

What if we come to visit you in New Orleans then? We may come on the evening of the 18th and live (spend?) with you a day or two. Then you may tell me if you wish to come to stay with me for the baby's birth. Of course, I wish very much that you would. I would be very glad to have your company at home and would be glad to look after June while you are in a hospital and afterwards, while you would be still weak after your confinement. It would be nice for her (June) here with children in the yard, etc. Our home is used to children!

If you wish to come to stay with me, then we can leave together for Dallas (on October 20, or thereabouts). But perhaps Lee would not let you go. He may feel lonesome without his wife and children. It is also true that a hospital here costs more, as you wrote in your letter. Before, I was looking for a hospital where it would cost less, but we do not have any like that here. Everything, including a doctor and hospital would cost here \$225.00. I am very sorry. But we may talk about this personally, may we not?

Please, address me by "thou" when writing to me (do they say it this way?) Try it. (THIS is from the verb "to try," is it not?). It would not be as hard for you to do in Russian as it is for me. Tell me please, is it correct to write "Thou" with a capital in letters as you do "You?"

I wrote to Ruth Kloefer about you. She is a secretary for the New Orleans Quaker Church (genitive of "church," feminine? I asked her if she knows any Russians in New Orleans. I also wrote to Mrs. Paul Blanchard, Secretary of the Unitarian Church in New Orleans. I also asked her if she knows any Russians there. Perhaps one or the other would be able to find a Russian friend for you.

Write without fail. Regards to Lee from me, please.
Kiss June.

Translator's Note: The sender writes a fairly good Russian, but she is not sure of her grammar; hence her questions regarding various word forms. She also gives in parentheses pronunciation of American proper names mentioned in the letter. She requests Marina to address her in letters with a familiar pronoun "thou" as is the Russian custom among close friends. (The writer herself uses "thou" in addressing Marina.) In a more formal letter, when using a pronoun "you," Russians spell it with a capital letter; that is why the writer asks if she should spell "thou" also with a capital (which is not done, as a rule).

Dear Marina,

Thank you very much for your letter which I received a week ago. I was very sorry to learn that Lee is not working. It is hard for him and for you in the meanwhile. I hope that he will begin (working) again soon. Perhaps, he has already began.

It is too bad, you are not in Dallas yet. I found out that you may go to the Parkland Hospital (there, in Dallas), and receive everything necessary and pay only according to your earnings. Those unable to pay do not have to.

But, in order to get this aid, you have to live in Texas for one year and, in Dallas County, for six months.

Lee told me that he learned a little from his uncle how to drive a car. It would be very useful for him to know how to drive. But it is hard to find time for this when he works every day.

Tomorrow, we and the children will go to Baltimore, Maryland, where Michael's brother and his wife live. We will spend one day there and then we will go further to Washington, where we will stay with sister until Thursday. Then back to Paoli again, where we will wait for my father. Referenced airtel requests San Antonio to advise if San Antonio files contain any information concerning a clothing purchase by OSWALD as reflected in the 11/30/63 edition of the New York Times.

Review of San Antonio files reflect the following communications were set forth both to the Bureau and Dallas which appear to refer to the incident mentioned in the New York Times newspaper:

1. San Antonio teletype to Bureau and Dallas dated 11/22/63, 12:35P, captioned ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, 11/22/63, Dallas, Texas;

2. San Antonio airtel to Bureau dated 11/28/63, captioned as number 1 above and accompanying LHM, also captioned as above. It is to be noted that this LHM begins by setting forth certain information appearing in the Laredo Times newspaper on 11/27/63 about an alleged purchase of clothing at Joe Brand Clothing Store, Laredo, Texas.

One copy of this airtel is being furnished New York for information.

ReBuairtel to Dallas 1/14/64 and San Antonio airtel 1/20/64 which made reference to San Antonio's letterhead 11/28/63. The information in San Antonio's 11/28 letterhead in the assassination case did not resolve the question raised by the article in 11/30/63 issue of "The New York Times," nor did it resolve the allegation of Vincent Christi. San Antonio endeavor to resolve these matters and report results suitable for dissemination under Oswald caption. Note that San Antonio's 11/23/63 letterhead referred to above has not been furnished to the Commission due to nonspecific nature of contents.

If necessary, Dallas should set forth lead for New York in effort to determine source of the allegation in the article in question. Dallas advise San Antonio and Bureau if a receipt from clothing store in Laredo was found among Oswald's personal effects. San Antonio include Dallas advice in report to be submitted.

