In connection with a phase of its proposed activity, the Commission is interested in knowing more about the residence of Lee Harvey Oswald during the 13-day period occurring between October 19, 1962, the date upon which he moved out of the YMCA at Dallas, Texas, and November 2, 1962, the date upon which he took up residence at 602 Elsbeth Street, Dallas, Texas.

We have reviewed all the information available to the Commission and have found that during the above-mentioned period, Oswald's residence is not known. Accordingly, the Commission has asked me to request of you that the Bureau undertake such steps as may be feasible in developing the desired information.

MARINA ADVISED SHE AND OSWALD OWNED TWO CAMERA ONLY AT TIME OSWALD'S DEATH. ONE CAMERA WAS RUSSIAN MADE AND BOUGHT IN RUSSIA, AT MINSK, SEPTEMBER SIXTYONE AND WAS LATER BROUGHT BY OSWALDS TO UNITED STATES. MARINA IDENTIFIES THIS CAMERA AS BEING CHEAP IN PRICE.

THE OTHER CAMERA OSWALD OWNED WAS AN AMERICAN CAMERA WHICH HAD BEEN THE PROPERTY OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD PRIOR TO HIS ENTRY INTO THE UNITED STATES MARINES. Dear Mr. Hoover:

Enclosed you will find a carbon copy of a letter addressed to the Attorney General which was sent to Congressman Hale Boggs, a member of this Commission, who in turn referred it to me. With respect to Mrs. Lou Wylie Hayes, the writer of the enclosed, Congressman Boggs in his referral letter to me stated in part:

"Mrs. Hayes is a thoroughly responsible person and information contained in her letter of December 11, 1963, should be checked out thoroughly by the Commission."

The letter is being forwarded to you for informational purposes and also with the request that you conduct an appropriate investigation to determine whether there is any additional evidence to support Oswald's statement to Mrs. Hayes that he had been recently in Cuba -- if, in fact, it was Oswald who was seated on the bus next to Mrs. Hayes. In this regard, I would respectfully suggest that the latter's identification of the former be made more certain through Bureau interview and evaluation.

I appreciate your continuing cooperation in the work of this Commission.

Dear Mr. Kennedy:

I am hesitant about writing you this letter as I do not know if the information it contains will be of any value, and at the same time unless I do, I shall always wonder if I might not have helped in some small way in the investigation of your wonderful brother's death.

Let me introduce myself first. I am a 70 year old retired newspaper woman who worked here on the Times Picayune, until 1928 when I went to New York and served variously as associate editor of Our Navy Magazine, a reporter for several years on the old Brooklyn Eagle, and for a brief time, when Stanley Walker was an editor on the New Yorker magazine I did leg work on assignments which the big brass wrote up. At other times I handled publicity for hotels, and as a volunteer for the Catholic Big Sisters, and Brotherhood Week. Mr. Harold Klein (I believe he now spells it Kline) who holds an executive office with the Manufacturers Hanover Trust Co., in Manhattan, and Mrs. Sarah DeForest, executive Secretary of the National Layman's Committee which stages Bible Week each year and which has offices 156 Fifth Ave., will remember me, as also Mr. Thomas Deegan of Thomas Deegan Co. Inc., now publicizing the New York World's Fair.

I returned to New Orleans in 1941, serving as publicist for Pan American Airways at a time when no reporters were allowed at the airport because of war time restrictions, also as an air raid warden instructor, during which time I worked with the F.B.I on several cases.

With the above information I hope that you will realize I am not a crank, trying to get my name in the papers. What I have to tell you is this. I am a volunteer worker for our Notre Dame Seminary Library, which is located on Carrollton Ave., and particularly during the warm weather I ride a Carrollton-Poydras Street bus to get back to town. This bus leaves at the junction of South Claiborne Ave., and Carrollton. On one particular day in September, the exact date of which I cannot recall, I boarded one of these buses, probably at 2:30 pm on a week day. I know that it was after school opened, and probably around the middle of the month. I took my favorite seat on the right hand, next the window, of the first cross-wise seat in the bus, going back to the city. Either when I got on or shortly after a group of high school boys boarded the bus and took the front side seats on each side. A little later, at a stop I cannot recall, a slim young man in a rather rumpled but clean sport shirt, khaki trousers, and carrying a small overnight bag of soft canvas such as one can buy at the chain drug stores boarded the bus and sat down by me. He seemed to be in quite a state of elation and was looking eagerly at people's face in a

way which indicated he wanted to start up a conversation. Evidently he felt the school boys had noticed him and he launched into a breathless and highly elated account of his visit to Cuba, which had just culminated at his arrival at the New Orleans Airport.

