**Synopsis** ROBERT KAYE borrowed \$5,000 from Mrs. ANNA MOYEN, Tulsa, Oklahoma, in August of 1963 after telling her he had an interest in a profitable business in Denver, Colorado. Mrs. ANNA MOYEN and BESSIE MOYEN stated they were not aware of any connection between ROBERT KAYE and LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

DETAILS:

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents DELMER R. EXON and JOE M. PEARSON:

AT TULSA, OKLAHOMA:

Mrs. ANNA MOYEN, an elderly widow, 1604 South Utica Avenue, stated on December 24, 1963, that she first met ROBERT KAYE in 1960 through her daughter, BESSIE MOYEN, who was then employed by the Traveler's Aid Society in Tulsa. KAYE had come to that agency for aid. He stated that he was a member of the Jewish faith and since the MOYENS were also of that faith they assisted him. ANNA and BESSIE MOYEN purchased clothing for him and he took his meals at their residence during about a ten-day period. He frequently drove ANNA MOYEN in her car when she needed to be taken somewhere. He asked her to give him a permanent job but she did not want him around as he was becoming a nuisance.

KAYE mentioned that he would like to go to Denver, Colorado, and after the MOYENS persuaded the Jewish Community Council to contribute the money for a bus ticket, he left Tulsa for Denver. About a year later KAYE called from Denver stating that he had found a job with a vending machine company.

In August, 1963, KAYE called again and stated that he was in business and was very prosperous. He stated he would like to come to Tulsa to visit the MOYENS and although they did not particularly want him to visit them, they did not know how to decline the visit.

KAYE came to Tulsa driving a 1959 station wagon. He told ANNA MOYEN that he was a partner in a large vending machine company in Denver but that the other partners were trying to oust him from the firm. He said that if he could borrow \$5,000 from ANNA MOYEN he could manage to stay in the partnership. Thereafter ANNA MOYEN loaned KAYE \$5,000 in cash and obtained from him a promissory note calling for repayment of the loan at interest over a three-year period. ANNA MOYEN exhibited the note which was dated August 28, 1963, and bore the signature "ROBERT KAYE."

KAYE also tried to trade his 1959 station wagon to BESSIE MOYEN for her 1959 Ford Thunderbird, but she declined to trade.

After obtaining the \$5,000 he left Tulsa, presumably to return to Denver, and the MOYENS heard nothing from him until sometime in October, 1963, when he telephoned and said he was sending a \$3,500 payment on the note. [Nothing has been received from him and the MOYENS have heard nothing from KAYE since that last telephone call.]

KAYE told ANNA MOYEN that he had been in a German concentration camp during World War II and that he had been wounded by the Germans. He stated that the U. S. Government had provided for his medical treatment and he was able to recover. He stated he was born in Poland and if he did anything wrong he would be deported from the United States.

ANNA MOYEN stated that KAYE never mentioned anything concerning LEE OSWALD nor did he mention the Soviet Union. She said she had never heard of LEE OSWALD prior to the assassination of President KENNEDY and certainly never contributed any money to OSWALD.

Mrs. MOYEN said she realized that she had been duped by KAYE and now realized that nearly everything he told her about himself was a lie. She stated she did not intend to take any action against KAYE because she did not want to suffer the embarrassment if the matter should become known outside her family.

Tulsa SA, OK, A  
BESSIE MOYEN, 1604 South Utica Avenue, stated on December 24, 1963, that she is presently employed by the Tulsa County Child Welfare Department. On January 13, 1960, she first met ROBERT KAYE when she was employed by the Traveler's Aid Society in Tulsa. KAYE came to that agency for aid stating that he had been traveling but had lost his luggage and had no money. He first stated he was a member of the Roman Catholic Church. When BESSIE MOYEN then suggested that he might desire to contact one of the Catholic charities, KAYE told her that he was of the Jewish faith. In view of their common religious faith, BESSIE MOYEN aided KAYE from her personal funds. She and her mother purchased clothing for KAYE and provided him with food for about a two-week period when KAYE stayed in Tulsa. They also paid for his room at the YMCA.

