NOTE: By letter 2-1-64 Mr. Rankin requested that the trousers and shoes of Oswald which he wore when arrested be obtained from the Dallas PD and forwarded to the Commission. He also requested to be advised what further items were in the possession of Dallas PD relevant to this investigation. We did obtain the trousers and shoes of Oswald and they were delivered to the Commission, for its use 2-2-64, by a SA of the Dallas Office. We also have now received 2 letters which were in the possession of the Dallas PD concerning Oswald which inadvertently had not been turned over by the police to be forwarded to the Bureau along with all other evidence that was sent to the Bureau. We have made copies of these letters and are enclosing them herein. The originals of the letters will be maintained by the FBI Laboratory along with all the other items of evidence in this case.

Protero, Amadora, Portugal, indicates that Protera identifies himself as former communist leader who repudiated communism and is residing in Portugal under protection of authorities. He indicated he is writing an article entitled "Oswald Didn't Killed Kennedy Bret, Yes..???", "The Yellow Danger." Protero requested he be furnished the name of an American book publisher who would publish his book. Protero also sent similar letter in English to the Attorney General. Dear Mr. Rankin:

This refers to a treatise by Dr. Jose I. Lasaga entitled "Possible Psychological Motivations in the Assassination of President Kennedy," a copy of which has been furnished to the Commission by the Department of Justice.

In his treatise Dr. Lasaga stated that through very reliable sources it had been ascertained that Lee Harvey Oswald held an extended interview with the Cuban Ambassador in Mexico, whom he met in a restaurant on the outskirts of the city, from where they both later departed in the Ambassador's automobile for a private conversation. We have been informed that Dr. Lasaga, in presenting his paper to a member of the White House Staff, said he received the aforementioned allegation from Angel Fernandez Varela, an employee of The Voice of Cuba in Miami, who in turn received it from Salvador Diaz Verson, who was in Mexico City after the assassination doing investigative work on behalf of an unnamed principal.

There are enclosed for your information two copies of a memorandum dated January 29, 1964, and a report of Special Agent James J. O'Connor dated January 23, 1964, at Miami, Florida, setting forth the results of our investigation into Dr. Lasaga's allegation. Dr. Eduardo Borrell Navarro, a former Cuban Cabinet Minister, who according to

Pursuant to your instructions, SAC Robert Rightmeyer of the Houston Office was contacted during the evening of 2-7-64. He was referred to the article that appeared in "The Nation" magazine which in turn referred to an article prepared by Lonnie Hudkins of the "Houston Post" under the headline "Oswald Rumored as Informant for the U.S." SAC Rightmeyer was advised that the Bureau had been informed that Hudkins had claimed that Lee Harvey Oswald bore the designation of 179 as an informant of the FBI and was paid \$200 a month for the FBI. SAC Rightmeyer was instructed to arrange for the immediate interview of Hudkins concerning his knowledge as to whether Oswald was an informant of the FBI or the U. S. Government. He was instructed to advise Hudkins that it had been reported to this Bureau that he had made a statement that Oswald had a symbol number of 179 and was paid \$200 as an informant for the FBI. Concerning this latter, SAC Rightmeyer was instructed to pin Hudkins down and, if he had any evidence of this, he should produce it. If not, we should get a signed statement from Hudkins. SAC Rightmeyer was advised that the entire interview with Hudkins should be reduced to a signed statement but he most specifically should cover the payment of \$200 and the symbol number 179.

SAC Rightmeyer raised a question whether or not the Bureau wanted to have Hudkins interviewed if they could not reach him until late tonight. He was advised that, under the circumstances, it would probably be best to reach Hudkins tonight and make an appointment to meet him tomorrow. SAC Rightmeyer also noted that it is entirely possible that Hudkins is presently in Dallas in which event he will contact the Dallas Office and relay these instructions to that office. SAC Rightmeyer was instructed to send in the material by teletype tomorrow.

