THE ATTORNEY GENERAL HAS RECEIVED UNDATED LETTER IN ENVELOPE POSTMARKED DECEMBER THIRTY-ONE LAST AT GUADALAJARA, JALISCO, MEXICO, TRANSLATION OF WHICH IS QUOTED AS FOLLOWS:

I ASK YOU TO FORGIVE THESE FEW BOLD LINES ADDRESSED TO SO DISTINGUISHED A PERSON.

MR. ROBERT, I AM A MEXICAN BY RACE AND NATIONALITY. ALSO, MR. ROBERT, I AM COMMUNICATING WITH YOU BECAUSE I DO NOT TRUST ANYONE IN THE MATTER I INTEND TO DEAL WITH.

I AM REFERRING TO THE DEATH OF YOUR BROTHER. PERHAPS, MY INFORMATION MAY PROVE QUITE HELPFUL EVEN THOUGH VARIOUS OFFICIALS OF THE UNITED STATES MAY BE INVOLVED AND AFFECTED BY IT. I, YOUR SERVANT, AM WILLING TO IDENTIFY THEM. I WILL TELL YOU ONLY LATER: HOWEVER, WITH PATIENCE. IT CONCERNS THE PLAN WHICH I NEVER THOUGHT WOULD BE CARRIED OUT.

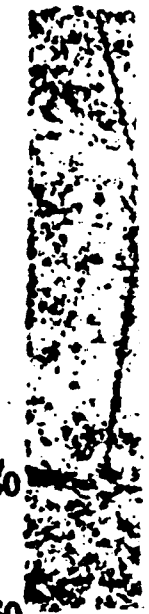

A Miami Herald Cuban newspaperman regarded as reliable by Miami, has stated he was told by a source in Mexico that Oswald on day following his arrival in Mexico together with Sylvia Duran of Cuban Consulate, Mexico City, met in a restaurant on outskirts Mexico City with an official of Cuban Embassy. This allegation was originally reported to White House with embellishment that the Cuban official was the Cuban Ambassador and that Oswald and Ambassador left the restaurant in the Ambassador's car for a conversation under secure conditions. Diaz now says he knows nothing about use of the car and merely refers to the Cuban as an official of the Embassy. He reported the story to Fernandez who in turn passed it along to the source who reported it to White House. Apparently the embellishment was either that of Diaz or Fernandez.

## Synopsis

JOHN JOSEPH METCALF, white, 23, unemployed, who had been drinking, on 12/6/63 claimed he could by investigation prove LEE HARVEY OSWALD innocent of assassination of President KENNEDY. He furnished no facts as basis of his claim. Claimed to have talked to OSWALD or "his twin" in Baltimore, Md., sometime between Aug. and Dec., 1962. METCALF has no record with Louisville PD.

DETAILS:

Re: JOHN JOSEPH METCALF

On December 6, 1963, JOHN JOSEPH METCALF, 519 North 26th Street, Louisville, Kentucky, appeared at the Louisville Office and advised SA GEORGE W. HUTCHISON as follows:

He, METCALF, had been drinking. He claimed that he could prove that LEE HARVEY OSWALD was innocent of assassinating President KENNEDY. He was unable to furnish any facts to support this claim and indicated that he thought that he would be able to go to Texas and "get more information quicker than the FBI" and thereby "clear this case" more quickly than the FBI.

METCALF said that he had talked with OSWALD about a year ago in Baltimore in a bar located "two bars from the Gaiety," a strip joint. He indicated that both he and the man he thought to be OSWALD were drunk. He could furnish no details of his conversation with "OSWALD" saying only that they "talked like a couple of drunks." When pressed to be more definite about the time of his claimed conversation with "OSWALD," METCALF indicated that it would have been between August and December, 1962. METCALF indicated that the man he now thought to be OSWALD did not identify himself by name but that he looked like OSWALD. METCALF finally said that the man was either OSWALD or OSWALD's twin brother.

METCALF indicated that he had been stationed in the Army at Fort Meade, Maryland, with the 555th Ordnance Battalion and that he had received a "208 discharge", (undesirable) from the post stockade at Fort Meade on June 24, 1963.

METCALF indicated that he had first furnished this information to an unidentified news reporter in the offices of the Courier-Journal or Louisville Times, Louisville, Kentucky. Thereafter, he went across the street from the newspaper building and talked with someone in a building which, according to METCALF's description of the building, was the Federal Building, Louisville, Kentucky. METCALF was unable to say to whom he had talked on the second occasion but indicated that this individual sent him to the FBI.