Trust KAYE later left Tulsa and went to Denver, Colorado. BESSIE MOYEN received a letter from him some time later in which he promised to repay her for her assistance. She wrote an answering letter telling him she considered he owed her \$60.

In August, 1963, KAYE telephoned from Denver stating he owned a profitable vending machine business. He suggested matrimony to BESSIE MOYEN and asked her to come to Denver. When she declined he stated he would come to Tulsa to visit her.

KAYE came to Tulsa in August, 1963, driving a 1959 station wagon. Upon his arrival he offered to trade his station wagon to BESSIE MOYEN for her 1959 Ford Thunderbird and offered to give her some shares of stock in his business.

While in Tulsa KAYE borrowed \$5,000 from Mrs. ANNA MOYEN. He obtained the money from Mrs. MOYEN when BESSIE MOYEN was not present and she did not learn of the loan until two days later when KAYE had left Tulsa. Since KAYE had obtained the loan in cash there was nothing she could do at that time.

On about September 20, 1963, KAYE telephoned, presumably from Denver, stating that he would be in Tulsa on October 3, 1963, and would make a \$3,500 payment on the loan. He did not appear and they have had no further contact with him.

On about October 4, 1963, a Mr. (First Name Unknown) CARLSON connected with a vending machine company in Denver, Colorado, telephoned the MOYEN residence attempting to locate ROBERT KAYE.

BESSIE MOYEN said she had never heard KAYE mention LEE OSWALD and she personally had never heard of him until the assassination of President KENNEDY. She stated she had never heard KAYE mention the Soviet Union.

BESSIE MOYEN stated that KAYE told conflicting stories concerning his background. He told of escaping from a German concentration camp when only five years old. He claimed he was taken in as a Company mascot by a U. S. Army unit in Europe during World War II and was later brought to the United States.

BESSIE MOYEN said she is convinced ROBERT KAYE has a psychopathic personality and is a menace to society. She stated that during her acquaintance with him she noted he had a vivid imagination and told stories which were completely unbelievable.

Enclosed are copies of two letters written by GALI CLARK, 4312 Selkirk Drive West, Fort Worth, Texas, on June 23, 1962 and November 27, 1963 to her brother MICHEL SCHERBATOFF, of Nice, France, concerning her acquaintance with LEE HARVEY OSWALD. These letters indicate that she was contacted by OSWALD at the suggestion of an employee of the Texas State Employment Agency since she (Mrs. CLARK) speaks Russian and OSWALD desired to establish a contact for his Russian wife who was unable to speak English. These letters relate Mrs. CLARK's limited contact with OSWALD. These letters were furnished by ALAIN MONTARRAS, of the Direction de la Surveillance du Territoire (DST), French domestic counterespionage service, on December 11, 1963. They were furnished to the DST by Mr. SCHERBATOFF. The Bureau may wish to translate these letters.

George Douhe a passe la nuit chez nous, le recevoir est toujours tres agreable, he is the perfect guest. Ce matin avant son depart nous sommes alles nous baigner a la piscine, Natasha Krassovska qui a passe la nuit chez Margo est venue nous rejoindre avec cette derniere.

J'ai ete tres embetees par un coup de telephone que j'ai recu Jeudi. Un certain Oswald m'a telephone voulant nous connaitre afin que sa femme russe puisse parler sa langue natale. Oswald a ete dans tous les journaux il y a 3 ans et de nouveau dernièrement, c'etait dans Newsweek et peut-etre dans Time. C'est un americain qui, il y a 3 ans, apres avoir termine son service militaire dans les Marines est alle en Russie et la peu apres dans un geste dramatique a remis son passeport americain a l'Ambassade Americaine en declarant qu'il ne voulait plus retourner aux USA. Par la suite il a du changer d'avis et il est de retour a Ft. Worth avec femme et bebe. A l'employment agency comme il se plaignait que sa femme etait tres seule ne parlant pas l'anglais une employee stupide lui a donne mon nom et celui de Mr. Gregory (ex Gregorieff). J'ai pris son numero de telephone mais je ne lui ai pas encore telephone et je ne suis pas si je vais le faire. Tous nos amis me disent de ne pas le faire, qu'il doit etre surveille par les FBI ou que peut-etre meme il travaille pour un des 2 cotes, et que de toute facon il doit etre desequilibre. Qu'en pensez-vous ?



