Room and Ramon's Restaurant in Denver. He said that by being patrons of these establishments, they have become casual acquaintances of JOSEPH SPERTE, Manager of the La Profile; ROGER SPERTE, Manager of Ramon's; and a waiter named EDWARD PARTYKA who has worked at both establishments.

In regard to PARTYKA, Mr. BOYD stated he has obtained a couple of loans from the Thrift Finance Company on the basis of his casual acquaintance with Mr. WAYNE ROBERT SMITH, and that the company has had considerable difficulty with this account. He said that he has personally discussed this delinquent account with EDWARD PARTYKA on several occasions within recent months, and that he has threatened to discuss the matter with PARTYKA's employers. Although he has promised in various ways to relieve the delinquent account, PARTYKA has failed to do so and is several payments in arrears at this time. Mr. BOYD said that he has found PARTYKA to be "a liar" and completely unreliable in regard to this matter. He said, however, that even though PARTYKA came to the Thrift Finance Company because of a reference from Mr. SMITH, he does not believe that SMITH, or his wife, have ever contacted PARTYKA relative to this delinquent account because SMITH acted strictly as treasurer of the company and never, at any time, attempted to supervise any of the accounts or loans.

Mr. BOYD advised that records of the Thrift Finance Company reflect that EDWARD and ADELINE PARTYKA, 134 Garfield Street, Denver, Colorado, first obtained a loan from that company on July 16, 1962 in the amount of \$216.69. The balance of this account was incorporated in a new loan made December 6, 1962, in total amount of \$504.00 repayable in 12 months at the rate of \$42.00 a month. The records reflect that payments were only made on January 4, 1963; April 22, 1963; August 5, 1963;

September 17, 1963; and October 21, 1963. The current outstanding balance is \$239.39. On loan application dated July 16, 1962, PARTYKA indicated that he resided at 1269 Logan, Apartment 31; that he had been employed as a waiter at La Profile Room for six and one-half years; and that his nearest relative was his mother, Mrs. ROSE GAZDA, 2211 East Baltimore Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland. He also listed the name of a brother, STANLEY PARTYKA, employed by the Martin Company, and his mother-in-law as Mrs. MARY WATKINS, 8417 (no street), Dallas, Texas.

Mr. BOYD concluded that although his contact with Mr. and Mrs. SMITH has been only infrequent and casual during the past few months, he absolutely does not believe that either of them would ever enter any "plot" or even make any brash statements relative to possible harm to the late President KENNEDY or any other individual. He added that the President of his company, Mr. LLOYD BCYD, has not had any more contact with Mr. and Mrs. SMITH than he has and, furthermore, has never had any direct contact with EDWARD PARTYKA relative to the aforementioned loan.

Mr. CECIL BURKHEAD, barber, 1123 East 9th Avenue, Denver, Colorado, advised TED BILLINGS maintains, a health food shop next-door to him at 1121 East 9th Avenue, and as a consequence, he has had several conversations with BILLINGS over the past two or three years.

BURKHEAD advised that BILLINGS recently told him he had been designated Colorado State Chairman of the Constitution Party of the United States, having recently attended some type of convention of this organization in Indianapolis, Indiana.

BURKHEAD stated BILLINGS has frequently expressed anti-Jewish sentiments and is an extremely outspoken type of individual concerning politics and patriotism.

BURKHEAD advised that on the Tuesday preceding the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, BILLINGS was in his barber shop and was discussing the fact that President KENNEDY believed in a "One World Party." For this reason BILLINGS advised that "the SOB ought to be shot." According to BURKHEAD, he recalled BILLINGS' making this statement several times during the course of this conversation, but at that time was not of the opinion that BILLINGS actually was serious and characterized him more as a "loudmouth."

BILLINGS categorically denied making this statement, pointing out that he is a firm believer in the Constitution of the United States which guarantees freedom of speech; however, that he did not consider the making of a statement of this type the proper use of freedom of speech.

BILLINGS further stated that he has never owned a firearm of any type in his life and that he has never had any intention whatsoever to assassinate the President of the United States, or any other individual.

BILLINGS further stated he was recently designated Colorado State Chairman of the Constitution Party of the United States, and attended a national meeting of this organization recently in Indianapolis, Indiana.

MICHAEL FLOOD, 423 South Beech Street, retired brick Fayer, advised that he was an ardent admirer of the late President, JOHN F. KENNELT and that he frequently argues politics with various individuals. He stated that approximately a week prior to the assassination of Mr. KENNEDY, he was discussing politics with an unknown male individual at Horn's Drug Center, Casper, Wyoming, and he, FLOOD, expressed the opinion to this individual that Mr. KENNEDY would be President for a long time. He stated that this individual replied to this statement with "Oh no he won't."

