 OWEN DEJANOVICH, STUDENT, ARIZONA STATE COLLEGE,
 FLAGSTAFF, ARIZONA, ADVISED HE FIRST MET LEE HARVEY OSWALD
 AT A SIX WEEKS RADAR SCHOOL IN BILOXIE, MISSISSIPPI DURING
 MAY AND JUNE, FIFTYSEVEN. HE ADVISED THAT IN AUGUST, FIFTYSEVEN
 HE AND OSWALD WERE PART OF A ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY MAN
 OVERSEAS DRAFT AND OSWALD WENT TO A MARINE BASE AT ATSUGI, JAPAN
 WHILE DEJANOVICH WENT TO BASE AT IWAKUNI, JAPAN. THE NEXT
 TIME HE SAW OSWALD WAS DECEMBER FIFTYEIGHT WHEN THEY CAME BACK
 TO U. S. TOGETHER IN A ONE HUNDRED MAN DRAFT. IN JANUARY
 FIFTYNINE HE AGAIN MET OSWALD AT MARINE BASE IN SANTA ANA
 CALIFORNIA AND WAS IN SAME SECTION WITH OSWALD UNTIL AUGUST
 FIFTYNINE, FOLLOWING WHICH BOTH DISCHARGED EARLY SEPTEMBER.
 STATED HE NEVER SAW OSWALD AGAIN.

DEJANOVICH STATED HE KNEW NOTHING ABOUT OSWALDS BACKGROUND,
 WHERE HE WAS FROM, OR ANYTHING ABOUT HIS EDUCATION. HE ADVISED

OSWALD HAD NO INTEREST IN ATHLETICS, HE ALWAYS STAYED ON
LIBERTY BY HIMSELF, WAS ALWAYS IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES, AND
NEVER STAYED AROUND BASE. OSWALD NEVER HAD ANYTHING TO DO
WITH ANYONE ELSE IN THEIR GROUP. DEJANOVICH STATED HE NEVER
HAD ANY DISCUSSIONS OF ANY KIND WITH OSWALD AND STATED OSWALD
ACTUALLY WORKED ON A DIFFERENT SHIFT THAN HE WORKED. STATED
HE HEARD OSWALD, WHILE IN JAPAN, HAD SHOT HIMSELF IN ELBOW
WITH PISTOL IN ATTEMPT TO GET DISCHARGE. HE ADVISED HE
KNEW NOTHING ABOUT OSWALDS ABILITY WITH A RIFLE. HE RECALLED
WHILE AT SANTA ANA OSWALD RECEIVED A RUSSIAN PAPER IN MAIL
AND VARIOUS OF THE MEN QUOTE KIDDED UNQUOTE OSWALD ABOUT HIS
RUSSIAN SPEAKING ABILITY.

DEJANOVICH IDENTIFIED THE MARINE NICKNAMED BEEZER AS
BEING HENRY J. ROUSSELLE AND STATED HE ONLY KNEW THAT ROUSSELLE
WAS FROM LOUISIANA AND WAS FROM A COAST TOWN ON GULF OF MEXICO,
HE STATED THAT NAME ROSE SOUNDS FAMILIAR AND BELIEVES ROSE
IS WOMAN ROUSSELLE SAID WAS HIS AUNT AND WAS WOMAN WHO HAD
BEEN AN AIRLINE HOSTESS AND WHO HAD AT LEAST ONE DATE WITH
OSWALD BECAUSE OF HER ABILITY TO SPEAK RUSSIAN AND OSWALDS
INTEREST IN RUSSIAN.

DEJANOVICH ADVISED HE DID NOT KNOW ADDRESSES OF ANY
OTHER MEN IN OUTFIT WHO MIGHT REMEMBER OSWALD BUT FURNISHED
NAMES OF PAUL HICKEY AND PAUL MURPHY, BOTH FROM MASSACHUSETTS
AND A SHERMAN COOLEY, PHONETIC, FROM LAKE CHARLES, LOUISIANA.