Le pauvre fils de Marie-Louise va peut-être perdre sa jambe. Un cancer très probable à la suite d'une chute, Mardi ils recevront le verdict. Ce pauvre garçon a 14 ans travaillait encore il y a quelque jours comme newspaper boy se levant à 3 heures du matin et marchant des blocks et des blocks. Tout ceci pour aider à payer les dettes de sa mère. Finalement il n'en pouvait plus de douleurs et ils l'ont pris chez le docteur. Maintenant Marie-Louise sanglote en disant "Le bon Dieu m'envoie cette punition pour ce que j'ai fait". Ce pauvre gosse ne se plaignait jamais mais il avait commence à boiter depuis un bon moment. Ses parents sont d'une négligence criminelle.

En esperant recevoir une lettre de vous je vous embrasse bien affectueusement.

Bien cher Michel,

Je te remercie de ta dernière lettre et je m'excuse d'être restée si longtemps sans t'écrire. Nous avons été absolument bouleversés par tous les événements. La mort du Président était déjà tragique mais avoir connu l'assassin était particulièrement horrible.

Je suppose que vous vous rappelez de mes conversations à son sujet lors de mon dernier voyage en France. A tout hasard je vais vous rafraîchir la mémoire. Avant mon départ pour Nice en Juin un des journaux ici avait un long article sur son retour à Ft. Worth avec sa femme russe. Quelque temps après je reçois un coup de téléphone, "This is Lee Oswald", puis un silence, et il m'explique qu'il était allé au Texas Employment Office pour chercher un job et qu'on lui a donné mon nom comme parlant russe, et il continue en me parlant de sa femme qui ne parle pas anglais. Bref il veut nous rencontrer. J'étais complètement prise au dépourvu et je lui réponds que mon mari n'est pas à la maison et que je ne connais pas ses plans pour le week-end, and tell him I'll call him back. Après ceci, grands conciliabules chez nous et nous ne téléphonons pas pendant un jour ou deux. Nous arrivons à un Samedi ou Dimanche (car les Collet etient chez nous) et nous en reparlons. Max dit tout de suite qu'il refuse d'aller chez eux (chez son frère) mais s'ils veulent venir chez nous pendant que les Collet sont là d'accord, si les Collet sont d'accord. Donc je téléphone, et tout fini en queue de poisson, il veut que nous allions chez lui et ne veut pas aller chez nous "It's inconvenient". Donc tout est fini, plus de nouvelles, des semaines passent et je viens en France.

Monsieur Gregory (ex Gregorieff, ingénieur, qui vient de Sibirie) a reçu a la meme époque le meme coup de telephone que moi, also referred by the Texas Employment Office (He went to see them with his son). Peut-être vous vous demandez pour quoi le T.E.O. La tante de Max a travaillé la-bas 20 ans et la soeur de Max y travaillait a ce moment la et y travaille encore. Quant a Gregory la femme qui lui a donne nos noms était son eleve de russe au Public Library. Intre temps Gregory me retelephone et me dit, apres son entrevue, "Gali, they are really very nice people", famous last words ! But we still do not see them. While I was gone to Nice, Gregory invites them to dinner or lunch and invites also George Douhe and Anna Meller and her husband.