"I saw Castro" he told them, "He is a fine guy. A Great person. From now on no prisoners are going to be returned to the United States unless I say so."

This of course startled me and I turned to look at him in the belief he was a hop head of some sort, but he simply appeared to be a highly pleased and excited young man. I asked him how he happened to be in Cuba.

"I flew there" he said, "The State Department is using me because of my contacts with Cuba. I spoke to the people and I told them Castro was a great man."

I then asked him how he got back.

"In an army plane" he said. "A U.S. Army plane. They flew me here, and the F.B.I met me and brought me to the corner of Canal Street (he gave the name of the other street but I don't remember it) and....."

I asked why they didn't take him all the way home.

"They don't want to know where I live. They don't want anybody to know where I live" he said.

The school boys were giggling and this seemed to anger him.

"At the airport they shoved a mike in my hand" he said, doubling his fist like a mike and holding it in front of his face. "I said hello to everybody. I told them Castro was a great guy and that we should all be friends."

At the time I thought he was referring to our own airport but now I believe he meant the airport in Cuba.

I questioned him further about Castro and he said "I never got to talk to him at all. He just shook hands with me and they rushed me right on out to the airport. From now on, I am going to Cuba and arrange every time the prisoners who are going to be sent back."

He then got off the bus, at a cross street, possibly Napoleon Av for he had a transfer in his hand. We all had a laugh, but I was rather disturbed and so when I got to town I went to a friend's apartment and called the City Desk of the New Orleans States, whose editor, Walter Cowan, told me no celebrity had arrived at our airport, and I then called the F.B.I and told them of the incident, saying that the man was probably a nut but that perhaps there might be something in their files on him and they would like to know he was back in town. I recognized this man as Oswald as soon as I saw a clear picture of hi

For the benefit of the A.P. writer in New York who wrote that Oswald could not be a Marxist without being a Communist, I would like to point out that at the time I was keeping a couple of people under surveillance for the F.B.I here I was told that one of them, a lad named Bancroft, who now has a United Nations job, was one of the high ranking Communists and did not carry a card, as they removed from their files all information on their top flight operatives so they could not be identified as party members.

My own unalterable belief is that Oswald was a Communist, that he bungled his job and went haysire and that Ruolo was assigned to remove him. The indignation over the murder of our president would be the logical out he would use in his defense.

Dorothy Thompson, speaking before the New York Women's Press Club, of which I was a member, told us soon after the fall of France that all Communist take-overs followed a pattern. First, the people by a constant barrage of propaganda were caused to distrust their leaders. Then, when some controversial issue came up, both sides were infiltrated and a revolution started, during which time those of our people who were Communists and were in high places would engineer a take over of the government. That pattern is pretty plain here. The only thing is that this country didn't react according to those in Europe--and Africa.

From my own personal experience with the F.B.I it is easy for me to believe what Oswald told about them meeting him at the plane, and we could well have been using him through the State Department which has a pro-Castro record, without anyone being the wiser.

I am sorry that I cannot remember the date, or the streets where the men boarded and left the bus, but after I culled the paper and the F.B.I I put this out of my mind until I saw Oswald's face on TV.

Enclosed is one copy each of a letter from J. Lee Rankin of the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy and its enclosure, both of which are self-explanatory.

For your information, Bufiles disclose a letter dated 7-28-42 from Mrs. Lou Wylie Van Sicklen, 725 1/2 St. Peter Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, who appears to be identical with Mrs. Lou Wylie Hayes, wherein she related several unrelated incidents concerning individuals who reportedly made pro-Japanese statements. She indicated she was a former newspaper woman having worked in New York for some 12 years and only recently returned to the south. She stated she would do anything in her power to be of assistance.

With regard to Walter Cowan, city editor, "New Orleans States" newspaper, referred to in the enclosed communication, Bufiles contain no information identifiable with him.

