It would facilitate the work of this Commission if your Bureau would conduct appropriate tests to determine the amount of time required to travel by bus from the stop located nearest Crozier Technical High School, 2218 Bryan, to the stop nearest to the erctwhile Oswald residence on Neeley Street in Dallas. These tests should be conducted on any weekday at approximately 6 p.m. and 7:15 p.m.

It would also be helpful if the Bureau could determine the time required to ride a bus from the stop nearest General Walker's hond at Holl Turtle Creek Boulevard to the stop located nearest Oswald's erstwhile home on Necley Street in Dallas. This latter test should be conducted at any time after 9 p.m. on a weekday evening.

Reference is made to your letter of January 31, 1964, requesting this Bureau conduct time tests on bus travel between specified locations in the Dallas, Texas, area.

On February 3, 1964, Special Agent Ivan D. Les of our Dallas Office conducted the requested tests with the following results:

At 6:12 p.m. Special Agent Lee boarded a Dallas Transit Company Bockley Avenue bus at the corner of Bryan and Crockett Streets, adjacent to Crozier Technical-High School, 2218 Bryan Street. He took this bus to the corner of Beckley Avenue and Neeley Street, which is the nearest bus stop to Oswald's former residence, 214 West Neeley Street, arriving at 6:33 p.m., elapsed travel time being 21 minutes.

This same route was again traveled commencing at 7:19 p.m. and terminating at 7:36 p.m., elapsed travel time being 17 minutes. Special Agent Lee pointed out the above two buses taken by him at 6:12 p.m. and 7:19 p.m. are the first buses scheduled to depart after the hour.

Special Agent Lee walked at an average pace from the bus stop at the corner of Beckley Avenue and Neeley Street to Oswald ge former, residence, elapsed walking time boing two minutes and fifty seconds.

The nearest bus stop to General Edwin A. Walker's residence, 4011 Turtle Creek Boulevard, Dallas, is located at the corner of Avondale and Oak Lawn Avenues, approximately one block west of the residence. The first bus scheduled to leave from this bus stop after 9:00 p.m. is a Preston Hollow Express which Special Agent Lee boarded at 9:26 p.m. He arrived at a bus transfer point in the 1600 block of Blm Street at 9:38 p.m. and alighted. At 9:53 p.m. Special Agent Lee boarded a Beckley Avenue. bus and alighted from same at the corner of Beckley Avenue and Neeley Street at 10:05 p.m., elapsed travel time being 39 minutes.

The Dallas Transit Company advised Special Agent Lee the bus schedules in effect on February 3, 1964, have been in effect for over a year. This concludes our inquiry into this particular matter.

NOTE: By letter dated 1/31/64 the President's Commission requested appropriate tests be made to determine bus travel time from Crozier Technical High School to the former Oswald residence on Neeley Street in Dallas around 6:00 and 7:15 p.m. The Commission also desired to know the time it would take to go by bus from General Walker's residence to Oswald's former residence after 9:00 p.m.

Dallas Office immediately instructed to conduct these tests, results of which furnished to Bureau on 2/4/64 and are set out in the above letter.

While we have not been apprised of the purpose of these tests by the President's Commission, the following is set out as a possible explanation for same.

Dallas Police Department records disclose General Walker reported a shot was fired into his residence about 9:00 p.m. on 4/10/63.

Dallas report of SA Warren C. DeBrueys dated 12/8/63 on pages 284 and 285 set out interviews of Marina Oswald on 12/3 and 12/4/63. She advised during the Spring of 1963 they resided on Neeley Street. One evening in the Spring of 1963 her husband indicated he was going to typing class at the Dallas evening school (Crozier Technical High School where Oswald last attended on 4/8/63) where he normally attended two or three times a week. On this particular evening he was very late and arrived home about midnight, very pale, agitated and excited at which time he admitted trying to kill General Walker by shooting at Walker with a rifle. Marina Oswald stated her husband normally would depart the Neeley Street address sometime between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. returning home about 9:00 p.m.

From the above it would appear the Commission is endeavoring to determine the truthfulness of statements and feasibility of information previously furnished by Marina Oswald as it relates to the other known activities of Oswald. It is possible this information may be necessary in connection with the current questioning of Marina Oswald by the Commission.

On 2/2/64, the clothing worn by Oswald at the time he was shot by Jack Ruby was brought to the Laboratory by SA Vincent E. Drain of the Dallas Office. This clothing consisted of the following items:

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1 pair of black shoes, loafer style
1 pair of black trousers
1 gray flannel shirt
1 T shirt
1 black sweater
1 pair of black socks

These items were examined for visible or invisible laundry and dry cleaners markings, but none were found. All items appeared to be of domestic manufacture with the exception of the shoes which were made in Japan.