After my return from France George calls me one day to say he is coming to Ft. Worth with Anna to bring des vêtements usages a Marina Oswald et des choses pour le bebe and would I meet them at the Oswald apartment, they are poverty stricken. I dropped by met Marina but not her husband who was at work. Apres j'ai revu Marina chez Elena Hall chez qui elle habitait. At that time already everybody was sorry for Marina, il était brutal. Oswald was in Dallas looking for a job. Peu apres Elena a eu un accident de voiture et a été hospitalisé environs une semaine. C'est pendant ce temps que je me suis occupé de Marina qui était toujours chez Elena mais sans voiture et ne parlant pas l'anglais, je la conduisais au grocery store, faire des courses et a l'hôpital voir Elena. Un Dimanche, Elena était toujours a l'hôpital, elle nous a invité a déjeuner (toujours chez Elena) et c'est ce jour-la que nous avons rencontré Oswald. Il était venu voir sa femme et son bébé de Dallas. Elle a aussi invité John Hall (le mari d'Elena, mais a ce moment ils étaient divorcés, ils se sont remariés depuis) qui était en voie de reconciliation avec sa femme. Il a parlé surtout avec Max et John de la vie en Russie Sovietique. Puis Marina a rejoint son mari a Dallas, ceci apres le retour d'Elena de l'hôpital, et nous les avons plus jamais revu. Ceci était il y a un an, au mois de Nov. dernier.

Tout ceci est bien desagrecable a present mais qui aurait pu imaginer ceci. Je dois avouer que j'avais peur qu'il tue Marina. Ses brutalites se sont succedees a Dallas ou elle a recu parait-il plusieurs black eyes et a ete recueillie par Anna Meller, les Vohrenschildt et les Ford. At that time I must say it seemed the right thing to help her.

Je vous remercie mille fois pour "Monsieur Blot" recu hier. Quand au disque de Piaf, celui que j'ai est le "Recital 1961" et les chansons sont tout a fait differentes de celles que tu me cites. Merci infiniment de vouloir me l'envoyer. Merci aussi pour des magazines recus derniere-ment.

Comment va Maman ? Je me fais beaucoup de soucis a son sujet et j'espere que toute cette histoire ne va pas trop la tourmenter. Tiens-moi au courant. Quel est ce malaise ?

June 23

Very dear Michel:

I thank you for your card from Paris. I suppose that by now you must be in Nice. I hope this trip has helped you both. To be able to see the children again must have been a great joy.

George Bouhe has spent the night at our house. It is always very pleasant to play host to him. He is the perfect guest. This morning, before his departure, we all went for a swim in the pool. Natasha Krassovska, who spent the night at Margo's, joined us together with Margo herself.

I was very much annoyed by a telephone call I received on Thursday. It was one Oswald, who telephoned me in order to become acquainted with us so that his Russian wife may speak her native tongue. Oswald's name was in all the papers about three years ago and then, again, quite recently. It was in Newsweek and, perhaps, Time. He is an American who, three years ago, after completing his military service with the Marines, went to Russia and, shortly thereafter, with a dramatic gesture, gave up his American passport in the American Embassy declaring that he did not want to return to the U. S. A. any more. Later, he must have changed his mind because he returned to Fort Worth with his wife and baby. At the employment agency, since he had complained that his wife was very much alone and that she was unable to speak English, one of the stupid employees there gave him my name and that of Mr. Gregory (formerly Gregorieff). I took down his telephone number, but I have not yet called him; I do not know what I am going to do. All our friends tell us not to bother with him; he must be under surveillance by the FBI and perhaps he is working for one of the two sides; and, at any rate, he must be mentally deranged. What do you think?

The poor son of Marie-Louise will perhaps lose his leg. It is cancer, which very probably developed as a result of a fall. On Tuesday, they will receive the verdict. This poor boy is 14 years old and was working, still a few days ago, as a newspaper boy getting up at three in the morning and walking blocks after blocks. All of this, in order to help to pay off his mother's debts. Finally, he could not stand the pain any more and they took him to a doctor. Now, Marie-Louise is sobbing and keeps saying: "The Lord sent me this punishment for what I did!" This poor child never complained, but he had started to limp a long time ago. His parents are guilty of criminal negligence.