A check of the name JOHN JOSEPH METCALF against the indices of the Louisville Office resulted negatively.

We are now in receipt of communications from the Dallas Office requesting minor changes be made in investigative reports previously submitted by Dallas which already have been disseminated to the Commission. Dallas requests are as follows:

1. Report of SA Warren C. Debrueys, 12-2-63, Dallas. That an additional page number be shown opposite a name in the index of the report. This can be done by ink notation in Bureau copies of the report. In view of the minor nature of the change, no action is necessary to correct the reports forwarded to the Commission.
2. Report of SA Warren C. Debrueys, 12-8-63, Dallas. The name Bissle and Bissel on page 246 should be changed to Biffle. Biffle was a reporter for the "Ft. Worth Press" and wrote three stories in 1959 and 1960 when he was in contact with Mrs. Marguerite Oswald while her son was in Russia. The information is nonsubstantive in character and does not materially add to the case. The name should be corrected in the copies of the report maintained at the Bureau. It is not necessary to change the reports forwarded to the Commission.

Dallas also has submitted an amended Cover Page H. The amended page shows that the records of Western Union, Del Rio, Texas, were made available by Madlyne Hodge. The amended cover page can be inserted in the Bureau copies of the report. Since the cover pages were not transmitted to the Commission, no action is necessary.

3. Report of SA Robert P. Gemberling, 12-10-63, Dallas. Dallas requests that on page 172 the date 10-24-59 should correctly be shown as 10-24-56. This relates to a selective service record prepared on information furnished by Oswald 9-14-59. Reportedly, Oswald served in the U.S. Marine Corps from 10-24-59 (Dallas says should be 1956) to 11-7-59, when he was honorably discharged. Based on the fact that the information was supplied 9-14-59, both dates 10-24-59 and 11-7-59 are patently incorrect. Oswald actually served in the Marine Corps from 10-24-56 to 9-11-59. The incorrect date indicated by Dallas can be corrected in the Bureau's copies of the report. No action is necessary with respect to the Commission since they have our report which contains the accurate record of his service in the Marine Corps.

Dallas requests that amended page 737 be inserted in report. The amended page shows the identity of the person to be subpoenaed if records of the General Telephone Company, Del Rio, Texas, are needed. The information from the records was negative in character and there appears to be no reason why a subpoena would be necessary.

It is obvious that the Agents who dictated the FD-302's reporting results of interviews and investigation are detecting these minor errors such as above. We can expect to have additional amended pages and corrections submitted. Since it has been explained to the Commission that the reports are raw material, we should not take any affirmative action to correct these reports unless it is something of major significance. In the future, we will handle these corrections in line with the above. Any major changes will be the subject of separate memoranda.

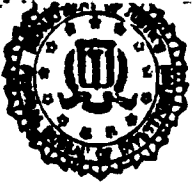

SA W. L. Collier received retel on 1/3/64. The Dallas Office requested permission to certify on the back of six photographs that the original documents from which the photographs were made appear genuine and there is no evidence of fraudulent change.

The photographs in question are photographs of birth certificates, military discharge papers of the subject, etc., which the U. S. Secret Service advised the Dallas Office are needed by Marina Oswald to make a claim with the Social Security Administration in view of the subject's death.

Since certification that the original documents are genuine cannot be made without genuine similar documents for comparison, at 8:18 PM, 1/3/64, SA Collier called the Dallas Office to clarify this matter and talked to the Duty Agent, SA W. H. Brown.

At 9:00 PM, SA Brown telephoned SA Collier after conferring with SAC Shanklin and SA Wallace Heitman, the agent handling this matter. SA Brown advised that the photographs had been furnished the Dallas Office by the U. S. Secret Service on behalf of Marina Oswald. On the back of each photograph was the stamped impression: "The original document of which this is a photocopy appears to be genuine and unaltered and to have been made at the time purported. SA Collier advised SA Brown that Dallas could certify only that the photographs were accurate copies of the original documents furnished to the Bureau.