A small piece of white paper bearing the following telephone numbers was found in the right side pocket of the trousers:

> "OR 9-9450 RI-8-9711 AC-2-4611 CO-7-3110 CH-7"

The "RI-8-9711" number was written in pencil. The remaining numbers in what appeared to be a ball-point pen. The "CH-7" number was crossed through.

These numbers were called to the attention of Supervisor James Malley, Division VI, who telephonically furnished them to the SAC of Dallas.





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SUBJECT LEE HARVEY OSWALD INTERNAL SECURITY - RUSSIA - CUBA

It will be noted that our New Orleans Office has previously stated that they interviewed Lee Harvey Oswald on 8-10-63 at his request.

On 2-7-64 SAC Harry Maynor was contacted and he was instructed to obtain information concerning the following: (1) How did the New Orleans Office learn that Oswald wanted to see an Agent while he was incarcerated in jail on 8-10-63? (2) Why did Oswald want to see an FBI Agent? Mr. Maynor was advised that if information concerning the above was not readily available, he should contact the person who made the request to the New Orleans Office and find out from this person what Oswald said as to why he wanted to see an Agent.

SAC Harry Maynor telephonically advised that Lieutenant Francis Martello, First District, New Orleans Police Department, telephonically advised the New Orleans Office on 8-10-63 that his department had arrested an individual on 8-9-63 who desired to talk with an FBI Agent.

SA John Lester Quigley proceeded to the New Orleans Police Department and went directly to Martello's office. Martello had on his desk several documents that appeared to be connected with the Fair Play for Cuba Committee. While looking at the literature, another officer brought Oswald to Martello's office. Martello then introduced Quigley to Oswald as being an FBI Agent. Quigley showed his credentials and proceeded to interview Oswald regarding his activities, particularly on 8-9-63, and his background. At no time during the interview did Oswald indicate why he wanted to talk to an FBI Agent. Oswald was not specifically questioned in this regard since Martello had previously stated Oswald wanted to talk to an Agent.

On 2-7-64 Martello was questioned by SA Quigley to determine the basis for Martello's prior advice to the effect Oswald desired to see an FBI Agent. Martello said he interviewed Oswald on the morning of 8-10-63 and had secured some information concerning Oswald's activities in the Fair Play for Cuba Committee in New Orleans. Near the end of the


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interview Martello said Oswald informed he would like to speak to an FBI Agent. Martello said he did not know why he wanted to see an Agent and he did not question him as to why but merely complied with Oswald's request.

I talked with SAC Shanklin, Dallas, on the morning of 2/7, to refresh my recollection that we had talked to Reporter Lonnie Hudkins of the Houston Post some time ago.

Shanklin said that on 12/28/63 Mrs. Paine advised that a reporter had talked to her and was coming back again to see her; that he said that according to a speially prominent woman in Fort Worth, who Mrs. Marguerite, Oswald (the mother) ' worked for in September or October 1962,' Lee Oswald was doing important antisubversive work for the government. The reporter was Lonnie Hudkins, who referred to an article in the NY Times speculating that Oswald might have made a deal with the US Government to return to the US from Russia and work on antisubversive work.

Our Houston office interviewed Hudkins on 12/31/63. The socially prominent woman was Linda Rosenthal, of Fort Worth. Hudkins said that he was on a "fishing expedition" and was attempting to determine if Oswald was a stool pigeon for a government agency.

We had already interviewed Nrs. Lowell N. (Linda) incomental on 11/29/63. She said she got the impression from Mrs. Marguerite Oswald that her solwas working for the US in Russia, but she had nothing specific in this respect.

I told Shanklin to send this in by teletype so that we would have it all together in case we had to reinterview. Hudkins and/or Wade. The teletype is attached.

O'CONNER stated that at the man's instructions he went to a small coffee shop located on South Broadway across from the Montgomery Wards Department Store on that same afternoon. On arrival at the coffee shop he was met by two men, one of whom did all the talking, and the other of whom had very little to say. whated that he was in possession of information which he was corraid would not be made available to the public unless he wook this action. He said the man thereupon showed him 4 or 5 pages of mimeographed material, the first page of which bore the heading "The following is a report of the Federal Bareau of Investigation." Mr. O'CONNER stated that the page also had the notation "Classified" stamped on it within a black border. Mr. O'CONNER stated that no degree of classification was listed on this page and that the word "Classified" was all that appeared thereon. He described the mimeographed pages as being in his opinion a copy of another copy and stated = ; that the words were barely legible and the condition of the pages themselves as being very poor. He also stated that it looked to him like a church or school bulletin and that the grade of the paper appeared to be very inferior.

