


Figure 26, 1963.

"The Dallas Times Herald" on January 14, 1964carried a story which quoted from a speech of the Attorney General of the State of Texas, Vaggoner Carri. delivered on the night of January 13, 1964, to the Brotherhood of the Highland Baptist Church in Dallas.

Mr. Carr reportedly stated that Federal Bureau of Investigation reports on Jack Ruby would be turned over to the Dallas District Attorney, Henry Vade, by the President's Commission investigating the assassination of President Kennedy. He said that you have agreed to turn over the data at the request of the Attorney General of the State of Texas who on Eaturday, January 11, 1964, gave the President's Commission all of the results of the Texas investigation into the assassination and the killing of Lee Harvey Oswald. He said that the District Attorney will be free to use the Federal Burcau of Investigation data in the prosecution of the accused slayer of Oswald.

Attorney General Carr also stated that he had not read all of the reports of the Texas investigation but from what he had read, he had come to these conclusions: "Oswald was a lone ranger and worked alone.

Telephone number CR. 5-5211 in Arlington, Texas, is located in the portion of the Bell Helicopter Company where Michael Paine is employed. Telephone number BL. 3-1628 is the residence number for Mrs. Ruth Paine. Michael Paine was interviewed and specifically denied making such a statement. On 1-10-64 Captain Barger advised he was unable to divulge his original source of information without first contacting the source as disclosure would put the source in jeopardy of losing his job. Captain Barger claimed not to know the name of his source. On 1-15-64 Captain Barger advised he had been unable to identify the source of his original information. He stated he had contacted the person he believed had furnished the information to him and had determined that this-person had not done so. MEMORANDUM FOR MR. SULLIVAN RE: LEE HARVEY OSWALD 105-82555

Bureau was attaching considerable importance to the allegation and he was instructed to take every step to resolve it. It was pointed out to the Dallas Office that Captain Barger indicating he cannot now recall the identity of his source is not very convincing. Consequently, Barger should be immediately and thoroughly reinterviewed.

It was pointed out that in the investigative report Barger's identity is concealed with a T Symbol. During the reinterview of Barger, the Agent should point out to him the significance of the allegation and the undesirability of having such an allegation attributed to an unidentified source. Dallas was instructed to get Captain Barger's consent to disclose his identity as the source of this allegation.

Dallas was also advised the Bureau did not desire to disseminate the report with this allegation unresolved. Dallas was instructed to submit the results of the interview of Barger on 1-15-64 on a separate 302 Form so that it could be included as page 66A of the report. Dallas was instructed to immediately interview Ruth Paine concerning this allegation and the results should be submitted so that they can be incorporated in the Dallas report.




