

ERIC ROGERS, 4907 Magazine Street, advised that he saw OSWALD leave his apartment at 4905 Magazine Street on the evening of the day following the day that Mrs. OSWALD and baby left in a station wagon. He could not recall the specific date or the day of the week but he said he remembers seeing OSWALD loading up clothes and household effects in the station wagon one day and that the following day Mrs. OSWALD and the baby departed in the station wagon driven by a lady who had two small children. ROGERS recalled that he paid particular attention to the fact that everything was very quiet in the OSWALD apartment the night after Mrs. OSWALD left and that he, ROGERS, wondered if OSWALD had also gone. He said that on the following evening just before dark he saw OSWALD run quickly through the gate in the fence leading to the OSWALD apartment and run toward the bus stop at the corner of Magazine and Upperline Streets. He said the bus driver saw OSWALD running and waited at the corner of Magazine and Upperline Streets for him. OSWALD crossed Magazine Street and ran around the back end of the bus and then up to the front of the bus on the opposite side to the entrance door. The bus was headed toward Canal Street.

ROGERS said that he noted that OSWALD was carrying two suitcases which he described as rectangular in shape and ABJISIONIA approximately eighteen inches long. He said both suitcases were the same size and that they appeared to be black in color. He wondered to himself how anyone who had been out of work for so long a period of time could afford to have such good luggage.

ROGERS places the time which he observed OSWALD leave his apartment at approximately 7:00 PM. He said that it was just before dark and that the street lights had not yet been turned on.

He said he noted that the station wagon was a late model one and in good condition and what made him notice it was the fact that it was loaded with clothing and household furnishings. He recalled that a baby bed or crib was tied on top of the station wagon. He said that he did not recall the number of the license. He was unable to recall whether a man or a woman was driving the station wagon at the time it blocked his bus. He was also unable to state the time of day or the day of the week when this happened.

EARL X HINDERSON

EARL SPENCER ANDERSON, Badge 171, residence address 6554 Jefferson Highway (Harahan), New Orleans 23, Louisiana, advised that he knew where the OSWALD apartment was located at 4905 Magazine Street, near Upperline. He stated that he did not recognize a photograph of OSWALD and cannot recall seeing him. He recalled seeing a station wagon parked in front of the OSWALD apartment for one or two . days several months ago. He cannot state when he saw the station wagon, but remembered that it was parked in front of the OSWALD apartment for one or two days. He further recalled one evening on a trip toward Canal Street where he had stopped at the corner of Magazine and Upperline Streets to pick up a passenger. He observed a man walking on the lake side of Magazine Street at the corner of Upperline, carrying two suitcases and walking toward the bus. ANDERSON said he waited for this individual to get on the bus and that this person asked if he could put his two suitcases by the driver's seat. This individual had one small suitcase which he placed alongside the bus driver's seat and a larger suitcase which he placed in the space behind the bus driver's seat. After this, individual paid his fare, he inquired as to the best route to the Greyhound Bus Station. ANDERSON said that he told him that he should stay on the Magazine bus until he got to Canal Street at which point he should transfer to a Canal streetcar going toward the lake. When this streetcar got to Elks Place, he instructed the individual to get off the streetcar and transfer to a Tulane bus at Elks Place and Canal Street which would take him to the Greyhound Bus Station, which is located on Tulane Avenue and South Claiborne Avenue. ANDERSON was unable to describe the color of the suitcases but recalled that they, although they were not new, were not in a dilapidated condition. They bore no tags or stickers to the best of his recollection. He said the small suitcase was rectangular shaped piece of luggage approximately 22 inches long. The larger suitcase was the same shape as the smaller one and it was about 29 inches long.

ANDERSON could not describe this individual except to state that he spoke in a pleasant voice and that

Mr. J. D. FUCHS, Manager, Winn-Dixie Store Number 1425, 4303 Magazine Street, advised as follows:

Store hours on September 24 and 25, 1963, were from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. On both dates, cash registers were cut off at 4:00 p.m. or within a few minutes thereafter to recap the days work. At the time of cut off, checks on hand in each register were removed along with the cash register tapes. The checks were then listed in total on adding machine tapes to prepare for deposit in the bank on the following day. Such deposits were picked up at the store just before 8:00 a.m. on these days and on September 26, 1963, for delivery to the main office of the National Bank of Commerce.

A deposit of \$1,552.33 was credited to their account on September 26, 1963, by the National Bank of Commerce. Any check deposited at the bank on September 26, 1963, would have been cashed at the store between 4:00 p.m., September 24, and 4:00 p.m., September 25. The adding machine tapes listing the checks included in the deposit were destroyed after approximately one week, and the cash register tapes showing details of transactions were destroyed within one month.

He viewed copy of Warrant Number G459698, issued by State Comptroller of Public Accounts, Austin, Texas, dated September 23, 1963, in the amount of \$33, and made payable to L. H. OSWALD, P. O. Box 30061, New Orleans, Louisiana. This warrant bears an endorsement by LEE H. OSWALD, 4707 Magazine. MR. FUCHS stated this item was okayed by him for cashing and was actually handled by Mrs. THELMA FISHER, Cashier Number 3. He noted that the warrant is endorsed for deposit to the account of Winn-Dixie Store Number 1425 through Cashier Number 3. He has no recollection of OSWALD or his wife, and has no recollection of having approved the warrant for payment.

The following investigation was conducted at New Orleans, Louisiana by SA G. MYRYWIN ALDERSON on December 11, 1963:

A review of the City Directories for the City of New Orleans, at the New Orleans Public Library, 219 Loyola Avenue failed to reflect that Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD resided at 914 Hennessey Street and 1661 Paul Morphy Street during the period from 1935 to 1945.

The City Directory for 1942 disclosed that Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD did not reside at 111 Sherwood Borest Drive. The Directory disclosed that THOMAS TEACH resided at 111 Sherwood Forest Drive in 1942. It was noted that CHARLES MURRET, wife LILLIAN, resided at 119 Sherwood Forest Drive in 1942. Mrs. LILLIAN MURRET is known to be the sister of Mrs. MARGUERITE OSWALD.
