Q350 Blue jacket

Results of examination:

Several brown head hairs and head hair clippings were found in the debris removed from the Q350 jacket. These hairs match in microscopic characteristics the previously submitted 17 hair sample of Oswald and originated either from him or from another Caucasian person whose head hairs exhibit the same microscopic characteristics.

It is pointed out that hairs do not possess enough individual microscopic characteristics to be positively identified as originating from a particular person to the exclusion of all others.

Several brown limb hair fragments of Caucasian origin were also found in the debris removed from Q350; however, these hairs did not contain enough microscopic characteristics to be of value for comparison purposes.

None of the textile fibers previously removed from the El gun could be associated with the Q350 jacket.

The jacket, Q350, was microscopically examined and chemically processed to determine if any gunpowder residues were present and no nitrates or nitrites such as would be present in gunpowder residues were found. It is pointed out that the absence of nitrates and nitrites does not necessarily indicate that the jacket was not worn by a person firing a weapon since such residues are not normally deposited on a shooter's clothing.

In accordance with Bureau instructions, SERGE FLIEGERS, Chief European Correspondent, Hearst Newspapers, and Broadcaster for Mutual Broadcasting System, was contacted on his return to Paris on Sunday 12/1/63. He was not available for interview until the afternoon of 12/2/63 at which time he advised as follows:

The information used in his broadcast from Vienna on November 24, 1963 was not received from an official Austrian source but from an unofficial contact in Vienna who visits Prague from time to time and may have, in turn, received information from a source there. FLIEGERS stated that he often refers to his "intelligence sources" meaning unofficial contacts who furnish him with "intelligence information". He admitted that this is misleading since it infers that his sources are official intelligence sources rather than unofficial, but that he prefers to use this term since it is a vague undefined description of his sources.

He stated that his source advised him that at the time OSWALD arrived in Russia in 1959 he was probably questioned by the KGB in a routine manner. This questioning was probably done by a low level KGB officer asking him for the reason for his coming to Russia, how long he intended to stay, etc. FLIEGERS' source reasoned that after this interview by the KGB he was probably placed in contact with Soviet Military Intelligence in view of his Marine Corps background. FLIEGERS stated that this may not have been the official GRU but could be another Soviet military group.

His source then reasons that because of OSWALD's Marine Corps background he probably would have been sent to a Soviet Military Intelligence sabotage school. This school could have been located in Moscow, or since OSWALD is reported to have resided in Minsk for several years, it could have been in that city.

FLIEGERS' source reasons that there is a strong military group in Russia which is anti-KHRUSHCHEV and thus pro-Peking. This group which would be strong Stalinists would naturally be opposed to the KHRUSHCHEV-JENNEDY relationship which had developed during the past two years. FLIEGERS' source also reasons that this military group would be interested in perpetuating the cold war in order to perpetuate their own military hierarchy. This source therefore reasons that this group may have ordered OSWALD to return to the United States and later instructed him to assassinate the President.

FLIEGERS recalls that one STEFAN BANDERA, a Russian-Ukrainian refugee, was assassinated in Munich, Germany, in 1959 by a Russian agent named BOGDAN STASCHINSKY. He stated that STASCHINSKY was arrested by German authorities and is presently in a German prison. The story came out that STASCHINSKY had attended a Soviet sabotage school where he was taught methods of assassination in Minsk, Russia. He stated that if STASCHINSKY actually attended such a school, he may know if OSWALD also was trained in a similar manner. He suggested that the Bureau may wish to consider having STASCHINSKY interviewed in Germany in this connection. It is noted, however, that STASCHINSKY was apparently arrested in 1959 prior to the time that OSWALD was in the Soviet Union. Ger

FLIEGERS was carefully questioned as to the nature of his sources and whether his sources had specific information or were speculating on the possibility of the above information. He repeated that his source is an unofficial contact in Vienna who visits Prague from time to time, that he may have received this information from another source in Prague who, in turn, may have contacts in Russia. He was pressed for the identity of his source and was asked if it would be possible for us to personally contact him. FLIEGERS stated that he doubts this strongly, but volunteered to recontact his source, if possible, to determine if he is willing to have his identity revealed. FLIEGERS stated that it is impossible for him to contact this source in Vienna by telephone and, therefore, it may take some time to receive an answer.

