Mr. GREGTOLDS, 1316 Timberlake Circle, Richardson, Texas, employee, Richardson Echo, advised he is the president of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) Affilate in Dallas, Texas. He stated that he had never seen or heard of LEE HARVEY OSWALD until President KENNEDY was assassinated. OLDS stated that after it had been reported in the newspapers that OSWALD was a member of the ACLU, he tried to verify this fact and finally determined from the New York Office that an application for membership had been submitted by OSWALD to New York. This application had been received in New York he believes on November 4, 1963. OLDS stated that he has no idea where the application form had come from unless OSWALD had picked up this form at a meeting of the ACLU on October 25, 1963. He has heard from some source, name not recalled, that OSWALD did attend a meeting of the ACLU on the night of October 25, 1963, which meeting was held on the campus of Southern Methodist University (SMU). It is believed by Mr. OLDS that OSWALD was brought to this meeting by MICHAEL PAINE. He has intended to talk to PAINE about OSWALD but has not had an opportunity. He advised that he, OLDS, was present at the meeting on October 25, 1963, and does not recall seeing OSWALD and certainly does not recall him entering into any discussions. He has heard, but once again he cannot recall the source, that OSWALD did have something to say at this meeting. He, however, does not know what OSWALD was supposed to have said.

OLDS stated he has not made any investigation regarding OSWALD but he has been following the background of OSWALD through the press with the intention of learning everything about him that he can. He stated he could not furnish any information at all regarding OSWALD since he did not meet him and stated he does not know JACK RUBY and knows of no association between RUBY and OSWALD.

He does not know of any other ACLU meetings which OSWALD might have attended and stated the only person other than PAINE he knows that might have talked to OSWALD at the meeting was a Reverend BYRD HELLIGAS, 4012 St. Andrews Drive, Dallas. He does not believe, however, that HELLIGAS can furnish any information regarding OSWALD and believes that HELLIGAS just either spoke to him or was introduced to him.

Reverend BYRD(HELLIGAS, <u>4012 St.</u> Andrews Drive, Dallas, Texas, advised that he attended the meeting of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) at Southern Methodist University (SMU) on the night of Ootober 25, 1963. He stated that after President KENNEDY was assassinated, he saw OSWALD on television and recognized him as a person who had been at the meeting on the night of Ootober 25, 1963. HELLIGAS advised he was in charge of the projector and coffee on the night of October 25, 1963, and OSWALD came up and said something to him about the projector. He does not recall what OSWALD said but it was some comment about how the projector worked. He did not have any other discussion with OSWALD and OSWALD did not make any further comment and said nothing regarding politics. HELLIGAS stated that he had never seen OSWALD before and could not furnish any further information regarding him at all.

He stated he could not furnish the names of anyone who attended the meeting who might have had any discussion with OSWALD. He has heard generally from sources whom he does not recall that OSWALD did have some comments to make during the meeting. The comments made by OSWALD are not known to Mr. HELLIGAS and Mr. HELLIGAS stated he certainly did not hear him say anything.

Mr, HELLIGAS stated he did not know JACK RUBY and does not know of any association between RUBY and OSWALD.

Mr. ARNALDO CAVAZOS, 628 Hambrick stated he and two other individuals crossed the border from Texas into Mexico at Laredo, Texas, on September 26, 1963, en route Monterrey, Mexico, on a business trip. He said the crossing took only about ten minutes and apparently not many persons were crossing at that point at the time because the highway from Laredo to Monterrey had many detours. He identified the other two persons as ALECTOR R. CAVAZOS, his brother, who resides 10206 Medlock, Dallas, and THOMAS ROGERS, employed with Fasco Motors, Richardson, Texas. He said the three of them were travelling in one auto and picked up no passengers en route. He said he did not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD and could not recall seeing anyone who resembled OSWALD at that time. TEXAS

Mrs. JODENE(HANDS, new Brans, wife of RAYMOND F. HANDS, 5512 James Drive, advised she accompanied her sisterin-law, ERNESTINE WHITE HANDS, Plantation Road, Fort Worth, J. A. and another relative, HARVEY CAMPBELL, of Dallas, Texas, on a trip to Monterrey, Mexico, in September, 1963. They crossed the border into Mexico at Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, on September 26, 1963, through Mexican customs. They changed their money at the Customs Office and did not see any Americans as they crossed the border. The purpose of the trip was for a vacaton.