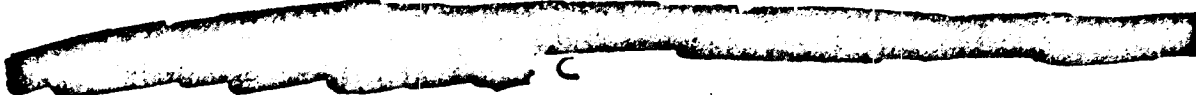

It is to be noted that the White House was in receipt of a paper entitled "Possible Psychological Motivations in the Assassination of President KENNEDY" written by JOSE I. LASAGA of Miami, Florida. This speculative paper attempted to establish that the motivation of OSWALD in the assassination of President KENNEDY was FIDEL CASTRO or a CASTRO agent and that OSWALD was motivated during his trip to Mexico between September 27 and October 2, 1963. The paper alleged that OSWALD held an extended interview with the Cuban Ambassador in Mexico City whom he met in a restaurant on the outskirts of Mexico City, from which restaurant they both later left in the Ambassador's car for a talk without being overheard.

The source of this latter information was alleged to be SALVADOR DIAZ VERNON. This individual was interviewed at Miami. He stated that while in Mexico City November 28-29, 1963, attending the Congress of the International Federation of Professional Newspaper Organizations, he was at the offices of the newspaper "Excelsior" on the night of November 25, 1963. There he learned through the Mexican press that the Mexican Government had arrested one SILVIA DURAN; that DURAN

allegedly had OSWALD as a guest in her house during his visit to Mexico; and that DURAN placed OSWALD in contact with officials of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City.

DIAZ VERNON went on to claim that he was told by Dr. BORRELL NAVARROS, an exiled Cuban newspaperman employed by "Excelsior," that OSWALD and DURAN on the day following OSWALD's arrival in Mexico City went to a restaurant called the Caballo Blanco or possibly the Caballo Bayo where they met an official of the Cuban Embassy. DIAZ VERNON claimed that he knows nothing about OSWALD and the Cuban official leaving the restaurant together in a car.

It was ascertained that Dr. EDUARDO BORRELL NAVARRO, a former Cuban Cabinet Minister who on occasion writes feature articles for the Mexico City daily newspaper "Excelsior," currently resides at 1303 Homero Street, Apartment 301, Mexico City. BORRELL NAVARRO was interviewed by a confidential source abroad on January 11, 1964, at which time he furnished the following information:

SALVADOR DIAZ VERNON was in Mexico City as claimed and discussed LEE OSWALD with BORRELL and other Cuban exiles. DIAZ VERNON also visited BORRELL in BORRELL's home.

BORRELL did not tell the story credited to him by DIAZ VERNON concerning the visit to a Mexico City restaurant by OSWALD and SILVIA DURAN. BORRELL had never heard this story or any similar story before.

BORRELL knew of no meeting between OSWALD and Cuban Embassy officials other than the meetings which allegedly occurred at the time OSWALD visited the Cuban Consulate in Mexico City.

BORRELL knew nothing concerning any visit by OSWALD to the home of DURAN.

It is to be noted that DURAN, whose complete name is SILVIA TIRADO DE DURAN and who was an employee of the Cuban Consulate in Mexico City, was questioned by Mexican authorities on November 23, 1963. At that time she confirmed that OSWALD had visited the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City during the time

He was in Mexico City from September 27 to October 2, 1963. She alleged that the purpose of his visits to the Cuban Embassy was to obtain a Cuban visa. She stated she had given him a telephone number to use in calling her concerning the visa, but denied that he had ever visited in her home.

On January 17, 1964, a source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that he had been unable to locate a Caballo Blanco Restaurant in Mexico City, but stated that there is a Caballo Bayo Restaurant located on the outskirts of Mexico City. The source said this is an extremely large, typical Mexican restaurant which does a very thriving business. He advised that on January 11, 1964, he exhibited photographs of former Cuban Consul EUSEBIO AZCUE LOPEZ, who was in charge of the Cuban Consulate at the time of OSWALD's visit there, of Cuban Ambassador JOAQUIN HERNANDEZ ARMAS, of SILVIA DURAN, and of the subject to employees of the Caballo Bayo Restaurant and had conducted extensive interviews of these employees. The source said he was unable to find anyone among the employees who could recall any of the persons whose photographs were exhibited as having been at the restaurant.