New Orleans immediately check indices to determine whether Mrs. Hayes contacted the New Orleans Office as alleged and definitely resolve this matter. In the absence of information in your files dictating to the contrary, Mrs. Hayes should be contacted for any additional specific information she may be able to furnish concerning this matter, following which Walter Cowan, city editor "New Orleans States" newspaper, should also be contacted for any corroborating information.

On 1/31/64, GEORGE E. BLACKSTOCK, Canadian Consul, New Orleans, exhibited application for Canadian passport filed by Reverend ALBERT OSBORNE at office of Canadian Consulate General, New Orleans. OSBORNE furnished his residence address as 1441 Doumond Street, Montreal, Canada. Following descriptive data contained in application: Born 11/12/88, Grimsley Linco, England, 5'10", 200 pounds, blue eyes, male, brown and gray hair, single, no scars or marks, occupation, minister. Claims resided in Canada from 8/2/17 to the present time and is a naturalized citizen of Canada due to service in the Canadian Armed Forces. OSBORNE's passport, # 4-347367, which was issued in June, 1963, was canceled and Canadian passport # 5-605377 dated 10/10/63 was issued to him by Chief Clerk PERCY WHATMOUGH, Canadian Consulate General's Office. This passport is valid to 10/10/68 and was delivered to OSBORNE personally 10/10/63. OSBORNE exhibited birth certificate and record of his service in the Canadian Armed Forces. He signed an affidavit claiming that no one in New Orleans knew him well enough to act as a guarantor because he was "in transit". The file

contained a letter from OSBORNE dated 10/16/63 at Mexico D. F. which was received at the Canadian Consulate General's office 10/18/63 and thanked the office employees for their kindness and enclosed \$5.00 for BLACKSTOCK to purchase a little present for the clerical force. The \$5.00 was returned to OSBORNE by letter dated 10/18/63 which was addressed to Reverend ALBERT OSBORNE, C/O American Express Company, Niza 22, Mexico D. F.

Chief Clerk PERCY WHATMOUGH advised 1/31/64 that during his conversation with OSBORNE at the time OSBORNE was in the Consular General's Office, OSBORNE said that he had come to New Orleans from his residence in Montreal by bus and that he was on his way to Mexico City by bus and that he considered this to be a vacation. Mr. WHATMOUGH did not know what bus route OSBORNE had taken from Montreal to New Orleans or the intended route from New Orleans to Mexico City.

Mr. J. A. DONALD, Canadian Consular General's Office, New Orleans, advised 1/31/64 that in many instances natives of Briton claim dual citizenship and therefore continue to carry a British passport in addition to a Canadian passport. It is suggested that the Bureau may wish to have Legat, London, determine if ALBERT OSBORNE or JOHN HOWARD BOWEN have possession of a valid British passport.

At 8:40 p.m. on 2/4/64, Olla Wells, Room 1744, Sherman Hotel, Chicago, Illinois, telephonically contacted the Bureau and furnished the following information: Wells identified herself as a writer who is active in politics and a personal friend of the Director. She indicated she had information regarding the President's assassination and said her information was that a Mexican meat company had offered a \$500,000 reward for the President's assassination and that Lee Harvey Oswald had dropped a cigarette lighter at the scene of the crime which had the name of the meat company painted on it. Wells declined to furnish any additional information over the phone indicating she was fearful of her life and was even reluctant to furnish her name. She concluded by stating that she would be waiting at the hotel and terminated the conversation.

Bureau files also indicate one Olla Wells, 542 Washington Boulevard, Oak Park, Illinois, was arrested in 1955 by the Chicago Police Department at the Sherman Hotel for soliciting. At this time Wells insisted she was an FBI informant and was subsequently interviewed and she wildly raved about the police. Preston Wells, her husband, advised Chicago Agents his wife had been imagining she was an FBI and police informant for years.

Chicago has additional information on this individual, however, it is not known if she is identical with the Olla Wells who telephonically contacted the Bureau on 2/4/64.

In view of the importance of this investigation and the allegations made, Chicago is instructed to locate and interview Wells concerning the allegations made by her. Her call to the Bureau should be acknowledged and the results of your inquiry furnished to the Bureau and Dallas in appropriate insert form, 25 copies for Dallas.

While it would appear Wells is identical with the subject of prior Chicago investigations and the mental condition of this individual might preclude prosecution, Chicago is nevertheless reminded to be alert for a violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 1001, for furnishing false information to a Federal officer.