Letter dated November 27, 1963

November 27, 1963

Very dear Michel:

I thank you for your last letter and apologize for not having written to you in such a long time. We have been absolutely upset by all the events. The death of the President was tragic enough, but having known the assassin was particularly horrible.

I suppose that you remember my conversations on the subject of this man when I took my last trip to France. At any rate, I will refresh your memory. Before my departure for Nice in June, one of the newspapers here carried a long article about his return to Fort Worth with his Russian wife. Some time later, I received a telephone call: "This is Lee Oswald," then silence; then, he let me know that he was at the Texas Employment Office looking for a job and that he had been given my name as one who speaks Russian. He went on to speak of his wife who does not speak English. In short, he indicated he wanted to meet us. I was completely taken aback and replied to him that my husband was not at home and that I did not know his plans for the week-end and told him I would call him back. After this, we held a great many councils between ourselves; but we did not call him for one or two days. A Saturday or a Sunday rolled around (the Collets were at our house) and we spoke about it again. Max right away said that he refused to go to them (his brother's) but if they wanted to come to our house while the Collets were there, he would be agreeable, if the Collets were agreeable. So, I telephone and all winds up in a fish tail: he wants us to go to his house and does not want to come to our house: "It's inconvenient." Therefore, it was all over, nothing happened. The weeks went by and I went to France.

Mr. Gregory (Gregorieff, an engineer from Siberia) received at the same time a telephone call similar to the one I received, also "referred" by the Texas Employment Office (he went to see them with his son). Perhaps, you wonder why the T.E.O. Max's aunt worked there for 20 years and Max's sister was working there at the time, and is still working there. As for Gregory, the woman who gave him our names was a Russian

student of his at the Public Library. In the meantime, Gregory called me again and, after his interview, told me: "Gali, they are really very nice people!"; famous last words! But we still do not see them. While I was gone to Nice, Gregory invites them to dinner or lunch and invites also George Bouhe and Anna Meller and her husband.

After my return from France, George calls me one day to say he is coming to Fort Worth with Anna to bring some used clothes for Marina Oswald and a few things for the baby, and would I meet them at the Oswald apartment, they are poverty-stricken. I dropped by, met Marina; not her husband who was at work. Later I saw Marina again at Elena Hall's, where she was living. At that time, everybody was already sorry for Marina. He was a brute. Oswald was in Dallas looking for a job. Shortly thereafter, Elena had an automobile accident and was hospitalized for about a week. It was during this period that I took care of Marina, who was still at Elena's, but without a car and unable to speak English. I would take her to the grocery store, to take courses, and to the hospital to see Elena. I must confess that I found her very cute at the time. One Sunday, Elena was still at the hospital, she invited us to lunch (still at Elena's). And it was on this day that we met Oswald. He had come to see his wife and his baby from Dallas. She also invited John Hall (Elena's husband, but at the time they were divorced; they remarried later) who was in the process of seeking a reconciliation with his wife. He spoke above all with Max and John concerning life in Soviet Russia. Then, Marina joined her husband in Dallas; this happened after the return of Elena from the hospital and we never saw them again. This happened about a year ago last November.

All of this is very disagreeable now, but who could have imagined this. I must confess that I was afraid that he might kill Marina. Episodes of his brutality occurred in Dallas many times and it seems that she suffered several black eyes and was given hospitality by Anna Meller, the Mohrenschildds and the Fords. At that time, I must say, it seemed the right thing to help her.

I thank you a thousand times for "Mr. Blot" which was received yesterday. As for the Piaf record, the one that I have is the "1961 Recital" and the songs are completely different from those you have mentioned. Many, many thanks for offering to send it to me. Thank you also for the magazines that I have received lately.

There is attached hereto an article appearing in The Dallas Times Herald, Sunday, Dec. 22, 1963, reflecting that an Agent wearing the robe and face mask of a doctor waited in vain at LEE HARVEY OSWALD's bedside for a deathbed confession.