FLOOD said that he would not have paid any attention to this remark normally but in view of the fact that he knows from prior conversation with this person, that he is originally from Dallas, Texas, and has stated in past discussions that Mr. KENNEDY was not liked by the people of Texas. FLOOD stated that this person in no way indicated that any harm would befall Mr. KENNEDY and there was a possibility that this individual meant by his remark that Mr. KENNEDY would not be re-elected. FLOOD said that this person appeared to be stable and not emotional and that he is employed by the United States Post Office sorting mail between Denver, Colorado, and Casper, Wyoming. He said that VEIMA, whose last name he does not know but who is employed by the Horn Drug Center, might be able to identify this individual by name.

FLOOD again advised that he would not have reported this conversation but he had observed this person at the Horn Drug Center Lunch Counter again on December 1, 1963, (Sunday), and this individual got up and walked away from the counter leaving half of his dinner uneaten which indicated to him that this person could not face him in view of Mr. KENNEDY's assassination. FLOOD reiterated that he never heard this person wake any remarks that would indicate to him that he was involved in the assassination of Mr. KENNEDY, however, he knew that this man was from Texas and that he did not like KENNEDY or at least RENNEDY's policies.

This phase of the investigation was based on information contained in an article on page 27 of the "Evening Bulletin", Providence, Rhode Island, on December 4, 1963, which reads as follows:

"Lee Harvey Oswald applied through a Providence Unitarian minister in 1959 for admission to the Albert Schweitzer College in Churwalden, Switzerland, and was accepted, but never showed up.

TO STATE THE SECOND SECOND TO THE PROPERTY.

"Dr. Schacht seid that he sent all documents relating to the Oswald application to Switzerland and has no records of the case here now. All processing of the application was by mail.

"To the best of his recollection, Dr. Schacht said, 'Oswald applied while he was in the Marine Corps. He apparently hoped to get out and wanted the junior year of study abroad. His references appeared satisfactory. The final decision is up to the college authorities in Switzerland. They reported that it looked as though he would fit in.

"Dr. Schacht said that an application never is accepted unless it is accompanied by three references, including one from a clergyman, and the named individuals are asked to report their views on the applicant's academic background, character and general qualifications.

"Because the Oswald application was approved,"

Dr. ROBERT H. SCHACHT, 138 Congdon Street, Providence, Rhode Island, Minister at the First Unitarian Church, 1 Benevolent Street, Providence, Rhode Island, was interviewed and the contents of an article appearing on page 27 of "The Evening Bulletin", Providence, Rhode Island, December 4, 1903, regarding LHE HARVEY OSWALD, was reviewed with him, and he re-affirmed the correctness of its contents. In addition, he furnished the following information:

As the Chairman of the American Admissions Committee for the Albert Schweitzer College, Churwalden, Switzerland, he explained that the school was not actually a true college because it gives no degrees, and its terms are usually for one year or a shorter length of time. He said that students from all over the world attend the college and study together with the ultimate end of working for better world unity.

On Monday, December 2, 1963, he received a letter dated November 29, 1963 from Miss ERIKA WEIBER, Secretary at the Albert Schweitzer College, which reminded him that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had applied for admission to the school in the spring of 1959 for the spring term of 1960, extending from mid April to June, 1950. Also, that OSWALD had not appeared at the school in the spring of 1960, even though he had been accepted. The letter continued that at that time, OSWALD's mother had contacted the school requesting information as to the whereabouts of her son, the subject, as she had not seen him "in several months". As the letter pointed out, she was notified by the school that the school did not know where her son was, and as set out in the letter she went to her Congressman, who in turn requested the FBI to conduct an inquiry, and the inquiry was conducted at the school by the FBI through the Bern Via Chur Police Department. The letter also pointed out that the Police Department had been at the school again in recent months and had reviewed the school records regarding OSWAID.

Dr. SCHACHT advised further that from his memory, he recalled OSWALD had filled out an application for admission to the Albert Schweitzer School-in the spring of 1959 while he was still in the Marine Corps. He did not recall the date, but recalled that OSWALD gave three references, names not recalled by him, who he believed were officers of the Marine Corps. He reiterated that it was necessary that OSWALD give a clergyman as one of the references, but he did not remember who that cleric was.

He said he had never met or spoken to OSWALD at enytime and the only connection that he had with him was through his filing of the application with the school's American Admissions Committee. He did not recall any other information concerning OSWALD on his application.

He said the application and all documents in connection with OSWALD's application for admission to the college had been forwarded to the Albert Schweitzer College in Churwalden, Switzerland, and those documents should be in the files of that school.

He said the only record he had in his files was a mimeograph sheet dated May 27, 1959, which he had sent to the other members of the Committee, and which only contained a list of the names of the applicants from the United States for the school. He said OSWALD's name was on that list. He could furnish no other information regarding OSWALD or this phase of the investigation.