For information New Orleans, John Howard Bowen is believed to be the person who sat next to Oswald on the Mexican Red Arrow bus on trip from Nuevo Laredo to Mexico City on 9-26/27-63. This person was described by Dr. and Mrs. John McFarland, Liverpool, passengers on bus in question, as being an 80-year-old male, U. S. citizen, who looked in 60's and who lived in Cuernavaca, Mexico, and Tennessee. He told McFarlands that he was retired school teacher who taught in India and Arabia and was currently writing book on Lisbon earthquake of 1775. He is also believed to be identical to a person sitting next to Oswald on the bus in question described by two Australian girls, Patricia Winston and Pamela Mumford, who boarded bus Monterrey, Mexico, evening 9-26-63 en route Mexico City. Girls described this person as Englishman in late 60's, heavy build, gray hair, balding, who was retired and lived in Mexico for many years. En route subject told girls he had lived in Russia and had been to Mexico City previously where he stayed at Hotel Cuba as it was inexpensive. He said he was not stopping at hotel (Cuba) this trip. En route the Englishman, believed to be Bowen, opined that subject apparently had been to Mexico City before.

SCHEIHING, Chula Vista, California, furnished information indicating one "LON" BONNER of Chula Vista, California, made comment in August, 1963, to the effect someone had told BONNER that President KENNEDY, Attorney General ROBERT KENNEDY, California Governor EDMUND BROWN and U. S. Supreme Court Chief Justice EARL WARREN "would be wiped out within a year".

DETAILS:

Date December 3, 1963

Mr. J. B. SCHEIHING, Trailer Space F-6, Brentwood Trailer Park, 1100 Industrial Boulevard, advised as follows:

He is employed as the gardener and caretaker at this trailer park. In August, 1963, he had a conversation with a resident of the trailer park who resides in trailer space F-14, one "LON" BONNER. BONNER is a white male, age approximately 38, who resides here with his widowed mother. BONNER is employed in the Los Angeles, California area.

SCHEIHING does not recall many specific comments made during this August, 1963 conversation but does remember that the gist of it was BONNER said he had been told by someone that President KENNEDY, Attorney General ROBERT KENNEDY, California Governor ELMUND BROWN and U. S. Supreme Court Chief Justice EARL WARREN "would be wiped out within a year". SCHEIHING asked BONNER who told him this but BONNER did not say. BONNER's source for this information is not known to SCHEIHING but he, SCHEIHING, somehow got the impression the person who had said this to BONNER may have been a fellow employee.

After President KENNEDY's assassination, SCHEIHING spoke with BONNER and referred to their August, 1963 conversation. Again BONNER's source was not identified but BONNER did repeat the identity of the same four individuals mentioned in August, 1963, that is President KENNEDY, Attorney General KENNEDY, Governor BROWN and Chief Justice WARREN.

BONNER resides at this trailer park on weekends but works in the general Los Angeles area during the week. He is a member of local 11 of some Electrical Workers Union in Los Angeles and his occupation is that of an electrical lineman. Currently, he stays at the Ho Hum Motel, 103 East Coast Highway, Long Beach, California, and is on the payroll of the R. S. Schulman Co. of Imperial Street, Los Angeles. This company is a contractor to the Edison Electric Company and BONNER is employed at the Edison Rio Hondo Substation, Long Beach, California.

**DETAILS:**

On December 21, 1963, the Oklahoma City Office advised they had received an anonymous letter dated December 20, 1963, together with one copy of a newspaper editorial by RUSSELL KIRK, titled "Was There an Assassination Plot?". A copy of this letter, which was signed "Just a Citizen" advised that the writer had clipped the article referred to above, as it made him think that he might have seen a car that could have come from Dallas the day President KENNEDY was killed. The writer stated that he is a delivery man, and makes two or three trips a day from Norman (Oklahoma), and on the day President KENNEDY was killed, he noted a Cadillac pass him at a high rate of speed. He stated the car stopped at a stop light in Moore (Oklahoma), and he drove after the car.

TP 105-2142

obtained the tag number, and noticed the car contained four men, who appeared to be "Latin Americans". He said they had CASTRO type beards. He stated that he could not tell much about the individuals in the front seat, but one appeared to be moving around like he was nervous, and the driver "looked sort of like Dan Durea only he was dark". The letter stated the Cadillac bore Florida license 3WV-2471.