The following is submitted for the information of the Bureau in the event any inquiries are received. Immediately following the report that OSWALD had been shot at the Police Station, I directed Agents to proceed to Parkland Hospital and establish liaison in order to insure that if OSWALD regained consciousness and desired to give a deathbed confession, that we would be in a position to take the same. SA CHARLES T. BROWN, JR. and SA WALLACE R. HEITMAN made arrangements with Dr. MOURY SOLTES and through him with Dr. TOM SHIRES, Professor of Medicine at Southwest Medical School and chief of surgery, to be available in the event OSWALD regained consciousness. In order to save time and be immediately available, these Agents did don operating clothing and took positions outside the operating room. OSWALD, however, died before regaining consciousness.

# 'Doctor' Waited In Vain

An FBI agent, wearing the robe and face mask of a doctor, waited in vain at Lee Harvey Oswald's bedside for a deathbed confession that never came, The Times Herald learned Saturday.

Oswald never regained consciousness and the words that would have removed all doubt once and for all as to whether Oswald killed President John F. Kennedy were never spoken.

The agent was on hand at Parkland Hospital on Nov. 24 during the one hour and 35 minutes doctors worked to save the life of the 24-year-old avowed Marxist who was felled by a pistol shot fired by Jack Ruby in the basement of City Hall.

Sources said the agent never left the side of the accused assassin while doctors worked on Oswald in the emergency room and later performed emergency surgery.

Oswald reportedly moaned and groaned several times, but no comprehensible words were ever spoken. Doctors describes his sounds as "death gasps."

He was brought to Parkland at 11:32 a.m. by ambulance and was pronounced dead following surgery in a second floor surgical suite at 1:07 p.m.

Oswald, during the 48 hours he was in police custody, never admitted the shooting of the President or Police officer J. D. Tippit.

On 12/1/63, FRANK BARNES volunteered the following information concerning JACK LEON RUBY and furnished the following voluntary signed statements:



"November 25, 1963  
Portland, Oregon

"I, Helen Harper, make the following voluntary statement to James Allen Benbrook and William S. Brown, who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I have been advised that this statement may be used in a court of law.

"For the last seven years I have been a stripper and my stage name is Honey Harper. I am 38 years of age having been born April 5, 1925 at Winston County, Alabama. I presently reside at the Comodora Hotel, Portland, Oregon.

"While at Des Moines, Iowa in December, 1961, I received a booking through the Mike Bluff Agency, St. Louis, Mo. to go to the Carousel in Dallas, Texas. I started to work for Jack Ruby at the Carousel, Dallas, about two days after Christmas, 1961 on a week to week contract. After about two and one half weeks of working for Ruby I quit, mainly because JACK RUBY was always getting upset, and on some occasions would bawl out another employee or bawl me out, and then turn around and apologize for his actions. Because of these actions I thought RUBY was kooky and changeable.

"During this period of time while I was at the Carousel the master of ceremonies and comic was Fobby O'Day and on a couple of occasions in the middle of his act, RUBY would go up to the raised stage and bawl him out for one thing or another and then later apologize, but would then turn around and do the same thing again.

"I have not seen or heard from Jack Ruby since the time I left the Carousel in January, 1962.

"I have read this this one page typewritten statement, and it is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

"I was born March 8, 1926, in Muncie, Indiana.

"When I was ~~sixteen~~ <sup>dead 1957-1962</sup> years old I left school and took a job with Sam Jaffe as a jeweler apprentice. His store was located on Walnut Street between Jackson and Adams Streets in Muncie, Indiana. There was a group of men in the neighborhood who talked to me about the Communist Party and about Russia and I believe that they were members of the Communist Party. They were Phillip Jasser, of Jasser's Clothing Store on Mulberry Street; Lawson Jaffe, who owned Lawson's Jewelers on Walnut Street; and Morton Standt, who owned Star's Jewellery Store on Jackson Street, and he also owned Berger's Jewelers on Walnut Street.

