, Texas, and prior to that was employed in a furniture store in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He said that the job he held the longest was with White's Auto Stores in Austin, Texas. He said these White's Auto Stores are operated by one EARL WHITE, who resides in Wichita Falls.

Colonel SANDS said that he returned from overseas in July, 1962, and at that time his brother was in the Midland, Texas, jail; and since that time, he believes his brother has been in jail in Duval, Arkansas.

Colonel SANDS said his brother has been married at least three times to his knowledge and that his first wife, a HELEN STUART, now resides at 1825 11th Street, Wichita Falls, Texas. He stated, however, that he and his mother have promised that they would never tell his brother her whereabouts since they have two girls, one of which is now married, and they want nothing to do with RAYMOND SANDS. He said RAYMOND SANDS was divorced from HELEN STUART SANDS in 1953 or 1954, and after that was married to a MOZELLE STEELE, who now lives at 1051 Fair Meadow Circle, Duncanville, Texas, which is near Dallas, Texas. He said since that time he has been married to another woman, name unrecalled, and at this time is allegedly going with a woman, name unknown, who lives somewhere in Arkansas, whom RAYMOND intends to marry.

Colonel SANDS was interviewed at his home in the presence of his mother, Mrs. BESSIE E. YOUNGKIN; and between the two, they advised that the last known address for RAYMOND SANDS was in October, 1963, in care of Mrs. LEAH BRIDGE, 2822 South Broadway, Little Rock, Arkansas. The address prior to that was in care of W. MILAN, 1522 West Third Street, Little Rock, Arkansas. Colonel SANDS said that his brother has kept in touch with his aunt, Mrs. FOY FITZPATRICK, 2424 Southwest 20th Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He said Mrs. FITZPATRICK is an elderly person and that her son, ARTHUR FITZPATRICK resides with her at the same address.

Colonel SANDS said on several occasions while his brother was in Newport News he contacted him or contacted the residence in an effort to contact their mother, but his mother would not talk to him on the telephone. He said on each occasion he pleaded for money, so on November 24, 1963, he, his wife, and his mother drove to Newport News and met his brother on the street in front of the Greyhound Bus Station and gave him \$50.00 cash, and did not carry on any conversation with him. He said, however, prior to their taking him the \$50.00, his brother had indicated that he wanted money to return to Little Rock. He said, however, he believes that if his brother did not go to Little Rock he would be somewhere around Memphis, Tennessee, although he does not know of any one location or person he knows in Memphis.

Colonel SANDS also said his brother told him in one telephone conversation that he had contacted a priest in Newport News, and had asked the priest to contact a priest at Fort Eustis in an effort to get him, Colonel SANDS, and his mother together. Colonel SANDS stated that he told his brother that he did not desire his presence under any circumstances and the sooner he got out of town the better off both of them would be. He said on the visit prior to November 20, 1963, to Newport News, his brother had appeared in Newport News approximately four or five days and interim had said he had been to Washington, D.C. He said on the first visit on November, 1963, to Newport News, his brother had registered at the Warwick Hotel, Newport News, and their mother had paid the hotel bill for him. He said he also learned from his brother that he spent at least two nights at the Salvation Army Headquarters in Newport News.

Colonel SANDS stated that should he receive any information which would reveal the whereabouts of his brother, he would immediately advise the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Colonel SANDS furnished the following description of his brother:

The report dated 11-25-63, which contains results of interview of John Edward Pic, reveals that during subject's visit to residence of his brother, Robert, on Thanksgiving Day, 1962, subject telephoned someone from Robert's house; and, thereafter, a young Russian man came to Robert's house and subject and wife departed with that individual. Unless previously identified and interviewed, same should be done immediately. That individual may be Paul Gregory, who has already been interviewed by your office. u

The report dated 11-26-63, which contains results of interview of Mrs. Ruth Paine, revealed that the Norman Friedericksens, 511 East Sixth Street, telephone number BL-3-9285, attended party at which subject was present and made it clear he was a Marxist. On November 26, 1963, HENRY OXNARD, 1383 Filbert Street, San Francisco, California, contacted the San Francisco Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and advised that approximately in 1961, prior to December 16 of that year, while a student at the University of Colorado, He met HARRY NIER who was the leader of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) at the University of Colorado. OXNARD said that present on this occasion were the following:

ED BUSH, who is now a stockbroker with offices at 705 Security Building, Denver, Colorado.

JACK FLOBECK, then just out of Yale University, now residing on Grape Street, Denver, Colorado, and employed by the Robinson Brick and Tile Company.

JOHN POULOS, who lives on Poplar Street in Aurora, a suburb of Denver, Colorado.

OXNARD stated that ED BUSH asked HARRY NIER if he was a Communist. NIER said no, but added that he was a "Marxist." When NIER claimed Cuba and CASTRO were for peace, ED BUSH asked NIER about the terrorist group in Venezuela. NIER replied approximately as follows:

"I don't know about that, but I'm going to Mexico and I know a guy named Oswald and I'll ask him."

OXNARD related that he particularly remembered the name OSWALD. OXNARD said that he had talked by phone with his parents, who reside at 345 Gilpin, Denver, Colorado, and his father stated that HARRY NIER had been interviewed over the radio at Denver and had denied knowing OSWALD.
