SINCE OSWALD/S DEFECTION RECEIVED SO LITTLE PUBLICITY, BOTELHO THOUGHT OSWALD MIGHT HAVE BEEN SPY FOR US. WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN AS SURPRISED IF OSWALD WOULD HAVE GONE TO CUBA BECAUSE HE ONCE MENTIONED HE WOULD LIKE TO GO TO CUBA TO TRAIN CASTRO/S TROOPS BECAUSE OF THE MONEY HE WOULD EARN.

BOTELHO SHARED SAME ROOM WITH OSWALD THE TWO MONTHS PRIOR TO OSWALD/S DISCHARGE. OSWALD VERY UNUSUAL PERSON IN THAT HE WOULD NOT SPEAK UNLESS SPOKEN TO AND HIS ANSWERS WERE ALWAYS BRIEF. HE ASSOCIATED WITH OTHERS AS LITTLE AS POSSIBLE. OSWALD SUBSCRIBED TO RUSSIAN LANGUAGE NEWSPAPER HE SAID WAS PUBLISHED IN SAN FRANCISCO AND TO WHICH HE STATED HE FIRST SUBSCRIBED WHILE IN TOKYO SO THAT HE COULD LEARN RUSSIAN LANGUAGE. NEVER GAVE ANY REASON FOR HIS INTEREST IN RUSSIAN LANGUAGE.

RICHARD CALL IN ANOTHER LANGUAGE, BEGAN CALLING OSWALD QUOTE OSWALDSKOVICH PAREN PHONETIC END PAREN END QUOTE AND OTHER MARINES CONTINUED TO DO THIS. ONE DAY BOTELHO CALLED HIM OSWALD AND OSWALD

REQUESTED THAT HE CONTINUE TO CALL HIM OSWALDSKOVICH AND WAS SERIOUS IN HIS COMMENT. BOTEHO ADVISED THAT MARINES ALSO BEGAN TO ANSWER OSWALD BY USING EXPRESSIONS LIKE QUOTE DA END QUOTE AND QUOTE NYET END QUOTE AND OSWALD WOULD SOMETIMES TALK TO THEM IN RUSSIAN. RICHARD CALL ALSO IN KIDDING MANNER TALKED TO OSWALD ABOUT OUR CAPITALISTIC WARMONGERING SYSTEM AND OSWALD TOOK HIS COMMENTS SERIOUSLY AND SEEMED TO AGREE.

OSWALD HAD ROUGH TIME IN MARINES BECAUSE OF INSUBORDINATION SUCH AS REPORTING LATE FOR MUSTER AND APPEARANCE NOT UP TO MARINE STANDARDS. OSWALD DID HIS OWN LAUNDRY AND HIS PRESSING NOT VERY NEAT. THERE WAS CONSIDERABLE PRESSURE ON OSWALD TO BECOME A BETTER MARINE AND THIS MAY HAVE ACCOUNTED FOR HIS DISLIKE OF U.S. AND HIS INTEREST IN RUSSIA.

OSWALD NEVER ENGAGED IN ANY FIGHTS ALTHOUGH HE HAD MANY VERBAL ARGUMENTS WITH SUPERIORS BECAUSE OF HIS INFRACTION OF RULES. OSWALD DID COMMENT ON COURT MARTIAL HE RECEIVED WHILE IN JAPAN AND

INDICATED HE HAD BEATEN UP A SERGEANT WHO HAD BEEN RIDING HIM FOR NO GOOD REASON, ACCORDING TO OSWALD. HE STATED HE MET SERGEANT WHILE OFF DUTY IN BAR AND SERGEANT INSULTED HIM AND SINCE BOTH PRETTY INTOXICATED, FIGHT OCCURRED.

BOTELHO STATED OSWALD ALMOST NEVER WENT ON LIBERTY. HE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY BOTELHO TO A MOVIE IN SANTA ANA AND ON ONE OTHER OCCASION THEY WALKED AROUND SANTA ANA. OSWALD ALSO DATED A GIRL FROM SANTA ANA ONCE BUT SHE DID NOT ACCEPT A SECOND REQUEST FOR A DATE SO HE DID NOT SEE HER AGAIN. HER IDENTITY NOT KNOWN TO BOTELHO. OSWALD LIKED TO READ PAPERBACK BOOKS AND PLAY CLASSICAL RECORDS, ONE IN PARTICULAR QUOTE RUSSIAN WAP DANCE UNQUOTE BY TSCHAIKOWSKY WHICH HE PLAYED OVER AND OVER. BOTELHO PLAYED ONE OR TWO GAMES OF CHESS WITH OSWALD BUT BOTELHO KNEW LITTLE ABOUT THE GAME.