"About six months to a year after I started work for Sam Jaffe a group of people came down from Chicago and I believe they were going to hold a meeting in Muncie. The group I have named were going to attend the meeting and I believe the meeting had something to do with the Communist Party or with Russia. It was to be held in a union hall upstairs from the store where I worked or in the Jewish meeting hall. The son-in-law of Sam Jaffe was one of the people who came from Chicago and he brought with him a man who was introduced to me as Jack Rubenstein (ph).

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"Last night, I saw the picture of Jack Ruby on television and at that time I did not think any more about it. Today while I was at work I came to me suddenly that Jack Ruby is the same person who was introduced to me in Muncie, Indiana, as Jack Rubenstein.

"As I mentioned before, Rubenstein came to Muncie, Indiana, twice while I was in the Navy. Both times he came to San Jaffe before I went in the Navy. Both times they were there to attend a meeting with the group that talked to me about the Communist Party. I recall that Jack Rubenstein was in show business in Chicago as he showed me a few card tricks and reading from a folded paper something I had written. He also brought with him a very tall black suitcase which was his show business.

"I went in the Navy on 6-21-46 and was discharged on 6-21-46. I then went back to my job with my wife.

"Shortly after my first boy was born in June 1947, there was another meeting held and Jack Rubenstein came again from Chicago with the assistance of Sam Jaffe. This meeting was held in the union hall above the Jaffe store. The next morning after the meeting I was sent on to the union hall to get a list that had been taken up there from the store. Up to the hall I had a copy of names on a table. There were two typewritten copies of names. The first name as I remember was Sam Jaffe, then Sam Jaffe, ~~Harold~~ ~~13201~~, ~~Morton~~ ~~13201~~, ~~Harold~~ ~~13201~~, and ~~Jack~~ ~~Rubenstein~~. I took this list of names to the Muncie Police Department. He said he would turn the list over to the FBI.

"Tonight I have been shown the picture of Jack Ruby in the Oregon Journal, 11-25-63, and this is a very good likeness of the person who was introduced to me as Jack Rubenstein. He appears older and the hair line is a little higher. I have also been shown the picture of Jack Ruby on page twelve of the Oregonian, 11-25-63, and this picture does not look like Jack Rubenstein. I have also been shown the picture of Jack Ruby in the San Francisco Examiner - page D, 11-25-63, and this picture looks like Jack Rubenstein except the hair line is higher and he appears heavier.

"After the meeting when I got the list I never saw Jack Rubenstein again.

"I never saw any membership cards of the people who talked to me about the Communist Party and they did not directly say

they were members but they told me I should join the Communist Party and 'get on the right side of the fence before it was too late.'

"The last time I saw Jack Rubenstein I would describe him as follows: 30 to 35 years of age, height about 5'10" to 6', 165 to 175 pounds, no scars or marks or anything unusual I can remember but he almost always wore a hat.

"When the son-in-law of Sam Jaffe and Jack Rubenstein traveled from Chicago to attend the meetings I think they came by auto but I do not remember seeing it.

"I have read the above statement & to the best of my memory it is true.

FEHRENBACH advised that SAM JAFFE died in 1959 or 1960 at Miami Beach, Florida, but was buried in Chicago where FEHRENBACH believed his widow still lives. FEHRENBACH said that SAM JAFFE had two daughters, CHARLOTTE and another, name unknown, who was married to the above son-in-law. FEHRENBACH believed that the PAZOLS and STANLEY are still in Miami where the PAZOLS once operated a jewelry store at Jackson and Wall St Streets. FEHRENBACH believed that LAWSON JAFFE sold his store in Miami and went to Dayton, Ohio, about ten years ago and that JAFFE is deceased.

FEHRENBACH stated that in addition to serving in the Navy, with honorable discharge, he also served in the Korean War, 1950 to 1951, with honorable discharge. He married REVILIS SWALLOW, a native Miami girl, on July 27, 1946.

