RULLIAXIGO 2 KOOY NOO F Peter Mc Laughlin, 160 Magnolia Avenue, Jersey City, New Jersey, was contacted on January 21, 1964, and acknowledgement was made of his letter to the Attorney General of the United States in which he asked if Oswald was a red-haired man since he met such a man, former U.S. Marine, in Mexico during October - November, 1962.

Mr. Mc Laughlin stated he sent the letter since he had never read in the newspaper regarding the color of Oswald's hair but did read he had been in Mexico during the above period of time in 1962. When advised that Oswald's hair was not red in color, he stated it was definitely not Oswald whom he had met but recalled the name given by this individual as John Otto Bridge. He stated he had met Bridge in Mexico City in October, 1962, and had been told by him he had been in the U.S. Marines. He noted Bridge had a Boston accent and was very interested in reading.

Kc Laughlin volunteered he was fifty-nine years of age; was born in a small town twelve miles from Glasgow, Scotland; came to the United States in 1927 after attending school until fourteen years of age and working in a steel mill in Scotland; was in the U.S. Army Air Force from 1942 to 1945 as a Radio Operator; has had different jobs in various parts of the United States, in particular in the transit bureau of Philadelphia, the Scioto Golf Club, Columbus, Ohio, and at the present is employed as a kitchen helper at the Harvard Club, 27 West 44th Street, New York, New York.

Operation INTERNAL SECURITY - RUSSIA - CUBA

The San Antonio Office of the FBL received anonymous letter postmarked 1-6-64, Norman, Oklahoma, addressed to "City - Mayor," Austin, Texas, which claimed BROUDER-BRUNDAGE, Tecumseh, Oklahoma, and his sister-in-law, PEARL, Communist leaders, were implicated in assassination of President of U.S. Files of Oklahoma City Office of FBI reflect Correspondence to FBI and made personal contact with representatives of FBI on many occasions from 1959-61, making numerous allegations against various persons, including BROUDER BRUNDAGE, Tecumseh, Oklahoma, and a PEARL or PEARL SWITH of Florida. On 1-23-64, it was ascertained that confined Central State Rospital, Norman, Oklahoma, as mental patient since 9-24-63.

DETAILS: On January 11, 1964, the San Antonio FBI Office received the following letter which was mailed in an envelope postmarked January 6, 1964, at 2:30 p.m., Norman, Oklahoma, and addressed to "City - Mayor," Austin, Texas. The envelope bore no return address, and the letter was anonymous. It is set forth as follows:

"Give-this-to-Mr. RUBY's-lawyer "then "Give-this-to-FBI.

"Who-killed-our-U.S. President?

"Mr. BROWDER-BRUNDAGE-of Tecumseh-Okla-thecommunist leader-of-Okla. Meet-Nov. 21 at-Ft Worth-His-sister-in-law PEARL-the communist-leader-of Florida-state-they-went-to-Dallas.

"She-knew-and-went-and-got Mr. OSWALD-tock-him-to-BROUDER-BROUDER-brain-washed-OSWALD promised-him-\$10,000.00 and-had-Mr. OSWALD-go get-his-guns-OSWALD-shot-Governor BROUDER shot-President-two-times-then-told-OSWALD-how to-escape--(and-get-killed-or-caught.). Es-was caught-and-to-city jail. They-was scared-CSWALD-would talk tell-on-them so-she-want-got-JACK-RUMT-brain-washed Mr. RUBY-(hypmotized) and had-him-kill-OSWALD.

"The-2 leaders-went-home

"Get-him-drunk-on-dope He tells-it-all

"He-has-killed- 22 "She-" " 33

"They-sat-hundreds-of-fires

"He-robed-bank 1930-where-worked

"sells-dope

reflect that a former resident of Tecumseh,
Oklahoma, directed correspondence to the FBI and made personal
contact with representatives of the FBI in Cklahoma and
Arkansas on many occasions from 1959 to 1961.

made
numerous allegations against various persons, including
BROUDER (BROWDER) BRUNDAGE, Tecumseh, Oklahoma, and a PEARL, or
PEARL SMITH of Florida.

On September 11, 1959, stated he was continually persecuted by BROWDER BRUNDAGE, Tecumseh, Cklahoma,

who he claimed had influenced his forbar against him and caused his relatives to commit him to a hospital. Indicated at that time that he had spent the past seven months in a hospital at Norman, Oklahoma.

On September 16, 1959, and October 5, 1959, contacted representatives of the FBI and claimed harassment by BROUDER BRUNDAGE, whom claimed was a Communist.

On July 5, 1961, appeared at the Oklahoma City Office of the FBI and furnished a five page handwritten statement in which he claimed he was being persecuted by the Communists. In the statement he claimed those persecuting him were as follows:

"GUS HALL - Washington, D. C. Mgr. PEARL SMITH - Florida - Supt over BROUDER BRUNDAGE - Tecumseh, Okla. RILEY - (PEARLS Son) - Dallas Texas BESSIE - Little Rock Ark."

In the above statement, stated that an FBI man at Fort Smith, Arkansas, told him how to trap PEARL. He added that PEARL was the daughter of Mrs. W. G. RIFFET, Shawnee, Oklahoma. He indicated that PEARL had killed two husbands, one at Weatherford, and one in Florida, in 1941.

On July 17, 1961, M. M. McDOUGAL, Attorney, Tulsa, Oklahoma, advised a representative of the FBI that had engaged him as an attorney in order to file a claim against the United States Government concerning a patent on a spot welder he cliegedly invented during World War II. McDOUGAL stated gave him a lengthy, handwritten brief concerning the invention and in which set forth considerable information concerning alleged Communist activities in the United States. Mentioned in the brief that one PEARL was allegedly the head of the Communist Party in Oklahoma. Indicated PEARL was in some way related to BROUDER BRUNDAGE of Tecumseh, Oklahoma, who was "a boss of Oklahoma" as well as a bank robber and dope addict.

In August, 1961, communicated with the Oklahoma City Office of the FBI on three occasions and stated he was committed to the Central State Hospital at Norman, Cklahoma, and

that he was same. In one letter he alleged that crooks had taken 1200 bed shoots from the hospital and shipped them to one PEARL in Florida and then to Cuba. Es also alleged that BROUDER BRUNDAGE took \$40,000, worth of equipment from the hospital.

On January 23, 1964, TED THUMPSON, Officer in Charge, Records and Personnel, Central State Hospital, Norman, Oklahoma, advised SA DONALD H. SLOAT that has been confined as a mental patient at that hospital since Deptember 24, 1963.