The Times article reported that from a clothing receipt found in Oswald's possession it was determined that he purchased \$32 worth of clothing at a Laredo, Texas, clothing store prior to going to Mexico and that Federal Agents were checking into this. This does not appear to be the case. We inquired by referenced airtel as to whether this had been run out and it appears that a check passer using the name of Vincent Christi appeared at a clothing store in Laredo claiming to be an investigator assigned to Laredo Air Force Base. He said he was there checking on report that Oswald purchased \$40 worth of clothing at the store and in checking through old sale receipts, he selected one in the amount of \$39.81 saying this was Oswald's purchase. Christi then made a purchase and cashed a \$20 check. It was unknown at time of San Antonio's 11/28 letterhead whether or not check bounced, but it probably did as Christi is not known at Laredo Air Force Base. The letterhead is nonspecific,

To some extent every man dreams of being a heroic, romantic individualist operating beyond limits of society. The great heroes of the ages -- The Greek warriors, Robin Hood, Sir Lancelot, the gun-men of the American West, Charles Lindbergh, and Babe Ruth -- were men of such cast. With automation and "team-work" replacing individual skill and daring in the arts of war and work the hero-emu-ator looks increasingly to fictional characters for identification. Thus, such non-conformist modern knights as Mickey Spillane's Mike Hammer and Richard Boone's TV characterization of "Palladin" have emerged. The epitome of the unbound, individualistic hero is Ian Fleming's James Bond. Bond is the embodiment of all the great indomitable heroes. He is endowed with special physical skills, he is contemptuous of conventional opinion, his daring and arrogance are unlimited, he operates on the principle that the end justifies the means; he has authorization to murder adversaries, which he does prodigiously and with relish.

A normal adult receives vicarious satisfaction identifying with James Bond -- and it may be assumed that the late John Kennedy, a James Bond fan, could be so classified. On the other hand, a person of paranoid tendencies, who has developed real or fancied heroic qualities, must be under great temptation to prove that he is actually of

James Bond quality. This must be especially true of a potential "hero" such as Lee Harvey Oswald who had been repeatedly frustrated and deprecated.

Oswald considered himself to be a superior and uncommon individual who had been maltreated by society. He was a reader of James Bond. When he acquired a high powered weapon and developed skill in its use, it was almost inevitable that something more substantial than target practice would be needed to consume his need to prove that he was of heroic stature. The presidential parade in Dallas presented a unique and overwhelming stimulus.

In magnitude and improbability the assassination of President Kennedy had all of the characteristics of a James Bond escapade. The subsequent behavior of Oswald, especially the killing of police officer Tippitt and the symbolic flight to the movie "War is Hell," could not have been more aptly plotted by Ian Fleming. In fact, Oswald might have escaped detection had he been less intent upon playing his romantic role to the ultimate.

No one seems to question the probability of literature triggering the imitated mind of a child to re-enact a terrible crime of fiction. Isn't it just as likely that an immature, bitter and neurotic adult would be similarly influenced?

This records our findings concerning one of the false allegations in the highly critical, grossly inaccurate article, "Oswald and the FBI," by Harold Feldman which appeared in the 1-27-64 issue of "The Nation." Memorandum to Mr. Sullivan dated 1-25-64 reviewed this article; however, at that time we did not have the true facts concerning the following allegation:

Allegation:

Eugene Pugh, agent-in-charge of the Customs office on American side of the bridge at Laredo, Texas, said that Oswald had been checked by American immigration officials on entering and leaving Laredo; that this was not the usual procedure as Americans were not required to check in with Immigration when crossing the border but that "U. S. Immigration has a folder on Oswald's trip." It was also alleged that William Kline of the Customs Service at Laredo said Oswald's movements were watched (presumably during his trip to Mexico between 9-26 and 10-3 last), at the request of "a federal agency in Washington."

Facts:

Oran Eugene Pugh, agent-in-charge of U. S. Customs at Laredo says he received number of calls from all parts of country after the assassination but that he does not recall name of Harold Feldman, author of the article. He states he did make statement that Oswald was checked by U. S. Public Health at International Bridge, Laredo, upon his exit from Mexico, having been told this by his assistant William Kline. (Kline denies so informing Pugh and no record of subject at Public Health could be located in our investigation). Pugh denies stating that Oswald was checked by the Immigration and

Naturalization Service (INS) on entering and leaving Mexico, although he admits saying that Americans are not required to check in with INS on crossing the border. In connection with his reported statement that INS had a folder on Oswald's trip, Pugh claims he was misquoted and that he merely stated INS had a folder on Oswald, having been informed of this by William Kline.

Allan Skinner, Chief of INS at Laredo, states that his office has no record or folder which relates to Oswald's trip to Mexico. He said he answered several inquiries from news media to the effect he had no such record in his office.

William Kline, Pugh's assistant, denies making any statement to anyone at any time that Oswald's movements were watched at the request of a federal agency in Washington. While he received numerous inquiries from reporters following the assassination, he does not recall the name Harold Feldman or of talking with anyone from "The Nation" magazine. Kline says that on 11-23, at the request of the Assistant Commissioner of Customs, Washington, he made inquiry concerning Oswald's Mexican trip and learned from a Mr. Cash, the American Consul at Nuevo Laredo, that Oswald entered Mexico 9-26 and exited 10-3 at Nuevo Laredo. Kline says he had no knowledge whatsoever of any check made on Oswald by the U. S. Public Health Service at Laredo and he denies so informing his superior Pugh. He did inform Pugh that he learned from an INS investigator at Laredo that INS had a record of Oswald due to his returning to the U. S. with a Russian-born wife. It was his understanding that this record dealt only with Oswald's return from Russia and did not show any coverage on Oswald since that time.