BOTELHO STATED HE CANNOT RECALL THAT OSWALD EVER HAD A VISIT FROM ANYONE. HE SEEMED TO BE WITHOUT FUNDS AND INDICATED THIS WAS DUE TO

These books were turned over to the Irving, Texas, PD, by Mrs. RUTH PAINE and thereafter furnished to the office through the Secret Service at Dallas.

It is requested the Cryptanalysis and Translation Section examine these books for the purpose of determining, if possible, if the books could possibly be used as espionage code books and if copies of such books are known to that section.

MARINA OSWALD has requested these books be returned to her as she uses them daily in her household activities. It is requested, therefore, that the FBI Laboratory return these books to the Dallas Office upon completion of examination.

DETAILS:

POSSIBLE TRAVEL OF OSWALD

By San Antonio communication to Minneapolis dated December 12, 1963, it was requested that REYNALDO GOMEZ be contacted re possible information that OSWALD was a passenger on the same airplane as GOMEZ.

Date December 27, 1963

REYNALDO GOMEZ, Airman First Class, Gettysburg Air Force Base, Gettysburg, South Dakota, advised that he recalled taking an airplane from Laredo, Texas to San Antonio, Texas, on October 3, 1963. GOMEZ explained that he had been home at Bruni, Texas, 43 miles east of Laredo, and was enroute on that date to Lackland Air Force Base. He stated that he boarded the airplane at Laredo, Texas for San Antonio, Texas. He advised that he is familiar with the appearance of LEE HARVEY OSWALD from seeing a photograph of OSWALD both on television and in the newspaper. He could not recall anyone on the airplane departing from Laredo, Texas, on October 3, 1963, who in any way resembled LEE HARVEY OSWALD. GOMEZ stated that a careful study of the photograph of OSWALD exhibited during the interview failed to elicit any recollection of familiarity.

BACKGROUND OF OSWALD

By Bureau communication dated December 20, 1963 and Seattle communication to the Bureau dated December 22, 1963, it was indicated that LEE HARVEY OSWALD may have been a resident at Stanley, North Dakota in 1953.

Date December 27, 1963

DELVIN DOUGLAS JELLESED, Westland Oil Company, Stanley, North Dakota, advised that he has been a resident of Stanley, North Dakota, his entire life and that he is not aware that LEE HARVEY OSWALD or his mother were ever residents of Stanley, North Dakota.

JELLESED explained that he has two brothers, DEL'AR FRANCIS, a member of the United States Air Force, who is stationed in Japan, and DALE LEROY, a member of the United States Army, who is stationed at Fort Sam Houston, San Antonio, Texas. JELLESED advised that while he has not been in frequent contact with his brothers, he is sure that if his brothers had any information that OSWALD had been a resident of Stanley, North Dakota and known to them, that this information would have been communicated to him by his brothers because of the wide publicity given to OSWALD.

JELLESED further advised that his mother, Mrs. HARRY WERBACH, former operator of the Stanley Cafe at Stanley, North Dakota, from approximately 1947 to 1960, now resides at Grenora, North Dakota. JELLESED stated that he is in more frequent contact with his mother and is certain that his mother would have mentioned to him the fact that OSWALD had resided in Stanley, North Dakota, had that been the case.

JELLESED reiterated that to his knowledge neither OSWALD nor his mother had ever been residents at Stanley, North Dakota, since this would have become common knowledge in view of the publicity given OSWALD and the small town complex of Stanley, North Dakota.

Date December 27, 1963

Mrs. HARRY MERBACH, Grenora, North Dakota, advised that she had no knowledge that LEE HARVEY OSWALD or his mother had ever been residents in Stanley, North Dakota. She explained that it would have been impossible for them to have been residents in Stanley, North Dakota, without this fact being known to the entire community because of the wide publicity given to OSWALD.

MERBACH explained that Mrs. ALMA COLE is her third cousin and resides at the present time in Yuma, Arizona. MERBACH stated that although she has had very little contact with ALMA COLE over the past years, she does communicate with her occasionally by letter and recalled that shortly after the death of President JOHN F. KENNEDY at Dallas, Texas, she had written a letter to ALMA COLE to the effect that it was certainly a shame that President KENNEDY was assassinated. MERBACH advised that while she was unable to recall the exact text of her letter to ALMA COLE, she emphatically did not write that any of her sons were acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD or had any knowledge whatsoever regarding the death of President KENNEDY or OSWALD'S planned participation in his death.