MONO F. Mrs/HANDS stated that in a bar in Monterrey, she saw one or two Americans, but none identical to LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She stated she does not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD, or JACK RUBY. DL 100-10461 RPG:gmf

On December 13, 1963, Confidential Informant, Dallas T-3, advised that Father RICHARD LAWRENCE/PHILION was located at Texquisistlan, State of Oaxaca, Mexico. According to informant, Father PHILION stated he obtained his Mexican Tourist Card at the Mexican Consulate in New Orleans, Louisiana, on September 17, 1963, shortly before the Consulate Closed on that day.' Informant advised that Father PHILION could not identify a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD as having been in the Mexican Consulate in New Orleans during the time Father PHILION was there.

According to informant, Father PHILION indicated he traveled to Mexico City by air and had no occasion to observe OSWALD when OSWALD crossed the border on September 26, 1963. . .

On December 16, 1963, Confidential Informant, Dallas T-3, advised that on that date <u>CARLOS ALMAGUER</u> <u>RCHARTEA</u> and his wife had on that date at Monterrey, <u>Mexico</u>, stated they entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on September 26, 1963, in their personally owned automobile and did not observe LEE MARVEY OSWALD and knew nothing of his activities while in Mexico.

On December 24, 1963, Confidential Informant, Dallas T-3, furnished the following information concerning efforts to locate JOHN H. BOWEN, a passenger with OSWALD on a southbound bus from Nuevo Laredo, An September 26, 1963.

Informant advised that investigation discloses BOWEN departed Mexico City October 1, 1963, on Flecha Roja bus, bound for Nuevo Laredo. Mexican immigration records reflect BOWEN departed Mexico, at Nuevo Laredo, October 2, 1963, but no information concerning his home address was available. $\mu 10 - B MHEO \times 174$

Informant advised that Flecha Roja bus records reflect BOWEN and one WILLIAM SY SHIVELY purchased consecutive tickets for Flecha Roja bus trip from Mexico City to Nuevo Laredo, although, they did not occupy adjacent seats. Mexican immigration records reflect SHIVELY was issued a tourist card at Nuevo Laredo, September 22, 1963, and entered Mexico at that location on the same date. SHIVELY departed Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on October 2, 1963, with BOWEN and him being checked out by the same Mexican Immigration Service employee.

The Mexican tourist card described SHIVELY as an American citizen, 22 years of age, and a student. He presented a birth certificate as proof of identity and his home address was given as Cincinnati, Ohio, no street address.



Mr. IVAN DXMARICLE advised he is the Associate Registrar of the Baptist Annuity Board, Southern Baptist Convention (SBC), Room 202, 511 North Akard Street, Dallas, Texas, He said he had no record of JOHN HOWARD BOWEN in the files of that office and that he doubted BOWEN had ever been a Baptist minister or a regular appointed missionary from the information concerning BOWEN's background and history of employment. He said that a record might be located in the files of the Foreign Mission Board, Southern Baptist Convention, 3806 Monument Avenue, Richmond, Virginia, if BOWEN served for any length of time under one of their appointments. He said the records of the Baptist Annuity Board at Dallas only cover members of the retirement plan of the Southern Baptist Convention in this area, and would not necessarily cover all persons listed in the Richmond Office of the SBC.

JAMES LAWRENCE, identifying himself as employed as a Leasing Agent of the Cross Country Development Corporation, a subsidiary of Bloomfield Building Industries, 3355 Poplar Avenue, Memphis, <u>Tennessee</u>, advised as follows:

LAWRENCE spent about ten weeks at the New Orleans sub-office of Cross Country Development Corporation, located Room 101 of the International Trade Mart, 124 Camp Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, said period running from July to the middle of October of 1963. He was there to handle leasing arrangements for a new International Trade Mart being constructed by Bloomfield Building Industries.