Mr. O'CONNER stated that a perusal by him of the contents of these pages disclosed that it was merely a recount of the events of the assassination of the President JOEN F. KENNEDY which appeared in many newspapers. He said the only information which had not been public knowledge up to this time was a short paragraph claiming that the assassination of the President had been planned and executed by the "La Cosa Nostra" and that LEE HARVEY OSMALD had been paid by the "Cosa Nostra" to carry out the assassination of the President. O'CONNER said that this material also indicated that JACK RUEY was a "soldier" of the "Cosa Nostra" and had been instructed to do away with OSWALD after the assass-! ination.

O'COMMER advised that since the news content of this material was not substantiated by any facts and in his opinion did not seem real to him, he told the two men that . he was not interested in putting this information out over the air. He said that his reluctance to handle this information was further strengtened by the fact that they did not furnish their names or support the content of the material by any factual cource.

Hr. O'COINER adviced that neither of these men claimed to be appointed with the FBI nor did they furnish any credentials to support any appointion with any Government

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clonel. He recalled that the spokesman for the two inferred that he had access to classified material and that he "got this out of the top secret classified file."

The format of the first page of the usual report of the FEI was described to Mr. O'CONNER who stated that the collection of pages shown to him by the unknown man was not similar in any respect to an FEI report. He said the first page of the pages shown to him contained nothing other than the introductory paragraph alleging that is is a report of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, immediately followed by the subject matter.

Nr. O'CONNER stated that he did not observe either of these individuals in or near an automobile and that he has not been recontacted by either since this initial contact. He was unable to furnish any information which would be helpful in identifying either of these persons. He described these men as follows:

EeDNairtel 2/6/64 relating to information furnished by Mr. Tim O'Conner, Manager of Endio Station KPML, Denver, relating to a reported encounter with two men who offered an "FBI report" on the assassination.

When current investigation is completed, Denver is instructed to incorporate the results of all investigation including that set out in reairtel in appropriate insert form and furnish to Dallas for appropriate reporting. Twenty-five copies should be furnished.

You should be alert to any further similar incidents of alleged "FBI reports" on the assassination and endenvor to identify the individuals involved. Consider possibility of TGP violation.

O'Conner states there was nothing of pertinence in this report which had not been previously seen by him in newspapers other than paragraph alleging assassination planned and executed by "La Cosa Nostra"; and that Ruby killed Oswald based on instructions from this group. 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SUBJECT LEE HARVEY OSWALD INTERNAL SECURITY - R - CUBA

SAC J. Gordon Shanklin, Dallas Office, called at 11:00 p.m., 2/9/64 to advise SA W.H. Floyd, Extra Duty Supervisor, Domestic Intelligence Division, that a current news item out of Fort Worth, Texas, charged that a law enforcement agency has had an eye witness to the shooting by Oswald of President Kennedy in custody since November 22, 1963. The news item inferred that the agency was the Dallas Police Department.

SAC Shanklin said inquires were made locally with Secret Service, the Sheriff's Office and Chief Curry of the Dallas Police Department. All denied any knowledge of such an eye witness being held and efforts to determine the source were negative. Shanklin said Dallas had checked with the manager of the building where Oswald worked and he had no knowledge of such a person, that the story was evidently a wild rumor.

SAC Shanklin will furnish further details on February 10, 1964 as they develop.

SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY DALLAS, TEXAS, 11/22/63 REQUEST BY INVESTIGATING COMMISSION

At the request of representatives of the Commission investigating the President's assassination, the Laboratory has reviewed the cameras recovered in this case that are reportedly Oswald's, also an Ansco flash attachment and an empty leather case. Based on the list of evidence furnished to the Commission, they have asked whether or not the empty case could be a camera case for one of the cameras recovered or an unknown camera, and whether or not the Ansco flash attachment could be used with the two cameras recovered.

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These items were reviewed and the empty leather case was found to be a case for a small pair of binoculars and could not have been used for either of Oswald's cameras. It is noted that both of the cameras are presently in cases. The flash attachment was found to contain a camera connection that is different from that used on Oswald's cameras and, therefore, it could not be used without some intermediate adapter. The Minox camera, which has just been received from Dallas and is reported to be the property of Mrs. Ruth Paine's husband, was also checked and found to have no connection for use with a flash adapter. This adapter given to Dallas Police by Mrs. Paine. Dallas Office instructed to find out who owns it.

The above information has been telephonically furnished to Mr. Howard P. Willens at the Commission.