It appeared from the interview with FLIEGERS that his information was vague, that he had received it probably third hand and that the information is largely speculation on his part and on the part of his source. This office is not in possession of detailed information regarding OSWALD's background and the Bureau is in a better position to evaluate this information and determine if it should be pursued in some manner. I have asked FLIEGERS to keep me advised of any specific information which he may receive in instant matter and he agreed to do so.

Information has been reported to Bureau that on 11-24-63 radio station WHN, New York City, carried broadcast from Vienna, Austria, wherein Serge Fliegers, chief European correspondent of the Hearst Newspapers, and a broadcaster for Mutual Broadcasting System, interviewed a "Mr. X" concerning the Oswald case. "Mr. X" expressed suspicion that Oswald had been trained as a Soviet intelligence agent during his visit to the USSR and that his assassination of President Kennedy may have been done on behalf of an anti-Khrushchev and pro-Peking faction in the Soviet Union.

New York Office has obtained tape recording of broadcast in question which was carried at 2 p.m., 11-24-63 by WHN. This recording has been monitored and it has been determined that "Mr. X" described only as a source familiar with Soviet intelligence operations, expressed suspicion that Oswald may have been acting for a Soviet intelligence group. In this connection he pointed out that Oswald had "probably" been questioned by Soviet intelligence upon his entry into the USSR in 1959 and that because of his Marine Corps background he "probably" would have been sent to a Soviet intelligence sabotage school.

"Mr. X" reasoned that there is a strong military group in Russia which is anti-Khrushchev and pro-Peking; that this group would naturally be opposed to the Khrushchev-Kennedy relationship which had developed during the past two years; that this group would be interested in perpetuating the cold war; and that, therefore, this group "may have" ordered Oswald to return to the U. S. and assassinate the President. At no point did "Mr. X" claim to have any specific or positive knowledge to support the foregoing speculation.

On instructions from Bureau, our Legal Attache in Paris interviewed Serge Fliegers on 12-2-63 regarding this matter. Fliegers described his source as "an unofficial contact in Vienna who visits Prague from time to time and may have, in turn, received information from a source there." He was pressed for the identity of the source and was asked if it would be possible for us to personally interview the source

Fliegers declined to identify his source but volunteered to recontact source to determine his willingness to have his identity revealed. However, Fliegers does not expect to be in touch with the source in the immediate future. Fliegers had no additional information to support the speculation and he promised to keep the Legat, Paris, advised of any further data he might obtain in this regard.

OBSERVATIONS:

Based on the facts developed, it appears this allegation regarding Oswald's possible activities on behalf of the Soviets is based entirely on speculation and is not supported in any way with facts. This appears to represent simply a case of "sensational" reporting on the part of Fliegers.

ACTION:

This is for information. No further action is being taken relative to this broadcast at this time.

Rerep SA J. Stanley Rotz dated 12-20-63 at BA, no copy to SL, which reported interview of Garrett Brock Trapnell on 11-23-63.

Although Trapnell's story is similar in most respects to previous story furnished by him in 8/63 and investigation at that time developed no information to confirm its accuracy, Bureau desires that MM immediately conduct investigation to determine whether there is a pool hall located on Flagler St., MM, and whether there is a small building located on corner of Tamiami Trail and Ninth, Tenth or Eleventh Street, MM, as described on pages 16 and 17 of rerep. Submit results in report.

For information of SL, Trapnell, an inmate of Clifton L. Perkins Hospital for Mental Defectives, Jessup, MD, on 11-23-63 he recognized subject as one of the 4 persons in pro-Castro group whom he had previously reported as plotting to kill the Attorney General. In prior interviews on 8-19 and 29-63 Trapnell identified the 4 individuals as Miguel Amador Fuentes, Antonio Ventura Bart, Cubans with whom he had associated in Cuba in 1958, Bart's wife and a Negro named Sousa. Investigation in 8/63 developed no information to show that those individuals and the meeting places in MM described by Trapnell existed. On 11-23-63, Trapnell furnished substantially the same information but changed identification of the persons involved. During latter interview, he named the conspirators as Fuentes, (FNU) Oswald, a girl Marta (LNU), and a dark-skinned male name unknown. He identified Oswald as subject. Also contrary to information furnished by him in 8/63 that he first met Fuentes in Cuba, he