On a day probably in middle August, exact date not recalled, JAMES LAWRENCE left the Trade Mart building accompanied by Mrs. DOLORES NEELEY, an employee of Bloomfield Building Industries, and he recalls they were followed out of the building by another acquaintance of his, namely <u>NICK</u>. <u>PALMISANO</u>, then employed as a Room Clerk at the Royal Orleans Hotel, New Orleans. Upon reaching the sidewalk from the entrance to the building, LAWRENCE recalls several bareheaded young white males who were passing out some sort of printed leftlets. One of these leaflets was given to Mrs. NEELEY, and she started to show it to LAWRENCE, at which time both Mrs. NEELEY and LAWRENCE noted that someone was taking movies of this series of events.

Mrs. NEELEY recognized the photographer as being employed by one of the television stations in New Orleans. LAWRENCE does not recall this man's name, nor the name of the station, but did remember that Mrs. NEELEY asked her television acquaintance as to his purpose in taking the movies and recalls the reply which was to the effect that the photographer did not know, that he had merely been told by his station to hurry to this location to take photographs of action on the sidewalk.

LAWRENCE merely recalled that Mrs. NEELEY told him that the leaflet had something to do about Cuba.

JAMES LAWRENCE was exhibited a series of six photographs taken by Television Station WDSU on August 16, 1963,

depicting various persons shown on the sidewalk outside the International Trade Mart, 124 Camp Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, when LEE HARVEY OSWALD passed out handbills.

LAWRENCE advised that with regard to OSWALD, who is shown definitely in photographs marked by SA LAWRENCE as IV, V, and VI, at the time he did not know OSWALD's identity or purpose, that he had not knowingly ever previously seen OSWALD, and has not knowingly seen him since that time. With regard to the other individuals depicted in photographs IV through VI, LAWRENCE stated that he does not recall knowing any of these individuals other than the person shown in these three photographs as a bareheaded male and wearing a checkered or plaid shirt and who is facing the camera in each pose, believed to be Mar ERIDGES, Maintenance Superintendent of the International Trade Mart

With regard to photographs marked by SA LAWRENCE as I through III, JAMES LAWRENCE identified himself as the person marked No. 4 in each of these three photographs, and further identified Mrs. DOLORES NEEDEY as the person marked as No. 1 in each of these three photographing stating that he was unable to identify the persons marked as Nos. 2 and 3 in these photographe. He did point out that standing directly behind Mrs. NEGLEY and nimself in photographs I through III is a white male having his head bowed and who is depicted as carrying a roll of some type material under his left arm, as being identical with NICK PALMISANO, Room Clerk, Royal Orleans Hotel, New Orleans, Louisiana, who had accompanied Mrs. NEELEY and LAWRENCE out of the Trade Mart a few moments before the photograph was taken. He stated that he is certain in his own mind that PALMISANO had nothing to do with the distribution of the literature and would further feel certain that, if his identification of the Maintenance Superintendent of the Trade Mart, believed by him to be Mr. BRIDGES, is correct, that Mr. BRIDGES would have had nothing to do with the distribution of this literature, and in his opinion would have been merely looking on as an interested or curious spectator.

LAWRENCE stated that he was rather shocked and surprised to see the hereinbefore mentioned six photographs appear on television as a part of a movie taken by an unrecalled New Orleans television station in New Orleans, Louisiana, at the time that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had purportedly passed out pro-Castro Cuban literature. He elaborated that this movie

was shown on one of the Memphis television stations on either November 23 or 24, 1963, following the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. He pointed out that his wife and he saw this on television and immediately recognized not only himself but Mrs. NEELEY and the person pointed out by the announcer as being identical with LEE HARVEY OSWALD, recalling OSWALD as being identical with the person shown in photographs IV through VI.