On December 31, 1963, Jacksonville Office reported Florida license 3WV-2471 was registered to a 1961 Cadillac, vehicle identification number 61G-102526, in the name of GERALD G. KOZAK, 10102 Nebraska Avenue, Tampa, Florida, with a lien in favor of General Finance Corporation, 902 Tampa Street, Tampa, Florida, in the amount of \$5,448.68, which lien was dated November 14, 1961. There was no stolen report for this automobile.

On January 6, 1964, DIANE FLORES, Tampa Police Department, advised SA WILLIAM C. HAY she was unable to locate any arrest record in the files of this department for GERALD G. KOZAK. On the same date, Mrs. EVELYN GORLITZ, Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office, Tampa, advised SA HAY she was unable to locate any arrest record for KOZAK.

ANGIE MC ELVY, Tampa Credit Bureau, advised SA HAY on January 6, 1964, that the files of this firm contained no record of GERALD G. KOZAK

The 1962 Tampa City Directory lists GERRY KOZAK and wife, EDITH, living at 10102 Nebraska Avenue, Tampa. GERRY KOZAK is listed as a wrestler. The Tampa City Directory for 1963 contains no listing for KOZAK.

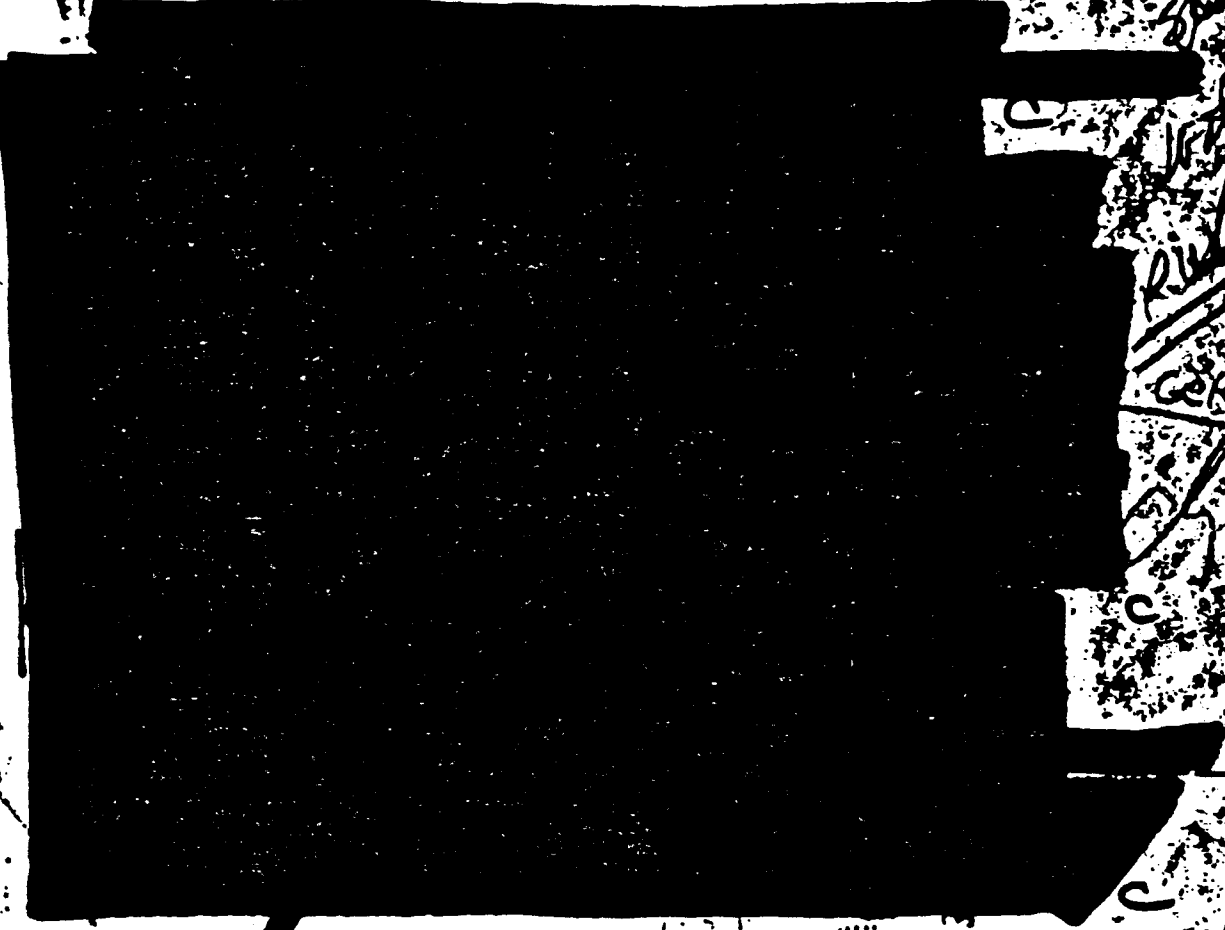

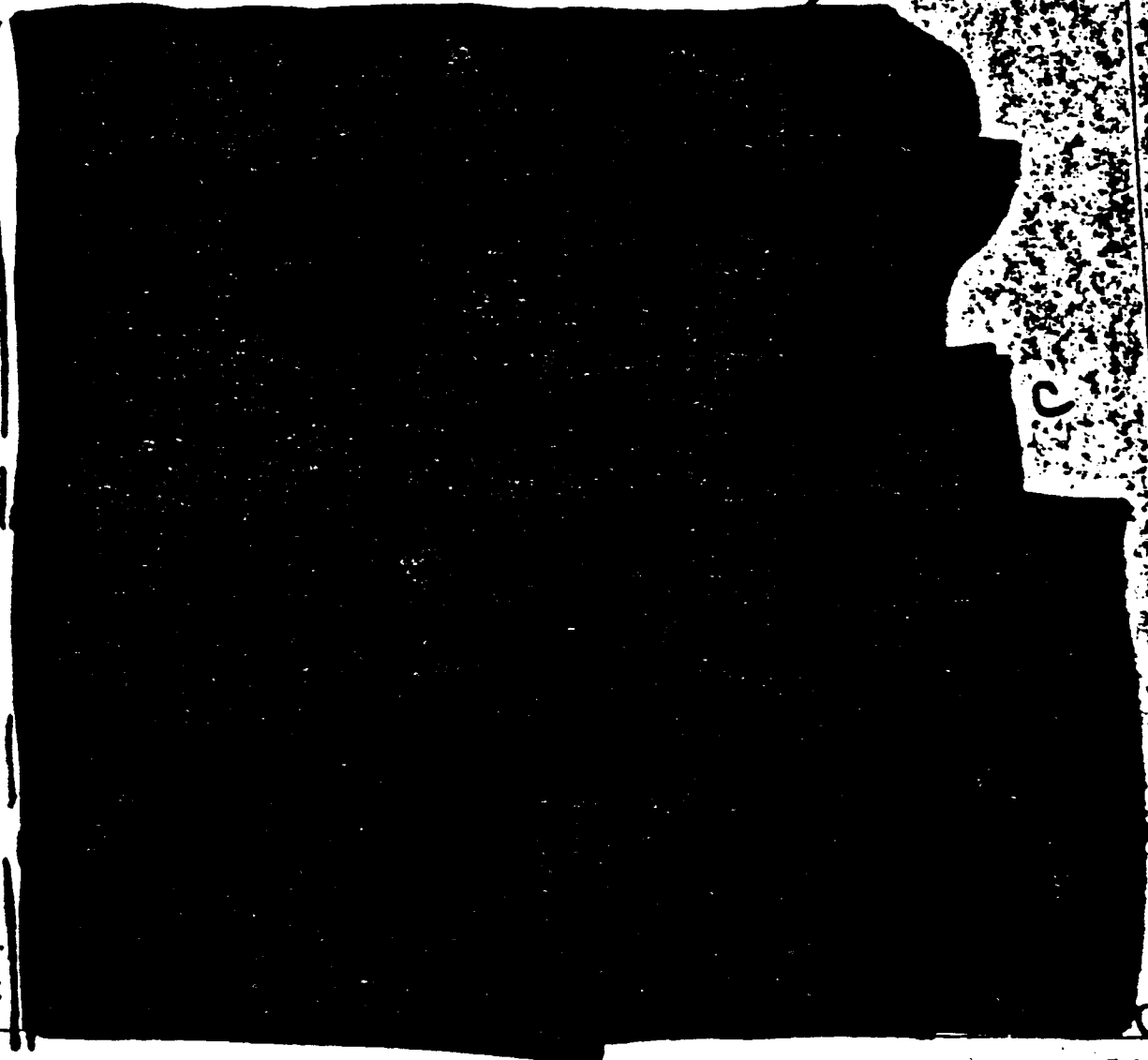
