Mrs. PETERMAN stated that she understood that Mrs. OSWALD purchased the house and maintained herself and her family on money obtained from her late husband's insurance. She supplemented her finances by operating a small grocery store in the front room of her house at that address.

Mrs. PETERMAN recalled that Mrs. OSWALD had three children, the oldest child a boy of approximately six years of age at the time of their moving from the Bartholomew Street residence, and who was the child of a former marriage. Her other two children, ROBERT and LEE OSWALD were about three years and one and one-half years of age respectively.

Mrs. PETERMAN did not recall the exact time of the OSWALDS' moving but it was her opinion that they lived at the Bartholomew Street residence for approximately two years.

During that time, Mrs. PETERMAN found no reason to question the loyalty and character of Mrs. OSWALD and her family and found them to be good neighbors.

Mrs. EDWARD BOUDREAUX, 831 Pauline Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised that the previous occupants of her house were a Mrs. OSWALD and her little four or five year old son and a Mrs. ROACH who lived there with her husband and took care of the little OSWALD boy. They lived in a house in the 800 block of Pauline Street, in about 1942 for a short period of time. Mrs. BOUTERIE could recall having rented the house for her mother herself. Her mother at that time wanted to get away from the children and the house on Lesseps Street for a little while and try living alone with her husband. Mrs. BOUTERIE said that her mother, Mrs. ROACH, was a very soft-hearted woman and was often helping friends and neighbors and even strangers when there was sickness or trouble. She would take them into her home and take care of them or would go to their homes and help out. Mrs. BOUTERIE could not, however, recall the name OSWALD as being familiar to her. Mr. RAY SAMUEL, Loving Enterprises, Inc., Room 1634, National Bank of Commerce Building, advised that the building containing the apartment at 126 Exchange Place is owned by his corporation. He said during the 1950s, the rental of the apartment was handled by Mr. M. ARNCLD LEHMANN, then with the New Orleans Realty Company, which has since gone out of business.

He stated that a search of his records reveals that Mr. LEHMANN had designated copies of correspondence with tenants of the apartment, for Loving Enterprises, Inc., files. Mr. SAMUEL located copies of two such letters, one dated April 15, 1955, addressed to Mrs. M. The second letter was also addressed to Mrs. M. OSWALD, same address, which advised that \$8 had been received from her on the gas bill, but she still owed \$8 and requested her to come to the office and pay it. This letter was also signed by Mr. LEHMANN, and dated May 3, 1955.

Mr. SAMUEL said he could locate no other information regarding Mrs. OSWALD and had never met her and had no know-ledge whatever of her son.

He stated further that he had no information of Mr. LEHMANN's present whereabouts and doubted very much if Mr. LEHMANN has maintained any records in this matter.

BETHLERYL CHILDREA'S RULL

Mr. BDW.N GPEWE, Resident Director, Bethlehem Children's Home, 9100 Grant, alvised that the Home was formerly known as the Evangelical Lutheran Bethlehem Orphan Asylum located at 5413 North Peters Street, New Orleans, Louisiana. Mr. GREWE advised that LEE HARVEY OSWAID and his brothers, ROBERT EDWARD OSWAID, JR., and JOHN EDWARD PIC were at the Orphan Asylum during the early 1940's. Mr. GREWE made available for inspection and copying all his records pertaining to LEE HARVEY OSWAID and his brothers but requested that the fact that LEE HARVEY OSWAID was at the Orphanage not be given any publicity if at all possible in view of the fact that he did not want the children presently at the Orphanage (Home) to know of this fact, particularly one child who has the same month and day of birth as LEE HARVEY OSWAID and who is already a problem at the Home.

Mr. GREWE made available the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting of the Evangelical Lutheran Bethlehem Orphan Asylum dated December 9, 1941, part of which concerned the OSWALDS as follows:

"A case was submitted to Pastor Nau from Redeemer Church involving a toy 10 years of age, one boy eight years and another two years. The Mother was married to a Mr. Pic who had died, later married to a Mr. Oswald who has also died. While she has some money left from insurance policies finds it necessary to seek employment and would like to have the children placed in the home. Pastor Nau was informed we could do nothing about the boy two years old, but something might be done about the other two children. Matter placed in the hands of the Committee with full power to act."

Mr. GREWE stated that the two year old boy referred to in the above minutes was LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He also made available the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting of the Evangelical Lutheran Bethlehem Orphan Asylum dated October 13, 1942, part of which concerned LEE HARVEY OSWALD as follows:

"Feb 1, 1945 4801 Victor Dallas, Texas

"My Dear Rev. Honald,

"I have just received your letter and it is apparent to me that there is a misunderstanding somewhere. My reasons for wishing to have the children return are due to the fact that when I marry I shall have to travel with my husband to such places as he may have to work. We are not able to establish a home now for the children because Mr Ekdahl's work takes him from city to city. We was only in Dallas a few months when he was transferred to New York then to Austin & now to Fort Worth. He expects shortly to be transferred to New York but then expects to be sent out again to some other locality for a few months. Under the circumstances it is impossible for us to take the children traveling, living at hotels and attempting to arrange for their schooling. For these reasons I think you will understand better why I wish to have the boys return to the home. They are more than willing to go. Since it was there home for the past few years I would rather they stay there than in some strange boarding school. I must ask you if you will please present these circumstances to the Board of Directors again and prevail upon them to reconsider their decision so that the boys may have a permanent place of adove in preference to moving them from school to school.

APPENDIX

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960 edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening in Cuba", placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuta" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. Charles A. Santos-Buch identified himself and Robert Taber as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and Taber obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the aforementioned advertisement.

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. However, during the past year this source observed there has been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that today their influence is negligible.

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that the Mational Headquarters of the FPCC is located in Room 329 at 799 Broadway, New York City. According to this source, the position of National Office Director was created in the Fall of 1962 and was filled by Vincent "Ted" Lee, who now formulates FPCC policy. This source observed Lee has followed a course of entertaining and accepting the cooperation of many other organizations including the CP and the SWP when he has felt it would be to his personal benefit as well as the FPCC's. However, Lee has indicated to this source he has no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. Lee feels the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations, but not support the Cuban revolution per se.

The CP and the SWP have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.
