Miss HEWIIT is a student at the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor. Her roommate is CATHERINE MALLORY, telephone HO 52221, Ann Arbor.

Sometime since the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, the following information was orally disclosed to Miss HEWITT by CATHERINE MALLORY.

CATHERINE MALLORY is a member of the University of Michigan Band and went to Soviet Russa with the University of Michigan Band in 1961. During March, 1961, the University of Michigan Band was giving some concerts at the Minsk Polytechnic Institute, Minsk, Russia. One night while the band was not performing, members of the band were divided into small groups, each of which was assigned an interpreter, for the purpose of going on a tour of the facilities of the Minsk Polytechnic Institute and having various phases of its operations explained by the interpreters. During the tour, Miss MALLORY became separated from her group and during this period was approached by a young American who advised her that he was a former member of the U.S. Marine Corps, had had some differences with his Government and had denounced his Government. The young man offered his services as an interpreter but it was Miss HEWITT's understanding that this was a personal offer of services and she had no knowledge that the young man was connected in any way with the Soviet Government, although she is not too clear in her recollection of this particular phase of the matter. Subsequently, Miss MALLORY, who had been very much impressed by the unknown young man who said he had denounced his Government, due to the oddity of the situation, made a record of this discussion in her diary. After the assassimation of President KENNEDY on November 22, 1963, Miss MALLORY did not connect her encounter with the above young man in Minsk, Russia, with LEE OSWALD, but sometime after the assassination Miss MALLCRY's mother, who had read the diary and had also read in a news account information indicating that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had worked in Minsk, Russia, in 1961, reminded her daughter of the information in her diary about meeting the former U. S. Marine. At this time Miss MALLORY gave some thought to the matter and after reviewing her diary came to the conclusion that the former

DAVID VAUGHN HOFFMAN, Apartment 16, Colonial Court Apartments, furnished the following information on interview:

He is employed presently as a professor of English at the Prince George High School, Prince George County, Virginia. He graduated from Tulane University, New Orleans, Louisiana, in the spring of 1963. From approximately May, 1963, until August, 1963, he resided with two roommates, JOHN HEGGARTY and TONY ECCLES, at 4107 Freret Streat, New Orleans, Louisiana. HEGGARTY and ECCLES were students at the University and were members of a group of which he, HOFFMAN, was also a member called""The Group". HOFFMAN described this group as consisting of members who were "weird" or "way out".

During the time they occupied the apartment at 4107 Freret Street, about three parties were held there, and at no time did he observe anyone resembling LEE HARVEY OSWALD, whose photograph he had seen in the newspapers at a later date after coming to Virginia. These parties, HOFFMAN said were attended by both Tulane students and "outsiders" some bearded, but he did not believe that even with beards he would not recall having observed OSWALD, had he ever seen him at one of the parties.

HOFFMAN said that to the best of his knowledge, HEGGARTY was now somewhere in Jamestown, New York, and that he had heard that HEGGARTY may be connected with a theatre at Jamestown called "Antono" (phonetic). ECCLES was last known by HOFFMAN to be a sorphomore at Tulane University for the 1963 - 64 school years.

> HOFFMAN observed that during the time he, ECCLES And HEGCARETY had the apartment together at Freret Street in New Orlfans, HEGGARTY slept a number of nights with one TEE-CUTCHEN, a co.ed then attending Newcomb College, an 4 m annex of Tulane University in New Orleans. HOFFMAN last knew CUTCHEN to be somewhere in Florida possibly attending school there.

HOFFMAN concluded by stating that he had never known or heard of LEE HARVEY OSWALD nor had he ever heard this name prior to the assassination of President KENNEDY.

ALLEN, Secretary and Bookkeeper, Chamberlain and Munt Academy, Port Gibson, Mississippi, advised that records of the school on JOHN EDWARD PIC and ROBERT OSWALD, discloses they were half-brothers' and the sons of MARGUERITA OSWALD, also known as <u>Marguerita</u> Ekdahl, Mrs. E. Mr. DANIEL FA SULLIVAN, 118 Twin Oaks Drive, Lafayette, who is employed as Division Geologist, Continental Oil Company, Lafayette, advised he recalled that in December, 1962, he and his wife attended a party at the DECLAN FORD residence in Richardson, Texas. He stated he has been acquainted with Mr. FORD since the 1940's and has known FORD's wife, KATJA, since they were married in July, 1961. Mr. SULLIVAN reviewed his check stubs and determined that the party at the FORD residence had been on the night of December 28, 1962. He advised it was quite late when he and his wife arrived at the party, that only a few of the guests were still present. He said that in addition to the FORDS, the following were present:

Mr. SULLIVAN advised he did not believe he had ever met LEE HARVEY OSWALD or his wife and on viewing the photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, stated the photograph was not familiar as being anyone that he had ever met. He stated it was possible that the OSWALDS had been present at the FORD party on December 28, 1962 at the same time that he and his wife were there, but he did not believe this to be true.