J. PAT DOYLE, 1107 SE 122nd Avenue, Portland, Oregon, advised that he is employed in electrical construction work for the Charles T. Parker Construction Co. in Portland. In August, 1963, he attended an electrical contractors' convention in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was accompanied by MATT WILSON, who also is in the electrical construction business in Portland. Both men were accompanied to New Orleans by their wives and two children.

At about 4 o'clock in the afternoon of Friday, August 9, 1963, Mr. DOYLE, Mr. WILSON and the young son of each were walking on Canal Street in New Orleans, approximately a quarter of a block behind Mrs. DOYLE, Mrs. WILSON and their two daughters. As they reached a point approximately in the middle of a block, some five blocks toward the Mississippi River from the Jung Hotel, they observed two young men who were carrying signs which bore pro-Cuban inscriptions. They had leaflets in their hands. One of the men wore on his front a yellow or orange-colored sign which bore as part of its inscription, the words, "Viva la Fidel."

As Mr. DOYLE, Mr. WILSON and their two sons reached the scene, a group of persons who appeared to be Cubans took issue with the two demonstrators and almost immediately, police officers arrived and prevented trouble. After a short discussion, the demonstrators were placed in a patrol car by the officers and taken from the scene. During the argument, a placard carried by the demonstrator not wearing the sign was smashed and the leaflets were torn from the hands of the men and scattered on the sidewalk. The pieces of the placard were placed in the patrol car when the men were taken away.

Motion pictures of the incident were taken by JIM DOYLE, 14-year-old son of Mr. DOYLE.

Following the assassination of President KENNEDY, Mr. DOYLE and other members of his family viewed the film taken in New Orleans and were agreed that the pictures of the young man who wore the yellow-colored sign strongly resembled photographs they had seen of LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

Making the trip with them were their two young children, JIM, age 14, and SHARON, age 11.

Accompanying the DOYLES to New Orleans were Mr. and Mrs. MATT WILSON of Portland and their two children, MARSHA, age 13, and DONALD, age 11, Mr. WILSON attended the convention with Mr. DOYLE.

On the afternoon of Friday, August 9, 1963, at about four o'clock, the two families were walking along Canal Street in New Orleans, some five blocks toward the Mississippi River from the Jung Hotel. Mrs. DOYLE and Mrs. WILSON, with their daughters, were walking approximately a quarter of a block in front of Mr. DOYLE, Mr. WILSON and the boys. About the middle of the block, they passed two young men who were carrying signs, which bore pro-Cuban wording. One of the men was carrying a placard on a stick and the other wore on his front, a yellow or orange colored sign which, as part of its wording, said, "Viva la Fidel." The two men also were carrying leaflets in their hands.

Shortly after the women passed these men, a disturbance started when other individuals, who had the appearance of Cubans, started arguing with the demonstrators. The placard was smashed, and the leaflets scattered on the sidewalk. Police officers soon appeared, however, and prevented further trouble. They also placed the two young men in a patrol car, along with the pieces of the placard, and took them from the scene.

During the difficulty, motion pictures were taken of the incident by young JIM DOYLE.

Since the assassination of President KENNEDY, Mrs. DOYLE and her family viewed the pictures taken by her son and had agreed that the demonstrator who wore the yellow-colored sign strongly resembled photos they had seen of JACK HARVEY OSWALD.

The sign bore pro-Cuban wording, including the words, "Viva la Castro" or something similar. There were other words which favored Cuba, but which Mr. WILSON could not remember.

About the time that this young man was observed a group of individuals who appeared to be Cubans approached and took issue with him. Police officers soon arrived on the scene and prevented further trouble, but not before the leaflets were torn from the man's hand and scattered on the sidewalk.

Mr. WILSON seemed to recall that during the difficulty, a placard on a stick was leaning against a light post nearby. He could not recall any of the wording thereon.

The young demonstrator eventually was placed in a police patrol car and taken from the scene.
