The letter translated into the English language, which is quoted on the following page, is a letter from RUTH PAINE to MARINA OSWALD, dated May 16, 1963, and was obtained by the Dallas Police Department, along with other personal documents of MARINA OSWALD and her husband, LEE HARVEY OSWALD, through a search of the RUTH PAINE residence, at Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963. The content of the letter indicates that it was written at Irving, Texas, and it will be noted the OSWALDS were residing in New Orleans, Louisiana, on the date of the letter.

Date January 16, 19641

A letter, dated May 16, 1963, addressed to "Dear Marina" from "Ruth", written in the Russian language, and part of the personal correspondence and documents acquired by the Dallas Police Department from a search of the RUTH PAINE residence, 2515 Fifth Street, Irving, Texas, has been translated into the English language, and reads as follows:

"5/16/63

"Dear Marina,

"Back home again and everything is as usual; floor has to be scrubbed; dishes should be washed; there's a wash to be done - it is particularly lonesome after our visit which was interesting and unusual. It is true that life is busy now but not as interesting as at your place.

"I conducted war today against roaches and think that I will be victorious. I expect to prepare some new soup and salad so as to see if same will be good enough for Saturday's guests. I must explain that I know little concerning preparation of food for more than four. We'll see what will happen.

"Mikhail did not call me to ask for directions or way (?) I finally called him at work. He was never home at the apartment. I am angry with him today and plan to leave immediately for New York to look for a lover. He loves his machines - that's all. Regards to Lee and write me soon re: diapers, roaches and such home topics. Kiss June.

A-P-P-E-N-D-I-X

SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY

The Socialist Workers Party has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

LOUIS WEINSTOCK

A source advised on December 13, 1959, that on December 13, 1959, LOUIS WEINSTOCK elected to the National Committee of the Communist Party, USA, at its 17th National Convention held December 10-13, 1959.

Masthead of "The Worker" dated October 18, 1963, lists LOUIS WEINSTOCK as its business manager.

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. ~~SANTOS~~ ~~BUCH~~ identified himself and ROBERT ~~TABER~~ as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and TABER obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the aforementioned advertisement.

Ny Cuba
On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. However, during the past year this

source observed there has been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that today their influence is negligible.

On May 30, 1963, a second source advised that the National Headquarters of the FPCC is located in Room 329 at 799 Broadway, New York City. According to this source, the position of National Office Director was created in the Fall of 1962 and was filled by VINCENT "Ted" LEE, who now formulates FPCC policy. This source observed LEE has followed a course of entertaining and accepting the cooperation of many other organizations including the CP and the SWP when he has felt it would be to his personal benefit as well as the FPCC's. However, LEE has indicated to this source he has no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. LEE feels the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations, but not support the Cuban revolution per se.

The CP and the SWP have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

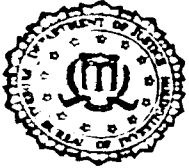