He asked if I would be interested in taking a bit part in a movie, and before considering, I accepted. correspondents who were allowed into the court-room for the trial of Lee Harvey Oswald for the assassination of President Kennedy. The Producer is Harold Hoffman (who signed our checks) and the Director is Larry-Buchanan (whose last movie was 'Free, White. and Twenty-One'). Mr. Carter, of T. E. C., knew before-hand the nature of the film but was asked not to reveal anything about it to those he hired to lir. Hoffman stued at the beginning: 'If. play in it. a reporter asks any of you about the movie, don't say anything; send him to me.' I was called down? once for attemptin to read the script (which, I understand, was largely written by Mr. Hoffman). The shooting commenced at about 8:30 a.m. and was completed, as far as we were concerned, by 5:30 p.m. Essentially, sir, this film is an exoneration of the Communist, Lee Harvey Oswald. But I am convinced that it is an even more direct assault upon your prosecution of Jakob Leon Rubenstein (alias Ruby'), In the first place, Oswald's defense attorney is portrayed by an old-time KSKY announcer who even looks like Belli, and who is constantly jumping up shouting 'Objection!' to any incriminating evidence (none of which is ultimately entered). Apparently, even the evidence which came out in the local papers (Oswald's prints and coat-hairs on the weapon etc.) is dis- allowed. There is admitted, to the best of my knowledge, only insignificant circumstantial; evidence. There is at least one instance in which reference to Rubenstein is thrown out. Witnesses for the Prosecution are castigated by the Defense who is palpably the 'hero' of the documentary. An a objective observation would be that there can be no. true documentary as long as the F.B.I. files are retained by Pravda-sponsored Earl Warren and his Commission. At one point, to accentuate 'police brutality, ' the Defense shouts, 'a client was questioned for as long as 24 hours at a time by TEAMS of interrogators!' Knowing the reputation of Capt. Fritz as an interrogator, I can not bring myself to entertain such slander. While Oswald's attorney is consistently depicted as a suave, knowledgeable, crusader, the prosecutoris consistently portrayed as a first-class fop, who zee ev in if victorious in the;

trial -- is disgustingly artificial. I might add that the plea was 'innocent on the grounds of existing insanity' and the production title was 'You Are The Jury'. Evidently, there is a long spiel by the judge (a foreigner) at the end of the trial adjuring everyone to test the criminal's sanity (not his misdeed) only on what the scriptwriter allowed to be entered as evidence in the farce. The jury then walks out to deliberate and that ends the saga. Finally, we were all paid \$1.15 per hour, so I presume that the film cannot be distributed nationally. The Producer advised me that it would be released in the state sometime in April or May, and locally about June. It's my guess that the lawyers 4 for Rubenstein and the Oswalds are behind the production, among others, because the film certainly will not benefit your cause.

In claiming this superiority, he considered SA MURDOCK's ability to be in the scholastic field while he considered himself better qualified in the speaking language.

When DELGADO previously described his trip to Mexico, he had furnished the name of Private WATTS as one who had accompanied him. He was closely questioned concerning the trip and steadfastly maintained such a trip was made and that OSWALD definitely accompanied them. He admitted he could not name but only guessed at the name Private WATTS. He stated since the early interviews he has been thinking about this and concluded it was not the name Private WATTS but does not recall at all who the other Marines were.

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DELGADD was closely questioned regarding his allegation that he believed OSWALD must have "penciled in" his score in order to qualify and was pressed for specifics regarding this statement. DELGADO admitted his earlier remarks were occasioned by his opinion OSWALD was not particularly interested in firearms training. He felt anyone with as little interest in such training as OSWALD had exhibited in his presence would not be a good shot and would not have qualified if his true score were recorded. He admitted as far as he knows it would have been impossible for OSWALD to personally have entered a false score.

With regard to DELGADC's claim he had observed certain material in OSWALD's locker, he admitted during the current interview he had never seen any written material which he could specifically identify as emanating from the Cuban Consulate. He did claim to have seen some foreign language material in the locker but due to his inability to understand any foreign language he admitted he could not identify it specifically.

It is the opinion of the Newark Office that DELGADO, a young Puerto Rican of limited education, has exaggerated the extent of his knowledge of OSMALD during the previous interviews. Based on the interviews conducted with DELGADO together with interviews about him with others associated with him, it would appear that DELGADO would at any opportunity magnify his own importance. It is felt that only after repeated interviews could the basic facts be determined and beliefs and opinions be distinguished from actual knowledge. It appears evident that DELGADO's pertinent knowledge of OSWALD is extremely limited

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and that they had barely more than a casual acquaintance, at best, for a few months in 1959, while both were teen-agers in the service.