She further stated that she certainly did not comment in the letter that OSWALD and his mother had at one time resided in Stanley, North Dakota or that she or her sons were acquainted with them. She explained that ALMA COLE had been a resident of Stanley, North Dakota, many years ago and that she had attempted suicide while a resident of Stanley, North Dakota, by drinking Lysol. MERBACH went on to add that it was her belief that ALMA COLE may possibly be suffering from a mental condition caused by a change of life and a recent operation for female disorder.

She also advised that she was unable to recall any acquaintances of her grandson who might have associated with him in 1953, pointing out that she is 80 years of age.

Mr. J. Lee Rankin, Counsel for the Commission, on 12/20/63 stated he was particularly interested in knowing whether a search had been instituted of Postal Money Orders that might have been sent or received by Lee Harvey Oswald or Jack Ruby.

Mr. Rankin was advised that U. S. Postal Inspector Harry Holmes, Terminal Annex, Dallas, Texas, advised the Dallas FBI Office it would be impossible to locate a Postal Money Order unless the Postal Money Order number, amount, or date, could be furnished for making this check. Inspector Holmes advised all money orders purchased and cashed are finally received at the Money Order Center, U. S. Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Inspector Holmes estimates that probably four to five million money orders cashed are received on a daily basis at the Money Order Center in Washington, D. C.

Mr. Rankin was advised that no check has been instituted with the U. S. Post Office Department, Washington, D. C., in an attempt to trace Postal Money Orders in view of the absence of any specific information which would aid in such a check.

Mr. Rankin requested that he be furnished information in memorandum form concerning this situation relating to Postal Money Orders.

ACTION: There is attached for Mr. Rankin's use a letterhead memorandum setting forth the information relative to the checking of Postal Money Orders which will be delivered by Malley if approved.

Counsel for the Commission investigating captioned matter has requested that efforts be made to determine if subject sent or received Western Union or Postal money orders.

Inquiry by the Dallas Office has determined that records pertaining to Postal money orders are filed centrally in Washington, D.C., in the Post Office Department, and it is estimated that four or five million Postal money orders are received daily at the money order center. It does not appear feasible, therefore, to attempt to check for Postal money orders sent or received by the subject.

Dallas has determined that Western Union money order records are kept for six months in local offices of Western Union. During the past six months Oswald resided in Dallas and New Orleans. Dallas has already checked the local records of Western Union covering Oswald's period of residence in Dallas with negative results.

New Orleans has advised that pertinent records are retained in the seven local Western Union branches and ten or twelve Agent days would be required to search the records. New Orleans has been instructed to immediately arrange to check these records.

The Western Union Audit Bureau in Minneapolis has the records of Western Union money orders covering the period prior to the past six months. Minneapolis has advised that to check these records for the period of June, 1962, when Oswald returned to the United States, to May, 1963, would take at least two months and 3,000 hours of clerical time at a cost of \$2.50 per hour.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that unless the New Orleans Office comes up with some suspicious money orders sent or received by the subject during the past six months the Commission be advised that records covering Oswald's residence during the six-month period were checked negatively; that to go beyond that period would cost a minimum of \$7,500 and take at least two months to complete; that our investigation has clearly indicated that Oswald was living within his income; that we have found no evidence of any bank accounts or other depositories for funds held by Oswald; that there is no evidence of any kind that he was receiving money from other than his employment, despite all of the speculation that has appeared in the newspapers; and that, therefore, it does not appear feasible or practical to make this further check of Western Union and the Bureau will not do so unless requested that it be done.

It is also recommended that the Commission be advised that records of Postal money orders are filed centrally in Washington, D.C.; that an estimated four or five million orders are received daily, and that it does not appear to be feasible to check for Postal money orders sent or received by the subject, particularly in light of facts set forth above concerning his financial status.