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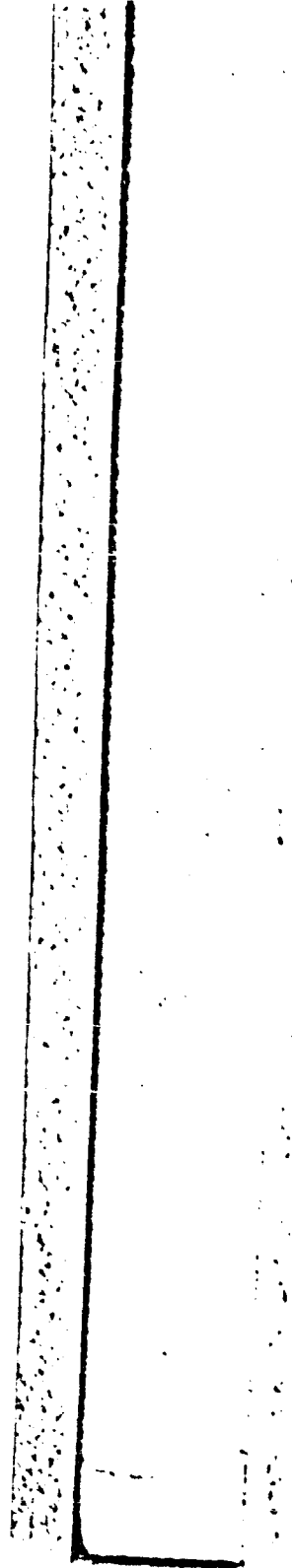
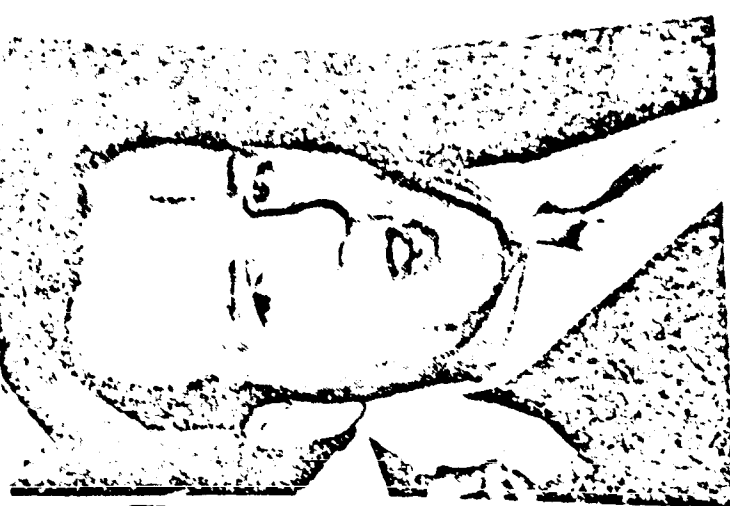

SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT

At 9:45 p. m. on 2-9-64, Kemper received a call from Sid Roberts of Associated Press. Roberts said that an exclusive had just come out in the "Fort Worth Star Telegram" that there was an eye witness to the assassination of the President. This eye witness was purported to be a Negro janitor who saw Oswald shoot the President and that he is going to testify to this before the Warren Commission. According to the story, the janitor was on the same floor with Oswald and stated, "Oswald almost stepped on me." According to the story, the janitor was arrested for vagrancy and has been held since that time in protective custody.

In line with our policy, no comment was made on this matter.

At 9:55 p. m. , 2-9-64, Tom Pettit of NBC, Dallas, called about the same story. He said that he had talked to Mr. Ed Guthman of the Department and Mr. Guthman said that he had not seen anything in FBI reports concerning such a witness.

It is noted that Mr. Guthman had called me in this regard and stated he was going to cut the rumor off.

At 10:06 p. m. , 2-9-64, Mr. John Riseling of the "Washington Post" called concerning this story and he was given no comment and referred to Mr. Guthman.

We are checking for explanation of this entry as it suggests that Mrs. Paine may on 10-23-63 have known of subject's purchase of the rifle. If so, this will establish that Paine has been untruthful to us re her knowledge of the rifle and it is also possible she may have had knowledge of the Walker incident. Marina Oswald's refusal to admit to us her knowledge of subject's Mexican trip appears significant and suggests either that there was more to the trip than has been developed to date or that Marina was protecting someone possibly Mrs. Paine who has denied ever talking to Marina about the trip. Necessary that we have report on these aspects by Friday to insure Commission has all the facts prior to taking testimony from Mrs. Paine.