Mrs. PAT/ ROCHELLE, Secretary, Glen Addington Public Relations, 4533 Rose Avenue, Dallas, Texas, advised that she had heard from Mrs. SAM MEADOWS, who is also known as ANN/ MEAZOWS who operates a tavern in Fort Worth with her husband, that HENRY/AXLINE, of Fort Worth, Texas, a former high school classmate of hers, had been in Mrs. MEADOWS' tavern a few days after JACK RUBY had shot LEE HARVEY OSWALD. AXLINE was drinking at the time, and he stated that he knew why OSWALD had shot President KENNEDY; that a secret group known as Fair Play For Cuba in Dallas had each contributed \$75,00 apiece to LEE OSWALD to shoot the President and that JACK RUBY was a part of this group, Mrs. ROCHELLE stated that she also learned from Mrs. MEADOWS that Mrs. HENRY AXLINE had been questioned about this by some authorities, exact organization unknown, and Mrs. AXLINE denied this. Confidential Informant, Dallas T-7, advised Special Agent CMARLES T. BROWN, JR., that LEE M. OSWALD rented Post Office Box 6225 located at the Terminal Annex Post Office Station, Dallas, Texas, on November 1, 1963. In his application for rental of this box OSWALD indicated the name of his firm as, "Fair Play for Cuba Committee," and another firm was indicated as, "American Civil Liberties Union." We indicated the type of business as "Non-profit." According to informant, Postal records indicated OSWALD rented this box for the period November 1 through December 31, 1963, and paid \$3,00 rental in cash for the box on November 1, 1963.

Informant advised that on December 5, 1963, he examined Post Office Box 6225 at which time he ascertained the only item contained in the box was the December 6, 1963, issue of "Time" Magazine., The magazine was addressed to LEE H. OSWALD, Box 6225, Dallas, Texas. The mailing strap on the magazine indicated OSWALD's subscription expires in December, 1963. Informant stated that since the afternoon of November 22, 1963, a close watch has been maintained on this box. On the afternoon of November 22, 1963, a 24-hour physical surveillance was placed on the box by Postal Authorities which lasted until midnight, November 24, 1963. According to informant no one appeared at the Post Office to ask for any mail in this box. Informant stated that a continued close watch has been maintained and will continue to be maintained for any persons attempting to obtain mail from this box.

Informant stated that it is his understanding that OSWALD had a key to Post Office Box 6225 in his

pocket at the time of his arrest on November 22, 1963. Informant stated that he was at the Nomicide Detail Room, Dallas Police Department, on November 22, 1963, and observed the key in the possession of an unidentified Nomicide Detail Detective. The detective told informant that the key had been found on OSWALD at the time of OSWALD's arrest.

Informant stated that he questioned numerous Postal employees after November 22, 1963, regarding any mail, packages, magazines, or other material received through Box 6225 by OSWALD and none were able to recall any material of any kind being placed in the box with the exception of one employee whose name informant was unable to recall. This employee told informant he thought on one occasion he had placed some type of Russian newspaper in the box but the employee was unable to specifically recall placing the item in the box and he was not able to recall a date on which it had been done, if it had actually been done. Informant stated that upon examining the box on the afternoon of November 22, 1963, it was determined there was dust in the bottom of the box indicating no mail had been received through the box.

Informant concluded by saying that on November 24, 1963, OSWALD admitted renting P. O. Box 6225 and P. O. Box 2915 in Dalla's, Texas. He also admitted to informant that he rented P. O. Box 30061 in New Orleans, Louisiana. OSWALD did not make any admissions to informent concerning his use of this box nor did he admit receiving a gun at any time through any of the aforementioned <u>5</u> DL 100-10461 RPG:gmf

Post Office boxes. He denied receiving any mail addressed to A. HIDELL through any of the Post Office boxes and denied that anyone else had ever received any mail through these boxes. He admitted to informant that on one or two occasions he may have given his Post Office Box key to Box 2915 to his wife for her to obtain the mail from the box and bring it to him.