EARL SPENCER ANDERSON, bus driver, New Orleans Public Service Co., could not identify photograph of OSWALD and cannot recall ever seeing OSWALD. ANDERSON states he does not know where OSWALD's apartment at 4905 Magazine located and could not state when, but recalled several months ago seeing station wagon parked in front of apartment for one or two days. ANDERSON recalled that during one evening trip towards Canal Street, he stopped at corner of Magazine and Upper Line Streets to pick up passenger carrying two suitcases. Passenger placed smaller suitcase alongside bus driver's seat and placed larger suitcase behind bus driver's seat. After paying fare, passenger inquired as to best route to Greyhound station. ANDERSON could not describe passenger. Other bus drivers interviewed, but could furnish no information, except JERRY TRACEY, who recalled on one occasion about 2 or 3 months ago, observing a station wagon backing out of driveway located next to OSWALD's apartment. Station wagon observed loaded with clothing, household furnishings and that a baby bed or crib tied to top of vehicle. Investigation determined that unemployment compensation check payable to OSWALD cashed sometime after 3:00 A.M., 9/25/63 at First Dixie Store, 4303 Magazine Street. OSWALD's mother, MARGUERITE C. ERIC ROGERS, 4907 Magazine Street, advised that he saw OSWALD leave his apartment at 4905 Magazine Street on the evening of the day following the day that Mrs. OSWALD and baby left in a station wagon. He could not recall the specific date of the day of the week but he said he remembers seeing OSWALD loading up clothes and household effects in the station wagon one day and that the following day Mrs. OSWALD and the baby departed in the station wagon driven by a lady who had two small children. ROGERS recalled that he paid particular attention to the fact that everything was very quiet in the OSWALD apartment the night after Mrs. OSWALD left and that he, ROGERS, wondered if OSWALD had also gone. He said that on the following evening just before dark he saw OSWALD run quickly through the gate in the fence leading to the OSWALD apartment and run toward the bus stop at the corner of Magazine and Upperline Streets. He said the bus driver saw OSWALD running and waited at the corner of Magazine and Upperline Streets for him. OSWALD crossed Magazine Street and ran around the back end of the bus and then up to the front of the bus on the opposite side to the entrance door. The bus was headed toward Canal Street.

ROGERS said that he noted that OSWALD was carrying two suitcases which he described as rectangular in shape and approximately eighteen inches long. He said both suitcases were the same size and that they appeared to be black in color. He wondered to himself how anyone who had been out of work for so long a period of time could afford to have such good luggage.

ROGERS places the time which he observed OSWALD leave his apartment at approximately 7:00 PM. He said that it was just before dark and that the street lights had not yet been turned on.

EARL SPENCER ANDERSON, Badge 171, residence address 6554 Jefferson Highway (Harahan), New Orleans 23, Louisiana, advised that he knew where the OSWALD apartment was located at 4905 Magazine Street, near Upperline. He stated that he did not recognize a photograph of OSWALD and cannot recall seeing him. He recalled seeing a station wagon parked in front of the OSWALD apartment for one or two days several months ago. He cannot state when he saw the station wagon, but remembered that it was parked in front of the OSWALD apartment for one or two days. He further recalled one evening on a trip toward Canal Street where he had stopped at the corner of Magazine and Upperline Streets to pick up a passenger. He observed a man walking on the lake side of Magazine Street at the corner of Upperline, carrying two suitcases and walking toward the bus. ANDERSON said he waited for this individual to get on the bus and that this person asked if he could put his two suitcases by the driver's seat. This individual had one small suitcase which he placed alongside the bus driver's seat and a larger suitcase which he placed in the space behind the bus driver's seat. After this individual paid his fare, he inquired as to the best route to the Greyhound Bus Station. ANDERSON said that he told him that he should stay on the Magazine bus until he got to Canal Street at which point he should transfer to a Canal streetcar going toward the lake. When this streetcar got to Elks Place, he instructed the individual to get off the streetcar and transfer to a Tulane bus at Elks Place and Canal Street which would take him to the Greyhound Bus Station, which is located on Tulane Avenue and South Claiborne Avenue. ANDERSON was unable to describe the color of the suitcases but recalled that they, although they were not new, were not in a dilapidated condition. They bore no tags or stickers to the best of his recollection. He said the small suitcase was rectangular shaped piece of luggage approximately 22 inches long. The larger suitcase was the same shape as the smaller one and it was about 29 inches long.