Mrs. DANIEL F. SULLIVAN, nee Ruth Wells, 118 JILLIVAN, Twin Oaks Drive, Lafayette, advised she recalls having attended a party at the DECLAN FORD residence in Richardson, Texas, between Christmas, 1962 and New Year's, 1963. She stated the SULLIVAN family had driven from Lafayette, Louisiana to Dallas, Texas on the day of the party and had arrived at the party late, getting there around 11:50 p.m." She stated the party had been an open house-type party and that Mrs. FORD told her there were about 30 invited guests. She related that when she and her husband arrived, the only persons present other than the FORDS were Mr. and Mrs. THOMAS RAY, Blossom, Texas; Mr. and Mrs. FRANK RAY, 4525 Alta Vista, Dallas, Texas; CAROLE (last name unknown), who has worked for FRANK RAY; Mr. and Mrs. (first name unknown) JACKSON, Dallas, Texas, Mr. JACKSON being in the real estate business; and ED and ZENA JOHNSON, Georgetown, Texas, Mr. JOHNSON being in the dry cleaning business and President of the Chamber of Commerce). Mrs. SULLIVAN advised that Mrs. FORD, whose first name is KATJA, is of Russian extraction and came to the United States as a war bride after World War II. She was subsequently divorced from the serviceman that she had married and in about the latter 1950's appeared on the television show "This Is Your Life." As a result of this television appearance, many Russian war brides and other Russian women had contacted Mrs. FORD and she had helped them with some of the problems that presented themselves to the women.

As a result, Mrs. FORD is known to many women of Russian extraction living in the United States. She related that in addition to Mrs. FORD, both Mrs. RAYS, Mrs. JACKSON and Mrs. JOHNSON were all of Russian background. She stated the photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD did not appear to her to be anyone she had ever met and added she did not recall having ever met OSWALD or his wife. She stated that as OSWALD's wife was of Russian background, it was quite possible that OSWALD and his wife had attended the party at the FORD residence and it was also possible they had been there during the period that the SULLIVANS were at the party, but she did not recall them.

On December 30, 1963, Mr. GEORGE EABOESCH, 1623; Humanity Street, advised he was a member of the Civil Air Patrol, New Orleans Squadron, New Orleans Airport, in 1955. When shown a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, Mr. BOESCH stated that OSWALD is unknown to him and was most definitely not affiliated with the New Orleans Squadron at any time during the period of membership of Mr. BOESCH.

Mr. BOESCH continued by saying that the members of the squadron never received any formal firearms training and no weapons had been issued to members. He said that very infrequently a member of the squadron would take his personally owned 22 caliber rifle to the airport where he would fire it on a makeshift range. He said that these occasions constituted the only times any member would do any shooting whatsoever and that these occasions were not part of official participation in Civil Air Patrol activities.

Mr. BOESCH was shown photographs of the device • utilized as a sling on the rifle of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He stated he could not identify it as anything with which he is familiar and was most explicit in stating that it is not a piece of equipment issued by the Civil Air Patrol.

NO T-1 advised SA RICHARD BUCARO on December 20, 1963 that he estimated there were approximately 45,000 money orders sent out from the New Orleans Western Union Telegraph Offices during the period, May to September, 1963, inclusive. These money orders were sent from the main office and seven branch offices and are filed in chronological order. He said money order records prior to May, 1963, have been destroyed in accordance with Western Union policy.

On December 24, 1963, NO T-1 advised SA RICHARD BUCARO that he had received authority from his main office in Dallas, Texas, to conduct a search of his outgoing money order records with instructions to utilize Western Union personnel to search for possible money orders sent by LEE HARVEY OSWALD under his true name and aliases which were furnished to him by Western Union, Dallas, Texas, along with names of OSWALD's associates, which search would cover the same names as were searched by Western Union in Dallas. NO T-1 stated he would begin the search on December 26, 1963, and estimated that it would take several days.

On January 1, 1964, NO **L1** advised that his personnel completed the search at the main office and seven branch offices late on January 3, 1964, as instructed, and no money order record was located which could be identified as having been sent by LEE HARVEY OSWALD.