By referral from Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach on 1/2/64, we were furnished a copy of a treatise on the possible psychological motivations of the assassination of the President, which had been presented to the White House by Dr. Jose I. Lasaga, an exiled Cuban psychologist. The treatise contained an allegation that "through very reliable sources" Dr. Lasaga ascertained Oswald held an extended interview with the Cuban Ambassador to Mexico, whom he met in a restaurant on the outskirts of Mexico City, from where they both later left in an automobile for a talk without being overheard. From this Lasaga concluded that Oswald's actions in applying for Cuban and Soviet visas while in Mexico City were nothing "but a gigantic alibi." This details results of our inquiry into this allegation, which we find has no basis in fact.

### THE TREATISE:

Dr. Lasaga's paper is a highly speculative document in which the basic premises have been drawn from articles in the press. In it he endeavors to reason that Oswald was motivated in the assassination by unnamed Cuban agents during his trip to Mexico City in late September and early October, 1963. The above allegation was made by Dr. Lasaga in support of the above conclusion. Pressed by a White House Staff member for his source of this allegation, Lasaga said he received it from Angel Fernandez Varela, an exiled Cuban attorney and editor who, in turn, received the information from Salvador Diaz Verson, an exiled Cuban newspaperman. Dr. Lasaga volunteered the information that Diaz Verson developed the information in Mexico City where, after the assassination, he was doing investigative work in behalf of an unnamed principal.

The Department, in furnishing a copy of the treatise to us, advised it was making a copy of it available to the President's Commission.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION:

Investigation by Miami and Legal Attache, Mexico City, has developed the following: Diaz Verson stated that while in Mexico City in late November, 1963, shortly after the assassination, attending a newspaper congress, he was told by Dr. Borrell Navarros, a medical doctor employed by Mexican newspaper "Excelsior," that Oswald on the day after his arrival in Mexico City in September, 1963, traveled to the Caballo Blanco or Bayo restaurant where he met a functionary of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City. Diaz Verson said no mention was made by Dr. Navarros that Oswald left the restaurant in a car in order to engage in private conversation and he denied that Borrell referred to the Cuban Embassy official as the Cuban Ambassador. Diaz Verson admitted passing the information received from Dr. Borrell to Fernandez Varela but he denied saying the Cuban official was actually the Cuban Ambassador and that the Cuban and Oswald left the restaurant together in a car.

Fernandez Varela stated that Diaz Verson told him that the Cuban Ambassador to Mexico met with Oswald at the Caballo Bayo restaurant in Mexico City and left the restaurant in a car. He admitted passing this information to Dr. Lasaga, telling Lasaga that in his opinion all of the statements of Diaz Verson might not be true, as he believed Diaz Verson was inclined to embellish a story to make it more interesting. Fernandez Varela denied telling Dr. Lasaga that Diaz Verson was in Mexico acting on behalf of an unnamed principal.

Dr. Borrell Navarro, former Cuban Minister of Education during the Batista regime, on interview in Mexico City stated he did not tell the story credited to him by Diaz Verson. He added he had never heard such a story and knew of no meeting between Oswald and any official of the Cuban Embassy in a restaurant in Mexico City. He said that all he knew concerning Oswald's activity in Mexico were the published accounts of Oswald's visit to the Cuban Consulate. Investigation through our sources at the Caballo Bayo restaurant was negative.

RECOMMENDATION:

That reports of our investigation into Lasaga's allegation be furnished to the Deputy Attorney General and the President's Commission. Attached are letters for this purpose.

Reference is made to my memorandum 2/7/64, wherein information was set forth concerning articles appearing in the Italian press to the effect that Oswald had worked for the Bureau and CIA. You were informed that Bureau files were being checked concerning Lucio Manisco, New York City correspondent for the Italian newspaper "Il Messaggero"; Manisco was the author of one of the referenced articles. Bureau files disclosed the following:

In March, 1962, a confidential informant furnished information indicating that Manisco was making arrangements to obtain a visa to travel to Cuba. In this connection, he was in contact with the Czech Embassy. (Bureau file 105-108744).

In 1960, we were investigating Mario Rossi, a newspaper writer who allegedly had cooperated with the Israeli intelligence service. Our investigation disclosed that in 1959 a check from the bank account of Rossi was endorsed for deposit to the account of Manisco. In 1959, Rossi advised us that his only association with Manisco was to substitute for Manisco as a correspondent for an Italian newspaper. (Bureau file 64-33017, Serials 49 and 54).