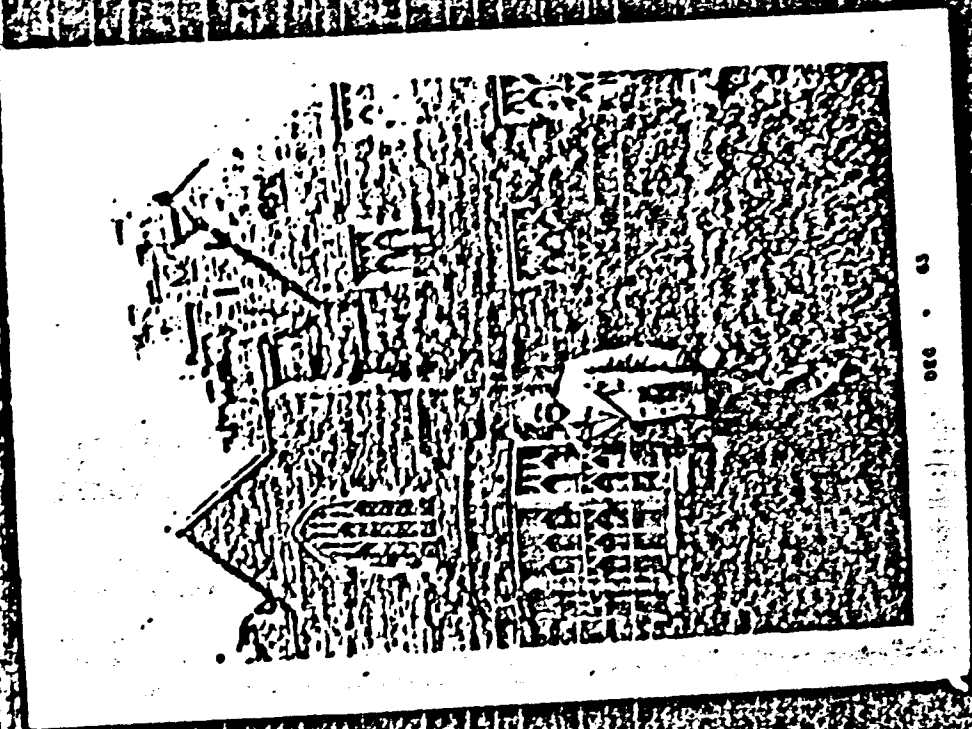
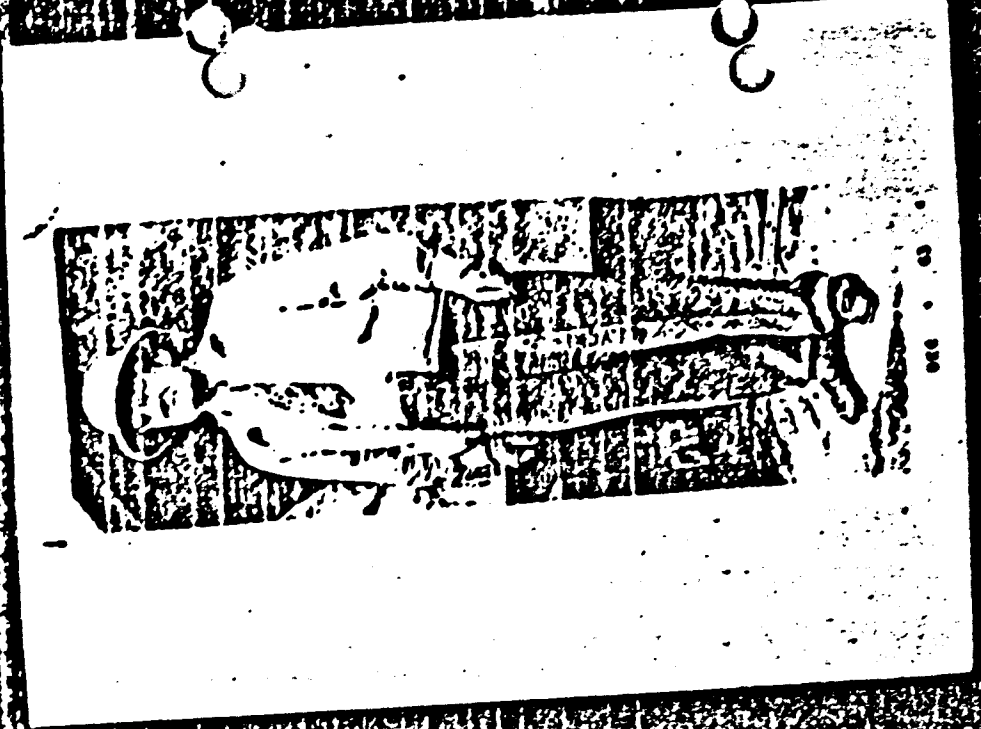

It was his opinion that the snaps and rivets were attached in a superior manner indicating the strap might be foreign made. He felt that a leather dealer might be able to narrow the search by examining the leather.

He further said that the snaps on the wide strip of leather were not familiar and their use foreign to him.

He suggested that one NATHAN POLLOCK of the Reliable Belt Company be contacted as he manufactures guitar and other leather belts and straps.

Mr. NATHAN POLLOCK, President, Reliable Belt Company, 2169 South Canalport, Chicago, Illinois, furnished the following information after viewing a photograph of the strap found on OSWALD's rifle:

He could not be sure what kind of strap it was nor if it was domestic or foreign made. He could not recall seeing a similar strap but it was his opinion based on general experience that this strap was the sort usually found on a camera bag or binocular case. He said it appeared to be a full grain piece of leather but probably a cheap or inferior piece of leather. He said that if it was manufactured outside of the United States, the leather would be stamped to this effect.

Mr. POLLOCK further advised that the search might be shortened by taking apart the straps to see if they were stamped by their manufacturer.

LOUIS J. THOMAS, Owner, United Binocular Company, 9043 South Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, was interviewed at his residence, 12334 70th Court, Palos Heights, at which time he furnished the following information:

He advised upon viewing the photographs of the sling which had been on OSWALD's rifle, that they appeared to him to be a foreign setup. He said by this he means he cannot recall ever having seen such a belt or sling on any American made binoculars or gun. THOMAS advised that he has never seen a binocular strap on a binocular case made up in such a manner. He said the only straps he has seen on binocular cases has been the single type strap and that the strap is the same width all the way around.

From viewing the wide part of the strap on which appears two snaps, the possibility exists that there may have been a place on a jacket where these snaps would have been snapped to. He said the only reason that he could see for such an arrangement would be to keep the strap from sliding around on the person's shoulder.

THOMAS advised that from the photograph that the leather appears to be a very cheap type as the strap shows that it has "bubbles" in the leather. THOMAS continued that such a strap may have been issued on submarine duty during World War II in connection with binoculars. He said this was only a guess, but felt may be the arrangement was such that a person on a submarine would be able to control his binoculars better through a snap arrangement on the case. However, THOMAS could not recall ever having seen such an arrangement. THOMAS concluded that he has never seen such a sling as pictured in the photographs ever having been issued on a rifle.

Seattle Office received information from several sources reporting Luce indicated prior to the assassination of President Kennedy that he would offer \$100 to anyone who would assassinate President Kennedy. After the death of President Kennedy, Luce reportedly showed no remorse. Seattle did not follow through and confront Luce with these allegations. This should be done and at the same time an assessment should be made as to whether Luce represents a threat to the security of President Johnson or other Government officials.

STELLA BRAY, nee Kalifia, also known as Mrs. CHARLES BRAY, the Village Apartments, 1538 Payne Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, advised that she is a stripper who dances under the name "YUM YUM."

She related that during the Summer of 1956, she was booked into the Carousel Club, Dallas, Texas, which was owned and operated by JACK RUBY, by her booking agent, LILLIAN MC CARDELL of Houston, Texas. She could not recall the specific months although she did remember that it was during the Summer, and it was her first engagement as a stripper.

She noted that at the time there were five strippers on the bill including herself and a CINDY EMBERS, who was the headliner. She could not recall the identities of the other three girls and last knew CINDY EMBERS to be engaged in stripping on the West Coast.

She advised that her relations with JACK RUBY were strictly that of an employer and employee and further that RUBY never had anything but business dealings with the strippers. She stated that during her three month engagement she casually spoke to RUBY and often saw him eating breakfast at a restaurant frequented by show people. The one thing that still stands out in her mind was the fact that everyone in Dallas seemed to know RUBY and she recalls that often people seemed to go out of their way to say hello to him. She said she had no information pertaining

to his background.

She stated that she recalls RUBY to be very calm individual who never seemed to get excited. For this reason, she stated that she could hardly believe that RUBY killed LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

She noted that she never discussed politics with RUBY and no information ever came to her attention concerning his political affiliation. She had no reason to believe that he was other than an average American who was solely interested in making a living. She further reflected that she had never seen or heard of LEE HARVEY OSWALD prior to the President's assassination.

She concluded by saying that she can always be reached through her booking agent, LILLIAN MC CARDELL, Houston, Texas.
